Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

(d) The actual time at which work is com-menced shall be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker, and no alteration of these times shall be introduced until seven days shall have elapsed after the Union has been notified of such alteration.

6.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, until the usual time of start on the next ordinary day.

(b) All work performed on Saturday after twelve noon or on Sunday shall be paid for at double time rates.

(c) Work performed by pieceworkers, beyond the ordinary hours of duty and all time worked on Saturday before 12 noon shall be paid for at the rate of 50 per cent. in addition to the ordin-ary piecework rates, for the first four hours, and at the rate of 100 per cent. in addition to ordinary piecework rates thereafter until the usual time of starting on the next ordinary working day.

Work performed by pieceworkers on Saturdays after 12 noon or on Sundays, shall be paid for at the rate of 100 per cent. in addition to ordinary piecework rates.

(d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day's work shall stand alone.

(e) As far as practicable, no junior worker shall be employed on overtime unless the proportion of adults to juniors as provided in this Award is maintained whilst such overtime is worked.

- (f) Notwithstanding anything contained herein: (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisations, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this sub-clause.

7.---Meal Money.

A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

9.-Leading Hands.

Any worker appointed by the employer as a leading hand shall be paid in addition to the prescribed rates as under:— Per Week

10.—Mixed Functions.

A worker engaged for more than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

11.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service of every worker shall be a contract of hiring by the week. One week's definite notice shall be given on either side of the termination of the engagement: Provided that a worker may be summarily dismissed for misconduct, in which case he shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(b) All wages shall be paid in cash, on or before Friday, in each week, and shall be paid within ten (10) minutes of the usual time for finishing work.

(c) Except as provided in subclause (d) hereof, when the engagement of a worker is terminated he shall be paid all wages and holiday pay due to him within ten (10) minutes of the expiration of the engagement.

(d) When the engagement of a worker is terminated for misconduct, he shall be paid all wages due to him, within two (2) hours of the termination of his engagement.

12.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union, or the unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Holidays.

(a) Subject to subclause (b) hereof the following days or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:— New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All work performed on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

All work performed by pieceworkers on such days shall be paid for at the rate of 100 per cent. in addition to ordinary piecework rates.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) All work performed by pieceworkers on such days shall be paid for at the rate of 100 per cent. in addition to ordinary piecework rates.

14.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

 $(\ensuremath{\mathbf{g}})$ The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

15.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his em-ployer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(e) Notwithstanding the provision of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year unless during the ordinary working hours that the worker is absent the employer requests in writing the employee to produce on his return to work a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

16.-Time and Wages Record

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered:-

(a) The name and sex of each worker, includ-ing piece workers;

- (b) The nature of his or her employment;
- (c) The time he or she commences and finishes work each day;
- (d) The total hours worked each day and each week;
- (e) The wages and overtime (if any) received therefor;
- (f) The ages and sex of junior workers.

Such book shall be entered up each day in legible English characters and shall be signed weekly only if correct by each worker. Such book shall be open for inspection at the factory office by the Union representative during working hours.

Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this pro-vision to the extent of the information recorded.

17.—Employment of Females.

Female workers shall not be employed on the following work: Pan work, bottle-brush making (other than baby bottle-brush making), finishing, millet-broom making or on any work other than bench drawing, filling machine, automatic boring and filling machine, semi-automatic boring and filling trimming machine, mining machine filling machine, trimming machine, mixing machine and applying lacquer or duco.

Feather dusters, fiat varnish brushes, mops, millet whisks and baby bottle-brushes may be made by females.

18.—Proportion of Juniors.

(a) Males—Junior workers (male) shall be allowed in the proportion of one (1) junior to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) workers in receipt of the full adult male rate prescribed in this Award.

(b) Females—Junior workers (female) shall be allowed in the proportion of one (1) junior to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) workers in receipt of the full adult female rate prescribed in this Award.

(c) Where no experienced adult male or female worker is available, ready and willing to perform work under this Award, the employer may employ additional male or female junior workers in excess of the proportions prescribed in subclauses (a) and (b) of this clause.

(d) The proportions prescribed in subclause (a) and (b) of this clause shall at all times be strictly maintained; provided that nothing in this clause shall operate to cause the dismissal of any junior worker employed in the industry at the date of this Award. If any junior worker employed in the industry at the date of this Award. If any junior worker employed in the in-dustry at the date of this award shall cease to be employed in the industry through any cause what-soever, his or her place may be filled by another junior worker; provided that the engagement of such junior worker shall not operate to cause the dismissal of any adult worker. (e) In the event of any adult male or female worker being dismissed for any reason other than misconduct, and such adult male or female worker is not replaced by another adult male or female worker as the case may be, the proportion of junior male or female workers, as the case may be, prescribed in subclauses (a) and (b) of this clause shall immediately be effected.

