WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, it is provided that the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows: That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from 1st January, 1959, to 31st December, 1963, both dates inclusive.

Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters at City Beach extending along the foreshore one-quarter of a mile in each direction from the Groyne and to a width of one-half mile from mean low-water mark.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, it is provided that the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows: That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets, and also against the use of fish traps, for a period of five years as from 1st January, 1959, to 31st December, 1963, both dates inclusive.

All that portion of the Avon River starting from the centre of Sinclair Crossing at Dumbarton and extending generally north-westerly downwards to the centre of the crossing of the Toodyay-Bolgart Road near the Toodyay Townsite boundary.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, it is provided that the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year; and whereas such Proclamation may, by section 11 of the said Act, be subject to any specified exception as regards place or time: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking crabs by means of sunk set nets in that portion of Western Australian waters known as the Swan and Canning Rivers (including their tributaries) for a period of five (5) years from 1st December, 1958, until 30th November, 1963, except within those portions of the said rivers as so defined in the Schedule hereto, from 15th December in each of the years 1958, 1959, 1960, 1961 and 1962 to 30th April of each of the succeeding years respectively.

Schedule.

(1) The waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers upwards (or easterly) from a line drawn from the south-west extremity of Point Resolution to Point Walter Jetty to—

- (a) a line drawn from the southern extremity of the Swan Brewery Wharf (situated on the western side of the river near Eliza Point) to the Mill Point (or Belches Point) Spit Post;
- (b) a line starting at the intersection of the eastern side of Canning Beach Road (road No. 8869) and the southern side of road No. 10002 and terminating at the westernmost corner of lot 3 of Canning Location 37, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 11877, a point near the northernmost intersection of Melville Parade and Canning Highway.

(2) All that portion of the Canning River from a line starting at the intersection of the south-eastern side of Canning Highway and the western side of The Esplanade and terminating at the intersection of the eastern side of Leonora Street and the north-eastern side of Wooltana Road to a line starting at the intersection of the southern side of Canning Avenue and the south-western side of The Esplanade and terminating at the southernmost extremity of the foreshore of Mount Henry.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January, 1959, to 31st December, 1964, both dates inclusive.

Schedule.

(1) The whole of the waters of the King River (Albany), including its tributaries, north of a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a point on the western foreshore of Oyster Harbour 25 chains south from the southern extremity of the Lower King River Bridge to a point on the northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains east of the northern extremity of the said bridge.

(2) All that portion of Oyster Harbour and the Kalgan River and its tributaries lying north of a line starting at a post situate at the junction of the northern shore of the said Oyster Harbour and the right bank of the said Kalgan River and extending south-westerly for a distance of about 23 chains to a spit post marking the edge of the channel and thence southerly to the westernmost extremity of Swan Point. (Public Plan 451C/40.)

(3) The waters of the Channel Entrance between King George's Sound and Oyster Harbour (Albany), downwards from a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains north of Emu Point to a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains south of Emu Point.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 422/58.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator-in-Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

Bayswater-Morley Park Area.

Bayswater Metropolitan Main Drain.

Section 5.

Amendment of Route.

Construction of a pipe and open channel drain for a distance of approximately 880 feet, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8247.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 15 of 1958.

Between Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Branch), Perth, Applicant, and Conservator of Forests, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Radio and Telecommunications (Government) Award."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from delivery of this Award.

5.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers classified in the First Schedule hereof and employed by the Conservator of Forests.

6.—Definitions.

(a) "Serviceman" shall mean a worker employed in making, repairing, altering, assembling, testing, aligning, fault locating, winding, and wiring radio machines, instruments or other apparatus, including public address systems.

(b) "Telephone mechanic" means a worker who installs, tests, adjusts and fully maintains all types of manual telegraph services and associated equipment.

7.—No Reduction.

This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

8.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture, as the case may be, of a week's wages in lieu of such notice.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 9, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) When a worker is discharged before the usual pay day, he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk, unless the worker desires to collect at the office.

