THE Conciliation Commissioner in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by Section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:---

#### 3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to those workers employed by the respondent in the classifications set out in Clause 9 hereof.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area com-prised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

### 5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

### 6.--Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of casual workers, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(b) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct.

#### 7.-Casual Workers.

(a) Any worker dismissed through no fault of his own before the expiration of one (1) week of his employment shall be considered casual and shall receive ten per cent (10%) above the rate specified for the work performed.

(b) The services of a casual worker may be terminated by one (1) hour's notice, given by either side, on any day.

### 8.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wages as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

- (b) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid thirty - eight and sixpence (38s. 6d.) per week extra;
- (c) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid fifty-seven and sixpence (57s, 6d.) per week extra.

### 10.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall be worked between Monday and Friday inclusive and shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week or eight (8) hours in any one day and except in the case of shift workers shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(b) The meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) Where three shifts are worked, the ordinary hours of other than day shift shall be inclusive of a twenty minute crib time which shall be taken in relays at such times as not to cause a stoppage of work.

### 11.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. Provided that all work performed after noon on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) All work performed on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in sub-clause 15 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.

(d) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

(e) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

(f) When a worker other than a shift worker is required for duty during any meal period, whereby his meal period is postponed for more than one (1) hour he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(h) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.

### 12.—Shift Work.

(a) The employer may, if he so desires, work his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Union and of the intended starting and finishing times or ordinary working hours of the respective shifts.

(b) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

(c) (i) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.

(ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

(d) Where a shift commences at or after 11 p.m., then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

#### 13.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

### 14.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for half or more of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

#### 15.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to Clause 11 hereof, be allowed as holidays, without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Any worker absenting himself from work without reasonable cause, proof of which shall lie upon him, on the whole or any portion of the working day succeeding a holiday provided for herein, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this clause.

#### 16.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provision of this clause.

(f) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(g) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this clause.

#### 17.-Sick Leave.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

absence is for three (3) days or more. (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in sub-clause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues. (e) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply

(e) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this clause.

#### 18.—First Aid.

The employer shall provide a first aid chest in conformity with the scale prescribed by the Factories and Shops Act.

19.—Time and Wages Record.

(a) The employer shall keep a record containing:—

- (i) The names of all workers employed by him to whom this Award applies.
- (ii) The class of work performed.
- (iii) The hours worked (including overtime) by each worker; and
- (iv) The wages paid (including overtime) to each such worker.

(b) Such record may be inspected at any time during ordinary working hours by a duly accredited representative of the Union, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

20.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a Chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—

- (i) Adjusting any matter of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involves interpretations of the provision of this Award or any of them.
- (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Arbitration Act 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

### 21.—Posting of Notices.

The employer shall allow union notices, except those which on reasonable grounds he considers objectionable, and a copy of this award to be posted up by the Union in a place accessible to the workers and approved by the employer.

### 22.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

(i) Name in full.

(ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate, or if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled, he shall make restitution to the employer.

### 23.-Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

#### (b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with the one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 24th December, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that busines becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be the service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

- (4) Such service shall include-
  - (a) Any period of absence from duty on annual leave or long service leave.
  - (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
  - (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
  - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
    - (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26th, 1950;
    - (ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
    - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;

- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provision of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be---

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2), hereof of such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accural of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
  (iii) Where a weather here accurated at least to be accurate the service of the service after the service accurate the service accurate

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or

(iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraph (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

### (d) Payment for Period of Leave,

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

scribed standard; (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave. (4) The ordinary time vate of pay

- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
  - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
  - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

### (e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:---
  - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;

- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

### (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the 24th December, 1958.

### (g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

#### (h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

### (i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to Long Service Leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 24th December, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

### (j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

#### (k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

### INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. No. 51 of 1960.

Registered 26th September, 1960. THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912/52, this 26th day of September, 1960, between the Employers named in the Schedule of this Agreement of the one part and The Foremen Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia of the other part, witnesseth as follows:-

#### 1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to foremen steve-dores separately or conjointly employed by the employers named in the schedule of this Agreement and shall operate at the Port of Albany.