19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers upon being engaged, shall fur-nish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

(i) name in full.

(ii) age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an em-ployer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate, or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award and in the be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled, he shall make restitution to the employer.

20.---Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or in-firmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker may be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

21.-Right of Entry.

Accredited representatives of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers on the business premises of the employer during non-working times or meal breaks.

In the case of dispute between the Union and an employer which is likely to lead to a cessation of work or to an application to the Court and which involves the inspection of workers or of machines in the process of production, such union representatives shall have right of entry into the factory at any time during which the workers or machines concerned are working, but this per-mission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

22.-Posting of Award and Union Notices.

(a) A copy of this Award supplied by the Union shall be placed in a suitable place agreed upon by the employer and the union.

(b) The accredited union representative shall not be prevented from posting any notice of the union not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon be-tween the employer and the union. Failing agree-ment in this connection the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award, or the said notices, shall be posted.

23.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purposes of the (a) The Court appoints, for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the functions of :-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpre-tation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

24.-Outdoor Work.

No work of any description or class covered by this Award shall be done or performed for any employer, except in the factory workshop of any employer bound by this Award.

25.—Provision of Materials and Tools.

(a) The employer shall provide all materials and tools used by his employees. $\label{eq:alpha}$

(b) No charge shall be made against a worker for the use of bench appliances or tools of trade supplied by the employer.

(c) Clocks—One reliable clock shall be installed in each factory, and the starting and finishing time of workers shall be taken from that clock.

26.-No Reduction.

This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his or her class of work.

27.—Casual Workers.

(a) Any worker dismissed through no fault of his own before the expiration of one (1) week of his employment shall be considered casual and shall receive ten per centum (10%) above the rate specified for the work performed.

(b) Casual workers may be put off or leave at any time without notice.

28.—Piecework.

(a) An employer may make a contract with any worker or group of workers for payment by results by piecework.

(b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity for a full week's work of ordinary hours at least the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work: Provided that, where a worker works part of a full week at piecework rates and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under such piecework rates, plus the proportionate amount which he is entitled to receive under this Award at time rates of pay.

(c) A worker working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay as prescribed herein.

(d) In the event of any dispute regarding piecework rates occurring and remaining unsettled between the employer and workers, the employer or the union may refer such dispute to the Board of Reference.

(e) If any increase or decrease in the basic wage as proclaimed from time to time is not included in the piecework rates, the worker's earnings shall be increased or decreased as the case may be, in accordance with such increase or decrease in the basic wage.

29.-Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with the one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be the service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include-

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service---
 - (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slacknes of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;

(i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the

such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

(a) by his death;

(b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct.

- the amount of leave shall be-
 - (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
 - (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated —

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard; (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay-

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment, for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum

equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termina-tion. Such payment shall be deemed to have satis-fied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought Into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled be any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may de-duct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a or payment in lieu thereof under a State law of a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in re-spect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation bereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the avtort of the period of such leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which of three years thereafter, keep a fecord from which can be readily ascertained the name of each wor-ker and his occupation, the date of the commence-ment of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which pay-ment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:-

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefore nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Indus-trial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a wor-ker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave the period in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in sub-stitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in re-spect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its emlong service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an approp-riate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Aus-tralian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employees? Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period commencing from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof and ending on the 30th June, 1961.

4.-–Area.

This Award shall operate over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

5.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers engaged in classifications referred to herein employed by the Metropolitan (Perth) Passenger Transport Trust.

6.—Divisions.

This Award shall be divided into divisions viz.a preliminary division (Clauses 1 to 6); a division applicable to the Traffic Section (Clauses 7 to 22); a division applicable to the Non-Traffic Section (Clauses 23 to 29) and a division applicable generally to all workers under the award (Clauses 30 to 47).

Division II.—Traffic Section.

7.—Definitions.

(a) "Omnibus Driver" shall mean any worker employed to drive a motor omnibus vehicle whilst it is being used to carry passengers.

(b) "Trolley Bus Driver" shall mean any worker employed to drive a trolley bus whilst it is being used to carry passengers.

used to carry passengers. (c) "Conductor" shall mean any worker, except the driver, who is employed to collect fares from passengers travelling in a trolley bus or in an omni-bus and who, with the permission of the Trust, directs the starting or stopping of such vehicle. (d) "Leading Hand" shall mean a worker in charge of work who directs three (3) or more workers

workers.

(e) "Shunter" shall mean a worker required to drive all types of vehicles including tractor for the purpose of shunting.

(f) "Part Time Industrial Driver" shall mean a driver employed as such by agreement between the Trust and the Unions concerned.

