WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1951, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with

the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time by Proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh specified in the Proclamation to which immediately prior to the issue of the Proclamation the said Part III does not apply, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of 30 days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh runs or is situate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such runs or is situate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Ord River and its tributaries to which immediately prior to the issue of the Proclamation the said Part III does not apply; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister, and with the advice of the Commissioners, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1951, shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Ord River to and have effect in relation to the Ord River and all the tributaries thereof as shown marked and defined on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 37836, as kept in the Department of Public Works.

effected by Acts Nos. 30 of 1946 and 54 of 1947; and whereas by section 29F of the State Electricity Commission Act, 1945-1959, it is provided that subject to the approval of the Governor the Commission may from time to time amend any term or condition or both of the superannuation scheme constituted under section 29A of that Act: Now, therefore, the Commission being desirous of amending the terms and conditions of the said super-annuation scheme constituted under section 29A of the State Electricity Commission Act, 1945-1959, hereby resolves and determines that the said superannuation scheme be amended in such manner that subparagraph (1) of paragraph 7 of the terms and conditions of such scheme shall when so amended be as follows:

7.—Title to Superannuation Allowances.

(1) Every contributor who

- (a) shall have completed ten years' total service, and shall become incapable of discharging the duties of his office or employment with efficiency by reason of permanent ill-health or infirmity of mind or body; or
- (b) shall have attained any age between sixty-five and seventy years and have completed ten years' service; or
- (c) being a female contributor and having made an annual contribution to the superannuation fund of not less than six pounds per centum of so much of her annual salary as does not exceed eight hundred and thirty-two pounds per annum, shall have attained the age of sixty years,

shall be entitled, on resigning or otherwise ceasing to hold office or employment, to receive during life a superannuation allowance according to the scale provided by paragraph 8 (1) hereof, in the case of officers, and by paragraph 8 (2) hereof, in the case of wages employees.

Provided that the provisions of item (c) of this subparagraph shall apply only to those female contributors who within three months of the date of the publication in the Govern-ment Gazette of the amendment effected by that item elect to contribute at the rate specified in that item and do so contribute as from that date.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 11 of 1960.

Registered 27th January, 1960.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, of Western Australia, this 7th day of December, 1959, between the West Australian Local Government Officers' Association Union of Workers, (hereinafter called "the Association") of the one part and the Municipality of Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called "the Local Authority") of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be know as the Kalgoorlie Municipal Council Officers' Agreement, 1959.

2.—Arrangement.

- 1. Title.
- 2. Arrangement.
- 3. Area.
- 4. Scope
- 5. Definitions.
- 6. Resignations and Dismissals.
- 7. Hours of Duty.
- 8. Holidays.
- 9. Annual Leave.
- 10. Long Service Leave.
- 11. Overtime.
- 12. Minimum Salary of an Officer Acting in a Higher Grade or in a Dual or Multiple Capacity.
- 13. Sick Leave.
- 14. Travelling Expenses.
- 15. Preference to Seniority on Promotion.
- 16. Board of Reference.
- Term.
- 18. Salaries.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall extend over and include the boundaries of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie and any premises or land upon which any undertakings of the local authority are being carried on.

4.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers in the employment of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie but shall not include health inspectors.

5.—Definitions

"Officer" shall mean an employee eligible to be a member of the Association.

"Permanent Officer" for the purpose of this Agreement is one who is appointed by resolution of the local authority and is given notice of such appointment in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

"Town Clerk" shall mean the person appointed to that position in accordance with the Municipal Corporations Act and who may include in his duties the Secretaryship of the local Board of Health, Water Board, Sanitary Board or Drainage Board or of one or more of such Boards.

"Local Authority" shall mean the Municipality of Kalgoorlie.

"Engineer" shall mean an officer of the local Authority (excepting a works supervisor) who is required to prepare estimates and/or specifications and/or to set out, supervise or control and/or inspect the outside work of the local Authority.

"Works Supervisor" shall mean an officer who supervises, directs and controls outside work.

"Foreman" shall mean an officer other than engineer who supervises work under the direction of an engineer or works supervisor.

"Senior Typiste" shall mean an officer employed as a typiste who is over the age of 21 years.

