Governor of Western Australia: WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom con-stituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Govern-ment or from the State, he may in every such case, by and instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be speci-fied; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the seat of Government: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you, the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer, as from the date of my departure upon the said absence, to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior to notification of its making being published in the Government Gazette been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

## No. 2 of 1959.

# Registered 6th May, 1959.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 1st day of May, 1959, between W.A. Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and Derby Meat Processing Co. Ltd. (hereinafter called "the Management") of the other part witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows: follows:-

## 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Derby Meat Processing Agreement.

#### 3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply in respect of the rates of wages and conditions at the Derby Meat Processing Co. Ltd.

## 4.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of twelve (12) months from the date hereof.

#### 5.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the meanings respectively set out against them, that is to say:—

- (a) "Week Days" Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- (b) "A Week" shall mean Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (c) "A Day's Work" shall mean eight hours on week days Monday to Friday.(d) "Mutually Agreed" or "Mutual Arrange-
- ment" implies agreed between the Management of the works and the Union or its representatives in writing.
- (e) "Shift Work" shall mean work done in time preceding, during and following ordi-nary working hours by separate relays of employees.

## 6.—General Conditions.

(a) Clauses under this heading are to be operative except where otherwise provided herein.

(b) Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher rate than the rate pertaining to his re-cognised task shall be paid for that day at the highest rate of such tasks.

(c) Wages shall be paid in accordance with ar-rangement arrived at between the Management and the workers in accordance with subclause (d) of clause 5.

(d) The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on

behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. Overtime shall be distributed on a roster system, but any employees shall have the right to forgo his place on the roster except for work in his own department, if required by the Management for work in that department. In all cases of overtime sufficient men for the job required must be supplied.

(e) Employees engaged to live on works shall be provided without charge, with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose including stretcher, mattress and pillow.

(f) All delegates shall be officially recognised by Management.

(g) Notwithstanding that the rates of pay are set forth on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Management or the employees to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee was employed at a daily wage.

(h) The employment and rates of pay of boys shall be a matter of mutual arrangement.

(i) Each employee who boards at the work canteen shall have an amount equal to twenty-seven per cent. (27%) of the district basic wage deducted from his wages weekly.

(j) Shifts of eight hours may be worked in departments where operations are continuous or where they require attention for more than 12 hours in the 24.

(k) One clear day (not including the date of arrival) shall elapse between the date of arrival of seasonal operatives and the date of commencement of operations.

(1) Waiting time allowance as defined in clause 18 shall be paid for the day after the day of the arrival of seasonal operatives.

(m) All employees, including season operatives shall if so required by the Management do any work other than that they were engaged to perform that is available between the date of arrival of seasonal operatives and the date fixed for the commencement of operations as determined by clause 21 (a) hereof.

(n) For the purpose of this clause. seasonal operatives shall be defined as those Australasian Meat Industry Employees who customarily reach Derby by plane immediately preceding the commencement of operations.

#### 7.—Clothing.

(1) The Management agrees to supply each male employee with two (2) singlets or flannels and two pairs of shorts or long trousers and to each female employee two (2) uniforms and caps.

(2) Such clothing to be washed and kept in good repair by the employee.

(3) The employee shall report for work each day in a clean set of such clothing.

(4) If at any time the Management considers the clothing is no longer serviceable the employee shall purchase and wear replacements which shall be washed and worn in accordance with the above subclause.

(5) Protective boots, coats, gloves and aprons, shall be supplied by the Management to all workers who require them by the nature of their work, and same shall be replaced when required.

(6) A laundry equipped with a washing machine shall be provided by the Management.

#### 8.—Preference.

Preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to members of the Union who are parties to this Agreement provided they are competent workmen for the task for which they are selected and do their work to the satisfaction of the management.

Subject to preference to members of the Union who are parties to this Agreement, the Management shall have the right—

(a) to select employees with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks;

- (b) To allot to employees their respective tasks; to dispense with the services of any employee for incompetence, drunkenness, misconduct;
- (c) in the event of the work of an employee being unsatisfactory at a task to which he has been transferred the Management shall have the right to place such employee on waiting time in accordance with clause 18;
- (d) Employees engaged in Perth shall be selected from the lists supplied by the Union.

#### 9.—Transfer.

The Management may transfer employees from one department to another. In this case the rates payable shall be those specified for the task performed, subject to subclause (d) of general conditions. In the case of alleged unreasonableness, the local delegates can discuss with the Management.

