Resolved that the Perth Road Board in pur-suance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1957, prepared the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the road district of Perth and enclosed within the inner edge of a blue border on the plans now produced to the Perth Road Board, and marked and certified by the Secretary to the Road Board, under his hand, dated the 5th day of August, 1958, as Plan No. 1 and Plan No. 2.

Details of Scheme No. 6.

- 1. Area: This Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the blue border on the Scheme plans numbered No. 1 and No. 2.
- General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are to improve and develop the area to the best possible advantage and to secure suitable provision for traffic for residences and of land for building purposes and for drainage purposes.
- 3. Acquisition of Land: Such of the land in the area of the Scheme as is not now the property of the Board shall be resumed or otherwise acquired for the purposes of this Scheme.
- 4. Resurvey of Area: The area shall be resurveyed in order to improve and develop the area, to make provision for new lots and setting aside land for roads drainage reserves and easements.
- 5. Works to be Carried Out: The new roads will be constructed and drained.
- 6. Re-allocation of Lots: The lots created by the re-survey of the area will be dealt with as follows:-
 - (a) Owners of lots which due to size were incapable of subdivision will be offered one new lot.
 - (b) Owners of lots which were capable of subdivision will be offered two new lots for every such lot owned by them.
 - (c) The remaining lots will be treated as surplus lots. Each owner will be offered a lot or lots in the new subdivision as nearly as may be in the position of the land resumed from him and where possible having the same amenities of view, corner position and the like. 2A.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be one (1) year from the commencement of the first pay period beginning after the date of the delivery of the Award (delivered the 23rd day of December, 1947).

3.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all mental nurses who are employed in any Government Hospital, Mental Ward, or Home for Mental Cases in Western Aus-tralia which is within the jurisdiction and/or under the control of the Inspector General, Mental Health Services, but does not apply to the Hospital known as "Lemnos," which is exempted from the provisions of this Award of this Award.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Mental Nurse" means a person employed by the employer engaged in nursing, caring for, and/or working with mentally ill patients and who holds, or is in course of training for, a mental nursing certificate.

(b) "Charge Nurse" means the person who is appointed, subject to the provisions of the Pro-motions Appeal Board Act, to be in charge of any ward or wards containing mental patients.

(c) "Roundsman" or "Rounds Nurse" is a person who makes an inspection of the various wards between the hours of 8.15 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. and is the responsible person in charge, and who performs all duties as set out by the employer.

(d) "Ward" means a collection of rooms set aside for the accommodation of mental patients, and which contain the necessary requirements for the care and supervision of such patients.

5.—Hours.

(a) (i) The ordinary working hours for mental nurses employed at "Greenplace" and Female Ward 7 at Claremont, shall be forty-four (44) per week.

(ii) These nurses shall be paid an allowance of (h) These nurses shall be paid an allowance of thirty shillings (30s.) per week in consideration of time of duty in excess of forty (40) hours per week including call duty outside the ordinary hours prescribed in paragraph (i) hereof; provided that when a nurse at "Greeenplace" is called upon to relieve the cook outside her rostered hours of duty, curve the cook outside her rostered hours of duty, overtime rates shall be paid, but the allowance prescribed in this paragraph shall not be included in the calculation of such overtime.

(b) The ordinary working hours for mental nurses employed at Whitby, shall be one hundred and sixty (160) in each four (4) weekly period, to be worked in twenty (20) or twenty-two (22) shifts at the option of the employer.

(c) (i) Subject to the preceding provisions of this clause, the ordinary working hours shall be eighty (80) per fortnight to be worked in ten (10) or eleven (11) shifts at the option of the employer.

(ii) Where ten (10) shifts are worked, the workers concerned shall have two full days off duty in each week and where eleven (11) shifts are worked, the workers concerned shall have one and two days respectively off duty in each alternate week.

6.—Overtime.

(a) (i) All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours as rostered for any one shift shall be classed as overtime.

(ii) All overtime worked on any day other than a Sunday shall be paid for at one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the ordinary rate for the first four hours, and at double the ordinary rate thereafter.

(iii) All overtime worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double the ordinary rate.

(iv) Week-end penalty rates shall not be deemed to be part of the ordinary rate for the calculation of overtime.

(b) The preceding provisions of this clause shall not apply to workers at Greenplace or in Female Ward 7 at Claremont.

(c) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way whether directly or indirectly be party to or concerned in any ban, limitaion or restriction upon the working of over-time in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

(d) Where a worker is required to work overtime for a period of at least two (2) hours in excess of the rostered daily hours, without being informed before booking off on the previous day, he or she shall be provided with a meal free of cost.

(e) A worker who has completed his rostered hours of duty and has left the job, and who is recalled to work, shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(f) A worker who reports for duty at the rostered time and who is then advised that the commencing time for such duty has been altered since he was last on duty, shall be paid a minmum of two (2) hours at ordinary rates, but this shall not apply to a worker who has been absent from duty on his last previous rostered shift.

7.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of four (4) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, shall be allowed annually to all workers after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the employer.