(g) "Fare Collector" shall mean any worker whose only duty is to collect fares from passen-gers travelling in an omnibus or from intending passengers in queues.

8.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week, to be worked in not more than five (5) shifts.

(b) Any worker required to report for duty on any shift prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall, subject to subclause 12 (b) hereof, be deemed to have worked six (6) hours at least for shifts worked from Monday to Friday (inclusive) and five (5) hours for shifts worked on Saturday, Sunday or public holidays. Provided that the fore-going minimum periods may be lessened by agree-ment between the Trust and the Unions concerned.

(c) Drivers, conductors and fare collectors shall be paid not less than one (1) hour for any portion of a rostered shift.

(d) Any time worked on any shift prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be worked in a con-tinuous period excepting meal intervals, provided that in the case of omnibus and trolley bus drivers, conductors or fare collectors, broken shifts may be worked to suit the exigencies of the Trust's business. In such cases no shift shall consist of more than three (3) periods of working time.

9.—Day Off.

(a) Wherever practicable forty-eight (48) hours' notice of cancellation of a day off shall be given.

(b) Any worker called for duty on such days and actually attending for such duty shall receive a minimum of four (4) hours' pay at the rate applicable to the day unless at least two (2) hours' notice is given to him that he is not required to report for duty.

(c) Where a worker is required to work cn his rostered day off and is given another day off in lieu in the same week he shall be paid for any time worked on such rostered day off at the rate applicable to the day plus one-quarter. If a worker is not given another day off in lieu he shall be paid for any time worked at the rate of time and a half except in the case of Saturdays, Sun-days and Holidays prescribed in Clause 45 hereof, when the rate shall be double time.

(d) As far as practicable work on rostered days off, at each depot, shall be distributed among all workers desirous of performing such work in such a manner as to give each such worker a proper share of the work.

10.—Three Portion Shifts, Call Backs and Meal Allowance.

(a) In any three portion shift, the time worked in one of such portions shall be paid for at the rate applicable to the day plus one-quarter. Such quarter time extra shall stand alone and be pa.d for in addition to the ordinary weekly wage.

(b) When called upon during the performance of a shift to do a call back (not being a rostered third portion of a shift) a meal allowance of five shillings (5s.) shall be paid.

(c) Where on any day through the alteration of a rostered shift without reasonable notice, the meal relief time of a driver or conductor is reduced below one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours, or the time of taking such meal relief is altered by more than one (1) hour, a meal allowance of five shillings (5s.) shall be granted.

11.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the ordinary weekly hours; or in excess of nine (9) hours in any one shift; or outside the daily rostered hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half except that any time worked in excess of a daily spread of twelve (12) hours shall be paid for at the rate of double time provided that payment shall not be made twice for the same hour of work.

(b) Any worker called upon to work before or after his daily rostered hours of duty shall be paid a minimum of one (1) hour provided that this subclause shall not apply in the case of an accident, absence of another worker, or any other cause whatsoever beyond the control of the Trust.

(c) All time worked by drivers, conductors and fare collectors on special passenger services outside the usual rostered timetable between the hours of midnight and 5 a.m., shall be deemed to be overtime and be paid for at the rate of double time with a minimum of two (2) hours work at that rate. This subclause shall not apply to workers employed on the night staff.

(d) The Trust may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

12.—Saturday and Sunday Work.

(a) All time worked during ordinary hours on a Saturday shift shall be paid for at half time extra or on a Sunday shift at ordinary time extra. Such half time or ordinary time extra shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the ordinary weekly wage. For the purpose of this subclause a Saturday or Sunday shift shall be deemed to be a shift commencing on a Saturday or Sunday irrespective of the number of hours worked on such days.

(b) Any worker required for duty on a Saturday or Sunday and actually attending for such duty shall receive a minimum of two (2) hours' pay at the rate applicable to the day unless at least two (2) hours' notice is given to him that he is not required to report for duty.

13.—Meal Relief.

No worker shall be rostered for continuous duty for a longer period than five and three-quarter $(5\frac{3}{4})$ hours without a meal break of at least thirty-five (35) minutes at a depot or at least forty-five (45) minutes elsewhere. This subclause shall not apply to depot night staff whose daily hours may be worked consecutively without a break but where a break is given it shall be thirty (30) minutes.

Reasonable facilities for boiling water shall be provided by the Trust at each depot.

14.—Rosters.

(a) The Trust shall post a shift roster showing the shifts to be worked from each depot not less than fourteen (14) days before such shifts commence to operate provided that such roster may be altered in the case of holidays or change of routes or any contingency that the Trust could not reasonably foresee. Such roster may be inspected by the Unions concerned.

