IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 378 of 1960.

Between City of Perth Municipality, Applicant and West Australian Local Government Officers' Association Union of Workers, Perth, Respondent.

HAVING heard Mr. G. J. Martin on behalf of the Applicant and Mr. V. Ulrich on behalf of the Respondent, and by consent, the Court in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, doth hereby order and declare that Award No. 3 of 1932, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended and consolidated with such amendments in the terms of the attached Schedule.

This Award shall be known as the Local Governing Bodies (City of Perth—Senior Officers) Award as amended and consolidated.

3.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to the officers employed by the City of Perth who are engaged in the classifications described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Perth.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof, subject to the right of any party to the award to apply to the Court for a review of the provisions of this award subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948.

6.—Hours of Duty.

(a) (i) The hours of duty shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive; one hour shall be allowed for lunch which shall be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.; provided that this subclause shall not apply in special cases where different hours are stipulated.

(ii) Where an officer is required to attend at Committee or Council meetings by the Council such time of attendance shall be considered as part of his ordinary duties.

(b) Any officer supervising other employees of the Council shall work the same hours as the employees they supervise.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Officers may be required to perform public duty beyond the usual hours, whenever it is necessary to bring up arrears of work, or to meet any temporary pressure of business.

(b) Payment for overtime shall be at the discretion of the Council.

(c) Overtime if paid for shall be at the following rates:—

- (i) Time and a quarter for the first five hours of overtime during the Monday to Friday period in any week.
- (ii) Time and a half for overtime in excess of five hours during the Monday to Friday period.
- (iii) Time and a half for overtime worked on Saturday mornings.
- (iv) Double time for overtime worked on Saturday afternoons, Sundays and public holidays.

(d) When any officer is required to work in the office in the evening a tea allowance of 6s. 6d. shall be paid, provided that no tea money shall be payable in cases where overtime is paid for.

8.—Salaries.

(a) The minimum salaries payable under this Award shall be as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

(b) The annual increments set out in Schedule "A" shall take effect as from the 1st November in each year.

(c) All salaries shall be paid at least once a month. $% \left({{{\left({{{{c}_{{\rm{s}}}}} \right)}}} \right)$

(d) Provided that, subject to clauses 9 and 10 of this Award the Council may fix the commencing salary of an officer appointed to any position classified in the Schedule hereto at any amount within the salary range prescribed therein for such position.

9.-Transfer of Officers.

When an officer is transferred to a position carrying a higher classification, he shall suffer no reduction in salary, and shall be considered in the year of service in such higher position with a salary at least equal to or next above the salary he was in receipt of at the time of the transfer.

10.—Officers Acting in Higher Capacities.

When an officer is temporarily executing the whole of the duties of a position carrying a higher salary than that in which he is usually employed for a continuous term of three (3) calendar months or longer, he shall be paid during the whole time he is performing such duties at least the salary attached to such higher position for the year of service which will give him a salary next above that which he is receiving in the lower capacity.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any other officer under the control of the officer temporarily executing higher duties as specified above.

11.—Promotions.

In the event of the promotion of any officer whose conditions of service are regulated under the provisions of Award No. 131 of 1949 to any position classified under this Award, such officer shall be deemed to be in the year of service as set forth in the Schedule entitling him to the salary and classification next above the salary he was receiving prior to such promotion.

12.—Resignations or Dismissals.

Appointments under this Award shall be subject to three (3) months' notice on either side for officers with over three (3) years' service, and one (1) months' notice in other cases.

13.—Holidays.

All State Government holidays shall be observed and paid for except in the case of those officers who are required to supervise workers working under other Awards, who shall be allowed such holidays as may be due to the workers under their control.

In addition to the foregoing, officers shall, after the completion of one year of service, be allowed three (3) weeks' annual leave, exclusive of intervening public holidays.

Officers may, with the approval of the Council, be permitted to allow their annual leave to accumulate up to and including a period not exceeding three (3) years.

In the event of any officer resigning his position, all holidays accrued shall be paid for.

14.--Sick Pay.

In the event of absence from duty on account of sickness, officers shall receive pay as follows, viz.:-

- Over three years' service: Three months full pay and three months' half pay in any one year.
- Under three years' and over one year: Two months full pay in any one year.
- Under one year and over six months: One month's full pay in any one year.
- Under six months' service and over three (3) months' service: Two (2) weeks' full pay in any one year.

