IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, I the Governor, in the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto, from 1st June, 1959, to 31st May, 1964 inclusive 31st May, 1964, inclusive.

That portion of Western Australian ocean waters lying to the south and south-east of a line drawn from the northernmost extremity of Robert Point to a point on the ocean foreshore lying one-half mile north-east of the bar at the entrance to Peel's Inlet, wherever such bar may be.