(e) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of a strike by the Union or by any union affiliated with it, or by any other association or union associated with it, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

9.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

10.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(b) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for pecculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for pecculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(c) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(d) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(e) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(f) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund to the employer the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service up to the date of the termination of his services.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

11.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) (i) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(ii) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(iii) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(c) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or is available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(d) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

12.—Apprentices.

(a) The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the provisions of the Second Schedule annexed hereto.

(b) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following trade:—Radio serviceman.

(c) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime unless he so desires.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one (1) to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) tradesmen employed by him in that branch.

Provided that any employer adequately equipped to teach apprentices may, with the consent of a committee consisting of a representative of the employer concerned, a representative of the Union, with the Industrial Registrar as chairman, take on new apprentices up to the proportion of one (1) to each journeyman employed.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of tradesmen employed on all working days of the six (6) months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of tradesmen employed.

(f) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, if through lack of work the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may, with the concurrence of the apprentice, his guardian, and the Union, be suspended for a period agreed upon or, if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by the committee referred to in subclause (d) of this clause. The onus of proof of the circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer.

This provision shall be deemed to be included in all contracts of apprenticeship now existing and also in all future contracts entered into.

13.—Shop Stewards.

Subject to the recognition of properly constituted authority, shop stewards, to be appointed by the Union, shall be recognised by the management. The management shall be notified in writing by the Union of the stewards appointed.

14.—Hours of Duty.

(a) (i) The week's work shall consist of forty (40) hours and shall be worked in five (5) days.

(ii) The normal hours of labour shall, in the case of a five (5) day week, be worked in eight (8) hours each day, Monday to Friday inclusive.

(iii) Except as otherwise provided, the hours specified in subclause (a) shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(b) A meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) (i) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning.

(ii) This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by employees during this interval, but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any employee of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied, the Court may grant the employer exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

(d) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Award shall not, in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

(iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) hereof, nothing in this subclause shall affect the operation of any existing clause in this Award providing for overtime.

15.—Overtime and Sunday Time.

(a) (i) All time worked in excess of or outside the usual working hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours after the usual stopping time and double time thereafter: Provided that all work after 10 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive shall be paid at double time up to the usual starting time: Provided, also, that workers called upon to start work within an hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at time and a half until the usual starting time.

(ii) Where work other than work performed as provided in clause 14 (a) (iii) hereof, is done on Saturdays, the worker shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, but if work is performed in any period from 5 p.m. on Saturdays, the worker shall be paid double time for all time worked after that hour.

(b) When an employee is required for overtime duty in excess of one (1) hour after the usual ceasing time without being notified the previous day, he shall be supplied with any meal required or be paid five shillings (5s.) for such meal. This subclause shall not apply to workers residing within a radius of one (1) mile of the works.

(c) All time worked during the usual meal time by any worker shall be paid at overtime rates and such rates shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

(d) A worker called back after completing a day's work or called out on a Saturday or Sunday shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates, but if he is called out more than once within any period of two (2) hours of a call, he shall not be entitled to any further payment for time worked within the period of two (2) hours from the time when he commenced work in response to his first call.

(e) For all work done on Sunday, double time shall be paid, with a minimum of two (2) hours.

(f) Notwithstanding any provisions contained in this Award, the provisions of Clause 33 (b) of Award No. 4 of 1953, as amended, shall apply to workers bound by this Award when such workers are required for fire service duties.

16.—Fares and Travelling Allowance.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second class.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one day.

Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the employer and the worker may enter into such other arrangements as may be mutually satisfactory as regards outside work performed outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

17.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the Electrical Trades Union. Provided that the Department shall be under no obligation to communicate with the Union officers to ascertain whether a member is financial.

18.—Right of Entry.

On notifying the officer in charge, any officer of the Union, authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such Union, shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours, wherein members of such Union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the workers in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

19.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There shall be assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

20.—Allowances, Special Provisions, Etc.

(a) Allowances.

A tradesman (not employed as a first-class welder) who, in addition to his employment as such, is also required to do welding, shall be entitled to receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged.

(b) Protective Equipment.

Suitable rubber mats or other protective and highly insulated material to stand on shall be provided by the employer for the use of workers engaged upon work in the workshop on apparatus supplied with a voltage exceeding one hundred and ten (110) volts.

