IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 37 of 1959.

Between The Royal Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Health, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by the respective representa-tives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memoran-dum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include 'Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Tuberculosis Nurses' Award" and supersedes Award No. 39 of 1955, as amended.

2.—Arrangement.

3. Term.

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3.—Term.

This Award shall be for a period of three (3) years, with the right of any party hereto to apply to the Court for amendment after twelve (12) months.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect throughout the State of Western Australia.

5.—Definitions.

"The Federation" shall mean the Royal Austra-lian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) Industrial Union of Workers, Perth.

6.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours of workers other than at Woorolco Hospital shall not exceed-

(i) Forty (40) hours per week, or eighty (80) hours per fortnight at the option of the employer.

- (ii) Provided that an employer shall not change from a forty (40) hour week to an eighty (80) hour fortnight, except upon giving one (1) month's notice of his intention so to do to the Federation.
- (iii) Meal breaks shall not be counted as time worked

(b) At Wooroloo Hospital, one hundred and sixty (160) hours per four (4) weeks, exclusive of meal times.

(c) Straight shifts of not more than eight hours each shall be worked by Student Nurses.

(d) At hospitals which come under the pro-visions of sub-clause (a) of this clause, those on day duty shall be allowed one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ days continuous time off duty per week and those on night duty shall be allowed one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ days continuous time off duty per week or three (3) days continuous time off duty per fortnight.

(e) At Wooroloo Hospital, six (6) days continuous time off duty in every four (4) weeks shall be allowed.

Morning and afternoon tea shall be provided by the employer. The time allowed for such break shall not exceed seven (7) minutes which shall be taken when convenient to the employer, without deduction of pay for such time.

(g) Where a worker is required to travel as part of her duty, such travelling time shall be con-sidered as part of her working time, and there shall be no reduction in respect thereof.

(h) Should a student nurse carry out eight (8) or more consecutive weeks of night duty, then such student nurse shall not be rostered again for night duty for at least twelve (12) weeks from the last day of the preceding period of night duty except at the written request of the student nurse.

7.---Overtime.

All time worked in excess of ordinary working hours as prescribed in Clause 6 hereof shall be paid for as hereunder:-

- (i) Time and a half for the first eight (8) hours when working forty (40) hours per week.
- (ii) Time and a half for the first sixteen (16) hours when working eighty (80) hours per fortnight.
- (iii) Time and a half for the first thirty-two
 (32) hours when working one hundred and sixty (160) hours per four (4) weeks.
- (iv) All overtime worked in excess of that pre scribed in paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) hereof shall be paid for at double time rates.

(b) If the employer and worker so agree, time off in lieu thereof shall be granted at the con-venience of the hospital: Provided, however, that venience of the hospital: Provided, nowever, that such time off shall be in unbroken periods, accord-ing to each period of overtime worked; and also provided that the overtime is made up within twenty-eight (28) days from the time when it be-comes due, except where it applies to the change-over from night duty to day duty or day duty to might duty to night duty.

(c) Less than thirty (30) minutes' overtime for a week, or one (1) hour's overtime for a fortnight, or two (2) hours' overtime for a four-weekly period, as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

8.--Holidays.

(a) Every worker covered by this Award, where not otherwise provided for, shall be entitled to four (4) weeks' leave on full pay for each twelve (12)months' service.

(b) A worker with more than one (1) month's service and, in the case of a student nurse, three (3) months' service who may resign or be dismissed, except the dismissal is due to misconduct, shall be entitled to payment for holidays pro rata up to the time of her leaving the service, in such proportion as her period of employment bears to the number of days in the year.

(c) Every worker shall receive at least fourteen (c) Every worker shall receive at least fourteen (14) days' previous notice of the commencement of her leave. For the purpose of ascertaining the approximate time of annual leave, a roster shall be kept in all hospitals of over twenty (20) bed average, giving the necessary information. The roster shall be placed on a notice board in some convenient place for increasing by workers convenient place for inspection by workers.

(d) (i) Leave shall be paid for in advance at the rate of salary the worker is receiving at the time of taking such leave. Provided that any leave accrued for the final year of training shall be paid for at the rate payable for such year of service.

(ii) Leave shall be given as soon as practicable after falling due. The leave of a student nurse shall not accumulate, but shall be given each year. The leave of a nurse shall not accumulate except with the consent of the nurse and in no case shall it accumulate for more than two (2) years.

9.-Long Service Leave.

(1) Subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed all workers covered by this Award shall become entitled to thirteen (13) weeks' long ser-vice leave on full pay or twenty-six (26) weeks' long service leave on half pay—

- (a) after a period of ten (10) years' continuous service in a full-time capacity; and
- (b) after a further period of ten (10) years' continuous service in a full-time capacity; and
- (c) after each further period of seven (7) years' continuous service in a full-time capacity.