## 10.—Hours of Labour.

Unless otherwise specifically mentioned forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work divided into five (5) working days as follows: Five (5) week days each eight (8) hours—40 hours.

Starting time shall be as mutually arranged between the Management and Union Representative at the commencement of season.

#### 11—Meal Times.

Meal times shall be as mutually arranged in accordance with clause 10 and all employees shall be entitled to a meal break for the midday meal of not less than one (1) hour.

#### 12.-Smokos.

Workers under this Agreement shall be allowed a smoko of 15 minutes each forenoon and a further smoko of 15 minutes each afternoon.

When reasonably required by the Management, owing to exigencies of work, employees shall forego their smoko until a convenient time.

## 13.—Overtime Rates.

Overtime shall be paid as follows:---

## (1) Day Workers.

(a) For all time within one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  hours before the worker's usual starting time, time and a half for the time worked within such one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  hour period.

(b) For all time worked after the worker's usual ceasing time to midnight, time and one half for the first four (4) hours and thereafter double time.

(c) For all time worked in the period commencing from midnight or commencing before one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  hours of the worker's usual starting time double time up to the worker's usual starting time.

(d) During meal hours and smokos, except as provided in Clause 12 double ordinary rates.

(e) For all work performed on Saturdays, time and one half or the first four (4) hours, thereafter double time with a minimum payment for two (2) hours.

#### (2) Slaughtermen.

(a) Slaughtermen when required to kill in excess of tally shall be paid rate and one half for such excess up to ordinary ceasing time Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) All work performed by slaughtermen after ordinary ceasing time Monday to Friday inclusive, shall be paid for at double rates.

(c) All work performed by slaughtermen on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays prescribed in clause 15 hereof shall be paid for at double rates to completion of tally and triple rates thereafter.

(d) Provided a slaughterman's labourer has cleaned up, and provided also that the day's tally has been done, he shall cease work with the slaughterman, but if called upon to work after the slaughterman has done his full tally, except for the purpose of cleaning up he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

In the event of any slaughterman or slaughtermen on whom a slaughterman's labourer is in attendance not doing his or their full tally, the labourer may, on the completion of the work, be employed at ordinary rates at other work on the floor for the time equivalent to the uncompleted portion of the tally.

## (3) Shift Workers.

(a) All time worked by shift workers in excess of the hours rostered in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at the rate of double time with a minimum for two (2) hours.

#### 14 .--- Minimum of Overtime.

Subject to any mutual arrangement, employees called back to work after meal time following ordinary ceasing tune shall be provided with a minimum period of two hours work, or shall be entitled to payment for such. Employees called out on Sundays or holidays shall be provided with a minimum period of two hours work or shall be entitled to payment for such minimum periods to be at overtime rates as appearing in clauses 13 be at overtime rates as appearing in clauses 13 and 15.

A worker required to work overtime before the usual starting time (clause 10) shall be entitled to a minimum payment for two hours at overtime rates.

## 15.-Holidays and Holiday Rates.

Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Satur-day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Derby Cup Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. Work performed on these days and on Sundays shall be paid for at double ordinary motor. double ordinary rates.

(c) In the case of workers working a five day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be at the rate pertaining to each employee's task.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to payment for such holidays for such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

#### 16.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ord-inary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker should have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each day observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when com-puting the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect and/or holidays; provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accidents sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(e) Annual leave must be granted not later than four (4) weeks after the leave falls due, and at least 14 days' notice shall be given to the worker of the date upon which he is to commence his annual leave.

(f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service. Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated leave or payment therefor.

(g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the employer of his right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.

(h) Workers regularly working for the manage-ment north of south latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two years, subject to the convenience of the management. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Perth during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in forward and return journey between the place of their employment and either of the said cities.

(i) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof shall mean the average rate of wage the worker has received over the period of his employment in respect of his ordinary hours of work.

(j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 17.—Travelling.

Each employee (except those engaged at Derby) shall be entitled to:

- (a) Passage from place of engagement Derby and travelling time allowance. to
- (b) Passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available plane at discretion of management from Derby to place of engagement after termination of work in his department; or when his services are not further required by the management; formed to the satisfaction of the management.
- (c) Any employee who leaves of his own accord or is dismissed under clause 8 (b) before the end of a fourteen (14) weeks' period from arrival at Derby, shall not be entitled to the payment of his fare to Derby and any wages due to him shall be retained as part payment and the balance will be legally recoverable.

Travelling time allowance referred to in subclause (a) hereof shall be at the task rate applicable.

