## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938-1956, that the Governor may, at any time, on the application of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, provide and declare by Proclamation that the property in all onions belonging to growers shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on or from some other date specified therein be divested from the growers thereof and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that any

onions belonging to the growers thereafter coming into existence within a time specified in the Proclamation shall become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board, and may by such Proclamation make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of such onions, and to deal with the same, as may be deemed necessary or convenient in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the Board has been constituted; and whereas by subsection (4) of that section it is also provided that the provisions of that section shall not apply to onions harvested and marketed by a grower during the period between the 31st day of July and the 1st day of November in each and every year; and whereas the Board has made application for the issue of a Proclamation accordingly, and it is deemed desirable and expedient that such Proclamation shall be issued: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and pursuant to the application of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Act, do hereby provide and declare for the purposes of the Act, that from and including the 1st day of November, 1958, to and including the 31st day of July, 1959, the property in all onions then belonging to growers within the meaning of the Act, shall, subject to all lawful exceptions and to any exemptions which may be lawfully granted by the Board, be divested from the growers thereof, and shall become vested in and be the absolute property of The Western Australian Onion Marketing as the owner thereof, and the Board may, but subject to the regulations at any time or from time to time in force do such lawful acts and things, and take such lawful means, as the owner thereof to obtain effectively possession of the onions which by notice in this Proclamation are the absolute property of the Board and to deal with the same, as the Board may deem necessary or convenient, in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the Board has been constituted.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1098/57.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner—

- (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 16th day of October, 1957, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of

the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 7 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council, has been pleased to declare under section 17 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1957, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the municipalities and road districts during the periods set out in Schedule No. 1 hereunder and to approve of the boundaries of the areas described in Schedules Nos. 1 to 18 inclusive hereunder.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 14 of 1958.

Registered 19th August, 1958.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 1st day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fifty eight between the West Australian Fibrous Plasterers' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and West Australian Plaster Mills Pty. Ltd. (hereinafter called "the employer"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "West Australian Plaster Mills Pty. Ltd. Agreement."

## 2.—Arrangement.

## 3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers classified in Clause 10 hereof employed at the works occupied and controlled by West Australian Plaster Mills Pty. Ltd.

## 4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 5.—Contract of Service.

One (1) day's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service. If such notice of termination is not given one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited. For the purpose of this subclause, notice shall be given at or before the usual starting time on any ordinary working day and shall be deemed to expire at the completion of that day's work.

## 6.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 7.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.

(c) The hours of work, except where shifts are worked shall be performed as follows: Monday to Friday inclusive between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(d) The starting and finishing time having been established in any factory, the employer shall notify the Union of any alterations thereto.

## 8.—Overtime.

(1) Any worker who is called upon to continue working for more than two (2) hours beyond his usual ceasing time shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid an allowance of three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to any worker who was advised on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime, nor to any worker who can conveniently return home for a meal.

(2) Any worker who has left the premises at which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one (1) hour shall receive payment for one (1) hour at overtime rates.

(3) If a worker is required to work during the recognised meal period so that the commencement of the meal period is postponed for more than half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) an hour, that worker shall receive payment at double time rates until he gets his meal.

(4) Subject to the preceding subclause, if a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not in consequence obtain during the shift the full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained or any portion lost.

(5) The expression "recognised meal period" means the period customarily observed as the meal period between fixed times at the works.

(6) All work performed outside the normal limits of the hours of labour shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(7) Notwithstanding anything contained herein—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime and such worker shall work the overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) An organisation, party to this Agreement, and/or a worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with (i) above.

## 9.—Shift Work.

Where two or more shifts are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

The penalty rate for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

## 10.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Agreement shall be as follows:—

## 11.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least once weekly.

(b) When a worker is discharged at or before the usual time he shall be paid all wages due to him.

