WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, it is provided that the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any Crown Lands to be a reserve for natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that reserves for natives be declared at Mulga Queen: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the areas more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be reserves for natives.

Schedule.

Native Reserve No. 25058.

All that portion of land containing 50 acres, being rectangular in shape and measuring 20 chains north and 25 chains east and having at its centre Trigonometrical Station J.R. 57 (Mount Maiden).

Native Reserve No. 25059.

All that portion of land containing 249 acres 1 rood 14 perches, bounded by lines starting from the north-eastern corner of Mining Lease 1508 and extending 170 deg. 50 min. 50 chains along the eastern boundary of that lease and its prolongation; thence 265 deg. 0 min. 50 chains; thence 350 deg. 50 min. 50 chains; and then 85 deg. 0 min. to and along the northern boundary of Mining Lease 1508 aforesaid to the starting point.

Native Reserve No. 25060.

All that portion of land containing 180 acres 1 rood 7 perches, bounded by lines starting from the westernmost corner of Gold Mining Lease 1976 and extending 42 deg. 4 min. 40 chains along the north-western boundary of that lease and its prolongation; thence 157 deg. 43 min. 50 chains; thence 222 deg. 4 min. 40 chains; and thence 337 deg. 43 min., to and along the south-western boundary of Gold Mining Lease 1976 aforesaid to the starting point.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 6th day of November, 1958, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Health Act, 1911-1957.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 811/57.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Health Act, 1911-1957, that every municipal district shall be a health district within the meaning of the Act, and the municipal council shall be the local authority for such district; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 22 of the Act that the Governor may place any area of land outside a municipal district, and whether actually adjoining or not, under the jurisdiction of the council of such municipal district, for the purposes of the Act, and such area shall for all the purposes of the Act be deemed to be within the municipal district while so placed under that jurisdiction and the Governor may remove the area of land from that jurisdiction and from that district; and whereas by Orders in Council dated the 1st June, 1911, the 15th May, 1941, and the 4th December, 1953, made pursuant to the provisions of section 22 of the Act, certain areas of land, outside the Northam Municipal District were placed under the jurisdiction of the Northam Municipal Council; and whereas it is now deemed advisable and expedient that as from and including the 1st November, 1958, the land so placed under the jurisdiction of the Northam Municipal Council be removed therefrom and that the boundaries of the health district be coterminous with the boundaries of the municipal district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the Act, doth hereby remove from the jurisdiction of the Northam Municipal Council all of those areas of land placed under that jurisdiction by Orders in Council dated the 1st June, 1911, the 15th May, 1941, and the 4th December, 1953, as from and including the 1st November, 1958.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 4112/94, Vol. 2.—That reserve No. 22892 should vest in and be held by the Albany Road Board in trust for the purpose of Conservation of Flora.

Corr. No. 5856/52.—That Class "A" reserve No. 25113 should vest in and be held by the Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia in trust for the purpose of Conservation of Fauna.

Corr. No. 3536/57.—That reserve No. 25157 should vest in and be held by the Westonia Road Board in trust for the purpose of Sand and Gravel Pit.

Corr. No. 2577/58.—That reserve No. 25158 should vest in and be held by the Gnowangerup Road Board in trust for the purpose of Depot Site.

Corr. No. 2336/54.—That reserves Nos. 25159 and 25160 should vest in and be held by the Conservator of Forests in trust for Forestry Purposes.

Corr. No. 2907/58.—That reserve No. 25161 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Railways in trust for Railway Purposes.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 8965/96.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 7250, at Mulline, should vest in and be held by the Minister for Mines in trust for Battery Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Mines in trust for Battery Site with power to the said Minister for Mines to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Country Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1957, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Donnybrook Country Water Area as defined in the Schedule hereunder, and to assign the name of "Donnybrook Country Water Area" thereto.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 13th day of November, 1958.

Schedule.

Donnybrook Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the south-western corner of Wellington Location 3192, a point at the north-western corner of Donnybrook Townsite and extending easterly

along a northern boundary of that townsite to the junction of the northern side of Hamilton Street and the eastern side of Fowler Street; thence easterly about 164 chains to the northernmost corner of lot 354, a point on the townsite boundary aforesaid; thence generally easterly, southerly and westerly along that townsite boundary to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Wellington Location 1487; thence southerly 40 chains along that prolongation and western boundary; thence westerly to a point situate 40 chains in prolongation southerly of the southernmost western boundary of Donnybrook Townsite aforesaid; thence northerly along that prolongation to the south-western corner of the townsite; and thence generally northerly along that townsite boundary to the starting point; being the land delineated and bordered red on Department of Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan Number 230 and on Department of Public Works Plan P.W.D., W.A. 36472.

