Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954. PROCLAMATION

F.D. 108/53, Ex. Co. No. 2111.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, the Governor in Executive Council may declare, *inter alia*, an popen season in respect of any of the fauna in any part or parts of the State and for such period as part or parts of the State and for such period as he thinks fit, and place such restrictions on the taking or disposal of the fauna as he considers advisable: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, act-ing by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an open season in respect of Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus ocydromus*, in all those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the road districts specified in the First Schedule hereto and districts specified in the First Schedule hereto and all those parts of the State which lie within the specified parts of the road districts specified in the Second Schedule hereto, subject to the following restrictions:

- (1) Grey Kangaroos shall be taken for sale in the areas aforesaid only by a person who is the holder of the requisite license issued under regulation 4 or regulation 5 or regu-lation 6 of the Fauna Protection Act Regulations.
- (2) A person so licensed shall not sell any carcass or any part of any carcass of a Grey Kangaroo to any person or firm or body who or which is not the holder of an appropriate license issued pursuant to the provisions of the Fauna Protection Act and the regulations made thereunder.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 38 of 1960.

(Registered 20th May, 1960)

(Registered 20th May, 1960) THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the "Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952," this thirty-first (31st) day of March, 1960, between State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Perth Branch and the Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Branch), Perth (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and The Colonial Sugar Refining Company Limited (herein-after called "the employer") of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows: and agree the one with the other as follows:-

1 ----Title

This Agreement shall be known as the "Metal Trades (Sugar Refining) Agreement."

2.—Arrangement.

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3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers classified in clause 21 hereof employed at the works occupied and controlled by the Colonial Sugar Refining Company Limited.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period to expire on the 28th February, 1961, from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.

6.—Overtime.

Except as otherwise provided:-

- (a) For all work done outside the hours of duty on any day as hereinbefore pre-scribed, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and at double time rate thereafter.
- (b) All time worked on Sundays and on the holidays prescribed in clause 8 of this Agreement shall be paid for at double time rate.
- Rest Period after Overtime. When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so (c) (i) Rest Period after Overtime. arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.
 - (ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his oridnary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecu-tive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such over-time until he has had eight (8) con-secutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.
 - (iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.
- (d) Any worker required to continue working overtime after ordinary ceasing time shall be paid 5/- for each meal time occurring during the period he is so working. Such meal times shall be deemed to commence at 8.00 a.m., 6.00 p.m. and midnight.

Provided that such payment shall not apply where the worker has been notified the previous day of the requirement to work overtime.

(e) An employee recalled after leaving the Company's premises to work overtime shall be paid a minimum of three hours at the appropriate rate.

(f) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement:-

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- No organisation, party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or in-directly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause. (ii) No organisation, this subclause.
- This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court. (iii) This subclause

7.-Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour for not less than two (2) hours, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be for a weekly engagement, terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 17 hereof as to payment for absence on account of illness. Where any absence extends for more than one (1) week, the employment shall be deemed to have terminated upon the expiration of the said week.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to subclause 6 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:— New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any Public Holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rate of pay shall apply.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) Where the employer closes his factory for the purpose of allowing annual leave to his employees in the event of an employee being employed for portion only of a year he shall be entitled, subject to sub-clause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other employees, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which each such worker has been employed. Such record shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union of Workers during the usual office hours.

11.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) In the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Agreement, in any of the matters hereinafter mentioned the Board is hereby assigned the following functions:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them.

(ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of Regulation 92 of the Regulations under the Industrial Arbitration Act shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

12.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour on the business premises of the employer, and accompanied by a representative of the employer if so desired, to inspect during the progress of the work the operations affected; but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one week.

13.—Recognition of Union Notices.

(a) Should any matters relative to terms and conditions of employment arise during the currency of this Agreement affecting the workers generally, the Union shall have the right by appointment to interview and to be heard by the employer's representatives thereon, with a view to arriving at some understanding.

(b) A copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union.

(c) The accredited Union representative shall not be prevented from posting any lawful notice of the Union in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union.

14.—Protective Equipment.