All officers absent through sickness must report such absence forthwith, and, if absent for more than two (2) days at any time, must furnish satisfactory medical certificates as to the nature of the illness and the necessity for leave of absence.

For the purpose of this clause "in any one year" shall mean from 1st November to the 31st October.

No officer, who, at the date of this Award, is in receipt of a salary, rate of pay, or other remunera-tion, or more holidays, and other benefits than are herein provided, shall have his pay, remuneration, holidays, or benefits reduced as a consequence of this Award.

Ulrich on behalf of the Respondent, and by consent, the Court in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 92 of the In-dustrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, doth hereby order and declare that Award No. 40 of 1947, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended and consolidated with such amendments in the terms of the attached Schedule.

Schedule.

This Award shall be known as the Local Governing Bodies (City of Perth-Sub Officers) Award as amended and consolidated.

3.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to all officers in the employ of the City of Perth with the exception of the following:— Town Clerk, Heads of Depart-ments, Assistants to Heads of Departments, Medi-cal Officer of Health, City Librarian, City Valuer, Chief Parking Inspector, Assistant Librarian and Health Inspectors Health Inspectors.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Perth, and any premises or land upon which any Undertaking of that Municipality is being carried on.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof, sub-ject to the right of any party to the Award to Apply to the Court for a review of the provisions dustrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.

6.—Definitions.

(a) "Permanent Officer." A "permanent officer." for the purposes of this Award is one who is ap-pointed by resolution of the Council and is given notice of such Appointment in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

(b) "Temporary Officer." A "temporary officer" (b) Temporary Officer." A "temporary officer" shall mean one who is engaged from time to time at the discretion of a Departmental Head and with the approval of the Town Clerk. A temporary offi-cer, after twelve (12) months' continuous service may, at the discretion of the Council, be placed on the permanent staff.

(c) "Year." For the purpose of this Award the term "year" shall mean from 1st November to the 31st October ensuing.

(d) "Lord Mayor's Orderly" shall mean an officer who, in addition to attending on the Lord Mayor and Councillors and at Civic functions, shall when required, act as Steward and also super-vise the work of the cleaners at the Head Municipal Office.

7.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided the hours of duty of officers working at the Head Municipal Office of the Council shall be 8.30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive; one hour shall be al-lowed for lunch, which shall be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(b) Foremen, or any officer supervising other workers covered by this or any other Award or Agreement shall work the same hours as the workers they supervise, and shall also carry out any emergency work considered necessary by the Head of the Department.

(c) The Lord Mayor's Orderly, assistant orderly and chauffeur, attendant and cleaner (Municipal Offices), caretakers, park rangers, propagators and fumigation officer and general hands in the Health Department, shall work such hours as the duties of their offices require.

(d) Curators shall work such hours as the duties of their offices require. Provided that they shall be allowed one day per week off duty on a day Monday to Friday inclusive, such day to be deter-mined by the Head of the Department.

(e) Surveyors, Storekeepers, Garage Clerk, Timekeepers, Weighbridge Attendants, Testing Officer, Assistant Testing Officers, and Senior Mechanic, shall work 40 hours per week from Monday to Friday inclusive,

(f) Library Staff. The hours of duty for library staff shall be $37\frac{1}{2}$ hours per week to be worked between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday and 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Provided that officers in this department shall only be rostered for duty over the $5\frac{1}{2}$ days Monday to Saturday inclusive one week in every three. When the officers are rostered for duty Monday to Friday inclusive, the weekly hours of duty shall not exceed $37\frac{1}{2}$ hours to be worked in shifts of $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

(g) Parking Facilities Staff:

- (i) Senior Inspectors, Inspectors (Clerks) Prosecuting Officer, Cashier and Assistant Cashier, Parking Inspectors.—Forty hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours between 7 a.m. and 12 midnight.
- (ii) Assistant Parking Inspectors.—Forty hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in shifts not exceeding more than eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- (iii) The officers provided for in subclauses (i) and (ii) hereof shall be allowed one hour for a meal to be taken between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m. for day workers and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. for workers on evening work.
- (iv) Parking Meter Coin Collectors.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in 5½ days, Monday to Saturday inclusive. The starting and finishing time for such workers shall be between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive with one hour for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m. The hours of work on Saturdays shall be performed between 8.30 a.m. and 12 noon.