## 18.—Waiting Time.

When no employment is available for an employee at his usual task such employee shall, if so required by the management, do any other work available and be paid whichever rate shall be the highest for the task performed or the recognised usual task.

If for any reason no employment is available to an employee, waiting time allowance of half his recognised task rate shall be paid for such waiting time in which case the minimum rate shall not apply to the period of such waiting time.

## 19.—Tallies.

(1) Slaughterman.—Fifty-six sheep or lambs shall constitute a day's tally for each slaughterman when a slaughterman's labourer is in attendance upon the slaughterman.

When no slaughterman's labourer is in attendance the tally per slaughterman shall be 37 sheep or lambs.

(2) Boner,--The following daily tally or the equivalent thereof per boner, shall be:--

Sheep 50 Carcases.

For the purpose of computing the daily tally and for work done in excess of the daily tally, the following subclauses shall apply:-

One carcase under 64 lb. shall equal one carcase.

One carcase over 64 lb. and under 90 lb. shall equal one and a half carcases. One carcase 90 lb. or over shall equal two car-

cases.

One ram shall equal two carcases. Four trunks shall equal three carcases. Three pairs of loins shall equal one carcase. Two pairs of hindquarters shall equal one carcase.

Two pairs of forequarters shall equal one carcase.

Four pairs of legs shall equal one carcase.

20.-Wages.

Subject to clauses 6 (b) and 9 the minimum weekly wage to be paid shall be as follows, calcu-lated on a basic wage of £13 11s. 6d. (males) and £8 16s. 6d. (females) per week.

Females shall not be permitted nor required to lift or carry by hand a cut or piece of meat in excess of 14 lb. in weight nor to lift or carry on trays an aggregate weight in excess of 35 lb.

#### 21.—Guarantee.

Subject to clause 8 (b) a guarantee of 14 weeks' work from date of commencement of slaughtering at Glenroy is given to each employee brought from Perth to Fremantle. The rates applicable under this guarantee shall be the rates for the respective tasks allotted.

(b) Every employee shall be engaged on the express condition that he will perform at least 14 weeks' work from such date of commencement and at the rates for the respective tasks allotted to him, and will continue to work for such additional period as in the opinion of the management is necessary to fulfil the season operations. This plause shell be decreated to have been complied with clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the worker has continued to work for a period of not less than four (4) weeks after last day of killing at Glenroy.

## 22.-First Aid.

It shall be obligatory upon the employer to keep at the works a first aid kit fully stocked in accord-ance with the provisions of the Australian Aerial Medical Service.

Liberty to apply to amend clause 6 (i) and clause 20 is reserved to either party after the Court of Arbitration has issued its decision in regard to Application 34/1959 (District Allowances).

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

# No. 7 of 1959.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Western Aus-Applicant, and the Minister for Agriculture and the Minister for Education, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner; and whereas the parties subsequently met and con-ferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling hin, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court of the Court.

# Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

#### 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as "The State Re-search Stations, Muresk Agricultural College and Agricultural Schools Workers' Award," and shall replace Award No. 16 of 1950.

## 3.---Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers engaged in the vocations mentioned herein and employed by the respondents at the research stations and/or agricultural schools, colleges and experimental farms under or operated by the Government of Western Australia, south of the 26th parallel of latitude, and west of the 123° longitude, and at the Gascoyne Research Station, Carnarvon.

#### 4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof.

#### 5.---Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the (a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Founda-tion Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that by agreement between the union and the employer the local Show Day for the district may be substituted for one of the above holidays. above holidays.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not re-quired to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness. including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the

working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

#### 6.---Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid, sub-ject to such day being taken at a time mutually arranged between employer and worker.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when comof the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in contimuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such annual leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dis-missed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein re-ferred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled days' leave due to them.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(h) Workers regularly working for the Govern-ment north of south latitude 26 shall be allowed ment north of south latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years sub-ject to the convenience of the employer. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two (2) years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 7.-Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Award.

#### 8.---Accidents, Transportation, Etc.

In cases of accident whilst on duty, the employer shall pay the Railway and/or any other transporta-tion fare of the injured worker to the nearest hospital; provided that when it is deemed necessary by the officer in charge that an attendant shall accompany an injured person the employer shall pay the attendant's transportation fare and such wages not exceeding eight (8) hours per day for the actual time occupied on the journey.

# 9.-Casual Workers.

A "Casual Worker" is one for whom less than one (1) week's continuous work is provided by the employer. Casual workers shall be entitled to receive ten per cent. (10%) in excess of the rate prescribed for their class of work.