### 2.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this agreement:----

- (a) "foremen stevedore" shall mean and include any person permanently employed under supervision directing the loading or discharging of cargo on any wharf or any vessel or wheat gallery and/or directing the work of waterside workers, or engaging labour for such purposes, and shall also be engaged in making, repairshall also be engaged in making, repair-ing and storing of any gear used in steve-doring operations or the carting to and from the wharves of such gear. The term shall not include any employer, wharf manager, assistant wharf manager, super-intendent or supervisor employed by the employer as such.
- (b) "Employer" for the purpose of this Agreement shall mean any of the employers named in the schedule of this Agreement.
- "Ordinary Working Day" shall mean any (c) day Monday to Friday inclusive, excluding Holidays.
- (d) "Meal Hours" subject to the provisions of Clause 6 (a) shall mean:---
  - Breakfast-7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

  - Tea—5 p.m. to 6 p.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal hour).
  - Supper-Midnight to 1 a.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal hour).
- (e) "Union" shall mean The Foremen Steve-dores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia.

#### 3.-Rate of Pay.

(a) Basic Wage-£14 9s. 2d. (South-West land Division of the State).

(b) The hourly rate of pay to be paid to a foreman stevedore employed under this Agreement shall be the appropriate hourly rate from time to time paid or payable to a waterside worker in respect to ordinary time, overtime, meal hours, Saturday and Sunday time and Holidays, plus an hourly margin of 1/- per hour.

### 4.—Guarantee of Earnings.

(a) Subject to any mutual arrangements with employer/employers, a foreman stevedore shall make himself available for work as required in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) The earnings of each foreman stevedore shall be aggregated over each complete period of the fifty two (52) weeks from the commencement of this Agreement. Where the aggregate earnings of a Agreement. Where the aggregate earnings of a foreman stevedore during any such period of fifty two (52) weeks is less than the equivalent of fifty two (52) weeks of forty (40) hours at the ordinary hourly rate as prescribed in clause 3 (b) of this Agreement, the employers shall pay to that foreman stevedore such amount as together with his aggregate earnings will equal the equivalent of fifty two (52) weeks of forty (40) hours at the ordinary rate as prescribed in clause 3 (b) of this Agreement.

(c) In the event of the death, resignation or retirement of any foreman stevedore, or his perm-anent employment being terminated by the employers, the guaranteed minimum earnings shall be applied pro rata.

(d) The guaranteed minimum earnings prescribed in sub-clause (b) hereof, shall be subject to a reduction of eight (8) hours at the ordinary hourly rate prescribed in clause 3 (b) for each ordinary working day for which he is not available for employment.

(e) A foreman stevedore shall be deemed to be available for employment on any day on which he 7 (Holidays), 11 (Annual Leave), 12 (Sick Leave) and 18 (Long Service Leave).

(f) Wherever practicable, work shall be regulated in order that each foreman stevedore will receive an equal distribution of earnings, and will not be required to work excessive overtime.

(g) A foreman stevedore shall work where and as directed by the employers, and shall transfer as required from job to job and/or ship to ship whether being worked by the same Employer or not.

### 5.-Hours of Work.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty shall be between 8 a.m. and 12 noon, and 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) The normal shift hours shall conform with the hours of work as prescribed for waterside work from time to time at the Port of Albany.

(c) A foreman stevedore required to work during the ordinary hours of duty prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof shall be paid a minimum period of eight (8) hours at the appropriate rate.

#### 6.—Overtime.

An employer may require any foreman (a) stevedore to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates of pay and such foreman stevedore shall work overtime in accordance with such require-ment, provided that the meal hours referred to in clause 2 (d) may be advanced by one hour to enable a foreman stevedore to be available at the normal commencing time of the succeeding shift.

(b) Where a foreman stevedore is required to work outside the ordinary hours of duty as pre-scribed in clause 5 (a) hereof, he shall be paid minimum periods as follows:-

- (i) If required to resume after the tea meal hour on any day, until the normal term-ination of the shift.
- (ii) If required to work on the night shift, for the full normal duration of such shift.
- (iii) If required to work on a Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., eight (8) hours at the appropriate rate.