(h) Officers may be required to perform public duty beyond the usual hours, whenever it is necessary, to bring up arrears of work or to meet any temporary pressure of business, or to attend any meeting of the Council or Committees.

(i) When a portion of the work of any department has fallen into arrear, the staff dealing with such work, or at the discretion of the Head of the Department, the whole staff shall be retained after the ordinary office hours until such arrears are brought up.

(j) Every officer shall, when required by a Head of a Department, remain after the usual office hours to complete work which the Head considers necessary to be done on the same day.

8.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed in excess of the hours prescribed in Clause 7 hereof shall be deemed overtime and except as provided for hereunder shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first five hours and time and a half thereafter.

(b) The entitlement of an officer to payment for overtime under subclause (a) hereof shall be determined by the Town Clerk on the recommendation of the Head of the Department.

(c) Officers not working under close supervision, or whose hours of duty are not definitely determined, such as Lord Mayor's Orderly, Assistant Orderly and Chauffeur, Curators, Caretakers, Attendants and Cleaners (Municipal Offices), Park Rangers, Propagator, Fumigation Officers and General Hands in the Health Department shall not be entitled to claim overtime, nor shall any officer in receipt of a margin of more than £643 per annum above the basic wage. Foreman shall be paid at overtime rates for work carried out on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays (as prescribed in clause 13) but shall not be paid for any overtime worked from Monday to Friday inclusive.

(d) Parking Facilities Staff:

(i) All work performed in excess of the hours prescribed in subclause 7 (g) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first five hours and time and a half thereafter.

Provided that all work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time. (ii) Where an officer is required to attend Court outside his rostered hours of duty he shall be paid all reasonable fares incurred and he shall be paid at ordinary rates with a minimum of two (2) hours. Witness fees (if any) for such officers shall be paid to the City of Perth.

(e) When any officer is required to work in excess of two (2) hours beyond the ordinary finishing time, a meal allowance of six shillings and sixpence (6s. 6d) shall be paid for any meal required.

9.-Saturday, Sunday and Holiday Work.

(a) Except as provided hereunder, officers called to work on after 12 noon on Saturdays or Sundays or on any day proclaimed as a Public Holiday under the Public Service Act, 1904-1957, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Caretakers, Lord Mayor's Orderly, Assistant Orderly and Chauffeur, Curators, Attendants and Cleaners (Municipal Offices), Park Rangers, Propagator and Officers receiving a margin of more than £643 per annum above the basic wage shall not be entitled to the benefit of this clause.

(c) Foreman, Inspectors, Fumigation Officers and General Hands in the Health Department shall be paid at the rate of double time for any work performed on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Xmas Day and Boxing Day and (in the case of foremen only outside employees' Picnic Day.)

(d) Provided further that subclause (a) hereof shall not apply to Library Staff, Senior Inspectors, Prosecuting Officers, Inspectors (Clerks), Inspectors (Clerks Cashier), Parking Inspectors, Assistant Parking Inspectors and Coin Collectors in respect to work performed on any of the days prescribed in clause 13(c) of this Award.

(e) Officers, except Senior Inspectors, Inspectors (Clerks), Inspectors (Cashier), Parking Inspectors, Assistant Parking Inspectors, Assistant Cashier, Coin Collectors and Library staff, shall be paid at the rate of time and one half for work performed before 12 noon on Saturday.

9A.-Shift Work.

Parking Inspectors shall be paid an additional $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent for night work after 5.30 p.m. This additional rate shall not apply to overtime performed on a night shift.

10.-Salaries.

(a) The Minimum Salaries payable under this Award shall be as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

(b) The Annual increments set out in Schedule "A" hereof shall take effect as from the 1st November, in each year.

(c) Proficiency Allowance.—Officers of the clerical staff shall, upon their attainment of the final examination of a recognised accountancy institute be paid an Annual Amount of thirteen pounds (£13) and this payment shall be made at the end of each completed year of service.

(d) Supervising Temporary Officers.—any officer placed in charge of five (5) or more temporary officers for a period of a week or any portion of a week shall be paid at the rate of ten shillings (10s.) per week in addition to his ordinary rate.

11.—Officers Acting in Higher Positions.

When an officer is temporarily executing the whole of the duties attached to a higher position for a continuous period of not less than four weeks, he or she shall be paid during the whole time he or she is performing such higher duties, the salary attached to such higher position for the year of service which will give him or her a salary next above that which he or she is receiving in the lower capacity.