21.—Notice Boards.

A notice board shall be provided by the employer on all jobs where, in the opinion of the officer in charge, it is considered that notices are essential to meet the convenience of the Union.

22.—Long Service Leave.

Workers shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with the conditions authorised from time to time by the Government of Western Australia for full-time wages employees.

Such leave shall at all times be taken at the convenience of the employer.

23.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Union.

24.—Testing Equipment.

The employer shall supply all necessary testing equipment and parts for the repair of same.

25.—Wages.

The minimum rates payable to workers shall be in accordance with the First Schedule hereinafter appearing.

The apprenticeship regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 and gazetted on the 6th November, 1953, shall apply to all apprenticeships under this Award, except in so far as the same are modified by the provisions of clause 12 of this Award and except for the further following modifications, viz.:-

Delete Regulation 36 and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

Lost Time.

36. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this Award, provided—

- (a) a payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;
- (b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four (4) consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a

medical certificate and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven (7) days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost, if any, of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer;

- (c) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

THE Conciliation Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties.

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Glass Trades Award" and replaces Awards numbered 15 of 1946 (as amended) and 15A of 1946 (as amended).

3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division except such portions thereof as are comprised within premises occupied by or worked in conjunction with the Railway Department or the Midland Railway Company.

4.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all employers in the industries carried on by the applicants in respect of workers coming within the classifications set out in clause 31 hereof and of apprentices in the trades to which apprenticeship is provided,

5.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Contract of Service.

The contract of hiring of every worker other than a casual worker or apprentice, shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the day, terminable by one day's notice which shall be given by the employer or the worker as the case may be. Failure to give such notice shall mean that the employer shall be liable to the payment of or the worker to the forfeiture of one day's wages in lieu of such notice. Provided that no notice shall be given which will terminate the employment on the working day preceding a holiday.

7.—Hours.

Subject as hereinafter provided, the ordinary hours of work shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours daily, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive. No alterations of the starting and finishing times shall be introduced until seven (7) days shall have elapsed after notification of such alteration has been confirmed in writing to the Union.

8.—Overtime.

(a) Payment for overtime shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter until the usual time of starting on the next ordinary working day.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained herein—

(i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime and such worker shall work the overtime in accordance with such requirement;

(ii) no organisation party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(c) In no case shall junior workers be employed on overtime, unless the proportion of adult workers to juniors as provided in this Award is maintained whilst such overtime is worked.

(d) All work performed on a Saturday afternoon, Sunday or any of the public holidays prescribed in clause 10 hereof shall be paid for at double rates.

9.—Meal Money.

A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

10.—Holidays.

Subject to clause 13 hereof the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day,

On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

11.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) Subject to subclause (f) of this clause such leave shall be granted at Christmas and notice in writing shall be given to the Union by representatives of the employers not later than three (3) months before Christmas, showing the date on which the factories shall close down for the annual leave.

(c) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(d) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

(f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled (subject to subclause (d) of this clause) to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

(g) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

12.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted to workers under this Award in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the order the Court made on the first day of April, 1958, as if the provision of that order were specifically included herein.

13.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provision of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only or less, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

14.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his usual rate shall be paid, whilst engaged on such work, at the rate prescribed therefor: Provided that, where no record of such work is kept the worker shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the day on which the work was performed.

15.—Casual Workers.

Any worker employed for less than one week, unless dismissed for inefficiency or leaves of his own accord, shall be deemed to be a casual worker, and shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rate prescribed by this Award for the time so employed.

16.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Leading Hands.

In addition to the margins prescribed in Clause 31 of this Award, leading hands shall be paid fifteen shillings (15s.) per week if in charge of not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers.

18.—Junior Workers.

(a) Junior workers, other than apprentices, shall be employed solely on labouring work and/or in the cementing of leadlights and shall not be employed on work usually performed by journeymen and/or apprentices.

(b) Male junior labourers shall be allowed in the following proportions:—

Junior Labourers to Tradesmen and Apprentices—	
1 to 1.	
2 to 3.	
3 to 5.	
4 to 7.	
5 to 9, etc.	