The employer shall make available such protective equipment as is agreed necessary between the employer and his workers.

15.—Apprentices.

Apprentices may be taken to the fitting and/or turning branch of the engineering trade in the proportion of one (1) apprentice for every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen: Provided that the fraction of two (2) shall not be less than one (1). Provided further that application may be made to the Board of Reference for the employer's establishment to be declared an "approved shop." In the event of such approval being granted, the proportion shall be one (1) apprentice for every one (1) journeyman.

16.—Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is employed for four (4) hours or less during any day on work in a higher grade than his ordinary occupation, he shall be paid for the time so occupied at the higher rate. If so employed for more than four (4) hours he shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the shift.

17.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal illhealth for one twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this sub-clause shall be available to the worker for a period of five (5) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

18.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

19.-Casual Workers.

"Casual Worker" means a worker employed for less than one (1) week, with a minimum of two hours in any day. He shall be paid at the rate of ten (10) per cent. in addition to the rate prescribed in this Agreement on an hourly basis.

20.—Long Service Leave.

(i) Period of operation.—This clause shall continue in force for the term of this Agreement, provided that in the event of any State legislation or State and/or Federal award providing for long service leave imposing any rights, liabilities, or obligations on the parties to this Agreement other than under this Agreement, and an exemption is not obtained from the operation of such legislation and/or award by virtue of this Agreement, this clause shall cease to operate as from the date of operation of such legislation and/or award.

(ii) Entitlement to Leave.—Subject to this Agreement every worker not being a casual worker shall be entitled to long service leave on ordinary pay in respect of continuous service with the Company.

(iii) Period of Leave.—The amount of such entitlement in the case of a worker who has completed at least 20 years' continuous service with the Company shall be:—

- (a) In respect of the 20 years' service so completed—13 week's leave; and
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service with the Company completed after such 20 years six and one-half weeks' leave.

(iv) Pro Rata Entitlement on Termination.—In the case of a worker who has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 20 years' service with the Company and whose services with the Company are terminated by the Company for any cause other than serious misconduct, or by the worker for any reason or by reason of the death of the worker, the worker shall be entitled to a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service since the commencement of his continuous service, or since the last accrual of entitlement to leave on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service.

- (v) Calculation of Continuous Service.
 - (a) For the purpose of this sub-clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, and shall, subject to any limitation herein, count as service.
 - (i) absence in respect of any period during which the worker shall have served as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (other than a member of the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia and other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan), or as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939 (as amended), or absence on compulsory service in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended): Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such absence;
 - (ii) absence on any annual leave or long service leave;
 - (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the Company if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations under this Agreement in respect of long service leave or annual leave; and
 - (iv) absence necessitated by personal sickness or injury of which not more than fifteen (15) working days a year shall count as service.
 - (b) For the purposes of this sub-clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, but the period of such absence shall not count as service:—
 - (i) absence following any termination of the employment by the Company on any ground other than slackness of trade, if the worker be re-employed by the Company within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
 - (ii) absence during any standing down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement;
 - (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the Company on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the Company within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
 - (iv) absence of the worker authorised by the employer at any time;
 - (v) absence arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute but only if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute.
 - (c) After the coming into operation of this Agreement absence from work by reason of any cause not being a cause specified in this clause for a period in excess of 14 days shall be deemed to break the continuity of service for the purposes of this clause unless the worker notifies the Company in writing of the reason for his absence.

(vi) Service before Commencement of Award.— For the purpose of calculating the entitlement to leave, continuous service of a worker with the Company immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Agreement, shall be taken into account but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of such service, provided that any service prior to such 20 years' service will carry such leave if the worker remains in the Company's service until his retirement.

(vii) Time of Taking Leave.—Long service leave shall be granted and taken on the retirement of the worker provided that when a worker has completed 20 years of continuous service he will be entitled to not more than eight weeks' interim leave which will be taken at such time as may be agreed between the Company and the worker having regard to the needs of the Company's establishment where the worker is working. Additional interim long service leave on the basis of four weeks for each additional ten years' service may be taken at such time as may be agreed between the Company and the worker.