Provided that this clause shall not apply until the officer concerned has been actually appointed to the temporary higher position by the Council. 12.—Resignations and Dismissals.

(a) Permanent Officers: One (1) fortnight's notice on either side shall be required to terminate the contract of service.

(b) Temporary Officers: One (1) week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate the contract of service, except where a temporary officer is engaged for a specified period or job.

(c) The foregoing shall not apply when an officer is dismissed for misconduct, or refusal to obey orders, or if, after receiving the prescribed notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

Subclause (a), (b) and (c) of this clause are subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, for the time being in force.

13.—Holidays.

(a) Except as provided in clause 14 (d) and hereunder all holidays prescribed under the Public Service Act, 1904-1957 shall be observed and paid for, except in the case of foremen who shall be allowed public holidays as may be due to the workers under their control.

(b) Provided that curators, caretakers, the Lord Mayor's Orderly, assistant Orderly and chauffeur, attendant and cleaner (Municipal Offices), park rangers, propagators, storekcepers, timekcepers, weighbridge attendants, fumigation officers, and general hands in the Health Department shall only be allowed public holidays as may be approved by the Town Clerk.

(c) Provided further that Library Staff, Senior Inspectors, Inspectors (Clerk), Inspectors (Cashiers and Assistant Cashiers), Parking Inspectors, Assistant Parking Inspectors and Coin Collectors shall not be entitled to the following public holidays:—The day following New Year's Day, Easter Tuesday, morning of Royal Show Day or the Queen's Birthday.

14.—Annual Leave.

(a) All officers shall after the completion of each twelve (12) month's service, be allowed two (2) weeks' Annual Leave; exclusive of intervening public holidays. Such leave to be taken at the convenience of the Town Clerk; provided that all Male Officers in receipt of a salary with a margin of £187 or more over the Male Basic Wage shall receive three week's Annual Leave and that all female officers in receipt of a margin of £187 or more over the female basic wage shall receive three week's Annual Leave.

(b) Officers may be permitted, with the approval of the Town Clerk, to allow their annual leave to accumulate up to and including a period not exceeding two (2) years.

(c) In the event of any officer resigning his or her position, all holidays accrued shall be paid for.

(d) Temporary officers with less than three months' continuous service shall not be paid for any public holidays or for any proportion of annual leave: Provided that where a temporary officer is employed for three months or longer, he shall be entitled to the due proportion of annual leave and for payment of any public holidays which may have occurred during his period of service.

(e) Caretakers, curators, attendants and cleaners (Municipal Offices), stablemen, park rangers and propagator shall receive three (3) weeks' annual leave.

15.—Sick Leave.

(a) In the event of absence from duty on account of sickness, permanent officers shall receive pay as follows—viz.:—

- (i) Over three (3) years' service—Three (3) months' full pay and three (3) months' half pay in any one year.
- (ii) Under three (3) years and over one (1) year—Two months' full pay in any one year.

- (iii) Under one year and over six (6) months —One (1) month's full pay in any one year.
- (iv) Under six months' service and over three(3) months' service—Two (2) weeks' full pay in any one year.
- (v) Library Workroom Employees (Female):
 - (i) Over six (6) months' service—One (1) month's full pay in any one year.
 - (ii) Under six (6) months' service and over three (3) months' service, two weeks' full pay in any one year.

(b) All officers absent through sickness must report such absence forthwith to the Head of the Department, and if absent for more than two (2) days at any one time, must furnish satisfactory medical certificates as to the nature of the illness and the necessity for leave of absence.

(c) A temporary officer shall be entitled, after three (3) months' continuous service, to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal illhealth, for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the temporary officer leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the temporary officer being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the temporary officer is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of any accident wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

16.—Travelling Expenses.

All reasonable travelling expenses authorised by the Town Clerk, incurred by an officer in the discharge of his duties shall be reimbursed by the Council.

17.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:

- (1) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them.
- (2) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

18.—Preservation of Existing Rates and Conditions.

No officer who at the date of this Award is in receipt of a higher rate of pay or other remuneration, or more holidays and other benefits than is herein provided shall have his or her pay, remuneration, holidays or benefits reduced as a consequence of this Award.

19.—Adjustment of Salaries.

The margins prescribed in this Award shall vary according to movements in the "marginal" allowance as determined from time to time by the Public Service Commissioner.
