"Turbine driver" means a worker who starts, stops, or operates turbo-alternators of five hundred (500) kilowatts capacity or over and high pressure feed pumps (Bunbury Power Station) on the main turbine floor, and who performs other duties incidental thereto, including but without limiting the generality of the foregoing definitions, the logging of readings.

"Boiler controller" means a worker responsible for the safe and efficient working of the maintenance of steam pressures and temperatures of up to four boilers whose controls are grouped on one panel.

"Assistant boiler controller" means a worker stationed on the operating floor of the boiler house who carries out the following duties in conjunction with the boiler controller:—

- (a) Operate remote controlled soot-blowers.
- (b) Attend to oil burners when on firing floor.
- (c) Hand control feedwater, when necessary.

- (d) Attend to coal weighers.
- (e) Attend to mill feeders when on firing floor.
- (f) Operate blow-down valves under instructions.
- (g) Prepare boiler plant for service and put on load under instructions.
- (h) Assist and relieve boiler controller as required.

"Turbine auxiliary driver" means a worker whose duty is to start, stop, and operate the feed pumps (other than at Bunbury Power Station), the circulating and air pump motors in the turbine basement, and to watch the operation of the condensing plant; of the high pressure pumps (other than at Bunbury Power Station) of the seepage pumps, of the compressors and rotary screens, the pulverisers at Bunbury Power Station, and attend to the bearings in operation in the turbine basement.

"Auxiliary plant attendant" means a worker whose duties are to attend to any part of the auxiliary plant not covered by other definitions.

"Boiler cleaner" means a worker who performs any work pertaining to the cleaning of a boiler or economiser, including—

- (a) the removal of dirt from inside or outside of the boiler casings;
- (b) the operation of air or steam soot blowers on "A" Station boiler East Perth Power Station only;
- (c) the breaking and making of drum manhole door joints and handhole door joints;
- (d) the searching for leaking tubes or faults;
- (e) the cleaning of scale or rust by hand or machine;
- (f) the turbinizing of any turbes with machines; or
- (g) the erection and dismantling of stagings around boilers.

"Fuelman" means a worker employed in the handling or unloading of coal.

"Tippler Attendant" means a worker responsible for the removal of coal from railway trucks by means of the tippler and shall include the operation, lubrication and cleaning of a tippler plant.

"Coal Belt Attendant 2nd Grade" means a worker whose duty it is to operate the belt trippers over the station bunkers, attend to the magnetic separators, attend to the running, lubrication and cleaning of the rubber belt conveyor system.

"Coal Belt Attendant 1st Grade" means a worker whose duty includes the duty as defined for the 2nd Grade Attendant and in addition the operation, lubrication and cleaning of the coal crushers, coal screens and chutes to the belt conveyors and stock pile at East Perth and Bunbury Power Stations.

"Greaser" means a worker employed in lubricating or oiling any machinery or shafting.

"Greaser Driver" means a worker on shift work whose duties include the driving of the shift vehicle, plant greasing and general operating assistant on the junior grades at South Fremantle Power Station.

"Hoist Attendant" means a worker whose duty it is to attend to the operation, lubrication and cleaning of skip hoist, coal screens, coal crushers and chutes to belt conveyors and stock-pile at South Fremantle Power Station only.

"Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than one (1) week continuously, but does not include a worker who, when work is available, leaves his employment before the expiration of one (1) week.

"Permanent worker" means a worker other than a casual worker employed under the terms of this award.

"Continuous Shift Work" means shift work on a rostered basis whereby the shift worker is successively employed on day, afternoon and night shift throughout the year.

6.—Mixed Functions.

(a) A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher rate of pay than his classified rate for two hours in any day or shift shall be paid such higher rate for the whole of the day or shift.

(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade, his wage shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

7.—Promotion.

(a) All promotions shall be made under and in accordance with the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945-1955 and the Regulations thereto.

(b) The Commission shall, in the prescribed manner, notify all applicants for any vacancy or new position of the person recommended for appointment to such vacancy or new position.