(2) (a) For the purpose of this clause, "service" means service as a worker of one or more of the Respondents to this Award and shall be deemed to include-

- (i) absence of the worker on annual leave or public holidays;
- (ii) absence of the worker on paid sick leave;
 (iii) absence of the worker on approved sick leave without pay, but not exceeding six
 (6) weeks in any year after 1/7/57, and not exceeding two (2) weeks in any year
- (iv) absence of the worker on approved leave without pay, other than sick leave without pay, but not exceeding two (2) weeks in any qualifying period; (v) absence of the worker on National Service
- or other military training, but only if the difference between the worker's military pay and civilian pay is made up or would, but for the fact that his military pay exceeds his civilian pay, be made up by his employer; and
- (vi) absence of the worker on worker's com-pensation for any period not exceeding six (6) months or for such greater period as the Minister for Health may allow.

(b) The service of a worker shall be deemed not to include-

- (i) service of the worker prior to 1st November, 1935;
- (ii) service of the worker prior to his attaining
- (iii) service of 18 years;
 (iii) service of the worker after the day on which he has become entitled to twenty-six (26) weeks' long service leave until the day on which he completes the taking of that leave:
- of that leave;
 (iv) any period of service of less than two (2) years with the one employer unless the worker submits a reason which, in the opinion of that employer, is a good and sufficient reason for entering into employment with another employer before the opinition of such two (2) years' service. the expiration of such two (2) years' service;
- (v) any period of service of less than twelve (12) months;
- (vi) absence of the worker on long service leave; or
- (vii) any other absence of the worker except such absences as are included in service by virtue of paragraph (a) of this subclause.

(3) Subject to the provisions of sub-clause (2) of this clause, the service of a worker shall not be deemed to have been broken—

- (a) by resignation in accordance with Clause 11 of this Award, if he resigns from his employment with one respondent to this Award and commences employment with another such respondent within one (1) week of the expiration of any period for which payment in lieu of annual leave and/or public holidays has been made by the first-mentioned employer or, if no such payment has been made, within one (1) week of the day on which his resignation became effective;
- (b) If his employment is ended by his employer for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory employment under this Award not later than six (6) months from the day on which his employment was ended; or
- (c) by any absence of whatever duration, approved by the employer as leave whether with or without pay.

(4) Application for leave without pay must be made before the commencement of the absence in respect of which leave is sought unless the cause of the absence occurs after the worker was last on duty, in which case application must be made not later than fourteen (14) days after the day on which the worker resumes work.

(5) (a) Long service leave shall be taken at a time convenient to the employer, but not less than thirty (30) days' notice shall be given each worker of the day on which his leave is to commence, except in cases where the worker and the employer agree to a lesser period of notice, or in other exceptional circumstances.

(b) All complete periods of leave must be taken before the day on which a worker is compulsorily retired.

(6) Any public holiday occurring during a worker's absence on long service leave shall be deemed to be portion of his long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(7) A worker who has become entitled to long service leave in accordance with sub-clause (1) of this clause and whose employment is ended before that leave is taken, shall be granted payment in lieu of that leave, unless he has been dismissed for an offence committed prior to the day on which he became entitled to that leave, in which case no such payment shall be made.

(8) If a worker who has become entitled to long service leave in accordance with sub-clause (1) of this clause, dies before taking that leave, payment in lieu of that leave shall be made to the worker's estate.

(9) If the employment of a worker ends before he has completed a full qualifying period in accordance with sub-clause (1) of this clause, payment in lieu of long service leave proportionate to his length of service shall not be made unless—

- (a) he has completed at least three (3) years' continuous service and his employment has been ended by his employer for reasons other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service; or
- (b) he is not less than sixty (60) years of age and resigns, but ony if he has completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service prior to the day from which his resignation has effect; or
- (c) he has completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service and his employment is ended by his employer on account of incapacity due to old age, ill health, or the result of an accident; or
- (d) (i) the worker is a trained nurse who, being a female, resigns to be married; but only if she has completed not less than three (3) years' continuous service since the day on which she completed her training;

(ii) the worker, a trained nurse, has married after not less than three (3) years' continuous service since the completion of her training, in which case payment shall be made in respect of service up to the date of her resignation;

(A worker shall be entitled to payment under sub-paragraph (i) or subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, but not under both and, on application for such payment shall produce her certificate of marriage.)

(e) the worker dies after having served continuously for not less than twelve (12) months next before his death, and leaves a widow, children, mother or invalid sister who were dependent on him, in which case such payment shall be made to such widow or other dependent. In this paragraph the feminine gender shall be deemed to include the masculine gender.

(10) (a) Subject to the provisions of this subclause and to those of sub-clause (1), a worker shall be paid during long service leave at his permanent classified rate of pay.

(b) If a worker has been employed in one or more positions each of which carries a higher rate than his permanent classified rate, for a continuous period of twelve (12) months ending not earlier than two (2) weeks before the day on which he commences long service leave, the rate which he has received for the greatest proportion of that twelve-month period shall, for the purpose of this sub-clause, be deemed to be his permanent classified rate of pay.

(c) If any variation occurs in the rate of wage applicable to a worker during any period when he is on long service leave, the worker's pay while he is on such leave shall be varied accordingly and, if the worker has been paid in full for the leave before its commencement, payment shall be adjusted as soon as practicable after the worker resumes work.