## 12.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided, that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained or arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

#### 13.—Under Rate Workers.

(1) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(2) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(3) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 14.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) All workers, except casual workers, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be entitled to holidays without deduction of pay in respect of the basic wage and margin, on the days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All workers required to work on the days named in subclause (a) hereof, or on any Sunday shall be paid double time rate for all time worked on any such day.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If any holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer and if such leave is not equal to

the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(i) "Picnic Day" shall be observed on a day mutually agreed upon between the employer and his workers.

(j) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(k) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 15.—Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up a record containing:—

(a) The name and address of each worker to whom this Agreement applies.

(b) the class of work performed by him;

(c) the hours worked each day by him;

(d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him.

Such record shall be signed by the worker and open to inspection by a representative of the Union during working hours and such person may take extracts therefrom.

#### 16.—Posting Copy of Award and Union Notices.

(a) No employer shall prevent an official of the worker's Union from posting a copy of this Agreement, or any Union notice, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place on any job.

(b) Liberty to apply to amend this clause is reserved in the event of any objectionable notice being posted.

#### 17.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

(1) The secretary or any authorised officer of the Union or association shall be allowed free access to any job or shop at any time during the meal period, and with consent of the employer or his foreman at any other time, to interview any of the workers if he desires to do so.

(2) The secretary or any authorised representative of the Union or association shall have the right to visit and inspect any factory or works or any part thereof during the time that work is being carried on outside the ordinary working hours and to interview workers therein.

#### 18.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of:—

(a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;

(b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

#### 19.—Long Service Leave.

(1) Entitlement to Leave.—Subject to this Agreement every employee, not being a casual employee, shall be entitled to long service leave on ordinary pay in respect of continuous service with the employer.



(2) Period of Leave.—The amount of such entitlement in the case of an employee who has completed at least 20 years' continuous service with the employer shall be—

- (i) in respect of the 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave; and
- (ii) in respect of each 10 years' service with the employer completed after such 20 years—six and one half weeks' leave.

(3) Pro Rata Entitlement on Termination.—In the case of an employee who has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 20 years' service with the employer and whose services with the employer are terminated by the employer for any cause other than serious misconduct, or by the employee for any reason or by reason of the death of the employee, the employee shall be entitled to a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service since the commencement of his continuous service, or since the last accrual of entitlement to leave on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service.

(4) Calculation of Continuous Service.—(a) For the purpose of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, and shall, subject to any limitation herein, count as service:—

- (i) Absence in respect of any period during which the employee shall have served as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (other than as a member of the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia and other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan), or as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939 (as amended) or absence on compulsory service in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended): Provided that the employee as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such absence;
- (ii) absence on any annual leave or long service leave;
- (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations under this Agreement in respect of long service leave or annual leave; and
- (iv) absence necessitated by personal sickness or injury of which not more than 15 working days a year shall count as service.

(b) For the purposes of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, but the period of such absence shall not count as service:—

- (i) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade, if the employee be re-employed by the employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (ii) absence during any standing down of an employee in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement;
- (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the employee is re-employed by the employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (iv) absence of the employee authorised by the employer at any time;

(v) absence arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute but only if the employee returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

(c) After the coming into operation of this Agreement absence from work by reason of any cause not being a cause specified in this clause for a period in excess of 14 days shall be deemed to break the contract of employment and the continuity of service for the purposes of this Agreement unless the employee notifies the employer in writing of the reason for his absence.

(5) Service before Commencement of Agreement.—For the purpose of calculating the entitlement to leave, continuous service of an employee with the employer immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Agreement, shall be taken into account but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of such service, provided that any service prior to such 20 years' service will carry such leave if the employee remains in the employer's service until his retirement.

(6) Time of Taking Leave.—Long service leave shall be granted and taken on the retirement of the employee provided that when an employee has completed 20 years of continuous service he will be entitled to not more than eight weeks' interim leave which will be taken at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the employee having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment where the employee is working. Additional interim long service leave on the basis of four weeks for each additional 10 years' service may be taken at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the employee.

