Child Welfare Act, 1947-1959. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1959, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court, and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the appointments of Frank Lucas and Roger Wyman Clark as Members of the Children's Court at Carnamah, and doth hereby appoint the persons named in the Schedule hereto to be Members of the Children's Courts at the places mentioned.

Traffic Act, 1919-1959. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Police T.O. 59/580.

WHEREAS by virtue of section 71 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1959, that Act and regulations made thereunder apply *inter alia* to persons and vehicles

in the public service of the Crown, or of any local authority but do not apply to any vehicle or class of vehicle or person or class of person to the extent of such exemption as may from time to time be declared by the Governor by Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 71 of the Act doth hereby declare that the class of vehicle specified in the Schedule hereto is exempt from the operation of all regulations in force and made from time to time under the provisions of the Act relating to brakes, lamps and lighting equipment except those regulations relating to any reflector or reflectors with which a vehicle is required to be equipped when used on a road.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers employed in the classifications set out in Clause 6 hereof in in the classifications set out in Clause 6 hereof in butter and cheese factories, milk condenseries, and establishments in which persons are permitted under the Milk Act of W.A. 1932-46 to treat milk either of their own production or on behalf of other producers or milk vendors, provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any award of the Court of Arbitration or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952. 1912-1952.

4.—Area.

This Award shall operate over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

5.—Term

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

7.-Additional Rates.

Milk Condenseries Section.

- (a) Washers of Vacuum Pans shall be allowed fourpence each flying clean or one shilling each full clean in addition to their ordinary weekly wage.
- (b) Workers handling coal and emptying ash pits shall be allowed fourpence per hour in addition to their ordinary weekly wage.
- (c) Workers employed stacking tin plate or unloading tin plate shall be allowed threepence per hour in addition to their ordinary weekly wage.

8.-Casual Workers.

Any worker dismissed through no fault of his own before the expiration of one (1) week of his employment shall be considered casual and shall receive ten per cent. (10%) above the rate specified for the work performed.

9.-Leading Hands.

Any male worker appointed by his employer as a leading hand in charge of three or more other workers shall be paid fifteen shillings per week in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

This clause shall not apply to any worker who in carrying out his duties is required to direct other workers.

10.-Hours.

- (a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) in any one day and shall be worked on any five days of the week. Except in the case of shift workers the ordinary hours shall be worked between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. in Cheese Factories and Milk Treatment Plants and between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. in Butter and Milk Condensery Factories.
- (b) A meal break of not more than one (1) hour nor less than thirty (30) minutes shall be granted each day.
- (c) Where three (3) shifts are worked over the twenty-four hours of each day a crib break of twenty (20) minutes shall be allowed during the ordinary working hours and shall be taken at the employer's convenience.
- (d) No worker shall be compelled to work more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.
- (e) Shifts in which the ordinary working hours are not continuous except as provided in subclauses (b) and (d) hereof shall be known as broken shifts and are to be worked within a spread of fourteen hours provided that such shifts shall finish not later than 10 p.m.

11.—Overtime.

- (a) For all work done beyond the ordinary hours of duty, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter except in the case of work done beyond a spread of fourteen hours on broken shifts when payment shall be made at the rate of double time.
- (b) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—
 - (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day's work shall stand alone.
- (e) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts.
- (f) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(g) All time worked on Sundays which is outside the ordinary working hours shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

12.—Saturday and Sunday Rates.

- (a) All work performed during the ordinary working hours on a Saturday shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter and on a Sunday shift at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) For the purposes of subclause (a) hereof a Saturday or Sunday shift shall be deemed to be any shift which commences between midnight Friday and midnight Saturday or midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday respectively irrespective of the number of hours worked on such days.
- (c) The rates prescribed in this clause shall be paid in substitution for and not in addition to the shift allowances prescribed in Clause 14 hereof.

13.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to subclause (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day
- (b) All work done on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the erdinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this clause for each day or part of a day so worked. Provided that, if by agreement between the employer and the worker or as a result of the worker's own default, only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day, an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day. Provided further that at the option of the employer, the foregoing provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if all work performed on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) hereof is paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.
- (e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply
- (k) Notwithstanding the foregoing the following provisions shall apply to all milk treatment plants situated within a 15-mile radius of the G.P.O. Perth-
 - (i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of three and two-thirds (33rds) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
 - (ii) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid eleven-thirty-sixths (11/36ths) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
 - (iii) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
 - (iv) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
 - (v) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Shift Work.