(d) District allowance shall not be paid during long service leave unless the family or dependants of the worker remain in the district.

(11) In all matters not herein expressly provided for, the long service leave conditions applicable to Government wages employees generally shall apply.

10.—Sick Leave.

(1) Student Nurses.

Sick leave shall be granted to student nurses on the basis of two (2) months on full pay for the first three (3) years' service and one and one-quarter $(1\frac{1}{4})$ days for each completed month of service after the first three (3) years.

(2) Trained Nurses.

(a) (i) Subject as hereinafter provided, sick leave shall be granted on the basis of ten (10) working days on full pay for each year of service.

(ii) If, in any calendar year, any absence through sickness exceeds the worker's current entitlement and, by service subsequent to the sickness, the worker becomes entitled to further sick leave with pay, payment may be adjusted at the end of that calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, whichever is the sooner.

(iii) Any unused portion of the sick leave herein prescribed, up to a maximum of seven (7) working days in each year, shall be allowed to accumulate and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(b) Workers in the employ of any respondent at the date of the amendment of 14/8/57 shall be allowed an initial credit as at that date on the following basis:—

- (i) Where continuous service exceeded three
 (3) years, forty-five (45) working days less any sick leave taken during the preceding triennial period.
- (ii) Where continuous service was less than three (3) years, an amount calculated on the entitlement provided for in sub-clause

(a) hereof, less any sick leave taken from the commencement of service to the date that amendment came into force.

(c) (i) The maximum period of sick leave allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed six (6) months.

(ii) A worker who has been granted six (6) months' continuous sick leave with pay shall not be entitled to receive further sick leave with pay until a period on duty of not less than four (4) weeks has been completed.

(3) General.

(a) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate. Provided that if in any case it is not convenient for the worker to obtain a medical certificate, sick leave may be granted on other evidence satisfactory to the employer, but such leave shall be limited to two (2) consecutive days in any one period and a total of three (3) days in any calendar year.

(b) Any period during which a worker is absent on leave without pay shall not be included as part of such worker's period of continuous service for the purpose of this clause.

(c) A worker who is absent on approved annual leave, long service leave, or leave without pay, shall not be eligible for leave under this clause during the currency of such approved leave.

(d) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

11.—Termination of Service.

(a) Except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, a worker's services shall not be terminated unless she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice or payment for such period in lieu thereof.

(b) No worker shall, without the consent of her employer, resign without first having given fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her intention so to do, and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold holiday or other pay up to the amount of fourteen (14) days' wages: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a nurse who has received a summons for duty with any of the armed forces of Australia.

(c) A worker dismissed for misconduct shall have the right of appeal against such dismissal to a Board of Reference or to such person as may be agreed upon by her with her employer, and such worker shall be entitled to a written statement as to the reason for her dismissal from her employer within fourteen (14) days of the said employer's having received a written request for such statement.

(d) This clause shall not apply to casual or parttime workers.

12.—Transfers.

(a) A worker who is transferred from one place to another shall be entitled to first-class travelling accommodation between the places of transfer and to full payment of salary during the time of leaving duty and taking up her new duties.

(b) (i) In addition, she shall be allowed travelling allowance of three shillings (3s.) for any meal purchased, or the actual cost of any meal purchased, if such cost exceeds three shillings (3s.). Meal times shall be 8 a.m. 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. Sixpence (6d.) for each morning and afternoon tea shall be allowed when travelling at 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Reasonable porterage shall also be allowed. Caims for taxi fares must be supported by receipts for the fares claimed.

(ii) No such meal allowance as mentioned shall be made for journeys completed between the ordinary meal times. Where practicable, at least fourteen (14) days' previous written notice shall be given to a worker required to transfer from one hospital or place to another.

13.—Engagement.

(a) When a nurse or student nurse is engaged for service in a hospital or place outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles of the General Post Office, Perth, she shall be entitled to first-class fare and travelling allowance as above from the place of engagement to the place of employment, and her term of employment shall be deemed to commence as soon as she leaves her place of engagement.

(b) If a worker is dismissed before the period for which she was engaged has expired, or if none is stipulated, then before the period of six (6) months from the date of her appointment, except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance as above to the place of engagement should she desire to return there.

Provided that if she was originally engaged in Perth and has been employed continuously at more than one public hospital without returning to Perth, then she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance to Perth, should she desire to return there.

And also provided that should a worker elect to return to her place of engagement or to Perth by any other conveyance than by rail, she shall be entitled, upon production of receipts, to actual transport expenses incurred; but such transport expenses shall not exceed the amount of either a first-class rail, boat, plane and/or coach fare at the employer's option, from the place of her last employment to the place of her engagement or to Perth, as the case may be.

(c) Any worker whose duties require her to travel shall be entitled to first-class travelling accommodation at the expense of her employer.

(d) If any worker who is engaged for duty in a hospital or place outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles of the General Post Office, Perth, remains for six (6) months or more in the service of the employer who engages her, she shall be entitled to return fare and travelling allowance as mentioned in sub-clause (a) when she leaves her employment.