(7) Payment on Termination for Leave Not Taken.—Where the employment of an employee is terminated otherwise than by his death and he has an entitlement to long service leave the employee shall be deemed to have entered upon and taken the leave from the date of such termination and the employer shall forthwith pay to the employee in full his ordinary pay for the leave less any amount already paid to the employee in respect of that leave.

(8) Payment on Death.—Where an employee dies during his employment and any long service leave to which he is entitled under this Agreement has not been taken or received in full by the employee, the employer shall upon request by the personal representative of the employee, pay to that representative the amount due in respect of such leave providing that where no personal representative has been appointed within three months of the date of the employee's death the employer may pay to the widow or such of the next of kin as it considers appropriate, the said amount due. The obligation of the employer to such employee or employee's estate in respect of long service leave shall be and shall be deemed to have been satisfied by such payment.

(9) Payment for Period of Leave.—Each employee shall be paid for each week of leave his ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave. Such ordinary time rate shall be for the standard hours prescribed by this Agreement but in the case of part-time workers for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(Note: "Ordinary time rate of pay".)

(1) shall not include:—

Shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

Payment in the case of employees employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by result shall be at ordinary time rates.

(2) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave.)

(10) Method of Payment.—Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) in full before the employee goes on leave, or
- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the employee had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the employee in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the employee, or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the employee.

(11) Public Holidays and Annual Leave during Period of Leave.—Any long service leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(12) Transmission of Business.—For the purposes of this Agreement where a business had, whether before or after the coming into operation of this Agreement been transmitted from an employer (in this paragraph called the transmittor) to another employer (in this paragraph called the transmittee) and an employee who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—

- (i) the continuity of service of such employee shall be deemed not to have been broken by reason only of the transmission; and
- (ii) the period of the continuous service which the employee has had with the transmittor (or any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be continuous service of the employee with the transmittee.

In this clause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(13) Benefits Related to Long Service.—The employer will continue to operate its F.E.A. Scheme to provide superannuation benefits in accordance with the rules of that scheme in addition to any leave granted under this Agreement.

(14) Leave to be in Satisfaction of all Rights.—The entitlement to long service leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave or benefit in the nature of long service leave, to which the employee may be entitled in respect of the employment by the employer, and any leave taken or in respect of which payment has been made by the employer shall be deducted from any amount of long service leave to which such employee is entitled pursuant to this Agreement.

(15) Records:—

- (i) The employer shall keep an adequate long service leave record.
- (ii) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 15 of 1958.

(Registered 1st September, 1958.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 1st day of September, 1958, between the Transport and Motor Operators' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust (hereinafter called "the employer") of the other part witnesseth that for the considerations hereafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

### 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust Workers' Agreement of 1958."

### 2.—Arrangement.

### 3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all persons employed by the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust in or in connection with the conveyance of persons and/or passengers by road, engaged in the classifications referred to in Clause 7 (Wages) hereof.

### 4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the first day of September, 1958.

### 5.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the whole of the State of Western Australia.

### 6.—Casual Workers.

(a) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per day in the case of male workers and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day in the case of female workers, in addition to an hourly rate calculated upon the weekly rate prescribed in Clause 7 hereof and on the basis that forty hours constitute a week's work: Provided that the minimum payment to a casual worker for work performed on any one day shall be not less than ten shillings (10s.); Provided further, that the rate of payment for casual workers for work done on any Saturday shall be at the rate of time and a half and on any Sunday or holiday shall be at double the ordinary rate for casual workers.

(b) The maximum number of casual workers allowed to be employed by any employer shall be in the proportion of one casual worker to every 15 or fraction of 15 weekly workers employed under the provisions of this Agreement: Provided that, where a casual worker is engaged to take the place temporarily of a weekly worker, such casual worker shall for the purpose of this subclause be regarded as and be deemed to be a weekly worker.

## 7.—Wages.

The minimum weekly rate of wage to be paid to and received by all workers, other than casual workers, shall be as follows:—

(4) No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be permitted to drive any vehicle whilst carrying passengers except at the rate prescribed herein for adult drivers. No person under the age of seventeen (17) years shall be employed as a fare collector. No male person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be employed as a conductor except at the rate prescribed herein for adult conductors.

