

GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS ACT, 1904-1957.

Government Railways Commission, Perth, 5th November, 1958.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the by-laws made by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission pursuant to the Government Railways Act, 1904-1957, and set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

- 1. By-law No. 54 made pursuant to the Government Railways Act, 1904 (as amended), and published in the Government Gazette on the 14th May, 1940, as amended by the amendments thereto published in the Government Gazette from time to time thereafter, is in these by-laws referred to as the principal by-law.
- Rule 1 of the principal by-law is amended by inserting the following new paragraphs:-
 - (j) "Train engine" means an engine which works a train, and in the case of a double-headed train, the leading engine on the train.
 - (k) "Assisting engine" means, in the case of a double-headed train, the engine (other than the train engine) on the train.
 - (1) "Bank engine" means an engine attached at the rear of a train to assist the train engine. (When specially authorised by the Chief Traffic Manager the bank engine may be placed in the middle of the train. middle of the train.)
- 3. Paragraph (b) of Rule 56 of the principal by-law is amended by inserting after the second paragraph under the heading "Single Aspect Shunting Signals" a paragraph as follows:-

When a single aspect shunting signal is placed on the same post as a semi-automatic signal which controls the entrance to a section worked under single line automatic signal conditions, the shunting signal does not authorise a movement along the main line into such section, but applies only to a route which diverges from such main line within the home signal.

- 4. Rule 61 of the principal by-law is amended-
 - (a) by adding after subparagraph (2) of paragraph (d) a subparagraph as follows:-
 - (3) When a shunting signal is provided the provisions of paragraph (b) of Rule 56 apply. ; and
 - (b) by adding after subparagraph (3) of paragraph (e) a subpara
 - graph as follows:—

 (4) When a shunting signal is provided the provisions of paragraph (b) of Rule 56 apply.
- 5. Regulation 4 of Appendix III to the principal by-law is amended by deleting paragraphs (e) and (f) and by inserting in lieu new paragraphs (e), (f) and (g) as follows:-
 - (e) When two or more engines are attached to the head of a train, the driver of the leading engine, unless there are local rules to the contrary, is responsible for the observance of signals and the working of the continuous brake. The driver of the second engine working of the continuous brake. The driver of the second engine (or assisting engines) must watch for, and take his signals from the driver of the leading engine, but the driver of the second engine (or assisting engines) is not relieved from the due observance of all signals regulating the safe working of the line. The driver of the second engine (or assisting engines) shall, in case of emergency only, assist in stopping or reducing the speed of the train by applying the vacuum or hand brake as may be required, but he shall not maintain or recreate vacuum, i.e., the steam valves to his ejector shall be closed or all exhausters shut down.
 - (f) When a bank engine, or engines, are employed to bank a train, the drivers of those engines shall not interfere with the working of the vacuum brake, nor shall they maintain or recreate vacuum. The leading driver shall control the vacuum brake in the manner prescribed by paragraph (e) of this regulation except in cases of emergency which may not be apparent to the leading driver or drivers, or of a run back, when the rearmost banking engine driver shall be deemed to be, and be responsible as, the leading driver for the purposes of this regulation.
 - (g) When the engines of a double-headed train are required to perform shunting operations, and the engines remain attached together, the driver of the train engine shall control the brake irrespective of the direction of travel. This instruction shall not relieve the driver of the assisting engine of maintaining a proper look-out and applying the brake to bring the train to a stand in order to avoid mishap.