(c) An employee who desires to appeal shall serve a notice in the prescribed form on the General Manager and the Secretary of the Promotions Appeal Board within fourteen clear days after the date of the notice referred to in subclause (b) hereof.

(d) Where any vacancy occurs or a new office is created, and it is necessary to fill the position without delay, a temporary appointment may be made, but applications for permanent appointment to the position shall be called within two (2) months of the occurrence of such vacancy or the creation of such new office as the case may be.

8.—Contract of Service.

(a) No permanent worker shall leave the department until the expiration of fourteen (14) days written notice of his intention to do so, without the approval of the Commission.

(b) Except in the case of summary dismissal for misconduct, peculation or theft, fourteen (14) days written notice shall be given by the Commission to any permanent worker and the reason for dismissal shall be stated in such notice.

(c) The Commission shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by a union or the union party to this award or by a union or unions affiliated with it or them or by any other association or union associated with it or them or through the breakdown of the Commission's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the Commission cannot reasonably prevent.

9.—Absence from Duty.

(a) Any worker losing time through sickness or injury shall as soon as possible notify his foreman, or other officer-in-charge in sufficient time to permit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties.

(b) Subject to the provisions of Clause 10 (Payment for Sickness) any worker losing time through sickness or special leave shall be reduced in wages only to the extent of the time actually lost through sickness or granted as special leave.

10.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the Commission shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof to the satisfaction of the Commission or its representative, of

sickness but the Commission shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to a worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

11.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Commission after a period of twelve months' continuous service with the Commission.

(ii) In addition to the leave hereinbefore prescribed seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays shall be allowed seven consecutive days' leave including non-working days.

(iii) Where an employee with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of fourteen consecutive days' annual leave, prescribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any award holidays fall within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds an aggregate of thirteen (13) weeks in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by the Commission for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with the Commission.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause other than for peculation or theft shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated leave or payment therefor.

(f) When work is closed for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Commission of its right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greater proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the annual leave.

(h) Provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(i) Annual leave shall be calculated up to the end of each financial year.

12.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, but at the option of the employer any employee may be granted Show Day in lieu of Sovereign's Birthday provided he makes application to his Officer-in-Charge.

(b) (i) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(ii) If any worker is required to work on a public holiday prescribed as a holiday under this Award which falls on a non-working day, he shall be paid the rate which he would have been paid if the day had not been a public holiday, and in addition shall have one day for each holiday so worked added to his annual leave.

(c) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(d) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday or resumes duty or is available on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(e) Day workers employed on Sunday work will be entitled to half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one day extra on their annual leave for every four (4) Sundays worked during the year; Sunday work shall not be counted for the purpose of this subclause unless at least three (3) hours actual work is done.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

13.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions relating to full-time Government wages employees generally as in force as at the date of this award, and as may be amended from time to time, shall apply to all workers employed under the provisions of this award.

14.—No New Designation.

No new designation shall be introduced during the currency of this award so as to reduce the status of any worker covered thereby.

15.—Shop Stewards.

Subject to recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards to be appointed by the Union shall be recognised by the Commission.

16.—Hours of Duty.

1. Day Workers.—

- (a) Forty (40) hours, exclusive of Saturday and Sunday work shall constitute a week's work. No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours.
- (b) The ordinary hours of duty shall be between the hours of 7.15 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday.
- (c) The usual hours of duty within the scope as provided in subclause (b) hereof shall not be altered without consultation with the Union.

2. Shift Workers.—The normal working hours for shift workers shall be forty (40) hours per week to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours per day provided—

- (a) That the time worked on Saturday up to a maximum of eight hours only shall be included in the week's work but the extra rate prescribed for Saturday time shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the week's earnings.
- (b) The time worked on Sunday up to a maximum of eight hours shall be included in the week's work, but the extra rate prescribed for Sunday time shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the week's earnings.