## 8.—Spread of Shifts.

(a) The spread of hours for omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors and/or conductors from the beginning to the end of the day's work shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

(b) No worker shall be required to work outside the daily spread of hours mentioned in subclause (a) hereof except by agreement between the employer and the Union and on payment of overtime rates as prescribed, unless for the purposes of relief in the case of sickness or absence of another worker, specials which take a worker off

his regular route for the whole of his shift, or an accident which prevents the proper working of the roster. In the event of disagreement, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

Provided that agreement between the employer and the Union shall not be required for work outside the spread of hours on Saturdays and holidays.

(c) No worker shall be booked off for a lesser period than a half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hour.

(d) No worker shall be called upon for duty until he has nine hours off duty between the shifts; except in the case of sickness of a worker, default of a worker, or in the case of an accident which prevents the proper working of the roster. Provided that in special circumstances a worker may be called on duty after eight (8) hours off duty to facilitate the change of shifts and then only with the consent of the Union.

## 9.—Saturday and Sunday Work.

Except in the case of casual workers, all time of duty on Saturdays shall be paid for at half-time extra, and all time of duty on Sundays shall be paid ordinary time extra; such half-time extra and ordinary time extra shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage and, subject to Clause 17 (referred to in Clause 14 hereof), shall not be taken into account in the calculation of overtime in any way whatsoever: Provided that this clause shall not apply to workers who finish by 1.30 o'clock a.m. on Saturday. The time so worked shall be deemed to be part of the Friday shift. Work which finishes by 1.30 o'clock a.m. on Sunday shall be deemed to be part of the Saturday shift.

## 10.—Posting Roster.

(a) The employer shall post a roster showing the ordinary hours to be worked during each week by weekly omnibus drivers, conductors and fare collectors, other than relief workers, which roster shall be exhibited in each establishment in such a place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned. The hours to be recorded in such roster shall not exceed the spread of hours prescribed in Clause 8.

Such roster shall be posted by the employer not less than two (2) days before the start of the working week, and may only be altered on account of sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee: Provided that workers may change shifts on any specified day by written joint application to the employer and on his approval. Where workers have changed shifts in accordance with the foregoing, they shall be deemed to have worked, on the specified day, the hours they would have worked had the change not been made.

(b) As far as practicable, rostered shifts shall rotate weekly to the intent that all workers on the roster may receive a proper share of all shifts on the roster. In any proceeding under this clause, the onus shall rest upon the employer to establish that such rotation was not practicable.

(c) The secretary of the Union or any person authorised in writing by him shall be permitted to inspect the roster at any time between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(d) No worker shall be rostered for duty on more than five (5) days in any week.

## 11.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in not more than five (5) days. No worker shall be permitted to be on duty without payment of overtime in excess of—

(i) forty (40) hours in any week;

(ii) in the case of omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, nine (9) hours twenty (20) minutes in any one (1) day;

(iii) all other workers, eight (8) hours in any one (1) day.

(b) Provided, however, that at the option of the employer eighty (80) hours shall constitute a fortnight's work to be worked in not more than five (5) days in any one (1) week, in which case no worker shall be permitted to be on duty without payment of overtime in excess of—

- (i) omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, forty-eight (48) hours in any one (1) week, or nine (9) hours twenty (20) minutes in any one (1) day;
- (ii) all other workers, forty-eight (48) hours in any one (1) week, or eight (8) hours in any one (1) day;
- (iii) all workers, eighty (80) hours in any fortnight.

Provided further, that in every case where it is intended to work the eighty (80) hours fortnight it shall be the duty of the employer, on the first day of the first week of each fortnightly period to clearly indicate such fortnightly period in the time and wages book.

(c) Any time worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift except in the case of omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, who may be worked in broken shifts to suit the exigencies of the employer's business, but in such case, no shift shall consist of more than three (3) periods of working time with two (2) intervals in one of which the meal interval may be included.