- (a) An employer may, if he so desires, work his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Union and of the intended starting and finishing times of ordinary working hours of the respective shifts.
- (b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift five per cent. and for night shift and broken shifts ten per cent. in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (c) Any worker who commences his ordinary hours between 5 a.m. and 6 a.m. in Cheese Factories and Milk Treatment Plants and between 5 a.m. and 7 a.m. in Butter and Milk Condensery Factories shall be deemed to be employed on early morning shift and be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (d) For the purpose of this Award and except as provided elsewhere herein:-
 - "Afternoon shift" means any shift finishing after 6 p.m.
 - "Night shift" means any shift finishing after midnight.

15.-Sick Leave.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

16.—Contract of Service.

- (a) All employees shall be engaged either as weekly or casual employees: Provided that an employer may engage a new employee as a casual and may alter the engagement to a weekly one at any time up to the pay day immediately following the day of engagement. If an employer so alters the engagement he shall only be liable to pay the employee concerned the proportion of the weekly rate calculated on the basis of the time worked.
- (b) A week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate the employment of a weekly hand or, in lieu of notice, by the payment or forfeiture, as the case may be, of a week's wages.
- (c) Provided this shall not affect the right of an employer to dismiss an employee without notice for misconduct.

17.-Mixed Functions.

A worker engaged for more than half (1) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for not more than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

18.—Right of Entry.

Accredited representatives of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers on the business premises of the employer during non-working times or meal breaks.

In the case of a dispute between the Union and an employer which is likely to lead to a cessation of work or to an application to the Court and which involves the inspection of workers or of machines in the process of production, such union representatives shall have right of entry into the factory at any time during which the workers or machines concerned are working.

19.—Time and Wages Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record in which shall be entered weekly:-
 - (i) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies;
 - (ii) the nature of the work performed;(iii) the hours worked each day;

 - (iv) the amount of wages and overtime (if any) received by the worker each week;
 (v) the ages of the junior workers.
- (b) The said record shall be signed by the worker if correct.
- (c) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the said record which shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during ordinary working hours and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

20.—Protective Clothing.

- (a) If a worker is required to wear rubber boots, waterproof apron, overall, or a uniform, the employer shall provide same free for use by the worker. Such rubber boots, waterproof apron, overall or uniform shall remain the property of the employer and shall be returned when required, in good order and condition, fair wear and tear excepted.
- (b) Should any dispute arise under subclause (a) of this clause, the matter shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

21.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained herein, the maximum rate payable under this Award shall be double time.

Board of Reference.

- (a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—
 - (i) adjusting any matter of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
 - (ii) dealing with any other matter which the court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

23.-Under-Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

24.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

25.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following:—

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.

This certificate shall be signed by the worker. No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age or period of employment with a previous employer being wrongly stated on the certificate.

26.-Limitation of Work of Juniors.

Juniors shall not be employed on any of the work classified in Clause 6 subclause (b) Items 1 to 6 inclusive, 11 to 13 inclusive, 15 to 24 inclusive and 26 to 28 inclusive, except by agreement between the Union and the employer.

27.—Long Service Leave.

- (a) Right to Leave:
 - A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.
- (b) Long Service:
 - (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
 - (2) Such service shall include service prior to the first day of April, 1958 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.
 - (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the first day of April, 1958, been transmitted from an employer

(herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes tranfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include:-

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave:

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—
 - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated:—
 - (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or

(iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and parttime workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;
- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances, or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave:

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:-
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave:
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case pay-ment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an ad-dress specified by the worker;
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.
- (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account:
 - (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
 - (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a pro-portionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
 - his employment or prior thereto entitled.

 (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed

- to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent there-of of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
- (4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowsuperannuation ance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.
- (g) Records to be Kept:
 - Records to be Kept:
 Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave any leave which may have been granted any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
 - (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.
- (h) Special Board of Reference:
 - (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
 - (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of-
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
 - (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.
- (i) State Law:
- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance here-
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law

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as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions:

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply:

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

Provided that such additional work shall not prevent them having continual supervision over their engine and/or boiler, and provided further that an engine driver or firemen required to attend to a refrigerating compressor shall have added to his margin the sum of nineteen shillings (19s.) per week. Notwithstanding the foregoing any firemen whose normal duties do not involve attending to a refrigerating compressor over five (5) days per week shall be paid in lieu of the above amount the sum of three shillings and ten pence (3s. 10d.) for each or part thereof so engaged.