17.—Guaranteed Week.

- (a) (i) The Commission shall guarantee to each worker, other than a casual worker or shift worker, a full week's work, exclusive of Saturday and Sunday work, except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of its workers or for any other cause beyond its control, the Commission is unable wholly or partially to continue operations at the generating stations and/or at any of its undertakings. Each week shall stand by itself.
- (ii) The Commission shall guarantee to each shift worker a full week's work except during such period as by reason of any action on the part of any section of its workers, or any other cause beyond its control, the Commission is unable wholly or partially to continue operations at the generating stations and/or at any of its undertakings. Each week shall stand by itself. Shift workers may be rostered for work on Saturdays and Sundays.
- (b) The guaranteed period may be reduced or affected as follows:—
 - (i) Where a worker is suspended, the provisions of Clause 18 (Wages During Suspension) shall apply.
 - (ii) In respect of any day when, as a result of a vote taken by the workers concerned with the consent of the Commission or by agreement between the Commission and the Union, a holiday is taken.
 - (iii) In respect of any day a worker is absent except through sickness as provided for in Clause 10.

18.—Wages During Suspension.

(a) Where a worker is suspended and the charge is not proven, full wages for the period of suspension shall be paid.

(b) Where the charge is admitted or proven, the worker may be deprived of wages for the whole or any portion of the period of suspension, but in such case the Commission shall decide the amount of wages of which it is intended to deprive the worker, and any such deprivation shall be recorded and regarded as part of the punishment.

(c) Unless proceedings on any charge are commenced within seven (7) days of the first laying of the charge and finalised within one month of such date the charge shall lapse and full payment of wages made to the worker for the complete period unless proceedings are delayed by causes outside the control of the Commission.

19.—Overtime and Sunday Work.

1. Overtime—

- (a) Except where otherwise specified, all work performed by any worker outside the usual working hours of such worker shall be regarded as overtime and the rates payable for overtime shall be as follows:—
 - (i) Where the worker commences the overtime within the period of one and a half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) hours prior to his usual starting time, time and one half for the time worked in such one and a half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) hour period.

- (ii) Where the worker works overtime in any portion of the period commencing five (5) hours or more after his usual stopping time, but commences the overtime prior to one and a half (1½) hours before his usual starting time, double time for all time worked up to the usual starting time.
 - (iii) Subject to the preceding paragraphs, time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) (i) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to work overtime for more than one (1) hour after his usual knock-off time, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3/6) in lieu thereof.
 - (ii) An employee working overtime shall be allowed a meal time of twenty (20) minutes without loss of pay after each four (4) hours of overtime if the employee continues work after such meal time and where the employee has not been notified the day before that he will be required for overtime he shall be paid meal allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2/6) for each such meal time, provided that a shift worker working overtime shall not leave the job until he is relieved.
 - (iii) Where a worker has been notified the previous day to work overtime which necessitates the provision of a meal or meals and has provided a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less than the amount advised, he shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2/6) for each meal supplied and which is surplus.
 - (c) All time worked by a day worker during the usual meal time shall be paid for at overtime rates and such rates shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.
 - (d) a worker recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's premises and who returns to his home on completion of such overtime work shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours' ordinary pay, or at overtime rates for the time actually worked, whichever is the greater; and in such circumstances time reasonably spent in getting to and from work shall be regarded as time worked at ordinary rates. The worker shall not be obliged to work for the two (2) hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.
 - (e) (i) When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that employees have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.
 - (ii) An employee who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not had at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, but ordinary working time occurring during such absence shall not be paid for; provided that if the employee, at his own request, is permitted to resume or continue working without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for all work performed during ordinary working hours.

2. Sunday Time (Day Workers)—

- (a) All time worked by a day worker on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (b) A day worker called on to do duty on any Sunday shall be paid for not less than four (4) hours at the rate applicable to that day; provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the four (4) hours if the job for which he was brought on to do is completed in less than four (4) hours, provided further, if he is called out for duty more than once within a period of four (4) hours from the start of a previous callout for duty, he shall not be entitled to any further payment for time worked within that period of four (4) hours.