(e) Upon termination of her employment, a worker shall receive payment before she leaves the hospital of all money due to her up to the termination of her employment.

(f) Except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, a casual worker shall receive return fare and travelling allowance, irrespective of her period of engagement.

(g) Upon the original engagement of a worker for employment under this Award, such worker shall be furnished with a service book in which the original employer and all subsequent employers under the Award shall, on the termination of such worker's services, cause to be entered, a record of the period of service of the worker and the capacity in which the worker was from time to time employed.

14.—Student Nurses.

(a) Any employer taking a student nurse on probation shall within fourteen (14) days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in writing.

(b) Within one (1) month from the end of the period of probation, an agreement in writing as required by the Act shall be executed and signed by the employer, the student nurse and, where the student nurse is under twenty-one (21) years of age, the parent or legal guardian of the probationer. There shall be three (3) executed copies of such agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one by the student nurse or her parent or guardian, and one shall be lodged with the Registrar.

(c) Student nurses shall be employed for a period of six (6) months on probation; such period shall count as part of the term of service.

(d) A student nurse may be transferred from one employer to another, but notification thereof must be sent to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof.

(e) The agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent of the parties, but notification of such cancellation must be forwarded to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof. (f) The employer, with the consent of the Court, may discharge a student nurse from service and cancel the agreement for misconduct or wilful disobedience or any other cause which the Court may deem sufficient: Provided, however, the employer shall be entitled to impose any other disciplinary measures as are provided in the indentures.

(g) Lecture Times.—Any lectures or examinations which occur normally during duty hours shall be computed as part of the working time of the student nurse whose duty it is to attend such lectures or examinations, and there shall be no reduction in salary in respect thereto.

(h) Student nurses who do not pass their final examinations may be retained until such examinations are passed and during such period they shall be paid at the rate provided for student nurses in their final year. But such extended period shall in no case exceed twelve (12) months.

(i) Student nurses shall not be obliged to work more than three (3) months' night duty in either the first, second, third or fourth year of training. Student nurses at the Kalgoorlie Hospital shall not be required to be on night duty for more than six (6) continuous weeks in any one period. After any period of night duty, a student nurse shall have an equivalent period of duty other than night duty.

(j) The employer shall report to the Court in writing the result of all examinations immediately the result is available, showing---

(i) the names of the candidates sitting;

(ii) the training school attended;

(iii) the result of the examinations.

This report shall be available for inspection by the Federation secretary or her authorised nominee.

(k) The proportion of student nurses in a training hospital approved by the Nurses' Registration Board shall be not more than eight (8) student nurses to each certificated nurse.

15.-Laundry and Uniforms.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to all reasonable laundry work at the expense of the employer, but where the uniform of any employee cannot be laundered at the hospital, an allowance of four shillings (4s.) per week shall be paid to the worker.

(b) Uniforms-

(1) Student Nurses.—The employer shall provide all uniforms, which shall at all times remain the property of the employer.

Student nurses who are required or recommended to wear a stipulated type of hospital stocking shall be provided with six (6) pairs free of charge each year.

For the purpose of this clause "hospital stocking" means stockings of a colour or material not ordinarily worn for civilian dress.

Student nurses shall pay an amount of three guineas $(\pounds 3 \ 3s.)$ towards the cost of initial uniforms on commencement of their training, but on completion of the first twelve (12) months of training the amount of three guineas $(\pounds 3 \ 3s.)$ shall be refunded to the trainee.

(2) Trained Nurses.—(i) The enployer shall provide uniforms or, alternatively, shall provide uniform material and pay up to twenty-five shillings (25s.) per uniform for the making, with a limit of six (6) uniforms per annum.

Payment will be made only when completed uniforms are passed by the matron to her satisfaction. Such uniforms shall remain the property of the employer until the lapse of six (6) months after the date of supply.

(ii) In lieu of providing uniforms, the employer may make the following allowance:—

Matrons and Sisters—Five shillings (5s.) per week. Provided that the worker conforms to the uniform stipulated by the employer regarding material, colour, pattern and condition. (iii) When requested by the workers, the employer shall secure material and supply it to the worker, at cost, provided this condition shall not come into effect until the lapse of six (6) months since the previous issue of uniforms to the nurse.

(iv) The worker may elect which method she desires to adopt for the provision of uniforms, but having elected the method desired, shall not be permitted to adopt the alternative method except by approval of and under conditions laid down by the employer.

(v) The employer shall provide two (2) caps (prescribed under the Nurses' Registration Board Regulations) per annum.

16.---Rosters.

A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in such place as it may conveniently and readily be seen by each worker concerned. The roster shall be posted not less than forty-eight (48) hours preceding the day on which the roster commences. The roster shall be available to the Federation secretary for inspection at all reasonable times. Rosters may be altered at any time if the hospital exigencies render any alteration necessary.

17.-Time and Wages Book.

(a) A time book or cards shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the Federation secretary, or her nominee, appointed in writing. Each worker must record each day in such book or card the exact time at which she starts and finishes duty, and also the time booked off for meals.

