(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with

the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the taking of marron by any means whatsoever in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, from 1st May to 31st December in every year.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Act aforesaid, I do further prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, by means of fishing nets intended to be used or capable of being used for the taking of marron, from 1st May to 31st December in each year.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid, I do hereby prohibit the taking of marron by means of unattended traps in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January to 30th December in each year.

All freshwater rivers, streams and brooks in the South-West Land Division, including the waters of the Harvey, Stirling, Wellington, Samson and Canning Dams.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921-1958.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (3) of section 14 of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921-1958, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislature of any part of the Queen's Dominions or of any other country or other competent authority for the enforcement within that part or that country of maintenance orders made by courts within this State, the Governor may, by Order in Council, extend this Act to that part or that country; and whereas the Governor is satisfied that such reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of the Isle of Man: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the provisions of the Act to the Isle of Man.

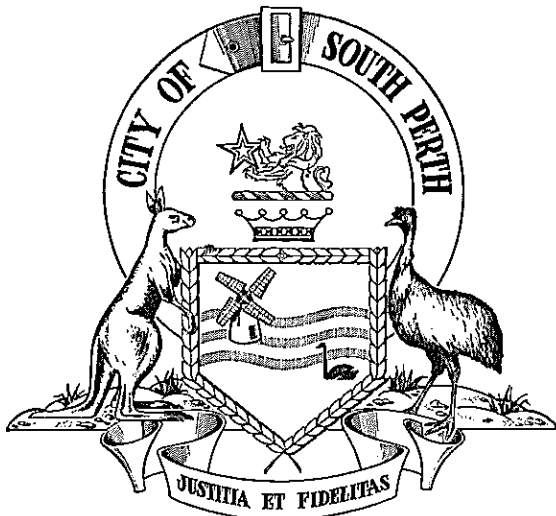

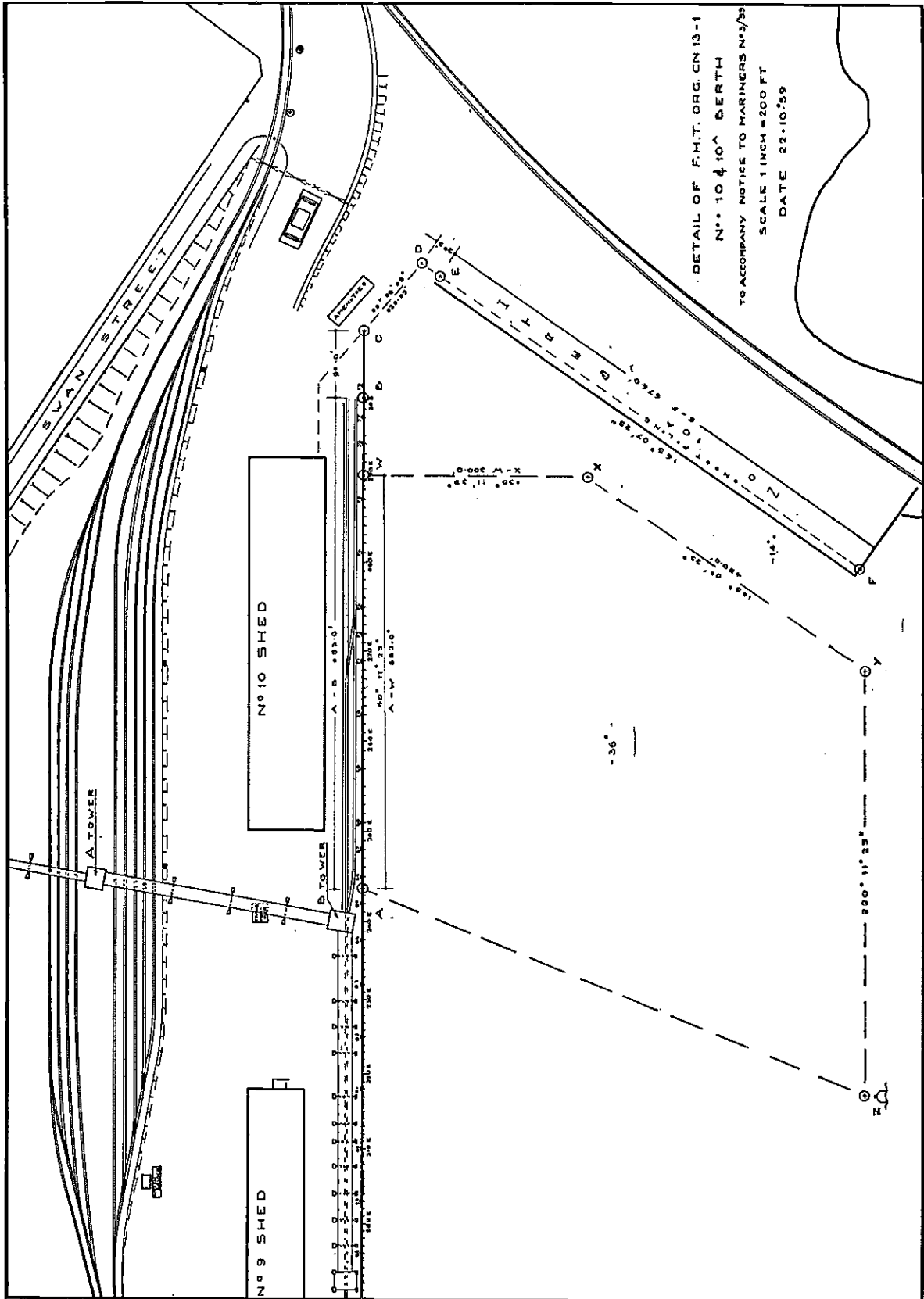

Between Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, Applicant, and The Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court now therefore the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs here-in it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Fremantle Harbour Trust Shed Supervisors' Award and replaces Award No. 27 of 1941, as amended.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to any person employed as a Shed Supervisor, or Assistant Shed Supervisor, by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

The area covered by this Award shall be the whole of the premises controlled by, vested in, or for the time being occupied by the Commissioners.

4.—Definitions.

"Shed Supervisor" shall mean and include any clerk employed in charge of a Shed or Berth.

"Assistant Shed Supervisor" shall mean and include any clerk employed in a permanent capacity as an assistant to a Shed Supervisor, or as a relief Shed Supervisor.