3. General—

- (a) No worker shall work more than sixteen (16) hours consecutively in any one period of twenty-four (24) hours.
- (b) Extra rates shall be computed at the rate applicable to the day on which the time is worked, provided that double time (i.e. twice ordinary rate) shall be maximum rate payable under any provision of this award.
- (c) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness as from a specific time for a callout to work after ordinary hours he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual time in which he so holds himself in readiness as from the specific time.
- (d) Except as provided in (1) (d) above, travelling time shall not be regarded as time worked within the meaning of this clause.

20.—Shift Work.

1. Casual Shift Workers—

- (a) The Commission may, if it so desires, place day workers on shift work, but before doing so shall give notice of its intention to the union. Whenever possible at least one (1) month's notice shall be given.
- (b) When shift work is required to be worked by day workers, the loading on the ordinary rates of pay for such shift work shall be 25% for afternoon and night shift.
- (c) Where a day worker is temporarily transferred on to afternoon or nightshift and is not given seven (7) day's notice of the intended transfer, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the time worked on afternoon or night shift from the time he commences afternoon or night shift until midnight on the following Saturday. Thereafter he shall be paid his ordinary shift rates.
- (d) Overtime on night or afternoon shifts shall be calculated on the basis of the rate paid for such shift.

2. Continuous Shift Workers—

- (a) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for continuous shift workers shall be 7½% for afternoon and night shifts worked between midnight on Sundays and midnight on Fridays.
- (b) Time and a half shall be paid for all rostered shifts worked by shiftworkers between midnight on Fridays and midnight on Saturdays.
- (c) Time and three-quarters shall be paid for rostered shifts worked by continuous shift workers between midnight on Saturdays and midnight on Sundays.
- (d) If a shift worker is called upon to work on his rostered day off he shall be paid as follows:—
 - (i) Between midnight on Sunday and noon on Saturday he shall be paid time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

- (ii) Between noon on Saturday and midnight on Sunday he shall be paid double time.

21.—Away from Home Allowance.

When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper and proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals and board and lodging. Fares shall be second class except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid and shall include return fares on completion of job.

22.—Payment for Travelling Time.

(a) A worker going to work away from or returning to his home station shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual travelling or waiting time for the first eight (8) hours, and thereafter at half the ordinary rates in any one period of twenty-four (24) hours.

(b) Where the waiting time exceeds four (4) hours, and suitable accommodation is available, the worker shall be deemed to be booked off duty and shall not be entitled to payment for the time he is booked off.

(c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.; provided this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time to be paid for below four (4) hours in any one (1) day; provided further that where by virtue of the length or nature of the journey the sleeping berth is available for six (6) hours or less, travelling time shall be paid for such period with a minimum of four (4) hours.

(e) A worker residing within the suburban area who is required to start work at some place other than his home station within the suburban area shall:—

- (i) If notified the previous evening, travel one way from or to work in his own time, provided that there is suitable transport available.
- (ii) If not so notified the worker shall travel both ways in the employer's time.

(f) The Commission shall provide free travelling from the home station: Provided however, that no worker sent on relief duty within the suburban area shall claim or be allowed extra travelling time if the station at which he is to work is nearer his residence than his home station.

(g) A worker who is working outside of the metropolitan area, and who is required to start work at some place other than at the depot to which he is attached, shall travel one way from or to work in his own time provided however, that the worker shall not be required to travel for more than three quarters ($\frac{3}{4}$) of an hour in any one day in his own time.

23.—No Reduction.

This award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rates prescribed for his class of work.

24.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the union party to this award, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any of the said unions shall within fourteen days of commencing employment under this award make and complete an application for membership of the union and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another industrial union, shall upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within fourteen days of such expiry make and complete an application for membership with the union party to this award.