6.—Resignations and Dismissals.

Terms of employment.—Subject to the provisions of the relevant Act or Acts for the time being in force the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) An officer being a Town Clerk, Engineer, Works Supervisor, Town Treasurer, Pool Manager, Traffic Inspector, Head Gardener, Electrical Engineer or Foreman shall not without the approval of the local Authority resign from his position until the expiration of one month's notice in writing of his intention to do so. All other officers to be required to give one week's notice
- (b) One month's notice shall be given by the local Authority to an officer whose services are no longer required provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct.
- (c) Temporary Officers. One (1) week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate a contract of service except where a temporary officer is engaged for a specified period or job.

7.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) Except as provided in subclauses (b) and (c) the hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday both inclusive with a break of one hour for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (b) The hours mentioned in subclause (a) may be varied by agreement between the local authority and the Association and where the duties appertaining to any officer cannot be efficiently carried out within the prescribed hours then in default of such agreement the hours of work shall be determined by the Board of Reference. Provided however, that the officer or officers concerned shall not be required to work (except subject to the provisions of the next following clause) a greater number of hours than those included in the hours specified in the said subclause (a).
- (c) The hours of duty of the Stores Clerk, foreman and overseers who exercise control over non-clerical workers shall be the same as those of the men over whom they exercise control.
- (d) The Caretaker shall work such hours as his duties require provided that such hours shall not exceed forty-four (44) per week without payment of overtime.

8.—Holidays.

The following holidays shall be granted and paid for namely:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labor Day, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Goldfields Cup Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and any other days that may be proclaimed as a public holiday in the Municipality or may be proclaimed as a holiday for persons employed in the Public Service or under the Public Service Act of the Government of Western Australia. When an officer at the direction of the Local Authority, works on any of the prescribed holidays he shall have the equivalent time added to his annual leave. This accumulation is limited to five (5) days in one year.

9.—Annual Leave.

- (a) After the completion of each year of continuous service all officers shall be entitled to and shall take a minimum of three week's annual recreation leave (exclusive of intervening holidays) on full pay. The leave shall be taken at a time mutually convenient to the officer and the local Authority at any time within six (6) months of its becoming due.
- (b) An officer not completing one year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to his length of service.
- (c) At least fourteen (14) days' notice shall be given to an officer by the local Authority before requiring him to take annual leave.

10.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All officers of the local Authority shall after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full time officers thereof be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the local Authority.

- (b) In calculating the length of service of any present officer for the purposes of this clause the following shall be deemed to be continuous service as a permanent full time officer of the local Authority:—
 - (i) Continuous service with the local Authority as a permanent officer immediately prior to the date hereof and after the 1st day of January, 1936.
 - (ii) In the case of an officer employed by the local Authority on a permanent full time basis immediately prior to entering thereon continuous full time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947
- (c) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed a break in the continuity of service and periods of absence on account of sickness up to but not exceeding three (3) months' duration in any one (1) year shall be included in the period of service.
- (d) Officers due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average rate of pay over the preceding twelve (12) months.
- (e) Any officer leaving the service of the local Authority on account of sickness or retrenchment or for any other cause which the local Authority in its discretion thinks reasonable after three (3) years or more continuous service as a permanent full time officer since the date of the commencement of service or since the date of which such officer last became entitled to long service leave hereunder as the case may be and the personal representatives of any deceased officer who dies after a period of service as aforesaid shall be entitled to be paid at the rate hereinbefore provided for such proportion of three (3) months as such period of service as aforesaid bears to ten (10) years.
- (f) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the officer for a further term and during such leave no officer shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Any contravention of the stipulation in this subclause contained shall entitle the local Authority to dismiss the officer from its service forthwith.

11.—Overtime.

- (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) all work done outside the hours specified in clause seven (7) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Executive Officers and heads of departments shall receive overtime as specified in paragraph (a) only for work of a special nature in excess of their normal duties.
- (c) Where an officer other than a departmental head or executive officer is required to be on duty on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 8 or on Saturdays or Sundays he shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (d) A minimum of two (2) hours shall be paid when overtime is worked.

12.—Minimum Salary of an Officer.

Acting in a Higher Grade or in a Dual or Multiple Capacity.

