Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954. PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

- That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of 17th December, 1960, to 30th April, 1961, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks defined in the Third Schedule hereto in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the road districts specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of 18th December, 1960, to 30th April, 1961, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks defined in the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exceptions of those areas defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of avicuiture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (4) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.

First Schedule.

Harvey, Bunbury, Dardanup, Collie, Preston, Capel, Busselton, Augusta-Margaret River, Nannup, Balingup, Greenbushes, Bridgetown and Manjimup Road Districts.

#### Second Schedule.

- (a) The whole of the area within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Perth.
- (b) All municipalities and townsites in the South-West Land Division.
- (c) The whole of the Rockingham Road District.
- (d) The whole of the waters of Lakes Leschenaultia, Yealering and Seppings, and Bambun, Wagin, Nambung, Mungala, Nannerup and Wardering Lakes and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (e) The whole of the waters of the Vasse, King and Kalgan Rivers, and all land within 20 chains of their banks.
- (f) The whole of the waters of Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (g) All the waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn south-east from Waterloo Head (Belvedere) on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore.
- (h) All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling Bridges and all land within 20 chains of the river bank.
- (i) The whole of the waters of Oyster Harbour and Princess Royal Harbour and all land within a radius of 20 chains of their shores.
- (j) The whole of the area of the Yanchep Caves Reserve.
- (k) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.
- (1) The whole of the area within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.
- (m) The whole of the area within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Boyup Brook.

- (n) The whole of the area within a radius of one and a half miles from the Post Office at Balingup.
- (o) All that portion of the Avon River in the Toodyay District, between the northern boundary of Avon Location 3 and a point opposite road number 2069, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (p) All that portion of Avon River from Dum-barton Bridge to the Railway Bridge north of Toodyay and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (q) All that portion of the Serpentine River from road 8629 at the southern end of Googrup (Willies) Lake to Peel Inlet near the Old Mill and all the land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (r) All State Forests, Timber Reserves, town reservoirs and other areas where shooting is prohibited under the provisions of any other Act, regulation or by-law.

#### MEDICAL BOARD OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Medical Act, 1894-1956, and in the matter of Sydney O'Neill, a Medical Practitioner, and in the matter of an inquiry by the Medical Board into the Conduct of that Medical Practitioner.

THE Medical Board of Western Australia, appointed under the above Act, was informed that the above practitioner had been convicted in the Perth Police Court on the 15th September, 1960, of knowingly giving prescriptions for a drug merely for the purpose of addiction, contrary to regulation 22 made under and for the purpose of Part VIA of the Police Act, 1892.

The abovementioned regulation reads as follows:—

22. (1) A medical practitioner, registered veterinary surgeon, or registered dentist shall not—

- (a) knowingly give a prescription for a drug merely for purposes of addiction; or
- (b) knowingly supply or administer a drug merely for purposes of addiction.

(2) In addition to any penalty imposed by the Act or regulations, a breach of this regulation shall be regarded as infamous conduct in a professional respect.

In accordance with section 13, subsection (1), of the Medical Act, 1894-1956, the above Board this day held due inquiry in relation to the said conviction. Having taken evidence and heard the said practitioner who appeared on his own behalf, the Board found that Dr. Sydney O'Neill, of 1290 Hay Street, West Perth, Registered No. 703, was guilty of infamous conduct in a professional respect and ordered that the registration of this practitioner be suspended for a period of twelve months commencing on the first day of December, 1960.

THE Conciliation Commissioner in pursuance of THE Conclusion Commissioner in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by Section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed neutrino. parties.

# Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Radio and Television Workers Award and replaces Award No. 75 of 1951.

#### 3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division and within a radius of ten (10) miles of the Post Office, Kalgoorlie.

#### 4.---Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

#### 5.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers classi-fied in Clause 29 hereof employed by the respond-ents set out in the First Schedule attached hereto.

6.—Definitions. (a) "Serviceman" shall mean a worker—other (a) "Serviceman" shall mean a worker—other than an apprentice employed in making, repair-ing and altering, assembling, testing, aligning, fault locating, rewinding and rewiring radio machines, instruments or other apparatus, in-cluding public address systems, tape recorders, stereo and hi-fidelity amplifiers, and television sets

(b) "Bench Assembler" shall mean workers employed in or in connection with the manu-facturing and assembling of radio and television sets or any repetitive hand processes in connec-tion therewith. Any work in the nature of altering, testing or adjusting such parts shall be the work of a tradesman.

(c) "Casual worker" shall mean a worker employed for less than one week.

(d) "Junior worker" shall mean a male worker under the age of 21 years and who is not employed as an apprentice.

