TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1957.

Section 46A.

I, HERBERT ERNST GRAHAM. Minister for Traffic, acting under the authority contained in section 46A of the Traffic Act, hereby authorise each and every licensing authority in a district or sub-district outside the metropolitan traffic area to issue permits for the movement of overwidth loads or implements, subject to the following conditions:—

Conditions to be Embodied in a Permit for the Movement of all Overwidth Loads or Implements (including Implements used in Agricultural or Horticultural Pursuits when such Implements are to be Moved to a Place other than in the same or an Adjoining District).

A.—Loads or Implements not Exceeding 10 Feet in Width.

(i) The transporting vehicle to carry front and rear signs reading—

"DANGER—OVERWIDTH VEHICLE"

in red letters five inches high on a white back-ground.

- (ii) If the implements are being towed, the danger sign shall be carried one in front of the vehicle and one at the rear-most portion of the vehicle being towed.
- (iii) Red flags to be placed at the widest portion of the load or implement being transported or towed
- (iv) Movement of overwidth vehicles or implements to take place only during daylight hours and parking on the made portion of any road is prohibited at all times.
- (v) Signs.—Overwidth signs to be removed or covered immediately on completion of movement.
- (vi) Additional conditions for movement of overwidth vehicles or implements into metropolitan area:—

Vehicles or implements travelling under permit as provided herein, must not travel on roads within the metropolitan area between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m., and after 4 p.m. Parking on roads in metropolitan area is prohibited at all times.

B.—Loads or Implements Exceeding 10 Feet, Not Exceeding 12 Feet in Width.

(i) A pilot vehicle to be used preceding the transporting vehicle at a distance of 50-150 yards and bearing a sign—

"DANGER—OVERWIDTH VEHICLE FOLLOWING."

(ii) The transporting vehicle to carry front and rear signs reading—

"DANGER-OVERWIDTH VEHICLE"

in red letters five inches high on a white back-ground.

- (iii) If the implements are being towed the danger sign shall be carried one in front of the vehicle and one at the rear-most portion of the vehicle being towed.
- (iv) Red fiags shall be placed at the widest portion of the load or implement being transported or towed.
- (v) Movement of overwidth vehicles or implements to take place only during daylight hours, and parking on the made portion of any road is prohibited at all times.
- (vi) Signs.—Overwidth signs to be removed or covered immediately on completion of movement.
- (vii) Additional conditions for movement of overwidth vehicles or implements into Metropolitan Area:—
 - Vehicles or implements travelling under permit as provided herein, must not travel on roads within the Metropolitan Area between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m., and after 4 p.m. Parking on roads in Metropolitan Area is prohibited at all times.

C.—Application for Permits for the Movement of Implements or Loads in excess of 12 feet, including Implements used for Agricultural or Horticultural Pursuits when such Implements are to be moved to a place other than in the same or an adjoining district are to be made to the Minister for Traffic through the Police Department.

THE Conciliation Commissioner in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by Section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties.

3.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to first class servicemen and servicemen employed in the Special Services Department of the W.A. Fire Brigades Board.

(c) Where less than a full week is worked, the worker shall be paid at the daily rate of pay for a five (5) day week.

5.—Higher Duties.

- (a) Where a serviceman is called upon to carry out inspections requiring recommendations for initial or additional fire protection, he shall be paid at the rate paid to the Inspector. This rate shall be computed on a daily basis.
- (b) Where a serviceman is directed to perform the duties of a first class serviceman he shall be paid the first class serviceman's rates of pay. This rate to be computed on a daily basis.

6.—Hours of Duty.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, worked from Monday to Friday.

Such hours shall be worked on each day between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. with an interval of one hour for lunch between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

7.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked by a serviceman outside his ordinary hours including travel by tanker on country work shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All time worked on Saturday between the normal starting time and noon shall be paid at time and a half and double time thereafter.
- (c) All time worked on Sundays and Public Holidays (as defined in Clause 8) shall be paid at double time.
- (d). In the computation of overtime each day will stand by itself.
- (e) The employer may require any worker to work overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.
- (f) An organisation, party to this Award, and/or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with (a) above with (e) above.

8.-Holidays.

- (a) A period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Board after a period of twelve (12) months' consecutive service with such employer. Provided that no annual leave shall accrue to any worker until he has served three (3) complete months.
- (b) For employment for portion of the year beyond three (3) months, the worker shall only be entitled to such holidays as are proportionate to his length of service.
- (c) A worker who is dismissed for peculation or theft shall not be entitled to annual leave or payment therefor.
- (d) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein shall deprive the employer of his right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.
- (e) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (f) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the order of the between the between to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.
- (g) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

9.—Travelling and Duty Outside the Metropolitan Area.

- (a) When a Serviceman is required to work outside the Metropolitan Area he shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per item for breakfast, lunch, dinner and bed. Provided that such allowance shall not be paid if full board and lodgings are provided.
- (b) Travelling by public transport shall be paid at ordinary rates with a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one day.

10.—Country Duty.

The employer shall give forty-eight hours notice of country duties.

11.—Sick Leave.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for more than one day.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct, or where the worker does not notify his depot of his sickness within four hours of his commencing time.

12.-Accident Pay.

Full pay shall be paid for accidents while on duty.

13.-Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly.

14.-Uniforms.

All uniforms as determined by the Board shall be supplied to the employee.

15.-Membership of Union.

Every Serviceman employed as a permanent employee of the Board shall on assuming duty, apply for Membership of "The Fire Brigade Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Coastal Districts) of W.A." and, if elected, shall remain a member of the Union whilst in the service of the Board.

16.-Contract of Service.

One (1) week's notice shall be given by or to an employee to terminate his engagement, or one (1) week's pay shall be paid or forfeited as the case may be.

This shall not affect the employer's right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

17.—Board of Reference.

A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purpose of this Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties; the chairman shall be mutually selected by the parties, failing their agreement the Industrial Registrar shall act as chairman.

Such Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—

- (a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them.
- (b) Deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose, are embodied in this Award.

18.—Term of Award.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date of issue. $\ \ \,$