thence easterly along the northern boundary of that location and of locations 12158 to 12153 inclusive, 21303 and 12152 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence southerly, easterly and northerly along boundaries of location 12170 to its north-eastern corner and onwards along the eastern boundary of location 27029 to the south-western boundary of location 11357; thence south-easterly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the western corner of location 11159; thence east-south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation north-north-westerly of the eastern boundary of location 25439; thence south-south-easterly to and along that boundary and onwards generally south-south-easterly and southerly along eastern boundaries of locations 23000, 12193 and 12194 to the south-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location and that of location 12195 to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 12187; thence southerly and westerly to and along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of location 16647; thence southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the northern boundary of location 19263; thence westerly, southerly, easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that location to the north-western corner of location 22090; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards along southern boundaries of locations 19263 aforesaid and 22940 and onwards to the western boundary of location 19232; thence southerly along that boundary to the southern corner of that location; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of location 19156 and onwards to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 11392; thence easterly and southerly to and along the northern and eastern boundaries of that location and onwards along the eastern boundary of location 11397 to the north-eastern corner of location 9911; thence southerly, westerly, again southerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the north-western corner of location 10507; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 15614; thence southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the northern side of the Great Eastern Railway Reserve; thence generally south-westerly and generally westerly along that side to the eastern boundary of Baandee Townsite; thence southerly, westerly and generally northerly along boundaries of that townsite to the southern side of the Great Eastern Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence generally westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 13218; thence generally southerly to and along that boundary and eastern boundaries of locations 10716, 13230, 13209, 13221, 13311, 10722, 18937, 18936, 10744, 10745, 26671 (reserve 21196) and again 10745 and onwards to the northern boundary of location 8509; thence easterly, southerly, again easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the north-eastern corner of location 15303; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location and of locations 15302, 15301, 25538 and 15300 and onwards to the easternmost north-eastern corner of location 17436; thence westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards generally westerly along northern boundaries of Kwolyin Agricultural Area Lots 13, 12, 310, 11, Avon Locations 8690 and 8688 to the north-eastern corner of 8689; thence westerly and south-westerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of location 7679; thence westerly and southerly to and along boundaries of that location to the northernmost north-eastern corner of location 8687; thence westerly and south-south-easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of Kwolyin Agricultural Area Lot 90; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the northern

19875; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location and northerly along the eastern boundary of location 11509 and onwards to the south-western boundary of location 24165; thence north-westerly along that boundary and a south-western boundary of location 19292 to the westernmost south-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location to the southern side of road number 4974; thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 11506; and thence northerly to and along that boundary and the eastern boundary of location 11490 and onwards to the starting point. - (3) clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof;
- (4) clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof;

subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

1. (a) In subclause (c)—

1. General Engineering Section: Delete classification and margin of motor machanic and insert in lieu:—

(b) Delete subclauses (i), (j) and (l) and insert in lieu:—

(i) Dirt Money—Threepence (3d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when engaged on work of an unusually dirty nature, where clothes are necessarily unduly soiled or injured or boots are unduly injured by the nature of the work done.

(j) Confined Space—Eightpence (8d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when working in "confined space" which means:—A compartment or space the dimensions of which necessitate a worker working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position, or without proper ventilation.

(l) Height Money—Workers engaged in the erection of steel frame buildings, bridges and gasometers at a height of fifty feet (50 ft.) or more above the nearest horizontal plane shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per day extra.

(c) Add a new subclause—

(m) A fitter or other tradesman, not specially employed as a welder, who, in addition to his employment as such is also required to do welding, shall be entitled to receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day extra whilst so employed.

Clause 8.—Hours.

2. Delete this clause and insert in lieu:—

(a) (i) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week.

(ii) Except as provided elsewhere, such hours shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day to be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five days of the week excluding Sunday and between 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. on the

weekly half holiday. Provided that the said forty (40) hours may be worked in five (5) days from Monday to Friday inclusive, at the option of the employer.