(b) The Trust shall post a duty roster showing the shifts to be worked during each week by omnibus drivers, trolley bus drivers, conductors and fare collectors, other than relief workers, which roster shall be exhibited in each depot concerned in such a place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.

(c) Such duty roster shall be posted weekly by the Trust before 1 p.m. Thursday and may only be altered on account of sickness or absence of a worker or on account of any contingency that the Trust could not reasonably foresee. Any alteration which may be required to this duty roster shall be drawn to the personal attention of the worker concerned at least a reasonable time before it becomes effective.

(d) As far as practicable rostered shifts shall rotate weekly to the intent that all workers on the roster may receive a proper share of all shifts on the roster. This subclause shall not apply to workers classified by the Trust as drivers although the major portion of their time is spent on work other than driving.

(e) Workers shall sign on and off at the beginning and end of their day's work at their depot or at such other places as may be fixed from time to time by agreement between the Trust and the Union concerned.

(f) Workers may change shifts or days off on any specified day or days by written joint application to the Trust and on approval. Where workers have changed shifts or days off in accordance with the foregoing they shall be deemed to have worked on the specified day or days the hours they would have worked had the change not been made.

(g) Omnibus drivers, trolley bus drivers, conductors or fare collectors arriving late for duty shall report to the depot master or his deputy who shall instruct whether they will be required or not for the whole or part of the remainder of the rostered shift. Should a worker be required to commence work he shall be paid for the actual time worked.

15.—Spread of Shifts.

(a) Except by agreement between the Trust and the Unions concerned—

- (i) the rostered spread of shifts shall not exceed twelve (12) hours from the beginning to the end of the day's work, except for a shift on special hire or in case of accident or any contingency the Trust could not reasonably foresee.
- (ii) no worker shall be called upon until he has had at least ten (10) hours off duty except to facilitate the weekly change of shift or in the case of a contingency that the Trust could not reasonably foresee, but in no case shall such rest period be less than eight (8) hours.

(b) No worker shall be booked off for a lesser period than thirty-five (35) minutes.

(c) Any work performed by omnibus drivers, trolley bus drivers, conductors or fare collectors on any day outside a spread of ten (10) consecutive hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half up to a spread of eleven (11) consecutive hours and double time thereafter.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, all time worked after 7 p.m. on shifts commencing before 9 a.m. on any day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

16.—Mixed Functions.

The Trust may require a worker to perform any work, but in respect of work covered by this Award performed by any worker, who is engaged for

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more than two (2) hours in any day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of such day or shift. If employed for two (2) hours or less he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked provided that any worker regularly required to drive shall be classified as a driver.

17.—Specials.

(a) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in this Award where a worker is required to work a shift on special hire he shall be paid only for the actual time driving irrespective of the time which elapses between commencing work and finishing work on any shift provided that a payment is to be made of at least six (6) hours twenty (20) minutes.

(b) If the period between the time of commencing work and finishing work exceeds twelve (12) hours a payment is to be made of at least seven (7) hours twenty (20) minutes and in addition all such time not occupied in driving in excess of twelve (12) hours shall stand alone and be paid as waiting time at half the time rate applicable for that day.

(c) Any worker who is covered by the provision of Clause 40, (Away from Home Allowance) shall not be entitled to be paid waiting time.

18.—Allowances.

(a) The time to be allowed to each worker for carrying out all duties incidental to his work shall be counted as part of the ordinary hours of work. Such times shall be fixed by agreement between the Trust and the Unions concerned or in default of agreement by a Board of Reference or by a Running Times Committee to be constituted by agreement between the parties or failing such agreement by the Court which hereby gives leave to either party to apply in that behalf.

(b) (i) Except in answering charges of his own misconduct from which he is not subsequently exonerated or for any explanation of failure to attend for duty or to furnish a report requested to be supplied on or before the previous day a worker attending by instruction of the Trust at his depot or elsewhere to answer complaints, furnish reports, supply statements or affidavits, submit to medical examination for eyesight or hearing tests or to attend any Court or coronial enquiry shall be paid for the time actually occupied at ordinary rates and reimbursed any train or bus fares reasonably expended.

(ii) Any worker, entitled to payment under paragraph (i) hereof, who so attends without having started his ordinary day's work and the distance travelled exceeds the distance from his place of residence to his usual signing on point, shall be paid in addition travelling time at ordinary rates in respect of such excess distance.

(iii) For making any report required by the Trust in his own time a worker shall be paid nine-pence (9d.) for each such report.

19.—Shortages.

(a) A list of all shortages and surpluses shall be posted at the depot each week.

(b) Workers with shortages posted against them shall be allowed to check their revenue and running journals and if desired any previous revenue and running journal.

(c) The Trust may deduct any shortage from any wages due to a worker or otherwise recover the amount from him. All accountable surpluses to be paid to the worker concerned.