(b) The salary sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection at the office of the employer concerned, by the Federation secretary or her nominee appointed as aforesaid.

(c) Any system of automatic recording by means of a machine shall be deemed a compliance with the provisions of sub-clause (a) so far as the particulars actually recorded are concerned.

(d) On each pay a worker in respect of the payment then due shall be furnished with a statement in writing, either on or in the pay envelope, containing the following particulars, viz., name, the amount of ordinary salary, the total number of hours or overtime worked (if any), the amount of any overtime payment, the amount of any other moneys paid and the purposes for which they are paid and the amount of the deductions made from total earnings and the nature thereof. Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to a hospital which utilises a machine system of recording particulars on salary envelopes or dockets provided that at least the following particulars are shown on the envelope or docket of each worker—viz. the name of the worker, the amount of ordinary salary, the amount of overtime paid and particulars of any deductions made.

18.—Interviews.

The Federation secretary shall be entitled to interview members of the Federation on the employer's premises at reasonable times.

19.—Notices.

If the Federation so requests, a copy of this Award shall be posted on a board of reasonable size in a place where it may be conveniently and readily seen by every worker concerned. The Federation secretary may also post thereon such other notices relating to Union matters as are reasonable.

20.—Preference.

All other qualifications being equal, preference of employment shall be given to members of the Federation.

Provided that any worker who is not a member of the Federation shall, within twenty-eight (28) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership of the said Federation.

21.—Present Salaries and Privileges.

Subject to the method of regulating salaries on the average of occupied beds, nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the salary of any worker who at the date of this Award is being paid a higher rate of salary than the minimum prescribed for her class of work.

A worker shall not be deprived of any privileges relating to her employment, enjoyed by her at the date hereof, except such as are dealt with in this Award, in which case the Award provisions shall apply.

22.—Relieving.

A nurse who performs the duties of a worker on a higher classification than herself for a period of more than seven (7) consecutive days shall receive the minimum wage of such higher classification as from the beginning of such period of relieving.

23.—Living Allowances.

(a) Where board and lodging are provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker an amount equal to thirty-three and one-third $(33\frac{1}{3})$ per cent. of the female basic wage. Provided that student nurses who are paid a percentage of the basic wage shall receive free board and lodging assessed at the above rate.

(b) In all cases the ratio of the value of board to that of lodging in the board and lodging allowance shall be two (2) to one (1).

(c) The Federation secretary or her nominee duly appointed in writing shall be entitled to inspect such food and accommodation at reasonable times.

(d) Where a worker is required to live out, a payment of twenty-five shillings (25s.) per week shall be made by the employer in approved cases. Provided that any dispute between the Federation and the employer shall be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(e) Where workers who are paid on a living out basis are provided with meals by the employer, deduction shall be made from their wages at the rate of one-twenty first (1/21st) of the allowance for board in accordance with sub-clause (b) hereof for each meal provided.

(f) When nursing staff are required to share rooms they shall pay half of the prescribed lodging allowance, in accordance with sub-clause (b) of this clause.

24.—Special Allowances.

In addition to the salaries prescribed herein, special allowances as set out in this clause shall be paid:—

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(a) To a trained or student nurse on night duty for more than eight (8) consecutive weeks, or twelve (12) weeks in broken periods in any one (1) year of service under the same employer and employed in over six (6) bed average hospitals from the beginning of the period
Provided that this allowance chell not be provided to a purse

shall not be paid to a nurse appointed as night superintendent and paid as such.

(b) (i) A worker who is required to remain on "close call" for duty and not allowed to leave the hospital precincts shall be paid the sum of three shillings (3s.) for each period in any twenty-four (24) hours she is so required, in addition to the salary to which she is otherwise entitled.

- Per week £ s. d.
- (ii) A worker who is required to remain on "remote call", i.e., on call for duty and allowed to leave the hospital precincts, shall be paid an additional sum of one shilling (1s.) for each period in any twentyfour (24) hours she is so required, in addition to the salary to which she is otherwise entitled.

25.—Emergencies.

In the event of any emergency arising, the Commissioner of Public Health may, with the consent of the President, take such measures as may in his opinion be necessary for the safety and protection or welfare of patients, notwithstanding anything contained in this Award.

26.—Casuals.

A nurse employed for a period of less than two (2) weeks shall be deemed to be a casual worker and be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the rates specified in this Award.

If a casual worker is still required at the end of two (2) weeks, she may be re-employed as a casual with payment as aforesaid, for another two (2) weeks.

27.-Part-time Employment.

(a) Notwithstanding anything contained herein, an employer shall be at liberty to employ parttime workers.

(b) A part-time worker means a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service who regularly works less than forty (40) hours per week.

(c) (i) Part-time workers who will work whatever hours the employer requires shall be paid the rate of wage prescribed in this Award for the class of work performed.

(ii) Part-time workers who are only available for duty at certain specified times shall be paid at the rate of wage for a staff nurse in her second year.