#### 10.---Contract of Service.

(a) The engagement of all workers except casual workers shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day or by payment on any day of one week's wages in lieu of such notice.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker is required to present himself for duty except such absence is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 13 (Absence Through Sickness) or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such cases wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) The engagement of casual workers shall be by the hour.

# 11.—Medical Chest.

(i) The employer shall provide a first aid outfit which shall be kept readily accessible and shall be open to inspection by an officer of the union.

(ii) Such outfit shall consist of at least the following:—Eye drops, Boracic acid, iodine, pieric acid (bottle solution), 1 inch bandages, 2½ inch bandages, 4 inch bandages, lint, cotton wool, triangle bandages, lysol, permanganate of potash, snake bite scarifier, 12 inch, 18 inch, 24 inch and 30 inch splints, and one pair of scissors.

#### 12.—Water Bags.

The employer shall supply waterbags on each work, free of charge.

## 13.—Absent Through Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer hereunder shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representive, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

#### 14.—Protective Clothing.

Overalls shall be supplied free of charge to workers when actually engaged at lamb marking and sheep dipping. Such overalls shall remain the property of the employer.

## 15.—Payment of Fares.

(a) The employer shall pay railway and other transport fares, or shall provide transport free of charge from the place of engagement to the place of work, and when the worker's services are terminated because there is no further work available, return fares or transport to place of engagement shall also be paid or be provided by the employer: Provided that, in the event of any worker leaving the work of his own accord, or being dismissed on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory work within three (3) months of time of engagement, the amount of the fare to the job may be deducted from any amounts due to such worker at the time of dismissal, and he shall forfeit privileges of free return to place of engagement.

(b) When a worker is transferred to suit the convenience or in the interests of the employer, the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of such worker as well as his wife and children dependent upon him, shall be paid by the employer.

By arrangement with the employer the cost of transferring necessary household furniture and effects shall be paid by the employer.

(c) If workers are transferred to another job at their own request, they shall not be entitled to fares or any allowances under this clause.

#### 16.—Accommodation.

(a) The deductions specified hereunder shall be made in the case of married or single men for the following privileges when available:—

(i) Married men—not exceeding 20 per cent of the male basic wage, for quarters, and the use of milking cow under the existing arrangement.

Where the use of a cow is not available to the worker as set out above, the amounts obtained by the above deduction will be reduced by two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.

 (ii) Single men (including juniors)—for quarters and use of stretcher an amount not exceeding seven shillings (7s.) per week but where a mattress with a removable cover, pillow, chest of drawers or wardrobe, and a chair are provided for the use of the worker, the charge shall not exceed eight shillings (8s.) per week.

(b) The supply of milk and butter at market rates at Muresk Agricultural College and the Narrogin Agricultural High School shall continue when available.

(c) Workers provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to 28 per cent of the male basic wage, provided that no charge shall be made when workers are away during annual leave.

Provided further that board and lodging shall be reduced by six shillings (6s.) per day where workers are absent from the college for periods of two days and over provided the Principal is given at least forty-eight (48) hours' notice of the worker's intention to be absent.

(d) The deductions specified above shall be made from the wages set out in clause 25—Wages.

## 17.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference; provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any registered industrial union shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership of the said union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another registered industrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within fourteen (14) days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

# 18.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives. one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 19.-Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours of workers other than domestics shall be forty (40) per week to be worked in five (5) days during the period Monday to Saturday inclusive.

(b) In the case of domestics—

- (i) the hours of work be eighty (30) per fortnight to be worked in any ten (10) days in the fortnightly period.
- (ii) in addition to one break for a meal there shall not be more than one break in any shift, such break to be not less than two hours' duration.

(c) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.

(ii) The union or worker or workers covered by this award shall not in any way whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

## 20.-Spread of Shifts.

The daily spread of shifts shall mean the period between the time when the worker first commences work and the time when he or she finishes work for the day. The daily spread of shifts shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

#### 21.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed—

- (i) outside the daily spread of hours;
- (ii) beyond eighty (80) hours per fortnight in the case of domestics; and
- (iii) beyond forty (40) hours in the case of other workers as provided in clause 19,

shall be deemed to be overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) All work performed by a domestic working to a roster on any day on which he or she is rostered off duty shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

## 22.—Payment of Wages.

(a) (i) Workers who are discharged other than for misconduct, or who resign by giving a week's notice shall be paid wages due by cash or cash order at the particular place where the worker was employed within thirty (30) minutes of the engagement terminating.