(d) Where a worker is required to visit the head office or depot in his own time to rectify shortages deducted from his pay and then found to have been wrongly deducted he shall be paid one half hour's pay at ordinary rates.

20.—Uniforms.

Should the Trust require or request workers to wear uniforms or wearing apparel of any specified description it shall provide same free of cost to workers. Such uniform or wearing apparel shall remain the property of the Trust and shall be returned to the Trust on demand in good order and condition subject to fair wear and tear.

21.-Rates of Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this section of the Award shall be as follows:—

Liberty to apply is reserved to any party to this Award in respect to the employment of and rates of wages for junior male workers.

22.—Special Rates.

(a) Leading Hands.—A Leading Hand placed in charge of;

- (i) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid at the rate of nineteen shillings (19s.) a week extra;
- (ii) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid at the rate of thirty-eight shillings and sixpence (38s. 6d.) a week extra;
- (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid at the rate of fifty-seven shillings and sixpence (57s. 6d.) per week extra.

(b) On engagement as a student any worker learning the duties of a driver, conductor or collector shall be paid at the rate of the basic wage providing he completes the period of tuition and is offered and accepts employment in the position so offered. Provided that any worker employed by the Trust in any classification shall be paid for any such time as if it were part of his normal duties.

- (c) Traffic workers shall be paid-
 - (i) ninepence (9d.) per hour extra in the case of drivers training student trolleybus drivers; and
 - (ii) ninepence (9d.) per hour in the case of conductors on the days when they are actually employed instructing student conductors.

(d) Drivers required to collect fares when working one-man vehicles shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per shift in addition to their ordinary wage, irrespective of whether they work a full shift or not.

(e) An allowance of sevenpence (7d.) per hour shall be paid to traffic workers for all ordinary time, payable at ordinary rates, worked between 8 p.m. on one day and 1 a.m. on the following day and between 5 a.m. and 6 a.m. Monday to Friday inclusive, except where a public holiday is observed on any of those days.

Broken periods of less than thirty (30) minutes on any shift shall be disregarded and from thirty (30) minutes to fifty-nine (59) minutes shall be paid as for one (1) hour.

(f) Drivers and conductors continuously employed on night shift and commencing duty after 10 p.m. shall be paid ten per cent (10%) per shift in addition to the rates paid for the class of work performed.

(g) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in this Award, part-time industrial drivers shall only be entitled to be paid for the time actually worked at the appropriate rate applicable to the day with the addition of a loading of twentyfive per cent (25 %) with a maximum of double time.

Division III.—Non-Traffic Section. 23.—Definitions.

(a) "Casual Worker" shall mean any worker who is dismissed through no fault of his own before the expiration of one week from the date of commencing work.

(b) "Storeman" shall mean a worker who is employed supplying materials, goods, etc., on receipt of orders and who maintains stocks and is responsible for the receipt of and/or distribution of tools, materials, etc.

(c) "Storeman's Assistant" shall mean a worker who supplies materials, goods, etc., on the instruction of the Storeman.

(d) "First Class Welder". First class welder means a worker using electric arc or acetylene, petrol or coal gas blow pipe on any work other than—

- (a) filling castings, or
- (b) cutting scrap metal, or
- (c) welding with the aid of jigs, or
- (d) operations specifically mentioned as being the work of a second, third or fourth class welder in the definitions of those terms hereunder.

(e) "Second Class Welder." Second class welder means a worker who-

- (a) uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in filling castings, or
- (b) welds with the aid of jigs, or
- (c) operates automatic welding machines for the setting up of which he is not responsible, or
- (d) operates a profile cutting or a straight line cutting machine.

(f) "Third Class Welder". Third class welder means a worker who uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in tacking preparatory to the completion of work by any other worker.

(g) "Fourth Class Welder". Fourth class welder means a worker using an electric spot or butt welding machine, or cutting scrap with oxy-acetylene blow pipe, petrol or coal gas blow pipe.

(h) "Trimmer (Vehicle)". A trimmer (vehicle) shall include any male worker who does any trimming or leather work in connection with motors or any vehicle in the vehicle building and repair trade.

(i) "Painter (Vehicle Building and Repairing)". A painter (vehicle building and repairing) shall include any skilled worker handling a paint brush or spray on to a motor car or any other vehicles in the vehicle building and repair trade: Provided that polishing in connection with all pyroxylin materials shall be considered the work of painters' labourers and junior workers.

(j) "Painter's Labourer (Vehicle Building and Repairing)". A painter's labourer (vehicle building and repairing) shall include any worker engaged in stripping, rubbing-down, cleaning undergears, and all preparatory work connected with paining other than using a paint brush or spray, except for black underparts and applying all lead and filling coats other than the finishing coat; Provided, however, that any worker operating a paint machine or spray shall be paid full tradesman's rates whilst so employed.

