3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers classified in clause 6 hereof employed by the respondent.

This Award shall operate within that area comprising the works of the respondent.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

7.—Hours.

- (a) Day Workers. Except as hereinafter provided the ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week exclusive of crib time, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (b) Continuous Shift Workers. The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week to be worked in five shifts of eight hours inclusive of crib time, to be worked according to the roster agreed to by both parties. One month's notice shall be given by the respondent of any change to such roster.

8.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked beyond the ordinary hours of duty or on a rostered day off shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty on a Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, with the consent of the company, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.
- (d) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid five shillings (5s.) in lieu thereof
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement:-
 - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation, party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether

directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

9.—Shift Work.

- (a) All work performed on a Saturday or Sunday during the ordinary hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid five per cent. for afternoon shift and ten per cent. for night shift in addition to his ordinary rate. The rates shall not apply when work is performed on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays.

10.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rates.

11.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.

12.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays to all workers except casual workers without deduction of pay, namely Easter Monday, Labour Day, Cup Day when falling on a Wednesday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that any worker who does not present himself for work (if required) on the working day following any of the abovementioned holidays shall not be entitled to be paid for such holidays unless he produces proof satisfactory to the employer that he was prevented by sickness from presenting himself for work on any such day and that such sickness was not due to intemperance or misconduct,

(b) All work performed on any of the holidays in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations when the rate of time and one half shall apply.

13.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of three (3) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) Seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one weeks' leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof. Where a worker with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of three (3) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof increased by one twelfth of a week for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
- (c) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday.
- (d) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-quarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect to each completed month of continuous service, or in the case of a worker referred to in subclause (b) hereof such payment shall be one third of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each such month he is so engaged.
- (e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (g) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause
- (i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Long Service Leave.

- (a) All employees shall after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full time employees thereof be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave to be taken at the con venience of the employer.
- (b) In calculating the length of service of any present employee for the purposes of this clause the following shall be deemed to be continuous service as a permanent full time employee of the Municipality:—
 - (i) Continuous service with the Municipality as a permanent full time employee immediately prior to the date hereof and after the 1st day of June, 1936.

- (ii) In the case of an employee employed by the Municipality on a permanent full time basis immediately prior to entering thereon continuous full time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September, 1939 and the 3rd day of March,
- (c) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed a break in the continuity of service and periods of absence on account of sickness up to but not exeeding three (3) months' duration in any one year shall be included in the period of service.
- (d) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average daily rate of pay over the preceding twelve (12) months.
- (e) Any employee leaving the service of the Municipality on account of sickness or retrenchment, or for any other cause which the Municipality in its discretion thinks reasonable after three (3) years or more continuous service as a permanent full time employee since the date of commencement of service or since the date on which such employee last became entitled to long service leave hereunder as the case may be and the personal representatives of any deceased employee who dies after a period of service as aforesaid shall be entitled to be paid at the rate hereinbefore provided for such proportion of three (3) months as such period of service as aforesaid bears to ten (10) years.
- (f) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Any contravention of the stipulation in this subclause contained shall entitle the municipality to dismiss the employee from its service forthwith.

15.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum that his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole of the shift.

16.—Centract of Service.

Except as provided by clause 17 all employment shall be by the week.

17.—Casual Workers.

- (a) A casual worker shall mean and include a worker competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of one (1) week from and including the date he starts work.
- (b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the rates set out above.

18.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Time and Wages Record.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relating to any workers affected by this Agreement and take extracts therefrom.

20.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

21.-Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman, and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) There are assigned to such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award the functions of—
 - adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the award or any of them.
 - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

- 1. Clause 2—Arrangement.—After "21. Hours" insert "21A. Shift Work—Concrete Wheat Silos—Continuous Pour."
- 2. After Clause 21—Hours, insert the following new clause— $\,$

21A.—Shift Work—Concrete Wheat Silos— Continuous Pour.

Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Award contained:—

(a) On Concrete Silos construction where it is found necessary to pour concrete by continuous pour methods, the employer may place the workers on shift work, but before doing so, shall give notice of his intention to the Unions concerned.

- (b) One month's notice shall be given of its intention of doing so, but such notice need not specify the exact commencing date of the pour.
- (c) When such shift work is to be worked, the loading shall be on the ordinary rates, including all allowances as prescribed in Clause 9 of this Award plus 25 per cent. for day, afternoon and night shift.
- (d) The normal working hours for shift work shall be forty (40) hours per week, to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive, provided that all overtime shall be double time.
- (e) All work on Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (f) All work on Sunday shall be paid at the rate of double time. Work under this Agreement shall not be recognised as shift work unless five (5) consecutive afternoons or nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime.
- (g) Half an hour crib time for shift workers shall be taken in relays at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work, and no deduction shall be made therefrom.
- (h) Such crib time shall be taken not less than four (4) hours and not more than five (5) hours after the commencement of the shift.
- (i) When it is found necessary to continue to work in continuous rain, oilskins shall be provided.
- (j) Lighting shall be sufficient to provide full safety conditions.
- (k) Necessary precautions shall be taken against arc welding flashes.
- (1) It is hereby expressly agreed that the terms of this clause shall be without prejudice to submissions which may be made by any party to this Award on future Reference of Industrial Disputes or Applications to the Court.
