(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked by day workers, prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time, and all time worked on Saturday shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All time worked by shift workers prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time and all time worked after 11 a.m. on Saturday shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:—

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

8.—Sunday and Holiday Work.

All work performed on Sunday, or the holidays prescribed in clause 6 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

9.—Proportion of Juniors.

The employer shall be entitled to employ one junior and, thereafter additional juniors may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every four (4) or fraction of four (4) workers in receipt of the full adult rate of pay.

10.—Mixed Functions.

A worker engaged for more than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

11.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the following particulars:—

- (a) The name of the worker.
- (b) The class of work performed by each worker.
- (c) The wages and overtime (if any) paid to each worker.
- (d) The time during which the worker has been employed.
- (e) The ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union, not more than once weekly, during the business hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

12.—Under Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage, as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

13.—Junior Workers Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled, he shall make restitution to the employer.

14.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-twelfth ($1/12$ th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

15.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to the Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.—Meal Money.

A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

17.—Notice Board.

An accredited representative of the Union shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award or any notice of the Union not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement in this connection the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

18.—Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or the Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or Union or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

19.—Shift Work.

Workers employed on afternoon shift shall be paid five per cent. (5%) extra. Workers employed on night shift shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) extra.

20.—Hours.

(a) Day Work.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked eight (8) hours daily, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Shift Work.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours each to be paid for at ordinary rates.

21.—Special Rates and Provisions.

(a) All workers handling greasy dead wool before treatment or carrying treated product from the front of the treatment machine shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(b) Workers engaged on dag and/or teasing machine working greasy pied wool or dag wool shall be paid threepence (3d.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(c) All workers employed in the machinery department in the treatment of heavy dusty backs and or broken (under 30% yield) and card wastes shall be paid 9d. per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(d) A worker in charge of a press doing clerical work shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift extra for the clerical work involved.

(e) Ankle rubber boots shall be provided for centre men on scouring machines and workers on greasy auto feed boxes.

(f) Goggles shall be supplied to drying machine hands.

(g) A set of goggles and aprons shall be supplied for each treatment machine.

(h) All workers in the fellmongery section, except those classing and handling dry sheepskins, shall be supplied with gloves, waterproof aprons, knee high rubber boots, thigh boots (for pit workers if necessary).

(i) All workers handling digested skin pieces from pie tanks before treatment or washing shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(j) Pullers classing to quality and pelt classers shall receive one shilling (1s.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(k) Shift boss shall be paid three shillings (3s.) per shift extra.

(d) Casual hands shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

23.—Tools of Trade.

The employer shall provide all necessary tools of trade used in the industry of fellmongering as well as goggles, aprons, gloves and (where pit work is done) rubber boots.

24.—Junior Workers.

No junior worker shall be employed trucking or handling baled wool. No junior worker under the age of sixteen (16) years shall be permitted to work between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

25.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Casual workers shall be paid within fifteen (15) minutes of their services being dispensed with and at the office of the place where the work has been performed.

(b) An employer may, in respect of a weekly employee and where it has been customary to do so, keep two (2) days pay in hand.

26.—Contract of Service.

(a) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminated by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side.

(b) One week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate the employment of a weekly hand or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(c) Provided that nothing contained in this clause shall affect the right of an employer to dismiss a worker without notice for misconduct.

(d) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice. The minimum engagement for a casual hand shall be four (4) hours.

27.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

Clause 28.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave:

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service:

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transferee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transferee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transferee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

(a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.

- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
 - (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
 - (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
 - (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
 - (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer

during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave:

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—
 - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

- (5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.
- (d) Payment for Period of Leave:
 - (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;
- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay—
- shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.
- (e) Taking Leave:
- In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—
 - Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
 - No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
 - In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.
- (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought Into Account:
- Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
 - Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
 - Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
 - An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.
- (g) Records to be Kept:
- Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave

and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference:

- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
(b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.—(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof, conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.—The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.—Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

I certify pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and BP (Kwinana) Proprietary Limited, Respondent.