(k) "Leading Hand" shall mean a worker in charge of work who directs three (3) or more workers.

24.—Special Rates and Provisions.

(a) Workers required to apply a coat of tar to butts of poles shall be paid an amount of one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day in addition to their ordinary rate.

(b) (i) No linesman shall go out with the tower wagon, except in cases of urgency, without an assistant.

(ii) No linesman shall work without an assistant when engaged on ladder work, unless in case of emergency when such assistant may not be available.

(c) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein, provided that a casual worker shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at such ordinary rates in respect of any day upon which he is required to report for work.

(d) Painters (Vehicle Building and Repairing)-

- (i) Dry rubbing down—No surface painted with lead paint shall be rubbed down or scraped by dry process.
- (ii) Washing of hands.—The Trust shall provide, for workers in the painting branch of the industry, washing facilities and soap suitable as a solvent for paint mixtures, in some convenient place, for the use of workers before meals and after knocking off work.
- (iii) Spray painting.—Where painters using sprays are employed, adequate protection for their health shall be provided by the Trust. They shall also be provided with respirators.

It shall be considered a breach of this Award for spray painting operation to be carried on contrary to any order of or regulations made under or in pursuance of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1959.

 (iv) Painters shall be allowed five (5) minutes each day before ceasing work at end of shift, for the purpose of washing and cleaning up.

(e) No worker shall be permitted to have a meal in any paint shop, or in such close proximity to any place where painting operations are being carried on as is likely to cause injury to his health.

(f) Blowers—Where practicable, blowers shall be installed in and around wood-working machines where dust is created and likely to affect the health of the workers.

(g) (i) Where a woodworker using his own tools has been in employment for more than one (1) week, the Trust shall allow him one (1) hour with payment therefor on termination of his employment to enable him to sharpen and pack his tools.

(ii) The worker shall be permitted to use the Trust's emery wheel or grindstone to sharpen his own tools in the course of his employment. (h) Tools---

- (i) Woodworkers and other branches requiring files and hacksaw blades, bench vyces, cramps (above four inches) and rasps for the execution of their work, to be supplied with same by the Trust.
- (ii) Where the apprentice to woodworking provides his own tools other than those mentioned in paragraph (i) hereof, he shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) perweek in his fourth and fifth year.
- (iii) Where the woodworker provides his own tools other than those mentioned in paragraph (i) hereof, he shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per week.

(i) Leading Hands—A Leading Hand placed in charge of—

- (i) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid at the rate of nineteen shillings (19s.) a week extra;
- (ii) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid at the rate of thirty-eight shillings and sixpence (38s. 6d.) a week extra;
- (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid at the rate of fifty-seven shillings and sixpence (57s. 6d.) per week extra.

25.—Rates of Wages.

26.—Mixed Functions.

A worker engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for half of one day or shift or less he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

27.-Hours of Duty.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) in any one day and, except in the case of shift workers, shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. (7 p.m. for linesmen) Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) Where shifts are worked these shall rotate as far as practicable.

(d) Any worker employed on a night shift, being a shift commencing after 10 p.m., shall be paid ten percent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate except where no day shift or day work is performed when he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.

(e) Liberty is reserved to any party to apply to amend this Award insofar as the fixation of rates for ordinary work on Saturdays and Sundays is concerned.

28.—Overtime.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty on any day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) (i) Rest period after overtime. When overtime is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(iii) If, on the instructions of the Trust, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(d) The Trust may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement. (e) (i) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the Trust or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

(ii) If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the Trust shall, unless it has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such period or subsequent meal.

(iii) No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

(iv) If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(f) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(g) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates. Provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work for the two (2) hours if the job for which he has been recalled has been completed in less time.

29.—Apprentices.

(a) The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the Apprenticeship Regulations, 1953 which are deemed to be embodied in and form part of this Award.

(b) Apprentices may be taken to the following trades or callings, namely: 1st class Welding; Bodymaking and/or Electric Welding; Painting (Vehicle Building and Repairing); Trimming (Vehicle) and Panel-beating including Welding; in the proportion of one (1) apprentice for every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen provided that the fraction of two (2) shall not be less than one (1).

Division IV.—General Section. 30.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

31.—Guaranteed Week.

(a) All workers, except casual or industrial part time workers, shall be guaranteed a full week's work, but if during any period by reason of any action on the part of any section of the Trust's workers, or for any cause beyond the control of the Trust it is unable to carry on either wholly or partially the complete running of buses, workshops or other normal operations, the Trust shall be entitled to employ only such workers (if any) it considers can be usefully employed and for such hours as it considers necessary and during such period no worker shall be entitled to payment except for work actually performed provided that workers who are required on any day, shall be paid a minimum of one (1) day's pay at ordinary rates.

