TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1958.

Quairading Road Board.

Traffic By-laws.

Police T.O. 58/460.

THE Quairading Road Board, in pursuance to an Order in Council made under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1958, published in the *Government Gazette*, 5th June, 1959, doth hereby repeal the Traffic By-laws gazetted on the 15th March, 1935 and 31st July, 1953, and make and publish the following by-laws to have effect within the townsite of Quairading in the Quairading Road District.

1. The areas designated Zone 1 and Zone 2 hereunder are set aside as prescribed parking stands for vehicles.

Zone 1.

Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of Heal Street in line with the eastern boundary of Cubbine Street, marked by a sign post, and continuing along the southern boundary of Heal Street in an easterly direction for 415 feet, to a point marked by a sign post; thence south-west for a distance of 169 feet to the Railway fence line; thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 355 feet along the Railway fence line; thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 119 feet to the firstmentioned sign post on the southern boundary of Heal Street.

Zone 2.

The area, designated by signs being 132 feet in width and 156 feet in length at the western approach to the Quairading Swimming Pool on reserve No. 15546.

(a) A person shall not park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on Zone 1 above other than facing north or south.

(b) A person shall not park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on those portions of the prescribed parking stands in Zone 1 and 2 above which are set aside as traffic lanes or ways.

2. A person shall not park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on the south side of Heal Street.

3. A person shall not park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle within a distance of 15 feet of any petrol pump situated on the footpath on the northern side of Heal Street, neither shall he cause to remain stationary within 15 feet of such a petrol pump except for the purpose of supplying petrol into the tanks connected with the petrol pumps or of obtaining a supply of petrol from the pump.

4. Subject to Traffic Regulation 183 of the Traffic Regulations, 1954, a person shall not park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle in Heal Street or Jennaberring Road for a period longer than two hours during the following times:—Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

5. A person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than £20.

1. In these regulations the Education Regulations, 1949, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th July, 1949, as amended from time to time thereafter, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 47B the following regulation:—

47B. (1) A teacher who lives away from home and is required to pay board in excess of six pounds (£6) per week is entitled to and shall be paid by way of an allowance the amount by which the board exceeds five pounds (£5) per week, subject to the conditions that—

- (a) the allowance does not exceed two pounds (£2) per week;
- (b) the allowance is not payable in respect of board during the schools' Christmas vacation;
- (c) the teacher makes a statutory declaration that suitable accommodation at a lower cost is not available and the District Superintendent certifies that such is the case;
- (d) the allowance is payable for a maximum period of two school years, but is payable for not more than one school year in respect of a continuous appointment in the same school or the same locality;
- (e) the allowance is not payable to a teacher holding an appointment in a school situated within a radius of thirty miles of the Town Hall at Perth, except in special cases approved by the Minister; and
- (f) the allowance is not payable to a teacher in receipt of a salary of one thousand one hundred pounds (£1,100) per annum or over.

(2) A married teacher who takes up an appointment necessitating the transfer of his home and finds it necessary to obtain boarding accommodation while seeking a home is entitled to and shall be paid an allowance of five pounds (£5) per week, subject to the conditions that—

- (a) the teacher makes a statutory declaration that suitable housing accommodation is not available for his family and the District Superintendent certifies that such is the case;
- (b) the allowance is payable for a maximum period of three months from the date of taking up the appointment; and
- (c) the allowance is not payable to a teacher appointed to a school situated within a radius of thirty miles of the Town Hall at Perth, except in special cases approved by the Minister.

3. Regulation 51 of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) by substituting for the figures and symbol "20s." in line three of paragraph (a) of subregulation (4) the figures and symbol "25s."; and