(viii) Payment on Termination for Leave Not Taken—Where the employment of a worker is terminated otherwise than by his death and he has an entitlement to long service leave the worker shall be deemed to have entered upon and taken the leave from the date of such termination and the Company shall forthwith pay to the worker in full his ordinary pay for the leave less any amount already paid to the worker in respect of that leave.

(ix) Payment on Death.—Where a worker dies during his employment and any long service leave to which he is entitled under this Agreement has not been taken or received in full by the worker, the Company shall, upon request by the personal representative of the worker, pay to that representative the amount due in respect of such leave providing that where no personal representative has been appointed within three months of the date of the worker's death the Company may pay to the widow or such of the next-of-kin as it considers appropriate, the said amount due. The obligation of the Company to such worker or worker's estate in respect of long service leave shall be and shall be deemed to have been satisfied by such payment.

(x) Payment for Period of Leave.—Each worker shall be paid for one week of leave his ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave. Such ordinary time rate shall be for the standard hours prescribed by this Agreement but in the case of part-time workers for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(Note:---"Ordinary time rate of pay"---

- (1) shall not include:--
 - shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
 - Payment in the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by result shall be be at ordinary time rates.
- (2) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave).

(xi) Method of Payment.—Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (a) in full before the worker goes on leave, or
- (b) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker, or
- (c) in any other way agreed between the Company and the worker.

(xii) Public Holidays and Annual Leave During Period of Leave.—Any long service leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave. (xiii) Transmission of Business.—For the purposes of this clause where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation of this Agreement, been transmitted from an employer (in this paragraph called the transmittor) to another employer (in this paragraph called the transmittee) and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee.

- (a) the continuity of service of such worker shall be deemed not to have been broken by reason only of the transmission; and
- (b) the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (or any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be continuous service of the worker with the transmittee.

In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(xiv) Benefits Related to Long Service.—The Company will continue to operate its F.E.A. Scheme to provide superannuation benefits in accordance with the rules of that scheme in addition to any leave granted under this award.

(xv) Leave to be in Satisfaction of all Rights.— The entitlement to long service leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave or benefit in the nature of long service leave, to which the worker may be entitled in respect of the employment by the Company, and any leave taken or in respect of which payment has been made by the Company shall be deducted from any amount of long service leave to which such worker is entitled pursuant to this Agreement.

- (xvi) Records.-
 - (a) The employer shall keep an adequate long service leave record.
 - (b) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

No. 45 of 1960.

(Registered 15th June, 1960.)

Part I.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this tenth day of June 1960, between the Employers named in the Schedule of Part I of this Agreement of the one part and The Foremen Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia of the other part, witnesseth as follows:-

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to Foremen Steve-dores in the employ of the Employers named in the schedule of Part I of this Agreement and shall operate at all Western Australian Ports within the jurisdiction of the Australian Stevedoring Industry Authority.

2.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this agreement:---

(a) "Foreman Stevedore" shall mean and include any person permanently employed under supervision directing the loading or discharging of cargo on any wharf or any vessel or wheat gallery and/or directing the work of waterside workers, or engaging labour for such purposes, and shall also be engaged in making, repairing and storing

of any gear used in Stevedoring operations or the carting to and from the wharves of such gear. The term shall not include any employer, wharf manager, assistant wharf manager, superintendent or supervisor employed by the employer as such.

- (b) "Employer" for the purpose of this part shall mean any of the employers named in Part I of this Agreement.
- (c) "Ordinary Working Day" shall mean any day Monday to Friday inclusive, excluding Holidays.
- (d) "Meal Hours" subject to the provisions of Clause 7 shall mean:-

Breakfast — 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

Dinner - Noon to 1 p.m.

- ea 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal Tea – hour).
- Supper Midnight to 1 a.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal hour).
- (e) "Union" shall mean The Foremen Steve-dores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia.

3.—Rate of Pay.

(a) Basic Wage - £14 6s. 4d.