25.—Passes and Privileges.

Workers who were employed by the State Electricity Commission prior to September 1st, 1946, and who have been continuously employed since that date shall continue to receive such passes and privileges they are entitled to at the date of this Award.

26.—Height Money.

Employees not in receipt of the power station allowance prescribed by this Award when working on or from temporary stages, planks or ladders at a height of fifty feet or more above the ground or floor level shall be paid one and sixpence (1/6) per day extra whilst so employed.

27.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award Boards of Reference. The boards shall each consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There are assigned to such boards, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the function of:—

- (i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (ii) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

28.—Right of Entry.

On notifying the officer in charge, any officer of the union authorised in writing by the president and secretary of such union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the workers in such places or premises. Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

29.—Allowances and Special Provisions.

(a) A casual hand shall be paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the minimum rate specified.

(b) Reasonable change room lockers and washing facilities shall be provided for the workers.

(c) A confined space shall mean the working place the dimensions of which necessitate an employee working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position, or where confinement within a limited space is productive of discomfort.

(d) Use of Protective Articles:—

- (i) Goggles, glasses and gloves or other efficient substitutes therefore, shall be available for the use of any worker engaged in welding or any other work in which their use is required for the protection of the worker.
- (ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgement on receipt thereof and on leaving employment shall return the same to the Commission.
- (iii) During the time the same are on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.
- (iv) No worker shall lend another worker the goggles, glasses or gloves or substitutes issued to such first-mentioned worker, and if the same are lent both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed to be guilty of wilful misconduct.
- (v) Before goggles, glasses and gloves, rubber boots or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the Commission to another worker they shall be effectively sterilised.

(e) Workers shall be paid allowances as specified herunder when engaged in the following:—

- (i) Working in a confined space as defined in subclause (c) above—3s. per day.
- (ii) To cleaning condenser and hot wells—3s. per day.
- (iii) Cleaning out precipitators on "B" Station boilers—5s. per day.
- (iv) Cleaning suction pipes—15s. per day.
- (v) Entering a bunker to trim or remove any coal which is on fire, or hot, when required by a person in authority so to do—3s. per day.
- (f) In addition to any other allowance which may be payable, the following allowance shall be paid:—

- (i) to workers engaged on boiler cleaning work—one shilling (1s.) per day extra;
- (ii) to workers under the direct control of the Power Production Engineer employed in power houses of installed capacity of 12.5 m.w. or more on operation work on power station plant—five shillings (5s.) per week extra.
- (g) Workers when temporarily:—

- (i) working in water over their ankles if not provided with rubber boots; shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra, provided this shall not be applied to a worker whose margin already provides for this work;
- (ii) workers getting wet while engaged in cleaning screens at South Fremantle Power Station shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day extra, provided this shall not be applied to a worker whose margin already provides for this work.
- (h) (i) Each worker covered by this award shall be supplied with two sets of overalls annually after six month's continuous service.
- (ii) Each worker shall sign an acknowledgement on receipt thereof, and on leaving his employment shall return same to the Commission.
- (iii) During the time they are on issue to the worker he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

(i) Except where other wise expressly provided, not more than one of the foregoing allowances or extra rates shall be paid at any one time, and where more than one allowance or extra rate applies, only the highest shall be paid.

(j) The foregoing allowances and extra rates shall be paid irrespective of the time at which the work is performed and shall not be included in the calculation of overtime or other penalty rates.

(k) Leading hands placed in charge of:—

- (i) not less than three and not more than ten other workers shall be paid 15s. per week extra;
- (ii) more than ten and not more than twenty other workers shall be paid 30s. per week extra;
- (iii) more than 20 other workers shall be paid 45s. per week extra.

30.—Under Rate Workers.

A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lower rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union.

If within seven (7) days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest Resident or Police Magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two (2) day's notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by the Commission for such wage for the period of six (6) calendar months thereafter, and, after the expiration of the said period until fourteen (14) day's notice in writing shall have been given him by the Secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

31.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to either party to apply at any time for amendment to Clause 20, Shift Work (Subclause 2 a)—Shift Loading and (Subclause 2 c) Rate for Rostered Sunday Shifts.