(d) Part-time workers shall be allowed sick leave and holidays in accordance with the provisions of this Award, only in the proportion which their weekly hours of duty bear to forty (40) hours.

28.-Other Provisions.

(a) Not less than thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed for each meal: Provided that where a nurse is called on duty during a meal time the period worked shall be counted in the ordinary working hours of duty.

(b) Student nurses sitting for the examination held by the Nurses' Registration Board shall as far as practicable be taken off night duty at least four (4) weeks before the examinations are held.

(c) For Tuberculosis Nurses' Registration Board examinations, as far as practicable, two and a half $(2\frac{1}{2})$ consecutive days off, i.e., one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ days to be days off per week, and one (1) day for examinations.

29.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

 (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award, or any of them; (ii) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act. 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

30.-Wages

(a) Wages shall be paid at least twice per calendar month, or fortnightly at the option of the employer, provided that, by agreement between the employer and the Federation. the wages in any particular case may be paid once per calendar month.

(b) The minimum wage rates payable to workers shall be as set out hereunder. The rates for convenience sake are set forth in weekly amounts.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 15 of 1959.

(Registered 10th December, 1959.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 30th day of November, 1959, between the Kalgoorlie Brewing Company Limited, whose registered office is situated at Brookman Street, Kalgoorlie (herein-after called "the Employer"), of the one part and after called "the Employer"), of the one part and the Breweries and Bottleyards Employees' Indus-trial Union of Workers of Western Australia, registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and having its regis-tered office at the Trades Hall, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union") of the other part, whereby it is correct or follows: is agreed as follows:-

Interpretation.

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean any person who is employed for not more than 40 ordinary working hours. The number of "Casual hands" shall not exceed one in every ten permanently employed or portion of the first ten by the said company.

(b) "Cellarman" whenever used in this Agreement shall mean a worker who is generally em-ployed at a majority of the undermentioned and racking beer from storage tanks and/or tends filter and shall not mean any employee who is casually employed in any one of the last mentioned processes.

(c) "Bottle Washer" shall mean any person employed washing bottles by hand or machinery.

(d) "CO2 Bottler" shall mean any person em-(d) CO2 Bottler shall mean any person employed in bottling CO2 gas.
 (e) "Leading Hands" are employees who are in

charge of and responsible for the work of others.

(f) "Motor Drivers"-Motor drivers shall not (g) "Shiftmen" shall be applicable to topmen

and cellarmen.

1.---Wages.

In view of the difference in trading conditions prevailing on the Goldfields as compared with trading conditions elsewhere in the State, the parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employer to the persons employed by it within the area covered by this Agreement in the capacities undermentioned respectively is as follows:—

Cold Rooms: Workers in cold rooms or cellars with a temperature of less than 45 degrees F shall be paid 5s. per week in addition to the minimum rate.

Storage Tanks: Reconditioning storage tanks and vats which shall include painting, cleaning and and vats which shall include painting, cleaning and scraping cylinders inside and outside. For all time during which they may be employed inside cylinders or vats at this class of work workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the margin above prescribed. Whilst engaged on this class of work outside of cylinders or vats, workers shall be entitled to be paid at the margin above prescribed plus the cold room allowance where applicable.

Boiler Cleaning and Ammonia Coils: For all time they may be employed scraping and cleaning boilers and chipping, cleaning, scraping or painting ammonia coils, workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addi-tion to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification.

Oilers and Aprons: Employers shall for use in their work only, supply oilskin coats, cash and docket satchels, leather aprons, gaiters or leggings to motor lorry drivers free of cost.

Adult Labourer: The employer shall make it a condition of employment that all workers must be covered by this Agreement and shall be members of this Union or become so immediately on their first pay day.

Boots: The employer shall, for use during working hours, only, supply suitable boots to those employed at the bottle washing, at the tanks, at the tubs, at the filters, at the cask washing shed, at the bottlers, and to any employees working in or about water such boots to be supplied free of cost.

2.—Hours.

Shift Cellarmen: Forty hours shall constitute a week's work for shift cellarmen and the hours to be worked shall be:-

(a) Day shift-

Week days:

8 a.m. to 12 noon. 1 p.m. to 3.40 p.m.

One hour off between 12 noon and 1 p.m. for lunch.

Saturdays:

8 a.m. to 11 a.m.

12 noon to 3.40 p.m. One hour off between 11 a.m. and 12 noon for lunch.

(b) Afternoon shift:

 $4.20\,$ p.m. to 11 p.m. inclusive of $30\,$ minutes for crib Mondays to Saturdays.

(c) Night shift:

11.40 p.m. to 6.20 a.m. inclusive of 30 minutes each shift for crib-Mondays to Saturdays.

Shift Topmen: Shift topmen shall mean one, two or three sets of men engaged for the sole purpose of brewing and working shifts for five days each of eight hours from Monday to Friday inclusive the hours of work to be:-

1st. Shift-7.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m.

2nd Shift-3.30 p.m. to 11.30 p.m.

3rd Shift-11.30 p.m. to 7.30 a.m.