HAVING heard Mr. H. Barry on behalf of the applicant and Mr. G. (a) Day Workers.—Except as hereinafter provided, the ordinary hours of work other than when working on watches, shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked between Monday to Friday inclusive, in shifts of eight (8) consecutive hours between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

(b) Shift Workers.—The ordinary working hours (other than when working on watches) shall not exceed 40 in any week, to be worked in five shifts of eight hours each inclusive of a twenty-minute crib time, which shall be taken in relays at such times as not to cause a stoppage of work. For the purpose of this clause a week means the pay week.

Liberty is reserved to the parties to apply for the provisions of an 80-hour fortnight.

(c) When a tug proceeds to sea, the employer may work the crew in watches, which may be set and commenced from the time the vessel leaves the berth or anchorage to proceed to sea.

(d) Outside the hours of labour and without payment for overtime, any work shall be done that is required for the safety of the tug.

3. Clause 9—Overtime.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

9.—Overtime (other than Continuous Shift Workers).

(a) Except as hereinafter mentioned, all work performed in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and all work performed on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. Provided that all work performed after noon on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) All work performed on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in subclause 12 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.

(d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.

(e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his vessel or place of employment (whether notified before or after leaving such premises), he shall be paid for at least three hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period, but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three hours for which payment has been made an additional payment shall not be made nor shall any extra overtime be paid in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his vessel or place of employment to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

(f) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.

(g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(h) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.

(i) This clause shall not apply to crews working on watches or ship-keeping.

4. Clause 9A—Continuous Shift Workers.—Add after clause 9 of the Award the following new clause:—

9A.—Continuous Shift Workers.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours as prescribed shall be paid for at the rate of double time, except where a worker is called upon to work a regularly rostered overtime shift, when the rate shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on any of the holidays prescribed in subclause 12 (a) or on Sundays in excess of the hours prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work. This shall not apply to the week-end penalty rates prescribed in clause (11) hereof.

(d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.

(e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his vessel (whether notified before or after leaving such vessel), he shall be paid for at least three hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period; but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three hours for which payment has been made, an additional payment shall not be made nor shall any extra overtime be paid in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his vessel to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

(f) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked, except that when the employer has received at least twelve (12) hours' notice of such absence, double time shall be paid.

(g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(h) This clause shall not apply to crews working on watches or ship-keeping.

5. Clause 10—Shift Work.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

10.—Shift Work.

(a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one week on day shift out of each consecutive three weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter. Provided that if he is required to work for more than one week consecutively on afternoon shift or for more than one week consecutively on night shift, such a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second and subsequent weeks of afternoon shift or of night shift.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers employed on what is known as the Standard Refinery Roster nor to workers to whom this subclause would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to private arrangements with another worker.

(b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift seven and a half per cent. (7½%) and for night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate.

(c) (i) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.

(ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

(d) (i) A worker who replaces a regular shift worker who is absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive shifts and the appropriate shift work rate if he works five or more shifts consecutively.

(ii) A worker who replaces on afternoon or night shift a regular shift worker who is absent by reason of a direction of the employer shall be paid at overtime rates unless he works the number of consecutive shifts prescribed in the next preceding paragraph.

(iii) The sequence of consecutive shifts shall not be deemed to be broken under paragraph (i) by reason of rostered days off in respect to workers employed on continuous process work or by a Saturday or Sunday in respect to other workers or by any public holiday or any other reason beyond the control of the employer.

(iv) A worker who does not work five (5) consecutive shifts for any reason beyond the control of the employer shall not be entitled to payment under the provisions of this subclause.

(e) Where a shift commences at or after 11 p.m., then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

6. Clause 11—Week-end Penalty Rates.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

11.—Week-end Penalty Rates.

All work performed during the ordinary working hours on Saturdays, Sundays or the holidays prescribed in subclause 12 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. These rates shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowances prescribed in clause 10 hereof.

7. Clause 12—Holidays.—Add to this clause a new subclause (h) as follows:—

(h) Seven-day shift workers, that is, shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one (1) week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (b) hereof. Where a worker with twelve (12) months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two (2) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (b) hereof increased by one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

8. Clause 13—Absence Through Sickness.—Add to this clause the following new subclauses (d), (e) and (f), as follows:—

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who, in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be

claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(f) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, subclause (e) hereof shall be deemed to become operative as from the date of operation of this amendment.

9. Clause 24—Maximum Rate.—Add after clause 23 the following new clause:—

24.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.