"Commissioners" shall mean the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners in office for the time being.

"Union" shall mean the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W. A. Branch.

"Officer" shall mean any person covered by this Award.

5.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute the week's work and the ordinary hours of duty shall be eight (8) hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch.

Provided that:—

- (i) Should an officer be not required for duty during the prescribed ordinary hours, his services may be utilised during other hours

without the necessity of his being remunerated for the ordinary hours during which his services are not required.

- (ii) Where an officer is required for duty on any day during other than the prescribed ordinary hours he shall be notified, where possible, of the hours during which he is required for duty not later than 5 p.m. on the preceding working day.

- (iii) Where, through unforeseen circumstances, it is not possible for an officer to be notified on the previous day that he is required for duty during other than the prescribed ordinary hours he may be notified to cease duty at any time up to 12 noon on the day concerned, in which case he shall be paid for the ordinary hours for that day until 12 noon.

(b) In cases of emergency, or by reason of unforeseen circumstances, an officer engaged on a continuity of duty during other than the prescribed ordinary hours may also be required to be available for duty during such ordinary hours as may be necessary.

(c) (i) An officer, whose services are utilised during other than the prescribed ordinary hours, in accordance with provisions of this clause, shall be paid for the whole of the shift for which his services are required.

(ii) For the purposes of this subclause a shift shall mean the normal shift in operation in the Port of Fremantle for the time being.

(d) Shed Supervisors shall be afforded preference for duty during the ordinary hours as prescribed herein.

(e) (i) The Commissioners may require any officer to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such officer shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) The Union or officer or officers covered by this Award, shall not in any way, whether directly, or indirectly, be party to, or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

6.—Rates of Pay.

(a) Basic Wage £13 18s. 7d. a week.

(b) Subject to Clauses 7 and 8 of this Award the hourly rates of pay of officers employed under this Award for ordinary time, overtime, Saturday and Sunday time and holidays shall be the respective minimum hourly rates payable to casual wharf (tally) clerks, plus fixed hourly margins as follows:—

(i) Shed Supervisors.