Other Workers: Forty hours shall constitute a week's work spread over five days from Monday to Friday inclusive eight hours per day, the working hours to be from 7.30 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

3.-Additional Allowances to Shift Workers and Casual Hands.

(a) All workers employed on regular afternoon and night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 10 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(b) Shift workers called on to work shifts without having been previously rostered shall be deemed "casual shift workers" and shall be paid an allowance for the first week only of $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. in addition to their ordinary rate of pay.

(c) The additional allowances mentioned in subclauses (a) and (b) hereof shall be taken into consideration when calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond eight (8) hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this Agreement.

(d) Casual hands shall be paid by the hour at the rate of ordinary pay plus five shillings (5s.) per day.

4.—Overtime.

If any employee works earlier than his starting time or later than his ordinary quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, each day to stand alone. The same rates shall be paid for Saturday work.

5.-Record Book.

The Company shall keep a record of the time of each employee of the time he starts and finishes each day and of the total amount of hours worked, and of the wages paid to each employee. Such record shall be open to the inspection of the Secretary or any person appointed by the employees' Union during working hours. Each employee shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

6.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays by employees in any department shall receive payment for the same double time rate. Workers who are required to work shift work shall be allowed one Sunday off in three.

7.—Holidays.

(a) All work performed by workers in any department on the undermentioned holidays shall be paid for at a rate equal to one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the ordinary rate of pay, and in addition such workers shall be paid one (1) day's pay for the holiday. All holiday shifts shall rotate. One ordinary day's pay shall be paid for the under-mentioned holidays to workers who do not work that day.

(b) The days to be observed as holidays according (b) The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Annual Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day and Sovereign's Birth-day. In case any of the above holidays fall on a Saturday or a Sunday another day shall be observed in liou thereof. in lieu thereof.

(c) It is agreed between the employer and union that in the event of any driver being called upon to work on holidays such driver is to be paid in accordance with subclause (a) per hour worked (a part of an hour to be paid for as a full hour) up to 10 a.m., and if such driver works after 10 a.m. he shall be paid for the full shift in accordance with subclauses (a) and (b).

(d) Any employee (excepting drivers) working any part of a shift shall be paid for the full shift in accordance with subclause (a).

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) An employer shall grant an employee who completes twelve (12) months' service three (3) weeks' annual leave; such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the employees and their respective employers between 1st March and 31st October in each year. The annual leave shall be in addition to the holidays mentioned in Clause 7 hereof.

An employer shall pay to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than one (1) month but less than three (3) months an amount equivalent to one and one-quarter (1_4) day's pay in respect of each completed month of service; and to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than three (3) months an amount equivalent to two and one-twelfth (2 1/12th) days' pay in respect of each completed month of service. The said payments shall be made to an employee entitled thereto:—

- (a) On the termination of his service if such termination occurs before he takes his annual leave; or
- (b) on the taking of his annual leave if he remains in the service of his employer.

An employer shall set aside and/or credit to an employee's account from time to time suffi-cient money to cover the said payments so that unless that employee's service be terminated earlier there will be available for him at the time he takes his annual leave a sum equivalent to two (2) weeks' double pay and one (1) week's single pay and apart from paying the money so set aside an employer shall not be obliged to make any payments to an employee in respect of his annual leave or in respect of the period during which such leave is actually taken.

(b) It shall be a condition of every worker taking annual leave that he— $\,$

- (i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
- (ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of leave; and
- (iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with Annual Leave.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a Medical Officer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

9.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker who is unable through sickness or accident to attend his duties shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty.

(b) A worker shall be entitled to sick pay in respect of any period of absence on account of sickness after the first day of January, 1948, on the basis of one half day's pay for each completed month served with the employer between the said first day of January, 1948, and the date of the commencement of such absence provided that in calculating the amount due to a worker in respect of any particular period of absence through sickness there shall be deducted therefrom any sum or sums previously paid to him hereunder.

(c) The term "sickness" shall not include any case where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof of his sickness satisfactory to his employer. This proof shall be in the form of a medical certificate if the absence is for three days or more. The employer shall have the right at any time to have the worker examined by a doctor on behalf of the employer.

(e) Except as aforesaid, a worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost through sickness or accident.

10.—No Contract or Piecework Shall be Permitted.

All work of any employee in the capacity as mentioned in this Agreement in or about a brewery or bottling works or in connection with the business of brewing or beer bottling shall be carried out departmentally by bona fide breweries' employees engaged and paid direct by the brewery proprietors and not by agents or contractors. This clause shall not apply to contractors erecting repairing or making alterations to building or machinery or to Carriers being engaged for the delivery of goods other than beer or empties or brewing materials as has been the practise or custom prior to this date. The employer agrees that such carriers employ only bona fide members of the Transport Workers' Union.

11.—Engagement.

The engagement between the employee and the employer shall be weekly; a week's notice from either party to terminate same except in the case of any employee absenting himself from duty, not obeying lawful commands or being guilty of misconduct or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempest or damage by the Queen's enemies when such agreement shall be terminated immediately.

