WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1904-1954, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Onslow: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that all that portion of land, containing approximately 1 acre 1 rood 8 perches, known as Onslow Lot 425, to be a reserve for the purpose of a hostel for natives (reserve No. 25709).

HAVING heard Mr. J. Darling on behalf of the Applicant and Mr. J. Mutton on behalf of the Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Engineering Union Association of Workers and The Boilermakers' Society of Australia, Union of Workers, Coastal Districts, W.A.; Mr. F. Marshall on behalf of the State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers; Mr. R. W. Fletcher on behalf of the Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Goldfields Sub-Branch), Kalgoorlie; Mr. J. G.

White on behalf of the Western Australian Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners' Industrial Union of Workers, The Operative Painters and Decorators' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, The West Australian Plumbers and Sheet Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers and The Operative Bricklayers and Rubble Wallers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth; Mr. H. Barry on behalf of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers; Mr. D. E. Maguire on behalf of The Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, and by consent, I, the undersigned, Conciliation Commissioner of the Court of Arbitration, in pursuance of a remission to me by the said Court and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, do hereby order and declare that Award No. 17 of 1955, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the terms of the following:—

1. Clause 6—Overtime.—Add to subclause (b) of this clause, a new paragraph reading as follows:—

Where a shift commences at or after 10.30 p.m., then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

2. This amendment shall operate as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 50 of 1960.

(Registered 1st September, 1960.)

THIS agreement made in pursuance of The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 1st day of September, 1960, between The State Executive Australasian Society of Engineers Industrial Association of Workers of the one part, and Massey Ferguson (Aust.) Ltd., of Caledonian Avenue, Maylands, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

## Clause 1.—Wages.

## Clause 2.—Special Rates.

## (a) A leading hand in charge of:—

- (i) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid Nineteen Shillings (19s.) per week extra; or
- (ii) More than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid Thirty Eight Shillings and Sixpence (38s. 6d.) per week extra; or
- (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid Fifty Seven Shillings and Sixpence (57s. 6d.) per week extra.

(b) A worker working as a machine tester shall receive One Shilling and Fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day above the assembler's rate.

## Clause 3.—Hours of Employment.

The ordinary hours of employment shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7.30 a.m. to noon on Saturday: Provided that the spread of hours herein prescribed may be altered by mutual agreement between the Employer and his workers, and also that the weekly hours may be worked in five (5) days.

## Clause 4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done outside ordinary hours the rate of wages shall be time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

(c) A worker recalled after leaving his workshop to work overtime shall be paid for three (3) hours' work at the appropriate rate.

(d) A worker occasionally required to hold himself in readiness to work after ordinary hours shall, until released, be paid standing-by time at the ordinary rate from the time from which he is to hold himself in readiness.

(e) For all work done during meal hours and thereafter until a meal break is allowed, time and a half shall be paid. A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

(f) Before starting overtime after working ordinary hours, a meal break of thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed unless the period of overtime is less than one and a half (1½) hours. The employer and any worker may mutually agree to a variation of this sub-clause.

(g) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above mentioned in respect of the meals not then required.

(h) When a worker working overtime finishes work at a time when reasonable means of transport are not available, the employer shall provide him with a conveyance or pay him ordinary wage rate for the time needed to reach his home.

(i) (i) Rest Period After Overtime.—When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between these times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(j) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement—

(i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates.

(ii) Neither the Industrial Association of Workers party to this Agreement nor any worker covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this sub-clause.

## Clause 5.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days publicly observed in lieu thereof in the Perth metropolitan area, shall be allowed as holidays, without deduction of pay—namely, New Years Day, Labour Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed in the preceding subclause the employer's establishment may be closed in which case a worker need not

present himself for duty and payment may be deducted but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) If a worker works on any of the holidays named in subclause (a) hereof, he shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive week's leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the employer.

(e) If any holiday named in subclause (a) hereof falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) ordinary working day for each such holiday.

(f) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's wage at his ordinary rate in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any absence from work except time for which the worker is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining the worker's right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year he shall only be entitled to (subject to subclause (f) of this clause) such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers are on leave on full pay.

(i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of this clause.

(j) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### Clause 6.—Shop Stewards.