(ii) Workers who are dismissed for misconduct shall be paid wages due by cash or cash order at a place designated by the officer-in-charge within twenty-four (24) hours of the time the worker reports to the officer-in-charge.

Provided that any holiday pay due to a worker referred to in paragraphs (i) and (ii) hereof shall be made available at Head Office or, at the request of the worker, despatched to his home address by registered post. (b) When or before payment of wages is made to a worker he shall, on request, be supplied with a docket showing at least the net amount of wages, margin, overtime and any allowances together with details of any deduction which are made from his earnings.

#### 23.-Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept a time and wages record, showing the name of each worker, the hours worked, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Such record shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited representative of the Union during the usual office hours. at the employer's head office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

#### 24.—Definitions.

"Leading Hand" shall mean a worker who is in charge of and directs the work of three or more other workers under this Award.

"General Farm Hand" shall mean a worker called upon to carry out all duties associated with the various activities of the employers relating to the operating and servicing of farm machinery and equipment, in addition to other work involved in primary agricultural production.

"Farm labourer" means any adult male worker other than those specified above.

#### 26.-District Allowance.

District allowances as applicable to Government wages employees generally shall be paid to workers bound by this Award.

## 27.--Special Allowances.

(a) In addition to the weekly margin prescribed in clause 25, an allowance of twenty shillings (20s.) per week shall be paid to demonstrators who are graduates of a recognised college of agriculture.

(b) Demonstrators who are called upon to give demonstrations outside of the classroom and to a whole course of students all of whom are not at that time rostered for practical farm work, shall be paid an allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per week.

## 28.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every four, or fraction of four, adult male workers. The rate of pay for junior workers shall be as under:---

- 14 to 15 years—38 per cent of the male basic wage.
- 15 to 16 years—44 per cent. of the male basic wage.
- 16 to 17 years—52 per cent. of the male basic wage.
- 17 to 18 years—60 per cent. of the male basic wage.
- 18 to 19 years—75 per cent. of the male basic wage.
- 19 years—Full basic wage.

No deduction for quarters shall be made from juniors' wages should it be possible for them to make arrangements for lodging as well as board with one of the married farm hands employed by the employer at research stations or institutions.

#### 29.-Old and Infirm Workers.

Notwithstanding anything elsewhere provided or prescribed in this award, any old and infirm worker may be paid a lower rate than that described by this Award, to be fixed by agreement in writing between the worker and the employer, and to be signed by each of them not later than one week after the commencement of the employment of the worker at such agreed rate: Provided that the employer shall, within fourteen (14) days of the signing of such agreement, forward a copy thereof to the Secretary of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch: Provided also that the employer, or the worker, or the said union may apply to the Board of Reference prescribed under this award at any time for a review of the rate fixed, and on any such review the Board of Reference may alter or vary the said rate and the decision thereon shall be final.

THE Conciliation Commissioner in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties.

#### 3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply throughout the State of Western Australia to all workers employed as tradesmen foreman and sub-foremen enumerated in clause 21—Wages hereof, by the Minister for Public Works, Minister for Water Supply, the Minister in charge of State Engineering Works, the Minister in charge of Department of Industrial Development and the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and to any other tradesmen foremen who may from time to time be included in the wages clause.

#### 4.—Definitions.

"Sub-foreman" shall mean a tradesman appointed by the management who is required to assist the foreman to a greater degree in the control of men and operation of the workshops beyond that required of a leading hand to the extent that it requires practically the whole of his time in this direction. Whilst occupying the position of subforeman he will be considered as being trained for a position of foreman, and when required must be capable of taking over the duties and responsibilities during any absence of the foreman.

#### 5.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours exclusive of time occupied for meals shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) days per week, Monday to Friday inclusive, subject to the provision of clause 6 (a) hereunder.

## 6.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours shall be classed as overtime and paid for as follows:---

- (i) (a) Time and a half for the first four (4) hours after the usual stopping time and double time thereafter. Provided that all work (other than shift work) after 10 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive shall be paid at double time up to the usual starting time.
  - (b) Where work other than shift work is done on Saturdays, the workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, but if work is performed in any period from 5 p.m. on Saturdays, the worker shall be paid double time for all time worked after that hour.
- (ii) All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates.

Provided that overtime shall not be construed as meaning the additional time up to a maximum of two (2) hours in each week usually and necessarily worked by foremen as part of their ordinary duties prior to and after the usual starting and finishing times.