(b) The hourly rates of pay to be paid to Foremen employed under this agreement shall be the appropriate hourly rates from time to time paid or payable to Waterside Workers in respect to ordinary time, overtime, meal hours, Saturday and Sunday time, and Holidays plus an hourly margin of 1/per hour.

(c) Foremen shall be paid for at least one shift on each day Monday to Friday inclusive and the weekly wage shall be not less than the equivalent of forty (40) hours at the ordinary hourly rate prescribed in (b) hereof.

4.-Hours of Work.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty shall be between 8 a.m. and 12 noon, and 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Where Foremen are engaged on the 5 p.m. to 11 p.m. shift the employer may on that day order such Foremen to work an additional four (4) ordinary hours from either 8 a.m. to 12 noon or 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., a tea meal hour break on this latter additional shift shall be allowed and paid to the employee as if worked.

(c) A Foreman required to work the ordinary hours as provided in sub-clause (b) hereof shall in addition to his entitlement for working the evening shift be paid only for the ordinary hours so worked on that day.

(d) Where an employee has worked from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and it is deemed necessary by the employer to order such employee to work the 5 p.m. to 11 p.m. shift he shall be paid for the meal hour break as if worked.

(e) Foremen on completion of a midnight to 7 a.m. shift on which they have been engaged, shall a.m. shift on which they have been engaged, shah not be ordered to work any of the ordinary hours of that day, but should the employer deem it necessary such foremen may be ordered to work the 5 p.m. to 11 p.m. shift on that day.

5.—Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall, if occurring on any day Monday to Friday inclusive, be granted to employees as a holiday with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates:—

Ordinary Holidays.—New Year's Day, Anni-versary of Australia Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Boxing Dav.

Extraordinary Holidays.—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day and Picnic Day (which shall be observed on the same day as the waterside workers' picnic day).

(b) When any of the aforementioned holidays fails on a Saturday or Sunday and an employee is not required to work on that day, no payment shall be made.

(c) Payment shall not be made for any holiday to leave without pay if he is available for duty on the standard of the standa the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes or is available for duty on the working day immediately following the holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause

(d) Where an employee is required to work on any holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause, he shall be paid for all time worked as provided for in clause 3 (b)

(e) In all cases of payment for work on holidays, the rate of payment prescribed in sub-clause (d) hereof, shall be deemed to include the ordinary payment for the holiday as prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof.

(f) An employee engaged to work on a holiday irrespective of which shift or part of such shift he so works that day, shall be given a day in lieu thereof with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates such day to be taken with his annual leave or as otherwise mutually arranged.

6.---Working Through Meal Hours.

Any employee required to work continuously through any meal hour prescribed by this Agree-ment shall be paid for such work at the appropriate meal hour rates until such time as one full hour's break has been allowed to the employee for a meal.

7.—Overtime.

An employer may require any foreman to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such foreman shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement provided that the meal hours referred to in Clause 2 (d) may be advanced by one hour to enable foremen to be available at the normal commencing time of the succeeding shift.

8.—Overtime-Period Of Engagement.

(a) Overtime shifts to be worked by foremen under this agreement and subject to sub-clause (b) hereof shall be:-

- 8 a.m. to noon Saturday. 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday.
- 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. or 9.30 p.m. Extended day shift.
- 5 p.m. to 11 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.
- 5 p.m. to 10.30 p.m. Sunday. Midnight to 7 a.m. Monday to Sunday inclusive.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions contained in sub-clause (a) hereof the Employer shall have the right to work employees continuous overtime in instances where the congestion of shipping de-mands, but the extra overtime so worked must at all times be reasonable, and shall be agreeable to both parties.

(c) Employees shall at all times when engaged on overtime shifts be entitled to payment for the maximum overtime period for such shifts.

9.—Travelling Time.

Where foremen are required to travel prior to or after the completion of any shift, travelling time shall be paid as follows:-

(a) To or from North Wharf five (5) minutes each way at the rate appropriate to the shift.

(b) To or from Woodmans Point, Gage Roads or Owen Anchorage twenty (20) minutes each way at the rate appropriate to the shift.