32.—Wages.

Basic Wage per week:—

- (a) Within a fifteen mile radius from the G.P.O., Perth—£13 12s. 3d.;
- (b) outside a radius of fifteen miles from the G.P.O., Perth, but within the South-West Land Division—£13 13s. 4d.;
- (c) outside the South-West Land Division, but below the 27th parallel of south latitude—£13 9s. 9d.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1958.

(Registered 28 July, 1958.)

Between Swan Brewery Company Limited, Emu Brewery Company Limited, and the Federated Engine Drivers' and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912-1952 this 28th day of July, 1958, between the Swan Brewery Company Limited and the Emu Brewery Company Limited both of Perth (hereinafter called "the Employers") of the one part and the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine Drivers' and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia being an industrial union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912-1952 (hereinafter called "the Union") of the other part whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations conditions and provisions set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out observed performed and complied with according to the true intent and meaning thereof by the parties hereto.

1.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this Agreement:—

(a) "Engine-driver" shall mean and include a worker who operates or drives any engine or engines the motive power of which is either steam, gas, air, oil, water, compressed air or electricity.

(b) "Fireman" shall mean a worker employed in a stokehold attending a steam boiler or suction gas generator over 6 h.p.

2.—Wages Schedule.

(a) The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities undermentioned is as follows—

(b) Engine-drivers, or firemen who shall be employed on boiler cleaning work, cleaning inside of pasteuriser, or bottle soaker shall receive payment at the rate of one shilling (1/-) per hour for all time so employed in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours, consisting of eight hours per day from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, shall constitute a week's work for engine-drivers and firemen who shall commence work not before 5 a.m. on any day, and the employer may require any engine-driver or fireman to start work at any time after that time. Where one shift only is worked such shift shall begin not later than 8 a.m. Any alteration to the working hours shall be by mutual arrangement.

(b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires shall be included.

4.—Shift Work.

(a) Workers may be employed—

(i) on "regular shift work" that is in regular rotation from week to week on two or three shifts spread over 16 or 24 hours respectively day shift to be worked from 7.30 a.m. to not later than 3.30 p.m. afternoon shift from 3.30 p.m. to not later than 11.30 p.m. and night shift from 11.30 p.m. to not later than 7.30 a.m.;

(ii) on "Casual shift work" that is on one weekly shift only worked in any department, casual, day, afternoon and night shifts to start and finish at the times respectively referred to in the preceding paragraph.

(b) In the case of both regular and casual shift work the first shift of the week will begin on Sunday at 11.30 p.m. and the last shift of the week shall finish at 11.30 p.m. on Friday. Duty Rosters shall be posted on Friday in each week and shall show the starting and finishing times of each worker during each week. Particulars relating to starting and finishing times shall be rigidly adhered to.

(c) The provisions contained in the previous sub-clause of this clause may be varied by mutual agreement between any employer and the Union.

(d) All workers employed on regular afternoon and night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 10% of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(e) All workers employed on casual night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 12½% of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(f) The additional allowances mentioned in sub-clause (d) and (e) hereof shall be taken into consideration in calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this Agreement.

5.—Overtime.

(a) The following overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half: All time up to 4 hours worked—

- (i) over 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;
- (ii) before the starting time of 5 a.m. mentioned in Clause 3 (a);
- (iii) in the case of shift workers outside rostered starting and finishing times;
- (iv) on Saturday.

(b) All overtime in excess of four hours worked during the periods referred to in sub-clause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Subject to any alteration by mutual arrangement, all workers on day work engaged in or about a brewery or bottling works shall if required to work more than one hour's overtime, after the usual finishing time be entitled to knock off for one hour after the usual finishing time for refreshments in which event, if notice of overtime has not been given at least 24 hours previously, tea money shall be paid at the rate of six shillings (6/-) but where food is provided by the employer tea money shall be reduced by the cost of the food provided. If notice of overtime has been given at least 24 hours previously tea money shall be paid at the rate of four shillings (4/-) and where food is provided by the employer tea money shall be reduced by the cost of the food provided.