#### 7.—Hours.

## (a) Day Workers.

(i) Forty (40) hours exclusive of Sunday work, shall constitute a week's work. Provided that, by agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establish-ment, the week's work may be worked in five (5) days, exclusive of the weekly half holiday and Sunday.

(ii) The ordinary hours of work shall be be-tween 8.0 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. except:—

- (i) on the weekly half holiday; when work shall finish at 1.0 p.m.
- where the employer and his workers mutually agree on some other starting (ii)and finishing times.

#### (b) Shift Workers.

(b) Shift Workers. The ordinary hours of work shall be forty (40) per week to be worked on any five (5) days of the week, provided that all such ordinary hours worked between 1.0 p.m. and midnight Satur-days shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter, and all such ordinary hours worked between midnight Saturdays and midnight Sun-days shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

#### (c) General.

(i) Meal interval shall be not less than thirty (30) minutes or more than one hour.

(ii) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours.

(iii) Any worker engaged on mixed functions such as service work and sales work shall not be covered by this Award unless such worker per-forms at least twenty-five (25) hours on service work in any week.

(iv) In any week in which a worker who is engaged on sales work and service work per-forms the work of a serviceman for twenty-five (25) hours or more, such worker shall be deemed to be covered by this Award, in which case the hours of work of such worker, working in the country away from the employer's principal establishment or place of business, shall be between 8.0 a.m. and 9.0 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and it shall not be necessary for such work to be performed in a continuous shift work to be performed in a continuous shift.

# 8.-Mixed Functions.

Subject to clauses 7 (c) (iii) and (iv) of this Award a worker engaged for more than half  $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or on shift duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked so worked.

#### 9.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. (b) Overtime on shift work shall be based on

the rate payable for shift work.

(c) Subject to Clause 7 (b)—work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in Clause 11 (a), shall be paid for at double time rates, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

(d) (i) Rest period after overtime. When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termina-tion of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, sub-ject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises he shall be paid for at least three hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three hours for which payment has been made, an additional payment shall not be made nor shall any extra overtime be paid in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his employer's premises to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of his ordinary working time.

(iii) Overtime worked in the circumstances specified in this subclause shall not be regarded as time worked for the purposes of subclause 9 (d) hereof where the actual time worked is less than three hours on such recall or on each of such recalls.

(f) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates, for the time he so holds himself in readiness.

(g) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(h) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

(i) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(j) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

#### 10.-Shift Work.

(a) An employer may, if he so desires, work his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Union and of the intended starting and finishing times of ordinary working hours of the respective shifts. (b) (i) Where any particular work is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that work, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.

(ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

(c) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

(d) Where a shift commences at or after 11.0 p.m., then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

# 11.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) (i) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to subclause 9 (f) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(ii) Provided that in the area comprised within a radius of ten (10) miles from the Post Office, Kalgoorlie, the employer may allow Kalgoorlie Cup Day and Boulder Cup Day as holidays without deduction of pay in lieu of Australia Day and State Foundation Day, in which event Australia Day and State Foundation Day shall not be holidays under this subclause.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.
## 12.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least weekly.

(b) Any worker leaving or being discharged from the service of the employer shall be paid the full amount of wages and/or holiday pay due to him within one (1) hour of ceasing work, or within one (1) hour of the opening of the office, if such office was closed at the time of ceasing work where the is a method be work, whenever this is practicable.

## 13.—Car Allowance.

13.—Car Allowance.
(a) Where an employee is required and authorised to use his own motor vehicle in the course of his duties he shall be paid an allowance not less than that provided for in the table set out hereunder. Provided that the rates contained therein shall be increased by one half penny per mile where an employee has not at any time received any form of financial assistance from his employer to purchase the motor vehicle used by him on official business. Notwithstanding anything contained in this subclause the employer and the employee may make any other arrangements as to car allowances not less favourable to the employee.
(b) Where an employee in the course of a

(b) Where an employee in the course of a journey travels through two or more of the separate areas, payment at the rates prescribed herein shall be made at the appropriate rate applicable to each of the separate areas traversed.

(c) A year for the purpose of this clause shall commence on the 1st day of July and end on the 10th day of June next following.

# 14.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day, or (if the em-ployer terminates it) by payment of one (1) week's pay except:—

- (i) in the case of a casual worker when one (1) hour's notice shall suffice, and
- (ii) for the first month of employment, when the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice or a day's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 15 or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

## 15.—Sick Leave.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service; Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health

shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sick-ness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive (0) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satis-factory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions herein-before prescribed, shall be allowed by his em-ployer in any subsequent year without diminu-tion of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the ord of the year in years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

## 16.—Outside Work.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a dis-tance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates, up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that when the travel-ling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

## 17.-Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one week one week.

#### 18.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this para-graph, and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours either at the employer's office or at the works.

