IN pursuance of the provisions of Section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the

portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st April, 1960, to 31st March, 1965, inclusive.

#### Schedule.

1. The whole of the waters of the Arthur River and the Balgarup River extending downwards from their sources to their junctions with the Blackwood River.

2. Also, all the waters of the Blackwood River extending downwards from the junction of the Arthur River and the Balgarup River to the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Sussex Location 133.