#### 7.—Meal Money.

A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and four pence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

## 8.—District Allowance.

District allowance shall be paid for as provided for in the Award covering engineering trade employees of the State Government.

## 9.—Camp Allowance.

Foremen and sub-foremen shall be paid the camp allowance applying to the main body of wages men with whom they are working.

#### 10.---Country Work.

(a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares including sleeper, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all meals and board and lodging.

(b) A worker travelling to work away from or returning to his usual place of employment shall be paid for the actual travelling time in his ordinary working hours, and in addition thereto, his actual travelling time outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one (1) day.

(c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(d) In respect to a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.: Provided that this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time when paid for below eight (8) hours in any one (1) day.

(e) Fares shall be first class including sleeper when necessary except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid.

# 11.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund the employer the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his services.

(d) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them: Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the employer of his right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.

(h) Workers regularly working for the Government north of south latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the employer. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two (2) years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

#### 12.—Public Holidays.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. (ii) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees. (iii) In the case of working a far day

(iii) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(iv) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(v) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

# 13.—Sick Leave.

A worker on production of an adequate medical certificate shall be granted sick leave on the following basis:—

(a) One-sixth of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(b) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed two (2) weeks' wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but any portion unused in any calendar year shall be allowed to accumulate up to the period of one (1) week and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(c) The privileges accrued by ways of accumulation of sick leave prior to this amendment, or fifteen (15) working days, whichever is the greater, shall be credited to the worker concerned.

(d) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(e) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause except under special circumstances as may be approved by the employer.

(f) Sick leave shall not be granted in respect of any absence due to a worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

(g) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

## 14.-Long Service Leave.

(a) A worker who has completed ten (10) years' continuous service shall be entitled to three (3) calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six (6) calendar months on half pay.

(b) For each subsequent period of seven (7) years' continuous service a worker shall be entitled to an additional three (3) calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six (6) calendar months on half pay.

(c) The provisions of subclause (a) and (b) shall apply as from the date of the issue of this Award: Provided that previous continuous service up to that date since the date a worker's last period of long service leave became due shall only be counted in full where the conditions prescribed in relation to that previous service provided for three (3) months' long service leave on full pay on the basis of seven (7) years' continuous service. Where such previous service would only have entitled a worker to three (3) months' long service leave on full pay on the basis of ten (10) years' continuous service, then the first eighteen (18) months of such previous service shall not be counted. (d) Continuous service shall not include the period during which a worker is on long service leave, or any period exceeding two (2) weeks a worker is absent on leave without pay or any service a worker may have had before reaching the age of eighteen (18) years.

(e) A worker, who resigns or is dismissed, shall not be entitled to long service leave or payment for long service leave other than that leave that had actually accrued to him prior to the date on which he resigned or the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

(f) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which a worker is on long service leave will be treated as part of the long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(g) A lump sum payment for long service leave accrued in accordance with this clause and for pro rata long service leave shall be made in the following cases:—

- (i) To a worker who retires at or over the age of sixty (60) years or who is retired on the grounds of ill-health, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the worker has completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service.
- (ii) To a worker who is retired for any other cause, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the worker had completed not less than three (3) years' continuous service before the date of his retirement.
- (iii) To the widow of a worker or to such other person as may be approved by the employer in the event of the death of a worker, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the worker had completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service prior to the date of his death.

(h) The calculation of the amount due for long service leave accrued and for pro rata long service leave shall be made at the rate of salary of a worker at the date of retirement, resignation or death whichever applies and no such payment shall exceed the equivalent of twelve (12) months' salary.

# 15.—Short Leave.

(a) The employer may on sufficient cause being shown, grant a foreman leave of absence not exceeding two (2) days—all such periods of leave to be recorded, and at the discretion of the employer shall or shall not be deducted from the worker's annual or accumulated leave.

(b) Provided that if the leave granted under subclause (a) hereof exceeds two (2) days in any one (1) year, the excess shall be deducted from the worker's annual or accumulated leave.

# 16.-No Reduction.

Any worker who has been, prior to the date of this Award, in receipt of a higher rate of pay than that specified herein, shall not suffer any reduction in such amount solely by reason of the Award.

# 17.-Contract of Service.

The engagement of a foreman or sub-foreman shall be terminated by one (1) month's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day, excepting that a worker guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

# 18.—Acting in a Higher Capacity.

When a sub-foreman is acting in a higher capacity for one (1) consecutive week or more, he shall be paid the minimum rate of pay of that position in which he is acting.

# 19.-Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

20.---Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.
