WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1960, that the Governor may by proclamation declare any Crown Lands to be reserves for natives and abolish any reserve so deserves for natives and abolish any reserve so de-clared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1960, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of March, 1953, the Governor declared an area at Narrogin more particularly described as reserve No. 25301 and defined in the Schedule to such pro-clamation to be a reserve for natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now therefore, I, the said Gov-ernor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1960, do hereby abolish the re-serve for natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of March, 1953, as aforesaid.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960. Greenbushes Country Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute a Country Water Area: Now therefore, His Excela country water Area: Now therefore, His Excel-lency the Governor by and with the consent of the Executive Council doth hereby constitute the Greenbushes Country Water Area as defined in the Schedule hereunder, and assign the name of "Greenbushes Country Water Area" thereto.

Schedule.

Greenbushes Country Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of reserve 6890 and extending easterly along the northern boun-dary of that reserve and onwards to the north-eastern side of South Western Highway (road No. 51); thence generally south-easterly along that side to the northern side of road No. 10123, a point on the Greenbushes Townsite boundary; thence generally south-easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the northernmost north-western boundary of late Mineral Claim 57; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the northernmost corner of that mineral claim; thence 135 degrees 2 min-utes 10 chains 42 links along the north-eastern boundary of that mineral claim; thence 225 degrees 2 minutes to an angle post on the south-eastern boundary of late Mineral Claim 57 aforesaid; thence south-easterly and south-westerly along boundaries of that mineral claim to its southernboundaries of that mineral claim to its southern-most western corner; thence about 288 degrees about 9 chains 50 links to a south-western corner of Greenbushes Townsite aforesaid, a point on the north-western boundary of late Water Lease 13; thence generally north-westerly along boundaries of that townsite to a point on the western side of Telluride Street; thence north-westerly along that side and onwards to the southern side of Road No. 2786; thence westerly along that side to the west-ern boundary of late Mining Lease 176; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lease to its north-western corner; thence north-north-westerly to the southernmost corner of Garden Area 19; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that garden area to its north-ernmost corner; thence northerly to the south-western corner of Reserve 6890 aforesaid; and thence northerly along the western boundary of that reserve to the starting point, as shown bordered green on Pian P.W.D., W.A. 38630.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960. Great Southern Towns Country Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may by Order in Council extend the boundaries of a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the consent of the Executive Council doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Great Southern Towns Country Water Area by adding thereto the area as defined in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Extension to Great Southern Towns Country Water Area.

All those portions of land being,

(b) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the north-western side of Collie Road and a line parallel to and 300 feet south-westerly from the north-eastern side of road number 2874 and extending south-easterly along that line and easterly along a line parallel to and 300 feet southerly from the northern side of Collie Road to the eastern side of Moodiarrup Road (road number 2981); thence northerly along that side to its intersection with a line parallel to and 12 chains 50 links northerly from the northern side of Collie Road aforesaid; thence easterly along that line and onwards to the eastern boundary of Darkan Agricultural Area Lot 85; thence southerly along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of lot 77; thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the western side of Moodiarrup Road aforesaid; thence generally southerly along that side to the north-eastern corner of lot 59; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that lot and the northern boundaries of Wellington locations 226 and 4537 to the south-western corner of Darkan Town Lot 177; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lot to its north-western corner, a point on the Darkan Townsite boundary; thence northerly along that boundary to the north-western corner of lot 142 and onwards to the north-western side of Collie Road aforesaid, and thence north-easterly along that side to the starting point.

1. Clause 6—Hours of Duty.—Add to this clause the following:—

Liberty is reserved to the parties to apply for the provisions of an 80 hour fortnight.

2. Clause 7—Overtime.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

- (a) Other than Continuous Shift Workers.
 - (a) Except as hereinafter mentioned, all work performed in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and all work performed on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. Provided that all work performed after noon on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
 - (b) All work performed on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in subclause 10 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
 - (c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.
 - (d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.
 - (e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his vessel or place of employment (whether notified before or after leaving such premises), he shall be paid for at least three hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period, but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three hours for which payment has been made an additional payment shall not be made nor shall any extra overtime be paid in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his vessel or place of employment to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

- (f) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.
- (g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

