WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1904-1954, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Broome: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of land, containing approximately four acres, known as Broome Lots 51 and 53, to be a Reserve for Natives. (Reserve No. 25790.)

Pingelly Sewerage Area.