(b) If any of the holidays prescribed in clause 8 of this Award fall within a worker's period of annual leave, there shall be added to that period one (1) day with pay in respect of each such holiday.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with the employer.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) "Ordinary Wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

8.—Public Holidays.

(a) Subject to the provisions of this clause, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) (i) If any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day, and the worker is not required on that day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on that day if it had not been a holiday.

(ii) If any holiday falls on a worker's rostered day off duty, that worker shall be granted a day off with pay at some subsequent date, or an additional day's pay, at the discretion of the employer, but where practicable, the day off with pay shall be allowed.

(iii) If any worker is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be taken at some subsequent date or to be added to his annual leave.

(c) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(d) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

9.-General Conditions.

(a) While present conditions as to the number and class of patients continue there shall be two (2) nurses on night duty in the following Wards at Claremont Hospital: No. 1 Hospital, Male Ward 3, No. 2 Male Ward, No. 4 Male Ward.

(b) Every nurse shall be given the opportunity of acquiring by experience a thorough knowledge of all practical work. He or she shall be under the supervision of the respective Charge Nurse, whose duty it will be to see that he or she is properly instructed in the practical work.

(c) Wherever possible or practicable, no male mental nurse shall be required to work under the orders and directions of a female mental nurse of junior status to him.

(d) No male nurse shall take charge in any ward in any Mental Hospital, Mental Observation Ward, or Receiving Home for mental cases unless he possesses a mental nursing certificate. The same provision shall apply to female nurses when the qualifications, experience and numbers on the staff will permit.

(e) Rosters shall be for fortnightly periods except in the case of workers at Whitby, where rosters shall be for four-weekly periods.

(f) A telephone shall be provided for the use of residential nurses and staff. The use of this shall be subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary by the employer.

(g) Not less than thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed for a meal.

10-Contract of Service.

Subject to section 187 (a) of the Luncy Act, 15 of 1903, as amended, and to regulations made thereunder:----

- (a) No worker shall be dismissed unless he or she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice of his or her dismissal, or pay for such period in lieu thereof.
- (b) No worker shall, without the consent of the employer, resign without first having given fourteen (14) days' previous notice of his or her intention to do so, and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold holiday or other pay to the amount of 14 days' wages.
- (c) The employer may, at any time without prior notice, dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if after receiving the notice prescribed in subclause (a) hereof the worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

11.-Sick Leave.

(a) (i) Subject as hereinafter provided, sick leave shall be granted on the basis of ten (10) working days on full pay for each year of service.

(ii) If, in any calendar year any absence through sickness exceeds the worker's current entitlement, and by service subsequent to the sickness the worker becomes entitled to further sick leave with pay, payment may be adjusted at the end of that calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, whichever is the sooner.

(iii) Any unused portion of the sick leave herein prescribed up to a maximum of seven (7) working days in each year shall be allowed to accumulate and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(b) Workers in the employment at the commencement of this clause, shall be allowed an initial credit on the following basis:---

- (i) Where continuous service exceeds three (3) years—forty-five (45) working days less any sick leave taken during the preceding triennial period.
- (ii) Where continuous service is less than three (3) years—an amount calculated on the entitlement provided for in subclause (a) hereto, less any sick leave taken from the commencement of service to the date this amendment comes into force.

[15 May, 1959.

(c) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate, provided that if in any case it is not convenient for the worker to obtain a medical certificate, sick leave may be granted on other evidence satisfactory to the employer, but such leave shall be limited to two (2) consecutive days in any one period and a total of three days in any calendar year.

(d) (i) The maximum period of sick leave allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed six months.

(ii) A worker who has been granted six months' continuous sick leave with pay shall not be entitled to receive further sick leave with pay until a period on duty of not less than four weeks has been completed.

(e) Any period during which a worker is absent on leave without pay shall not be included as part of such worker's period of continuous service for the purpose of this clause.

(f) A worker who is absent on approved annual leave, long service leave, or leave without pay, shall not be eligible for leave under this clause during the currency of such approved leave.

(g) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

12.-Travelling Time.

(a) A worker when travelling on duty away from his or her own home station or headquarters shall not by reason of such travelling suffer any interruption of the continuity of his or her pay for ordinary working hours in each day, but no overtime shall be allowed for time occupied in travelling.

(b) Where a worker is rostered for duty at a hospital other than his or her home station for a period of less than three (3) months, reasonable travelling time shall be allowed for the journey one way at ordinary rates of pay and such reasonable excess daily travelling costs between his or her place of residence or home station, as may be determined by the employer, and the place of employment. The words "excess daily travelling costs," for the purpose of this subclause shall mean the amount by which the cost of travelling to and from the place of employment exceeds the sum (if any) which the worker may ordinarily pay in travelling each day between his or her place of residence and his or her home station (including the return journey.)

13.—Travelling Allowance.

(a) Workers when travelling on duty outside the metropolitan area shall be re-imbursed the actual and reasonable cost incurred in such travelling. The costs of such travelling shall be computed from the time the worker leaves his headquarters or home. The cost of breakfast, lunch, dinner or bed will not be re-imbursed if the worker leaves headquarters or home after or returns before 8 a.m., 1 p.m. or 6 p.m. and midnight.