(b) Any worker stood down in accordance with the foregoing provision shall not lose any sick leave credits or other rights or privileges to which such worker would ordinarily be entitled under this Award provided such a worker resumes work as required after such stand down and provided further that this provision does not entitle a worker to payment for any holiday occurring during such period of stand down.

32.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the Trust in the event of the worker being entitled, by service subsequent to the sickness, to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from the Trust for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising cut of his own wilful defaut.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to the Trust of sickness, but the Trust shall not be entitled to a medical certificate, unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the periods specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by the Trust as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by the Trust in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, in the case of a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion the Trust before paying for any further absence in the same year may insist on the worker obtaining a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty because of personal ill health even although such absence was for less than three (3) days.

(f) For the purpose of this clause "calendar year" means a year from 1st January to 31st December.

33.—Under Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may, from time to time, be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the Trust.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

34.—Records.

The Secretary of the Union or his nominated deputy shall be entitled at all reasonable times during ordinary office hours to inspect the Trust's records of the hours worked by and the wages paid to workers covered by this Award.

35.—Passes.

Each worker shall be issued with a pass to be available over all routes operated by the Trust and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed from time to time by the Trust.

36.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time,

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(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

37 .- Temporary Change of Place of Employment.

(a) If a worker is transferred temporarily to work at a garage, depot or place which requires him to travel one (1) mile or more from his home beyond the distance he usually travels the excess time and fares to and from shall be paid for by the Trust. Any dispute arising under this clause shall be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(b) A relief worker shall have some one depot named as his regular depot and when he is required elsewhere he shall be treated as being temporarily transferred and subject to the provisions of subclause (a) hereof.

38.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers shall furnish the Trust witha certificate showing the following particulars:—(i) name in full;

(ii) age and date of birth.

(b) The Certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim from the Trust for additional wages on the ground of age in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate; provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the Trust if it so desires to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

39.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions relating to long service leave for full time Government wages employees generally as in force as at the date of this Award and as may be amended from time to time shall apply to all workers employed under the provisions of this Award.

40.—Away From Home Allowance.

Workers engaged on work in which they are unable to return to their homes at night shall be paid such personal expenses as they may reasonably incur. Provided that such expenses will not be less than fifteen shillings (15s.) per day.

41.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid weekly on such days and at such times as may be agreed upon between the parties.

42.—Protective Clothing and Equipment.

(a) The Trust shall have available protective clothing or equipment for use by its workers when engaged on work for which some protective clothing or equipment is reasonably necessary.

(b) (i) The Trust may require a worker to sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective clothing or equipment and he shall return same to the Trust when he has finished using it or on leaving its employment.

(ii) No worker to whom clothing or equipment has been issued under paragraph (i) hereof shall lend another worker any such article of protective clothing or equipment issued to such first mentioned worker and if the same are lent both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.

(c) During the time any article of protective clothing or equipment is on issue to a worker he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereof, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

43.-Increments.

In addition to the amounts set out in clauses 21 and 25, hereof, adult workers shall be paid an additional amount of two shillings (2s.) per week after ten (10) years continuous service and a

further additional amount of one shilling (1s.) per week after each subsequent five (5) years' continuous service.

44.-Contract of Service.

(a) (i) The contract of service of all workers, except casuals, shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture of one week's wages by the Trust or the worker concerned, as the case may be.

(ii) In the case of dismissal for serious and wilful misconduct the reason for such dismissal must be given in writing.

(iii) Provided that by agreement between the Trust and the worker concerned the notice or payment prescribed herein may be varied either in whole or in part.

(b) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for serious and wilful misconduct.

(c) The Trust shall, on engagement, state whether such worker is engaged as a casual hand or otherwise and shall not be deemed to be a casual hand unless he had been specifically engaged as such.

45.-Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) In addition to their annual leave, all workers other than casuals shall be granted the following holidays:— New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Xmas Day, Boxing Day and any other day proclaimed as a general public holiday.

(b) (i) A worker, other than one employed in the traffic section required to work on any of the days prescribed in subclause (a) hereof, shall be paid for such time at ordinary rates of pay and be subsequently allowed a day off duty without deduction of pay in respect of each day so worked, provided that any such day off may be added to the worker's period of annual leave.

(ii) A worker employed in the traffic section required to work on any of the days prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for all time worked at the rate of time and a half. For the purpose of this paragraph all time worked during a shift commencing on any of such days and only such time, shall be deemed to be worked on any of such prescribed days.