- (h) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.
- (b) Continuous Shift Workers.
 - (a) All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours as prescribed shall be paid for at the rate of double time, except where a worker is called upon to work a regularly rostered overtime shift, when the rate shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
 - (b) All work performed on any of the holidays prescribed in subclause 10 (a) or on Sundays in excess of the hours prescribed in subclause 6 (b) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
 - (c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work. This shall not apply to the week-end penalty rates prescribed in clause (8) hereof.
 - (d) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.
 - (e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his vessel (whether notified before or after leaving such vessel), he shall be paid for at least three hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period; but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three hours for which payment has been made, an additional payment shall not be made in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his vessel to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

- (f) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked, except that when the employer has received at least twelve (12) hours' notice of such absence, double time shall be paid.
- (g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

3. Clause 8—Saturday, Sunday and Holiday Work.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

8. All work performed during the ordinary working hours on Saturdays, Sundays or the holidays prescribed in subclause 10 (a), shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half. These rates shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowances prescribed in clause 9 (c) hereof.

4. Clause 9-Rates of Wages.-Delete subclause (c) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:--

(c) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift seven and a half per cent. $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$ and for night shift ten per cent (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate.

5. Add a new Clause 19:----

Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

6. These alterations will take effect as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. No. 2 of 1961.

(Registered 21st February, 1961.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this twenty-first day of February, One thousand nine hundred and sixty one, between the Employers named in the Schedule of this Agreement of the one part and The Foremen Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to Foremen Stevedores separately or conjointly employed by the Employers named in the schedule of this Agreement and shall operate at the Port of Bunbury.

2.---Definitions.

For the purpose of this agreement:---

- (a) "Foreman Stevedore" shall mean and include any person permanently employed under supervision directing the loading or discharging of cargo on any wharf or any vessel or wheat gallery and/or directing the work of waterside workers, or engaging labour for such purposes, and shall also be engaged in making, repairing and storing of any gear used in stevedoring operations or the carting to and from the wharves of such gear. The term shall not include any employer, wharf manager, assistant wharf manager, superintendent or supervisor employed by the employer as such.
- (b) "Employer" for the purpose of this Agreement shall mean any of the employers named in the schedule of this Agreement.
- (c) "Ordinary Working Day" shall mean any day, Monday to Friday inclusive, excluding holidays.
- (d) "Meal Hours," subject to the provisions of Clause 6 (a) shall mean:—
 - Breakfast-7 a.m. to 8 a.m.
 - Dinner-Noon to 1 p.m.
 - Tea-5 p.m. to 6 p.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal hour).
 - Supper—Midnight to 1 a.m. (except where work commences at or during the meal hour).
- (e) "Union" shall mean The Foremen Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia.

(a) Basic wage: £14 15s. 0d. (South-West Land Division of the State).

(b) The hourly rate of pay to be paid to a Foreman Stevedore employed under this Agreement shall be the appropriate hourly rate from time to time paid or payable to a waterside worker in re-spect to ordinary time, overtime, meal hours, Satur-day and Sunday time and Holidays, plus an hourly margin of 1s. per hour.

4.--Guarantee of Earnings.

(a) Subject to any mutual arrangements with Employer/s, a Foreman Stevedore shall make him-self available for work as required in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) The earnings of each foreman stevedore shall be aggregated over each complete period of fiftytwo (52) weeks from the commencement of this Agreement. Where the aggregate earnings of a foreman stevedore during any such period of fiftytwo (52) weeks is less than the equivalent of fifty two (52) weeks of forty (40) hours at the ordinary hourly rate as prescribed in clause 3 (b) of this Agreement, the employers shall pay to that fore-man stevedore such amount as together with his aggregate earnings will equal the equivalent of fifty-two (52) weeks of forty (40) hours at the ordinary rate as prescribed in clause 3 (b) of this Agreement.

(c) In the event of the death, resignation or retirement of any foreman stevedore, or his perman-ent employment being terminated by the employers, the guaranteed minimum earnings shall be applied pro rata.

(d) The guaranteed minimum earnings prescribed in subclause (b) hereof, shall be subject to a reduction of eight (8) hours at the ordinary hourly rate prescribed in clause 3 (b) for each ordinary working day for which he is not available for employment.

(e) Foremen stevedores shall be deemed to be available for employment on any day on which he is entitled to payment as provided for in clauses 7 (Holidays), 10 (Annual Leave), 16 (Long Service Leave) and approved sick leave.