10.—Meal Money.

Employees required to work after the tea meal hour on any day Monday to Friday inclusive, or after the midday meal on Saturday or Sunday shall be provided with adequate meals or paid the sum of 5/6d. for each such meal.

11.—Annual Leave.

(a) Employees shall be entitled to three consecutive weeks annual leave on pay for each completed year of continuous service.

(b) For lesser period of continuous service of one month or more payment on a pro rata basis to the foregoing shall be granted.

12.-Contract Of Service.

Except in cases of dishonesty, indiscipline or gross misconduct (when an employee shall be subject to instant dismissal and entitled to his wages and all holiday pay due up to the time of such dismissal), permanent foremen shall give or be given one week's notice of the termination of service or one week's wages paid for or forfeited in lieu thereof, provided that the one week's notice shall not be counted as annual leave or part thereof.

13.-Obnoxious Cargoes.

Employees shall receive agreed extra rates where they are affected by unusually dangerous or ob-noxious conditions in the area where they are working for the period of such disability.

14.—Overalls And Oilskins.

Permanent employees shall be supplied with one suit of overalls each twelve months and one oilskin coat every two years. An overcoat may be substituted for the oilskin coat provided the em-ployee is prepared to pay the difference in cost.

15.-Miscellaneous Conditions.

(a) Wherever practicable work shall be regulated in order that each foreman will receive an equal distribution of work and the hours of work, and will not be required to work excessive overtime.

(b) Foremen shall work when and where directed by the employer, and shall observe all instructions of the employer.

16.—Preference Of Employment.

All persons permanently employed as foremen stevedores shall be members of the Union, provided that any employee who at the time of engagement is not a member of such Union, shall become a member thereof within fourteen (14) days and provided also that the Union shall not refuse to accept as a member any such employee who is eligible and applies in the manner prescribed under the rules of the Union to become a member thereof.

17.-Board Of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between an employee and the employers, work shall be continued without any cessation and the matter referred to a Board of Reference, consisting of one (1) representative each of the employees and employers and a chairman, to be mutually agreed upon by those representa-tives; failing their agreement the Industrial Registrar of the State Arbitration Court shall act as chairman.

18.-Long Service Leave.

Employees shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with the provisions of Order No. 55 of 1958 of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

19.—Operation.

This Agreement shall operate from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on or after the tenth day of June one thousand nine hundred and sixty and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years.

Part II.

This Part of this Agreement, made between the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners of the one part and The Foremen Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Scope.

This part of this Agreement shall apply to foremen stevedores in the employ of the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

2.—Definition.

"Employer".-For the purposes of this part, employer shall mean the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

3.-Rates of Pay and Conditions of Employment.

With the exception of Clauses 5 (g) (Holidays), 10 (Annual Leave), 13 (Overalls and Oilskins) and 18 (Long Service Leave), the provisions of Part I of this Agreement will be deemed to be embodied in this part.

4.—Annual Leave.

(a) After the completion of each twelve month's continuous service, employees shall be entitled to two consecutive weeks' leave with pay at ordinary rates as prescribed in this Agreement.
(b) Where the period of employment is less than twelve months but exceeds one month employees

shall be entitled to leave pro-rata as the length of service is to the full year.

5.—Oilskins.

Permanent employees shall be supplied by the employer free of cost with one oilskin coat every two years; provided that the employee may sub-stitute an overcoat for an oilskin coat if the employee is prepared to pay the difference in cost.

6.-Sick Leave.

Foremen shall be entitled to sick leave with pay as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

7.-Long Service Leave.

Foremen shall be entitled to three months' long service leave with pay upon the completion of each seven years' continuous service, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the next grant of such leave

8.—Short Leave.

On sufficient cause being shown, foremen may be granted leave of absence with pay for a period not exceeding three (3) days (not more than two (2) days of which may be consecutive) in any one year. Such leave may, at the discretion of the Commissioners, be deducted from the foreman's next annual leave.

9.—Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall affect the rights or privileges accrued to any employee prior to the date of this Agreement.