(iii) Any worker who would have normally worked but is not required for duty on any of the days prescribed under subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for eight (8) hours at ordinary time.

(c) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave there shall be added to that period one (1) day (on which he shall be deemed to have worked) for each such holiday observed.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) (i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave on ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker, other than one employed in the traffic section, by the Trust after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service.

(ii) Workers employed in the traffic section shall be allowed one (1) week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in paragraph (i) hereof. Where a worker with twelve (12) months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve (12) monthly period in the traffic section he shall be entitled to have the period of two (2) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in paragraph (i) hereof increased by one twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(f) Subject to subclause (h) of this clause if a worker after one (1) month's continuous service in any twelve (12) monthly qualifying period lawfully

leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the Trust, the worker shall be paid for such proportion of the appropriate period of annual leave set out in the preceding subclause as the number of completed months of his service in that qualifying period bears to the full qualifying period of twelve (12) months.

(g) Workers shall be paid for annual leave at their classified rates of pay when such annual leave is taken. Provided that if within two (2) weeks before such annual leave is taken the worker is acting in a higher capacity and has been so acting for a period of not less than two (2) months continuously, the annual leave shall be paid for at the rate applicable to such higher capacity position.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for serious and wilful misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of subclause (f) of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(j) Liberty to apply for the insertion of a provision for an annual stand down of any section of the workers is reserved to the Trust if it should deem it advisable.

46.—Complaints and Charges Against Workers.

(a) When any complaint as to the conduct of any worker is received by the Trust or when any officer of the Trust charges any worker with any misconduct or breach of duty the officer of the Trust responsible for dealing with such complaint or charge shall first cause to be made a preliminary investigation of the circumstances. If as a result of such investigation the officer concerned is of the opinion that such complaint or charge may be true and is not of so trivial a nature as not to warrant any action, he shall require the worker concerned to attend before him to explain the incident or circumstances relating to the complaint or charge.

(b) Any worker required under the provisions of subclause (a) to explain the incident or circumstances relating to a complaint or charge, may if he so desires, be accompanied by an official of the Union of which he is a member.

(c) The officer dealing with the complaint or charge shall give to the worker full particulars of the complaint or charge and, if in his opinion, it is of so serious a nature as likely if proved true to result in the dismissal of the worker shall also give to the worker the name and address of the person making the complaint or charge and in any case before coming to any final decision on the matter shall allow the worker (if desired) reasonable time to bring before such officer any other worker or member of the public who may have any knowledge of the facts.

(d) Any worker aggrieved by a decision of the officer dealing with a complaint or charge shall have the opportunity to bring all the facts relating thereto before the Chairman of the Trust and in so doing may have the assistance of an official of the Union of which he is a member.

(e) No record prejudicial to a worker shall be made on his Conduct Record Card unless the provisions of this Clause have first been complied with.

47.—Preference.

(a) Preference of employment shall be given to suitable members of the Unions parties to this Award. Provided that any worker or applicant for employment who furnishes proof that he is a financial member of any other registered industrial union of workers shall subject to the provisions hereinafter contained be given equal preference.

(b) Any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any Union party to this Award or of any other registered industrial union of workers shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this award apply in accordance with its Rules to become a member of an appropriate union party to this award and any worker who is not a member of any Union party to this award but is a member of another registered industrial union of workers shall within fourteen (14) days from the expiration of his then current membership with such other Union apply to become a member of an appropriate Union party to this Award.

(c) The provisions of this clause shall not debar from employment or continuance in employment any applicant for employment or any worker whose application to become a member of an appropriate Union party to this award has been refused by such Union without reasonable cause unless and until such refusal is withdrawn.

(d) Any worker or applicant for employment who becomes a member of any Union, a party to this award, shall continue his financial membership of such Union in accordance with its Rules, while he continues to be employed under this award.

(e) The Trust shall within fourteen (14) days of being advised in writing by any Union party to this award of the breach by a worker of the provisions of this clause determine the employment of any worker who fails to comply with the provisions of this clause unless such breach is remedied by the worker concerned within such fourteen (14) days. Any dispute as to whether a worker has committed a breach of this clause may be referred to a Board of Reference by either the Trust or the Union concerned.

(f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to any worker who objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to being a member of an industrial union of workers, so long as such worker, from time to time, pays to a charitable organisation nominated by the Court an amount equivalent to the subscription and levies prescribed by the rules of the appropriate union to be paid by members of that union.

(g) Should any dispute arise as to the conscientious religious beliefs of any worker or applicant for employment the same shall be referred to a Board of Reference appointed under the award.

Between The West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Boans Ltd. and others, Respondents.

HAVING heard Mr. J. E. Try on behalf of the applicant and Mr. G. J.