Shop Stewards appointed by the workers in each workshop shall be allowed the necessary time during working hours to interview the employer or his representative on matters affecting workers whom they represent.

#### Clause 7.—Representatives Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the Association shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

Nothing in this clause shall derogate from the power of any such representative to enter any premises at any time when authorised under section 170 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.

#### Clause 8.—Travelling Time Allowance and Board.

(a) All fares and reasonable travelling expenses—including the cost, if any, incurred for meals—incurred by a worker during travelling shall be paid by the employer. The fares shall be 1st class on coastal boats, or on interstate boats where there is no 2nd class distinct from steerage. Train fares shall be at 2nd class rates, and in cases in which a worker has to travel all night, sleeping accommodation, if available, shall be allowed.

(b) Time occupied in travelling during the ordinary working hours of the worker shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

(c) If a worker has to be away from his home overnight he shall be allowed reasonable cost of board and lodging.

(d) When it is more convenient for the worker to go direct from his home to a job away from the employer's workshop he shall do so and shall start and cease work at the usual time customary at the workshop: Provided that any extra incurred by him in travelling shall be borne by the Employer.

#### Clause 9.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a Casual Worker employment shall be terminated by a week's notice on either side given at any time during the week or by the payment or forfeiture of a week's wages as the case may be. Whether an employee has given or been given notice as aforesaid he shall continue in his employment until the date of expiration of such notice. Any employee who having given or been given notice as aforesaid without reasonable cause (proof of which shall lie on him) absents himself from work during such period shall be deemed to have abandoned his employment and shall not be entitled to payment for work done by him within that period.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any time not worked on a day upon which a worker is required to present himself for duty, unless the time not worked is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 10 of this Agreement, or the time not worked is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under this Agreement.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The Employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by any industrial Association or Union or workers, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

#### Clause 10.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service provided that payment for absence through ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the Employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

#### Clause 11.—Time and Wages Book.

(a) The employer shall keep a time and wages book or equivalent record showing the name of each worker and his occupation, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week.

(b) The time occupied by a worker in filling any time books or cards, or in the making of records, shall be treated as time off duty but this does not apply to checking in or out at the beginning or end of duty.



(c) The time and wages book or equivalent record shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited official of the Industrial Association of Workers bound by this Agreement during the usual office hours at the Employer's office or other convenient place, provided that no inspection shall be demanded unless the accredited official suspects that a breach of the Agreement has been committed. Provided further, that only one demand for such inspection shall be made in any one fortnight in the same establishment.

#### Clause 12.—Tools.

The employer shall provide for each worker such tools as were customarily provided at the time of the making of this Agreement, and for sheet metal workers, snips used in the cutting of stainless steel, monel metal and similar hard metals. The worker shall replace or pay for any tools so provided if lost through his negligence.

#### Clause 13.—Posting Agreement.

The Association shall be permitted to post a copy of this Agreement in a prominent position in the workshop where it may be readily seen by the workers.

#### Clause 14.—Mixed Functions.

(a) A worker engaged on any day on duties for more than one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of one (1) day carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day, or if employed for one half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) or less than half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of one day he shall be paid the higher rate for the time actually worked.

(b) Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade than his ordinary classification his wage shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

#### Clause 15.—Definitions.

(a) "Assemblers" means an adult male worker engaged in putting together parts of any agricultural machinery covered by this Agreement which have been previously fitted. Removal of burrs or ragged edges shall not be deemed to be fitting.

(b) "Fitter" means an adult male worker engaged in the fitting of parts of agricultural implements or machinery and includes testing beaters.

#### Clause 16.—Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in this Agreement, if employed for less than one (1) week.

#### Clause 17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from the first day of September, 1960. Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from such date, either party may request the alteration or amendment of the Agreement.

#### Clause 18.—Area.

This Agreement shall supersede all previous Agreements and shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

#### Clause 19.—Long Service Leave.

##### (a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

##### (b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the

transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

#### (4) Such service shall include—

(a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.

(b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.

(c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.

(d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

(i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

(ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;

(iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

#### (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

(a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;

(b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;

(c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;

(d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;

(e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

(f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;

(g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the

same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;

- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service so completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award (or agreement), but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award (or agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—

- (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave,

and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award (or agreement) with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.
