## Native Welfare Act, 1904-1954. Reserve for Natives. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor.

BY His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Vic-torlan Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Com-panion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1904-1954, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives is a section of the provided that the section of th whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Beverley: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of land, containing approximately 4 acres 2 roods, known as Beverley Lot 333, to be a Re-serve for Natives. (Reserve No. 25531.)