(c) (i) Shed Supervisors and Assistant Shed Supervisors, respectively shall be paid a weekly wage of not less than the equivalent of forty (40) hours at the ordinary rates of pay prescribed in Subclauses (b) (i) (a) and (b) (ii) (a) of this Clause.

(ii) Earnings in respect of duty between the hours of 8 a.m. on Saturday and midnight on the Sunday next following shall not be taken into account when assessing the weekly wage specified in the preceding paragraph.

7.—Special Provisions re Overtime.

(a) If work is continued after the tea hour, officers shall be paid for at least one (1) hour at the appropriate rate.

(b) Where overtime is not in continuance of time worked prior thereto, but comprises or commences a new period of duty an officer who—

- (i) is required for duty on a Saturday, shall be paid a minimum of four (4) hours at the appropriate rate,
- (ii) is required for duty on a Sunday or a holiday, shall be paid a minimum of six (6) hours at the appropriate rate.

8.—Meals.

(a) Meal intervals shall be those ordinarily observed in respect of wharf work at the Port of Fremantle, and at the date of this Award are:—

Breakfast—7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Lunch—Noon to 1 p.m.

Tea—5 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Supper—Midnight to 1 a.m.

Provided that, where the operation of a shift system of work necessitates, the interval for supper may be 11 p.m. to midnight.

(b) Subject to Subclause (d) of this Clause, officers who are required to remain on duty during a meal interval shall be paid for such time at the hourly rate prescribed from time to time for casual wharf (tally) clerks, in addition to the amount otherwise payable, and such extra rate shall continue until the officer has been allowed a full hour for the meal. Provided that this Subclause shall not apply where work commences at or during or at the end of the tea hour.

(c) The provisions of Subclause (b) of this Clause shall not apply in the following circumstances:—

- (i) Where officers remain on duty after completing a midnight shift at 8 a.m.
- (ii) Where officers are required for duty during the dinner hour on an ordinary working day and continue on duty at the end of the dinner hour.

Provided that in such cases officers shall be paid at the hourly rate prescribed from time to time for casual wharf (tally) clerks, in addition to the amount otherwise payable for the actual meal interval only.

(d) Meal money shall be paid at the same rate and under the same conditions as are applicable to casual wharf (tally) clerks.

9.—Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and be paid for, namely—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and such other days as may be agreed upon.

10.—Annual Leave.

Each officer shall be granted leave of absence on full pay at the rate prescribed for the ordinary hours of duty for two weeks in each calendar year, as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

11.—Long Service Leave.

Each officer shall be entitled to long service leave as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners. Any officer who resigns or is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next prior thereto, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of resignation or retirement.

12.—Sick Leave.

Each officer shall be entitled to sick leave with pay as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

13.—Engagement.

(a) The engagement of any officer other than one in a temporary or relieving capacity shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side,

excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended, and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

(b) Temporary officers may be engaged on such daily or weekly rate as may be appropriate to the particular class of work, and shall be subject to one day's or one week's notice, as the case may be. Provided that any such officer engaged on a daily basis, but whose period of engagement has exceeded one week, shall be subject to one week's notice, and provided further that the minimum wage payable to a temporary officer shall not be less than the rate prescribed for similar work under this Award.

14.—Preference of Employment.

(a) All officers shall be members of the union, provided that any officer who at the time of engagement is not a member of such union shall become a member thereof within fourteen (14) days of such engagement, and provided also that the union shall not refuse to accept as a member any such officer who is eligible and applies in the manner prescribed, under the rules of the union, to become a member thereof.

(b) When a vacancy occurs in a position covered by this Award, the Commissioners shall notify the Secretary of the Union, and the Secretary of the Fremantle Tally Clerks' Section of the Union, and shall post in the office of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and also in some conspicuous place agreed upon by the Union, a notification as to the existence of such vacancy, and mentioning the date of the closing of applications, which shall not be less than one (1) week from the posting of such notices.

15.—Time and Wages Record.

Records shall be kept by the Commissioners, showing the name of each officer under this Award, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union during working hours.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties hereto, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of agreement not being arrived at between the said parties, the functions of:—

- (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

17.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the date of issue hereof: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date of this Award, application may be made to the Court, by leave of the Court obtained by either party to the Award, for a review of any of the provisions of the Award and same may be varied by the Court.