## 19.—Notice Board.

Every employer shall allow union notices, except those which on reasonable grounds he considers objectionable to be posted up by the Union in a place accessible to the workers and approved by the employer.

## 20.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provision of this Award or any of them.
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of Regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference.

## 21.—Special Provisions.

(a) Suitable rubber mats or other protective and highly insulated material to stand on shall be provided by the employer for the use of workers engaged upon work in the workshop on apparatus supplied with a voltage exceeding one hundred and ten (110) volts.

(b) Protective Equipment.—(i) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as, for example, hand screens, goggles, glasses, gloves, aprons, leggings and gumboots) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary. It shall be a defence to an employer charged with a breach of this subclause if he proves that he was unable to obtain either the item of equipment the subject of the charge or a suitable substitute.

(ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective equipment and shall return same to the employer when he has finished using it or on leaving his employment.

(iii) No worker shall lend another worker any such article of protective equipment issued to such first-mentioned worker, and if the same are lent, both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.

(iv) Before goggles, glasses, or gloves or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the employer to another worker they shall be effectively sterilised.

(v) During the time any article of protective equipment is on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

(c) Testing Equipment.—The employer shall supply all necessary testing equipment and parts for the repair of same. No worker shall be called upon to provide any testing equipment.

## 22.—Apprentices.

(a) The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the provisions prescribed in the Apprenticeship Regulations, 1953.

(b) Apprentices may be taken to servicemen in the proportion of one (1) apprentice for every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen. Provided that the fraction of two (2) shall not be less than one (1). Provided further that in an "approved" shop or factory the proportion shall be one (1) apprentice for every one (1) journeyman. For the purpose of this proviso an "approved" shop or factory shall be one to which approval (as regards one or more particular trades) has been given by the Board of Reference appointed under clause 20 hereof. (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, if through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may, with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian, be suspended for a period agreed upon or, if no such agreement be arrived at, may be cancelled by the employer. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer.

This provision shall be deemed to be included in all contracts of apprenticeship now existing and also in all future contracts entered into.

#### 23.—Junior Workers.

Unapprenticed male juniors may be employed in the ratio of one junior to every one adult worker in all occupations for which apprenticeship is not provided, at the rates of wages as set out in Clause 29 hereof.

## 24.-Junior Workers' Certificates.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- 1. Name in full;
- 2. Age and date of birth;
- 3. Name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer;
- 4. Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate he shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

# 25.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

## 26.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker (including an apprentice) cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 27.—Cadets.

(a) Notwithstanding anything herein contained or implied, a bona fide employer shall be permitted to appoint one son (or any other nominee) as a cadet to learn all the branches of the trade or calling of such employer. Only one such cadet at any particular time shall be permitted any employer.

(b) The employer of a cadet shall notify the Industrial Registrar within fourteen (14) days of his engagement. Upon receipt of such notification, the Registrar shall give the Union fourteen (14) days in which to object to the employment of the cadet.

## 28.—Part-time Employment.

The employer shall have the right, after having served written notice upon the Union, at the expiration of seven (7) days therefrom, to apply to the Court for an order to vary Clause 7 (Hours) so as to provide for a shorter working week for any or the whole of his workers at the rate of wages specified in this Award or proportionate to the time so to be worked, without payment of casual rates, but before any order is granted the employer shall satisfy the Court that by reason of financial depression existing in the State such an order would be expedient in the interest of all parties concerned.

29.-Wages. -

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:--

(f) Leading Hands—A leading hand placed in charge of:—

- (i) Not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid nineteen shillings (19/-) per week extra.
- (ii) More than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid thirty eight shillings and sixpence (38/6) per week extra.
- (iii) More than twenty (20) other workers, shall be paid fifty-seven shillings and sixpence (57/6) per week extra.

30.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with the one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service, (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

- (4) Such service shall include:----
  - (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
  - (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
  - (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
  - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
    - (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26th, 1950;
    - (ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
    - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be reemployed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination.

- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be-

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination, (d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rates of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual, or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay-

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

## (e) Taking Leave.

(i) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways-
  - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
  - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
  - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is

on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further pay-ment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

account of such period of leave. (2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or para-graph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employ-ment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in re-spect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employ-ment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employ-ment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled. thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service (a) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been loove taken and granted whether the same is granted before of after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any (4) An employer shall be entitled to onset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

## (g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employ-ment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employ-ment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:

(a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;

(b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of One representative or substitute therefore nomin-ated from time to time by the Western Aus-tralian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

## (i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be en-titled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers cov-ered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

## (j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favour-able for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions liereof.

#### (k) Liberty to Apply.

(K) Liberty to Appry. Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appro-priate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way any way.