When an Officer-

(a) performs the duties of a position of a grade higher for a period of not less than one month than that to which he is appointed, he shall be paid whilst performing the duties of such position the salary awarded to such position. In the event of the absence of a departmental head, this paragraph shall apply to all classified officers who would be called upon as a matter of course to perform work of a higher grade.

- (b) carries out the duties of or occupies a dual office he shall be paid the salary pertaining to the higher office.
- (c) carries out the duties of or occupies more than two (2) positions he shall be paid in addition to the salary prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) hereof ten per centum of the salary of each of the other positions occupied whether the salary for such other position or positions is prescribed by this or another Agreement.

13.—Sick Leave.

In the event of absence from duty on account of personal sickness all officers shall be entitled to payment for such absence on full pay as follows:—Ten (10) days' full pay for each year of service with a maximum of sixty (60) days on production of a medical certificate that such leave is necessary.

14.—Travelling Expenses.

(a) The Local Authority will pay to its officers all reasonable travelling and hotel expenses incurred by an officer in the discharge of his duties on production of the necessary vouchers.

The method and mode of travelling or the vehicle to be supplied shall be mutually arranged between the local Authority and the officer concerned provided however that nothing herein contained shall impose an obligation on any officer to provide a method of conveyance at his own expense nor shall it be a condition precedent to the appointment of an officer that he shall provide a conveyance at his own expense.

- (b) When by arrangements the officer supplies his own conveyance there shall be added to his expenses the amount equal to fair rental value for the vehicle and an adequate amount for running costs.
- (c) If the parties cannot agree upon any question arising under subclauses (a) and (b) hereof the matter may be referred for settlement by either party concerned to the Board of Reference.

15.—Preference to Seniority on Promotion.

Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office preference to fill such vacancy may be given to the senior officer of that department regard being had to his efficiency and long service.

16.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement the functions of—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the whole and/or any of the provisions of the Agreement;
 - (ii) classifying and fixing wages rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.
 - (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of One Year.

18.-Salaries.

The following shall be the minimum rate of salaries payable to officers governed by this Agreement.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the manufacture of Fire Bricks and Tapestry Bricks.

4.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of eighty (80) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three years commencing as from the beginning of the first pay period after the date hereof.

6.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.
- (b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (c) The hours of work, except where shifts are worked, shall be performed as follows:—Monday to Friday inclusive, between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

7.-Shift Work.

Where two (2) or more shifts in any one day are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference. The penalty rate for shift work shall be 5% for afternoon and 10% for night shift.

8.—Overtime.

- (a) Work performed beyond eight (8) hours on Monday to Friday inclusive, or beyond forty (40) hours in any one week, or except in the case of shift work, before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be deemed as overtime.
- (b) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, except in the case of burners, where overtime shall be paid for at ordinary time rates.
- (c) All work performed on Sundays and the holidays prescribed in clause 16 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
 - (ii) no organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

- (d) Pieceworkers:
 - (i) An employer may make a contract with a drawer for payment by results by piecework.
 - (ii) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a drawer of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours, at least the

minimum time rate of pay recognised by custom for such week's work: Provided that, where a drawer works part of a full week at piecework rates, and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under such piecework rates, plus the proportionate amount which he is entitled to receive at time rates of pay recognised by custom.

- (iii) A drawer working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay recognised by custom for drawers.
- (iv) In the event of any dispute regarding piecework rates occurring and remaining unsettled between the employer and a drawer, the employer or the Union may refer such dispute to the Board of Reference.

10.-Mixed Functions.

- (a) A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher rate than his usual rate of pay, shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for the period that he is actually engaged upon such work.
- (b) A worker called upon to do work carrying a lower rate than his usual rate of pay, for less than one half a day, shall be paid for such work at his usual rate of pay.

11.—Under-Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

12.—Payment of Wages.

- (a) All wages shall be paid on the job within twenty (20) minutes of the close of the day's work at least once a fortnight.
- (b) When a worker is discharged, or leaves his employment legally, at or before the usual time, he shall be paid all wages due to him within one day of ceasing work.

13.—Minimum Engagement.

Except as provided in clause 15, any worker engaged, under the terms of this Award shall be paid a minumum of three (3) hours' pay.