19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers shall furnish to the employer a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional pay in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate. If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age either verbally to the employer or in the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

20.—Apprentices.

(a) The term of apprenticeship shall be five (5) years.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be one (1) apprentice to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen in that branch, provided that the fraction shall not be less than one.

(c) Apprentices shall be taken to the following trades:—

- Drawing and/or designing.
- Sandblasting.
- Leadlight glazing.
- Glass bevelling.
- Glass silvering.

21.—Protective Clothing.

Where wet processes are employed, protective aprons and footwear shall if necessary be provided by the employer. Any dispute on this provision shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

22.—Provision of Appliances.

The employer shall provide the following tools or articles required on the jobs: Soldering irons, glass cutters and any machines required for the purpose of carrying out the work covered by this Award.

The employer shall provide boiling water for the mid-day meal.

23.—Clock.

One reliable clock shall be installed in each factory, and the starting and finishing times of workers shall be taken from that clock.

24.—Posting of Union Notices.

The accredited Union representative shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award, or any notice of the Union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notices shall be posted. Any such notice shall be submitted to the employer for approval before being posted.

25.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages record or records wherein shall be entered—

- (i) the name of each worker;
- (ii) the nature of his employment;
- (iii) the time he commences and finishes work each day;
- (iv) the total hours worked each day and each week;
- (v) the wages (and overtime, if any) received therefor;
- (vi) the ages of junior workers.

(b) Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this clause, to the extent of the information recorded.

(c) Such record shall be entered up each day in legible English characters, and shall be signed weekly only if correct by each worker.

(d) The record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the ordinary office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

26.—Interviewing Workers.

The secretary or any duly authorised representative of the Union shall not be prevented from visiting or conversing with the members of the Union on any job or in any shop during meal hours. The secretary or any duly authorised representative shall have the right to visit and inspect any factory or works or any part thereof during the time that work is being carried on outside the ordinary working hours, and to interview workers therein. The employer shall provide all necessary facilities to assist the secretary or representative in carrying this power into effect.

27.—Country Work and Travelling Time.

(a) When a worker is engaged in outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance, at current rates, shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return home each night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside the ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when travelling by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in any twenty-four (24) hour period.

(d) Where in the service of the employer the worker provides his own means of transport, the employer shall allow to such worker the ordinary train, tram, ferry or char-a-banc fare which would otherwise be paid by him.

28.—Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union, or the Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or because of any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

29.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of—

(a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

(b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

30.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All ordinary weekly wages shall be paid in cash, on or before Friday in each week, and shall be paid within ten (10) minutes of the usual time for finishing work.

(b) Except as provided in subclause (d) hereof, when the engagement of a worker is terminated, he shall be paid all wages and holiday pay due to him within ten (10) minutes of the expiration of the engagement.

(c) When the engagement of a worker is terminated for misconduct, he shall be paid all wages and holiday pay due to him within two (2) hours of the termination of his engagement.

31.—Wages.

32.—Definitions.

“Drawer and designer” shall mean a worker substantially engaged in the preparation in any manner of—

(a) designs for leadlight and/or zinlight and/or copperlight panels, windows or other glass work; or

(b) designs for panels, windows or other glass work (including any of its kindred products) which is to be sandblasted.

and who may be called upon to prepare masks and sandblast in connection with any of the foregoing, but shall not apply to any work performed by a signwriter as defined by Award No. 74 of 1951.

“Glass bevelling” shall mean and include all processes of glass grinding and/or polishing, including brilliant cutting but shall not include sandblasting.

“Glass silvering” shall mean the preparing of glass for silvering, silvering and application of protective coating.

“Leadlight glazier” shall mean a worker engaged in the making of leaded or zinc or copper light panels and windows and shall include the cutting of all glass or kindred products for such work.

“Glass sandblaster” shall mean a worker engaged in the making and/or cutting of masks or stencils for glass (or any of its kindred products) which is to be sandblasted and sandblasts same, but does not include a worker engaged as a “drawer and designer” who also performs the work hereinbefore referred to in this paragraph.