#### 7.--Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall, if occurring on any day Monday to Friday inclusive, be granted to foremen stevedores as a holiday with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates:-

- Ordinary Holidays.—New Year's Day, Anni-versary of Australia Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Boxing Day.
- Extraordinary Holidays.-Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day and Picnic Day (which shall be observed on the same day as the waterside workers' picnic day).

(b) When any of the aforementioned holidays falls on a Saturday or Sunday and a foreman stevedore is not required to work on that day, no payment shall be made.

(c) Payment shall not be made for any holiday which occurs whilst a foreman stevedore is off duty owing to leave without pay. Provided that a foreman stevedore shall not be regarded as be-ing off duty owing to leave without pay if he is available for duty on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes or is available for duty on the working day immediately following the holiday mescribed in (a) of this clause the holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause.

(d) Where a foreman stevedore is required to work on any holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause, he shall be paid for all time worked as provided for in clause 3 (b).

(e) In all cases of payment for work on holidays, the rate of payment prescribed in sub-clause (d) hereof, shall be deemed to include the ordinary payment for the holiday as prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof.

(f) A foreman stevedore engaged to work on a holiday irrespective of which shift or part of such shift he so works that day, shall be given a day in lieu thereof with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates such day to be taken with his annual leave or as otherwise mutually arranged.

### 8.-Working Through Meal Hours.

A foreman stevedore required to work continuappropriate meal hour rates until such time as one full hour's break has been allowed for a meal.

### 9.-Travelling Time.

A foreman stevedore engaged for work at the Deepwater Jetty shall be paid a travelling allowance under the same circumstances as is paid to waterside workers.

### 10.—Meal Money.

A foreman stevedore shall be subject to and entitled to the same conditions regarding payment of meal money as apply to the waterside workers at the port of Albany.

### 11.—Annual Leave.

(a) A foreman stevedore shall be entitled to three consecutive weeks' annual leave on pay for each completed year of continuous service.

(b) For lesser period of continuous service of one month or more, payment on a pro rata basis to the foregoing shall be granted.

### 12.-Contract of Service.

Except in cases of dishonesty, indiscipline or gross misconduct (when a foreman stevedore shall be subject to instant dismissal and entitled to his wages and all holiday pay due up to the time of such dismissal), a foreman stevedore shall give or be given one week's notice of the termination of service or one week's wages paid for or forfeited in lieu thereof, provided that the one week's notice shall not be counted as annual leave or part thereof.

### 13.—Obnoxious Cargoes.

A foreman stevedore shall receive agreed extra rates where they are affected by unusually danger-ous or obnoxious conditions in the area where they are working for the period of such disability.

### 14.—Overalls and Oilskins.

A foreman stevedore permanently employed shall be supplied with one suit of overalls each twelve months and one oilskin coat every two years. An overcoat may be substituted for the oilskin coat provided the employee is prepared to pay the difference in cost.

### 15.—Preference of Employment.

All persons permanently employed as foremen stevedores shall be members of the Union, pro-vided that any employee who at the time of engagement is not a member of such Union, shall be-come a member thereof within fourteen (14) days and provided also that the Union shall not refuse to accept as a member any such employee who is eligible and applies in the manner prescribed under the rules of the Union to become a member thereof.

### 16.-Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between a foreman stevedore and the Employers, work shall be con-tinued without any cessation and the matter re-ferred to a Board of Reference, consisting of one (1) representative each of the Union and Employ-ers and a Chairman to be mutually arread unce ers and a Chairman, to be mutually agreed upon by those Representatives; failing their agreement the Magistrate of the Local Court shall act as Chairman.

### 17.-Long Service Leave.

A foreman stevedore shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with the provisions of Order No. 55 of 1958 of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

### 18.—Operation.

This Agreement shall operate from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on the twenty sixth day of September one thousand nine hund-red and sixty and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years.