14.—Contract of Service.

One day's notice shall (with the exception of waste, sand and bag boys, in whose case one week's notice shall be required) be necessary to terminate the engagement of all workers. In the event of an employer or a worker failing to give the required notice one day's wages shall be paid or forfeited. Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, for misconduct, or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

15.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or any other Union or Association, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

16.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to clause 8, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Any worker absenting himself from work on the whole or any portion of the working day preceding or on the whole or any portion of the working day succeeding a holiday provided for herein shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.
- (d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, with such employer.
- (e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holiday or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to sub-clause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

17.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided, that subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.
- (b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore pre-scribed shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

18.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing-

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day by him;
- (d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him:
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union not more than once weekly, between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

19.—Notices.

Notices relating to meetings in connection with the Union shall be allowed to be exhibited in each yard. A printed copy of the conditions of this Award shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each yard.

20.-General.

- (a) Except where rubber-tyred vehicles are used plates or planks shall be provided for all wheelers wheeling into the kiln in all places except where the ground to be wheeled on is hard.
- (b) The employer shall provide oilskins to all workers whose work makes it necessary for them to work out in the rain.

21.—First-Aid.

Every yard shall be equiped with a First-aid outfit, and such outfit shall be kept in a suitable place not more than three hundred (300) yards from the place of employment.

22.-Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference consisting of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award the functions of to this Award, the functions of-
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award, or any of them:
 - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

23.-Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st day of April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service.
- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the 1st day of April, 1958, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes on employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittenthat business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.
- (ii) In this sub-clause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
 - (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
 - (b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employ-
 - (c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations here-under in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
 - (d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service-
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia overnt in the wealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act 1903-1956 and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act 1951 (as amended):

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediatey before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding-
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer:
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State

- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute.
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in repect of which he has requested and been refused leave:
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this sub-clause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—
 - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

- the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.
- (5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.
 - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like;
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought Into Account.

- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
- (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
- (4) An employer shall be entitled to off-set any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

- (h) Special Board of Reference.
- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a Chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April 1958 shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may be subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this Clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

24.—Liberty.

Liberty is reserved to either party to apply for a variation of the provisions of Clause 16 of this Award.

- (d) Three shillings (3s.) per day extra shall be paid to workers cleaning a bitumen tank or boiler.
- (e) Workers removing or burying liquid or solid offensive matter or swill shall be paid at the appropriate sanitary rate.
- (f) (i) Leading hands placed in charge of not less than three (3) or more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per week above the rate of wage of the workers whose work they direct.
- (ii) Leading hands placed in charge of more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid two pounds and sixpence (£2 0s. 6d.) per week above the rate of wage of the workers whose work they
- (g) The wage of any worker temporarily taking over the duties of another worker shall not be reduced whilst he is so employed.
- (h) Drivers who in addition to the hours of which the week is comprised are required to feed horses shall be paid as under in addition to their ordinary wage:
 - (i) Monday to Friday inclusive—per horse per day, 1s. 9d.
 - (ii) Saturday, Sunday and prescribed holi-days—for one horse, 6s.; for each additional horse, 4s.

- (i) A horse driver who is required to harness or groom a horse or horses outside his ordinary hours shall be paid for such work at overtime rates.
- (j) Any worker using explosives shall be paid whilst using such explosives not less than the rate prescribed for a powder monkey.
- (k) (i) Except in the case of night watchmen, night stablemen and male attendants at public latrines, workers working shift work outside the ordinary hours of duty shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to their ordinary rates.
- (ii) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as afternoon or night shift unless in either case five (5) consecutive afternoons or nights are worked, but shall be deemed overtime. On completion of the fifth (5th) consecutive afternoon's or night's work the worker shall be deemed to have been employed on afternoon or night shift as the case may be during the preceding four (4) afternoons or nights and thereafter any subsequent consecutive afternoons or nights he is so required.

The sequence of shift work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraphs by reason of the fact that work is not performed on a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday.