- (a) A worker (except a worker on piecework or a casual worker) shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to sub-clause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year.
- (b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (e) hereof, a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in sub-clause (a) of this clause which has not been allowed in any year to any worker by his employer

as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this sub-clause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers engaged in the classifications in clause 10 hereof employed by the respondents in the processing of cravfish in shore establishments.

4.—Area.

This Award shall apply throughout the State of Western Australia.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.-Hours.

Subject to clause 8 hereof, each worker shall work such hours per week as may be necessary to process all crayfish delivered to the factory at such times most convenient to the employer's business.

7.—Meal Interval.

No worker shall be employed for a longer period than five (5) hours without a break for a meal. The time allowed for each meal required shall not be more than one (1) hour.

8.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked by weekly hands in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) If any worker is required to continue working without being notified the previous day, for more than two (2) hours beyond a normal meal period, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid five shilling (5s.) in lieu thereof.

Provided that the provisions of this subclause shall not apply to a worker who can reasonably return home for a meal.

- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:-
 - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

9.-Piecework.

- (a) An employer may make a contract with a worker or a group of workers for payment by results by piecework,
- (b) Provided that a worker employed under such a system shall be paid at least the time rate of pay provided by this Award for the hours worked.
- (c) In the event of any dispute regarding piecework rates occurring and remaining unsettled between the employer and the workers, the employer or the Union may refer such dispute to the Board of Reference.

- (g) Casual Workers—Junior Males & Females—Junior workers engaged as casual workers shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in subclauses (e) and (f) of this clause.
- (h) "Grader" shall mean the worker who holds a license as a Grader from the Department of Primary Industries and who is the worker responsible for the packing and correct quality of processed crayfish.
- (i) The hourly rates as set out in subclauses 10 (d) (i), (ii) and (iii) are subject to adjustment in accordance with any variations in the basic wage which may be ordered by the Court from time to time.

11.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Employers shall when engaging workers state definitely whether such worker is engaged as a weekly or a casual hand.
- (b) One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required to terminate the engagement of a weekly hand.
- If an employer or a worker fails to give the required notice one (1) week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.
- (c) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave his employer's service at any moment without notice.

12.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

- (b) All work performed on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Provided that at the option of the employer equivalent time off duty in lieu thereof may be added to the worker's annual leave.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.
- (e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

13.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year.

Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each such Board shall consist of a Chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by regulations.

There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of-

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

15.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least weekly.

16.-Under Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers upon being engaged shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled he shall make restitution to the employer.

18.—Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a record or records containing the following particulars:
 - (i) Name of each worker and whether he is a weekly or a casual worker.
 - (ii) The nature of his work.

 - (iii) The hours worked each week. (iv) The wages and overtime (if any) paid each week.
 - (v) The age of each junior worker.

Any system of automatic recording by machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours at the employer's office or other convenient place, and the representative may be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

19.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

20.—General Provisions.

No female under the age of eighteen (18) years shall be required to lift weights in excess of 30lb., and no female worker over eighteen (18) years of age shall be required to lift weights in excess of 35lb,

Where workers are required to work in water suitable floor covering shall be provided or adequate footwear shall be supplied by the employer.

21.—Right of Entry.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal interval, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one week.

22.—Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award, if supplied by the Union, shall be posted in a place easily accessible to all workers.

23.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

24.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave:

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

- - (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
 - (2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service.
 - (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transmitter") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.
 - (ii) In this sub-clause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
 - (4) Such service shall include—
 - (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service
 - (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment;
 - (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the empleyer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
 - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth

Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act 1903-1956 and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

- (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act 1939-1946;
- (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act 1951 (as amended);

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
 - (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
 - (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
 - (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
 - (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave:

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this sub-clause.

- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall
 - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated:—
 - (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct:

the amount of leave shall be:-

- (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination:

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

- (5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.
- (d) Payment for Period of Leave:
 - (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave:
 - (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award (or agreement), but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;
 - (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave:

- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like:
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave:

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (e) applies—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award (or agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker;
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
 - (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall.

upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

- (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be brought into account:
 - (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
 - (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
 - (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extern thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
 - entitlement of the worker hereunder.

 (4) An employer shall be entitled to off-set any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the date hereof.

(g) Records to be Kept:

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award (or agreement) with respect to the Time and Wages Record.
- (h) Special Board of Reference:
 - (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of-
 - (a) The settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Wes-tern Australian Employers' Federation tern Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a Chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law:

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the date hereof shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions:

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply:

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.