6.—Record.

Each employer shall keep a record of the name of each worker, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, and wages paid to each worker, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the Secretary or any other person appointed by the Union during working hours.

Each worker shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

7.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

8.—Holidays.

All employees called upon to work in any department on the undermentioned holidays shall be paid one (1) day's pay for the holiday and in addition shall receive the following rates of pay on an hourly basis. All holiday shifts shall rotate.

- (a) One and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the ordinary rate of pay, with a minimum of four (4) hours' pay.
- (b) Twice (2) the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of four (4) hours.

The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Annual Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Show Day, and Sovereign's Birthday. In case any of the above holidays falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

9.—Annual Bonus.

The employer shall pay each employee receiving wages under this Award a week's pay by way of bonus on the last week in December in each year. Any employee leaving the employer's service for reasons other than misconduct, dishonesty, or neglect of duty before the payment of such bonus in any year shall, when leaving, be paid a *pro rata* payment in lieu thereof; any employee who shall not have been in the employ of the employer for a year in the first week of December shall receive a part of his week's pay bearing the same proportion to a week's pay as the period of his service bears to a year.

10.—Annual Leave.

(a) An employer shall grant an employee who completes twelve (12) months' service three (3) weeks annual leave; such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the employees and their respective employers. The annual leave shall be in addition to the holidays mentioned in clause 11 hereof. An employer shall pay to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than one (1) month but less than three (3) months an amount equivalent to one and one quarter ($1\frac{1}{4}$) day's pay in respect of each completed month of service; and to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than three (3) months an amount equivalent to two and one twelfth ($2\frac{1}{12}$) day's pay in respect of each completed month of service. The said payments shall be made to an employee entitled thereto:—

- (a) On the termination of his service if such termination occurs before he takes his annual leave; or
- (b) On the taking of his annual leave if he remains in the service of his employer.

An employer shall set aside and/or credit to an employee's account from time to time sufficient money to cover the said payments so that unless that employee's service is terminated earlier there will be available for him at the time he takes his annual leave a sum equivalent to two (2) week's double pay and one (1) week's single pay and apart from paying the money so set aside an employer shall not be obliged to make any payments to an employee in respect of his annual leave or in respect of the period during which such leave is actually taken.

(b) It shall be a condition of every worker taking Annual Leave that he—

- (i) Shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
- (ii) Shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of leave; and
- (iii) Shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with Annual Leave.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all right (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) (except as on the ground of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a medical officer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits of payments.

11.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service. Provided, however, that where a worker has received long service leave under previous agreements on the basis of 13 weeks' leave after 25 years' service, he shall be entitled to a further six and one half ($6\frac{1}{2}$) weeks' leave on the completion of each 10 years continuous service after the date he first qualified for long service leave.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transferee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transferee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transferee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include:—

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
- (b) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
- (c) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service;

(i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956 and except in Korea or Malaya after 26th June, 1950;

(ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;

(iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended);

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) The transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) Any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) Any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) Any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (e) Any termination of the employment of the worker on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (f) Any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (g) Any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate Union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (h) Any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Subject to subclause b (2) where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be:—

- (a) In respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) In respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated:—

- (a) By his death;
- (b) In any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

The amount of leave shall be:—

- (i) If such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) If such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) By his death; or
- (ii) By the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) By the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as the justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of a Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination.

The amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Agreement.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual, or if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) Shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) Shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by a Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by a Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Where a worker is beyond 60 years of age at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave he shall have the option of taking actual leave under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for long service leave.

(c) Where a worker is beyond 60 years of age at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave he shall have the option of taking actual leave under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement.