- Any worker who is called upon to clean out a septic tank and who is required to enter a septic tank to perform such work shall receive not less than the rate prescribed for pan removers plus two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per hour whilst so engaged: Provided that if such work is performed by mechanical means such worker shall be paid the rate prescribed for pan removers. Gum boots, masks and overalls shall be supplied by the employer to workers engaged on such work.
- (m) Any worker handling wet sewerage sludge shall be paid the rate prescribed for pan removers.
- (n) Pipe jointers, pipe setters, timbermen and others included in clause 28, subclause (b) (vii) or workers employed in shafts when working between six (6) feet and twenty (20) feet below the surface shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra. - (c) Work done on the days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Cup Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day shall be paid for at double time rate, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days: Provided that the employer may pay for work done on the abovementioned days at ordinary time rate and add one day (or in connection with repairs aforesaid, half a day) to the worker's annual leave for each day so worked.
- (d) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this $\mbox{\sc Award:---}$
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
 - (ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause

10.-Shift Work.

- (a) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift five per cent. (5%) and for night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate. These rates shall be replaced by those specified in subclause 9 (c) and subclause (c) hereof where work is done during ordinary working hours on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.
- (b) Where a worker works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift at least one week out of three, he shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (c) Work required to be performed on Saturdays or Sundays as part of the ordinary working hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

11.—Casual Workers.

- (a) A casual worker shall mean and include a worker competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of one (1) week from and including the date he starts work.
- (b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates set out above.

12.—Contract of Service.

Except as provided by clause 11 all employment shall be by the week.

13.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker, by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) Seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one weeks' leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof. Where a worker with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof increased by one twelfth of a week for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
- (c) If any prescribed holidays fall within a worker's period of Annual leave and is observed on a day which is the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (d) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service, or in the case of a worker referred to in subclause (b) hereof, such payment shall be one-quarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each such month he is so engaged.
- (e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause
- (g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to Compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of three (3) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (e) Notwithstanding the provisons of subclause (c) hereof, a worker, who in any calender year has already been allowed paid sick leave, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.

15.—Time and Wages Record.

A time record shall be kept by each employer in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week; the said record shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the ordinary office hours and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

16.—Meal Allowance.

Where a worker, without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, or (in the case of a day worker) after 5.30 p.m. he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid five shillings (5s.) in lieu thereof. Provided that this clause shall not apply to a worker who can conveniently return home for a meal.

17.—Posting of Award.

The employer shall keep any copy of the Award supplied by the Union posted in a conspicuous place in the engine room.

13.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Award, no time of duty shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

19.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

20.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman, and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) There are assigned to such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award the functions of—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the award or any of them;

- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

21.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All full time workers after serving the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder continuously for ten (10) years will be entitled, subject to the following conditions, to three (3) month's long service leave on full pay, to be granted at the convenience of the Employer.

In regard to workers engaged at the date of this Award with the Boulder Municipal Council, continuous service as from 1st January, 1936, shall be deemed to be service for the purpose of this Award, provided also that full time service with the armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September, 1939 and the date of this Award shall be deemed to be service for the purpose of this Award. Provided also that any worker leaving the service of the employer, who has served continuously for at least three (3) years next before his retirement, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of retirement. Provided also that any worker leaving the service of the Boulder Municipal Council at any time subsequent to the initial period of ten (10) years shall be entitled to payment for long service leave pro rata for such period. Such period or periods of continual service shall not count for the purpose of calculating long service leave if the worker is out of the employ of the Boulder Munipal Council for any period exceeding six (6) months at any one time, for any reason other than sickness or retrenchment.

- (b) Workers will be similarly entitled to a further period of (3) three months long service leave for every subsequent ten (10) years service.
- (c) Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. During long service leave no worker shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this condition will be followed by dismissal.
- (d) Workers shall be paid their salary in advance at the rate of pay equal to the average daily rate over the preceding twelve (12) months.
- (e) Any worker who is eligible for long service leave and who resigns, or is retired from the service of the employer, shall be paid for such long service leave due.
- (f) If a deceased worker would have been entitled to long service leave at the date of his death the amount of payment in lieu thereof shall be paid on claim to the next-of-kin.
- (g) Payment for long service leave shall not be made if a worker is dismissed for malpractice, misconduct or theft.

22.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved by both parties to the Award to make application for amendment at any time, to amend Clause 6—Wages.