12.-Discharge and Re-engaging Hands.

The question of dismissal and re-engagement of Union members shall be administered in a just and fair spirit according to the seniority of service but reserving to the employer the right to depart from the rule of seniority of service in circumstances where the employee is technically unqualified for the work, is incompetent or guilty of misconduct or in the opinion of the employer inconvenience would be occasioned to the employer owing to the inclusion in the dismissals of some essential man or the inability of the employer to re-engage some essential man. This clause to apply only to men of at least one year's continuous service. The following departments shall be considered as separate employment for the purpose of this clause:—

- (a) Bottle Department.
- (b) Brewery.
- (c) Delivery.

13.—Higher Duties.

No employee who has previously been in receipt of higher wages than arranged for in this schedule shall be reduced in wages under his present employment and shall receive a similar increase to all other employees.

14.—Under Rate Workers.

Any employee who considers himself unfit or not capable of earning the wages hereinbefore prescribed may be paid such less wages as may be agreed upon between the employer and the Secretary of the Union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twenty four hours after application has been made in writing to the Secretary of the Union the matter may be referred to the nearest Resident Magistrate for settlement. Any employee whose wage has been so fixed may work and be employed by any employer for such less wage for a period of six calendar months then next ensuing and thereafter until fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to such employee by the Secretary of the Union requiring his wages to be again fixed.

15.—Annual Bonus.

The employer shall pay to an employee receiving wages under this Agreement a bonus equal to one fiftysecond part of each weeks pay. The employer's liability shall become absolute at the end of each week of an employee's service. The said bonus shall be accumulated by the employer and held on behalf of and paid to the employee entitled thereto in the last week of December in each year or on the earlier termination of his service.

16.—Day Shift Workers.

All employees on day shift in or about a brewery or bottling works shall if required to work more than one hour overtime after the usual finishing time be entitled to knock off for one hour after the usual finishing time for refreshments. Any alteration to be by mutual arrangement.

17.-Leading Hands.

Where an employee is required to take a "leading position" he shall during the time he occupies such position receive the sum of £1 0s. 0d. per week in addition to his ordinary rate of pay.

18.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service. Provided, however, that where a worker has received long service leave under previous agreements on the basis of 13 weeks' leave after 25 years' service, he shall be entitled to a further six and one half $(6\frac{1}{2})$ weeks' leave on the completion of each 10 years continuous service after the date he first qualified for long service leave.

(i) Where a business has, whether before (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the trans-mittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior trans-(including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

- (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave; (b) any period following any termination of
 - the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations here-under in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
 - (c) any period during which the service of the
 - worker was or is interrupted by service—
 (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Oc-cupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 (ii) as a member of the Civil Construc-tion Corps established under the
 - National Security Act, 1939-1946; (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under
 - the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding-

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer:
- (d) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (e) any termination of the employment of the worker on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate Union business in respect of (g) which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (h) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence

or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be en-titled or deemed to be entitled shall be as pro-vided in this sub-clause.

(2) Subject to sub-clause b (2) where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be-

- (a) In respect of 20 years' service so com-pleted—13 weeks' leave.
- (b) In respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct.
- The amount of leave shall be:-
 - (i) If such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.
 - (ii) If such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof of the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 year's service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated-

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than
- serious misconduct; or (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the employee or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sick-ness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of a Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination.

The amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4)hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Agreement.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions bonuses allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In cases to which paragraph (2) of sub-clause (c) applies—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time as may be determined by a Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by a Board of reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Where a worker is beyond sixty years of age at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave he shall have the option of taking actual leave under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for long service leave.
 - (d) The employer shall have the right in cases of emergency to recall any worker from long service leave, in which case the unexpired leave shall be made up on some mutually convenient date.
 - (e) Any leave shall be exclusive of any public holidays or Annual Leave specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken.
 - (f) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:---
 - (i) In full before the worker goes on leave.
 - (ii) At the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
 - (g) It shall be a condition of every worker taking long service leave that he (or she)—
 - (i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
 - (ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of the leave; and
 - (iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with long service leave pay.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance, or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) above (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a Medical Officer appointed by the employer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

(h) In order to avoid confusion and embarrassment workers whilst on long service leave shall not, without the prior permission of the Officer in charge of the particular establishment, visit any of the premises of the employer except for the purpose of collecting pay or transacting genuine business with the employer's officers. Social visits shall not be indulged in. "Establishment" means any brewery, cooperage, or workshop but does not include hotels or annual picnics or sports or usual weekly competitive Sporting Activities.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought Into Account.

1. Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

2. Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Subject to subclause b (2) any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(i) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(ii) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

(h) Board of Reference.

In the event of any disputes arising on any matters herein the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference appointed by the parties to this Agreement and the Board shall determine all such disputes.

19.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the Eastern Goldfields District which district for the purpose of this Agreement shall mean that area enclosed by a circle drawn within a radius of 150 miles with the Kalgoorlie Post Office as the central point.

20.---Term.

This Agreement shall be for a term of twelve (12) months from the Seventeenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty eight.