- (iii) Within a radius of 25 miles from the Post Office, Kalgoorlie, such hours shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day, Monday to Friday inclusive, and shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. Provided that in the case of workers employed under this Award who are required to do maintenance work in establishments lawfully carrying on business on Saturdays and workers employed on refrigeration work during the period December to March (inclusive), the weekly hours may be worked from Monday to Saturday noon inclusive.
- (iv) In the case of continuous and/or shift workers the provisions of this subclause shall be deemed to have been complied with, if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty (80) hours per fortnight, to be worked in shifts of eight hours each, including crib time.
- (b) Lunch hour shall not exceed one (1) hour.
- (c) Workers working underground shall work the hours provided in Award No. 11 of 1946, as amended or replaced from time to time, for underground workers.
- (d) By agreement between an employer and the Union, the hours of work may in this case be worked under a roster, which shall provide for an average of forty (40) hours per week, spread over a period of three (3) weeks.

Clause 9.—Overtime.

3. Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

- (a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Repairs to the machinery of the employer which is broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, shall be paid for at time and a half for Sundays and holidays. When such work is performed on Saturdays outside ordinary working hours time and a half shall be paid.
- (c) Work done on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in subclause 10 (a) or subclause 10 (j) (i) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time: Provided that by agreement between the employer and the worker, payment for work done on any of the holidays referred to in subclause 10 (a) hereof, except Christmas Day, may be made at ordinary rates and a period equivalent to the time so worked shall be added to the worker's entitlement to annual leave. With respect to workers under this award working more than one shift any worker whose ordinary rotation shift falls on a Sunday or on any of the prescribed holidays shall be paid for such shift at the rate of time and a half.
- (d) Work performed on the day upon which the weekly half holiday falls by workers whose ordinary working hours are worked in five (5) days shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (e) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the premises he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (f) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour or (in the case of a day worker) after 5.30 p.m., whichever is the later, he shall be provided with

any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

- (g) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time that he holds himself in readiness
- (h) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.
- (i) When computing overtime, any district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.
- (j) When overtime work is necessary, it shall, whenever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

Where a worker (other than a casual worker) has not had at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between his usual finishing time on one day and his usual starting time on the next day, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (i) He shall, if he so desires, be entitled to have eight (8) consecutive hours off duty from the completion of his overtime work until he next commences work, but shall not be paid for such time off duty.
- (ii) If on the instructions of the employer, he continues/or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without having such eight (8) hours break, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the balance of the hours less than eight (8) which he has not had off duty. Hours of overtime actually worked since his last usual finishing time, shall be counted in computing the actual rate of overtime under this paragraph.
- (iii) If a worker, of his own volition, continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without such break, he shall be paid at ordinary rates.
- (k) (a) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (b) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

Clause 13.—Absence Through Sickness.

4. Add to this clause a new subclause as follows:—

- (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

Clause 14.—Shifts.

5. Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

- (a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one (1) week on day shift out of each consecutive three (3) weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter. Provided that if he is required to work for more than one (1) week consecutively on afternoon shift, or for more than one (1) week consecutively on night shift, such a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second and subsequent weeks of afternoon shift or of night shift.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers to whom this subclause would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to a private arrangement with another worker, nor to workers (known as "rostered relief workers") regularly employed on continuous process work who are required to work shifts to enable other workers engaged on such work to change shifts weekly and to have their days off, if such rostered relief worker is not required to work more night shifts or more afternoon shifts than the number of day shifts worked by him.
- (b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift five per cent. (5%) and for night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (c) (i) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.
- (ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.
- (d) (i) A worker who replaces a regular shift worker who is absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive shifts (other than day shift) and the appropriate shift work rate if he works five (5) or more of such shifts consecutively.
- (ii) A worker who replaces on afternoon or night shift a regular shift worker who is absent by reason of a direction of the employer shall be paid at overtime rates unless he works the number of consecutive shifts prescribed in the next preceding paragraph.
- (iii) The sequence of consecutive shifts shall not be deemed to be broken under paragraph (i) by reason of rostered days off in respect to workers employed on continuous process work or by a Saturday or Sunday in respect to other workers or by any public holiday or any other reason beyond the control of the employer.
- (iv) A worker who does not work five (5) consecutive shifts for any reason beyond the control of the employer shall not be entitled to payment under the provisions of this subclause.

Liberty to Apply.

6. Liberty to apply is hereby granted to the applicants in respect to Clause 6, Wages Relating to the Marginal Rate for Linesmen, and in respect to Clause 10, Holidays, and to the respondents in respect to the Award generally.

7. These alterations will take effect as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

Schedule.

Add a new clause as follows:—

30.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

(a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;

(b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of 15 working days in any year of his employment;

(c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;

- (d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
- (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after 26th June, 1950.
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an award, industrial agreement, order or determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed 13 weeks' leave;

- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall, subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award but in the case of casuals and part time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of sub-clause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to off-set any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall, during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of long service leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.