(d) No worker shall be permitted to be on continuous duty for a greater period than six (6) hours without a meal break of at least one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hour, and such meal break shall not be included in computing the hours worked each day.

(e) No rostered shift shall consist of more than three (3) periods of working time.

(f) A worker failing to take up his rostered or appointed shift unless such is due to illness or other unavoidable cause (the onus of proof of "unavoidable cause" shall rest upon the worker) shall pay the employer for any extra payment incurred thereby through another worker being called upon to work the shift.

(g) Specials: Where a worker is required to work off his regular route he shall be deemed to have worked the whole of the time which elapses between the time he leaves the starting place until he returns to that place if such time is less than six (6) hours forty (40) minutes in any one (1) day. If such time is six (6) hours forty (40) minutes or more in any one (1) day he shall be deemed to have worked six (6) hours forty (40) minutes at least on such day. Subject to the provisos hereto, all time in any one (1) day, occupied in waiting, shall stand alone and be paid for at half the time rate applicable for that day: Provided that any waiting time which is used to make up the six (6) hours forty (40) minutes beforementioned shall not be deemed waiting time for the purpose of this clause: Provided also that a worker who comes within the scope of Clause 18 (referred to in Clause 14 hereof) shall not be entitled to payment for waiting time under this clause.

(h) Whenever a worker commences a period of work on any day whether for the purpose of making up the ordinary weekly hours or for overtime he shall be deemed to have worked not less than one (1) hour for each such period.

(i) Each worker shall be rostered two (2) days off duty in each week.

(j) Subject to subclause (g) of this clause and subject as hereinafter provided all time between the earliest starting time and the latest finishing time, on any day, which is not counted as time of duty shall be deemed to be waiting time, shall stand alone and be paid for at half the time rate applicable to the day for the particular worker concerned. Provided that—

- (i) a worker shall not be entitled to any payment in respect of one hour of waiting time in any one day;

(ii) when two periods of waiting time occur on any day the maximum waiting time to be paid for shall not exceed three hours for such day; and when only one period of waiting time occurs on any day the maximum waiting time to be paid for shall not exceed two hours for that day.

#### 12.—Overtime.

(a) Omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors and/or conductors shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for all time of duty—

- (i) in excess of the ordinary hours of duty per week; or
- (ii) in excess of the daily hours of duty as prescribed in Clause 11 hereof; or
- (iii) outside the daily rostered hours of duty; or
- (iv) on the worker's rostered day off; or
- (v) outside the spread of hours as prescribed by Clause 8.

(b) All workers other than those mentioned in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for all time of duty in excess of eight (8) hours in any one (1) day or the ordinary hours of duty in any week.

(c) All overtime shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly or casual wage as the case may be.

(d) Overtime shall not be paid twice for the same hours of work.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained herein—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) the Union or any worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(f) When an employer has the right to alter the roster through the absence of a worker in accordance with Clause 10, subclause (a), he shall have the right to make such alteration without payment of overtime to the worker who replaces the absent worker, for working outside his original rostered hours.

#### 13.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions relating to full-time Government wages employees generally as in force as at the date of this Agreement, and as may be amended from time to time, shall apply to all workers employed under the provisions of this Agreement.

#### 14.—Other Clauses.

The provisions of the following clauses of Award No. 19 of 1956 shall be deemed to form part of and be embodied in this Agreement:—

## 15.—Exclusion.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement—

- (a) During the first three (3) months following the acquisition of the business of an operator by the Trust, the provisions of subclauses 10 (d), 11 (a) and 11 (i) of this Agreement shall not apply to the workers who were employed by that operator prior to such acquisition.
- (b) After the expiration of the first three (3) months following the acquisition of the business of an operator by the Trust, the provisions of subclause 11 (b) of this Agreement shall apply, in respect of workers who were employed by that operator prior to such acquisition, only by agreement between the Union and the Trust.