(b) If any worker, except at his own request, or on account of misconduct, is required by the employer to transfer to any station other than his home station, he shall be paid the actual reasonable cost of the removal of his household effects, unless the employer undertakes the removal.

14.—Night Duty.

Prior to going on night duty a nurse shall, wherever practicable, come off duty at 4 p.m. and go on at 11.30 p.m. the same night, provided that night duty is not to be preceded or succeeded by duty commencing after 12.30 p.m.

15.—Post Mortem Attendance.

A nurse and his assistant, carrying out mortuary duties in connection with post mortem examinations, shall be paid an allowance of fifteen shillings (15s.) and ten shillings (10s.) respectively per body.

16.-Charges Against Workers.

If a worker is formally charged under section 187a of the Lunacy Act, 1903, with an offence he shall be given at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing prior to the hearing in which to prepare his defence; but this shall not prejudice the power under the Act of immediate suspension. The said period of twenty-four (24) hours may be decreased upon the written request of the person charged.

17.—Uniforms.

(a) A first issue of uniforms for male nurses shall be supplied within three (3) months of being appointed, and thereafter they shall receive issues of uniforms once in every twelve (12) months.

(b) Raincoats, helmets and hats shall be issued in accordance with regulations.

18.—Emergencies.

The Inspector General and the Medical Superintendent or whoever for the time being may be in charge of any Mental Hospital in W.A., may at his or her discretion take such measures as may in his or her opinion be necessary for the protection, safety, or welfare of the patients, the staff, or the institution, and all instructions issued in pursuance of such special measures shall promptly and faithfully be carried out by all members of the staff to whom such instructions may be issued, and this shall be done without regard to whether or not such instructions may be in accordance with this Award.

19.—Higher Duties.

A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum rate than his regular rate of pay for a period of more than four (4) hours in the shift, shall be paid the higher minimum for the time engaged on such work.

20.-Old and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the wages awarded herein may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon between the union and the employer or his representative, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon such wage as shall be fixed by the Board of Reference upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Board upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Board's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Board shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the rate shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, in writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union

(c) Payment of increases in the rates for trainees prescribed for the second and third years of service shall be contingent on the examination required by the regulations being passed and their having completed 12 months' service at the rates of pay for trainees in respect of the first and second years of service respectively: Provided that should a trainee fail in his or her examination and later pass the examination the increase shall be payable from the date of the passing of the examination and subsequent increases in Grade II, shall, provided the trainee passes all subsequent examina-tions, be payable after he or she has completed each successive period of 12 months' service thereafter.

(d) A trainee shall be promoted from Grade II, to Grade I, when three (3) years of service are completed, and all examinations have been passed: Provided-

- (i) that where the third year examination is that where the third year examination is passed subsequent to the completion of three years' service, and all previous examinations have been passed, service in Grade I shall be deemed to commence and pay within such grade shall accrue as from the completion of the third year of service; and
- (ii) that where a trainee fails in any one examination, service in Grade I shall be deemed to commence and pay within such grade shall accrue only from the date of passing the third year examination.

(e) (i) Where board and lodging is provided for workers a charge of thirty-three and one-third per cent. $(33\frac{1}{2}\%)$ of the female basic wage shall be made therefor.

(ii) In all cases the ratio of the value of board to that of lodging in the charge for board and lodging shall be two to one.

(iii) Where the workers are provided with meals by the employer a deduction shall be made at the rate of one twenty-first (1/21st) of the value of board for each meal provided.

(f) An allowance of six shillings (6s.) per shift shall be paid to each Rounds nurse in the Main Block and at Heathcote, and an allowance of five shillings (5s.) to each Rounds nurse in X Block, between 8.15 p.m. and 7.30 a.m.

(g) An allowance of three shillings (3s.) per shift shall be paid to nurses who, at 4 p.m., take charge of all wards (excluding Male Ward 6), but this allowance shall not be cumulative on the allowance prescribed in subclause (f) hereof.

(h) Nurses in charge of Male Ward 6 at the Claremont Mental Hospital shall be paid an allow-ance of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week for additional responsibility.

22.—Penalty Rates.

(a) Workers whose ordinary rostered hours of work include work on Saturday and/or Sunday, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for ordinary hours worked between midnight Friday and midnight Saturday, and at the rate of time and a half for ordinary hours worked between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday.

(b) Workers who are rostered for night shift between midnight Sunday and midnight Friday, shall be paid five per cent (5%) of the ordinary rate in addition to the ordinary rate for each such shift worked.

23.-Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There shall be assigned to such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

24.—Union Secretary.

The Union secretary shall at all reasonable hours have access to various Institutions covered by this Award, for the collection of dues and to see that the various clauses of the Award are being observed.

He shall not enter any ward without the per-mission of the Medical Officer in Charge. He shall not interfere or interrupt a worker in the course of his or her duty. The Medical Officer in Charge shall determine whether workers are being inter-fered with or interrupted in their work.