(f) Wherever practicable, work shall be regulated in order that each foreman stevedore will receive an equal distribution of earnings, and will not be required to work excessive overtime.

(g) A foreman stevedore shall work where and as directed by the employers, and shall transfer as required from job to job and/or ship to ship whether being worked by the same employer or not.

5.-Hours of Work,

(a) The ordinary hours of duty shall be between 8 a.m. and 12 noon, and 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) The normal shift hours shall conform with the hours of work as prescribed for waterside work from time to time at the Port of Bunbury.

(c) A foreman stevedore required to work during the ordinary hours of duty prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof shall be paid a minimum period of eight (8) hours at the appropriate rate.

6.—Overtime.

(a) An employer may require any foreman stevedore to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates of pay and such foreman stevedore shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement, pro-vided that the meal hours referred to in clause 2 (d) may be advanced by one hour to enable a foreman stevedore to be available at the normal commencing time of the succeeding shift.

(b) Where a foreman stevedore is required to work outside the ordinary hours of duty as pre-scribed in clause 5 (a) hereof, he shall be paid ininimum periods as follows:-

- (i) If required to resume after the tea meal hour on any day, until the normal termination of the shift.
- (ii) If required to work on the night shift, for the full normal duration of such shift.
- (iii) If required to work on a Saturday, Sun-day or public holiday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., eight (8) hours at the appropriate rate.

7.--Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall, if occurring on any day Monday to Friday inclusive, be granted to foremen stevedores as a holiday with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates:-

- Ordinary Holidays—New Year's Day, Anni-versary of Australia Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Boxing Day.
- Extraordinary Holidays—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day and Picnic Day (which shall be observed on the same day as the waterside workers' picnic day).

(b) When any of the aforementioned holidays falls on a Saturday or Sunday and a foreman stevedore is not required to work on that day, no payment shall be made.

(c) Payment shall not be made for any holiday which occurs whilst a foreman stevedore is off duty owing to leave without pay. Provided that a foreman stevedore shall not be regarded as being off duty owing to leave without pay if he is available for duty on the working day immediately preced-ing a holiday, or resumes or is available for duty on the working day immediately following the holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause.

(d) Where a foreman stevedore is required to work on any holiday prescribed in (a) of this clause, he shall be paid for all time worked as provided for in clause 3 (b).

(e) In all cases of payment for work on holidays, the rate of payment prescribed in subclause (d) hereof, shall be deemed to include the ordinary payment for the holiday as prescribed in subclause (a) hereof.

(f) A foreman stevedore engaged to work on a holiday irrespective of which shift or part of such shift he so works that day, shall be given a day in lieu thereof with pay for eight (8) hours at ordinary rates such day to be taken with his annual leave or as otherwise mutually arranged.

8. -Working Through Meal Hours.

A foreman stevedore required to work continu-Agreement shall be paid for such work at the ap-propriate meal hour rates until such time as one full hour's break has been allowed for a meal.

9.—Meal Money.

A foreman stevedore shall be subject to and entitled to the same conditions regarding payment of meal money as apply to the waterside workers at the port of Bunbury.

10.—Annual Leave.

(a) A foreman stevedore shall be entitled to three consecutive weeks' annual leave on pay for each completed year of continuous service.

(b) For lesser period of continuous service of one month or more, payment on a pro rata basis to the foregoing shall be granted.

11.—Contract of Service.

Except in cases of dishonesty, indiscipline or gross misconduct (when a foreman stevedore shall be subject to instant dismissal and entitled to his wages and all holiday pay due up to the time of such dismissal), a foreman stevedore shall give or be given one week's notice of the termination of service or one week's wages paid for or forfeited in lieu thereof, provided that the one week's notice shall not be counted as annual leave or part thereof.

12.—Obnoxious Cargoes.

A foreman stevedore shall receive agreed extra rates where they are affected by unusually dan-gerous or obnoxious conditions in the area where they are working for the period of such disability.

13.—Overalls and Oilskins.

A foreman stevedore permanently employed shall be supplied with one suit of overalls each 12 months and one oilskin coat every two years. An overcoat may be substituted for the oilskin coat provided the employee is prepared to pay the difference in cost.

14.—Preference of Employment.

All persons permanently employed as foremen stevedores shall be members of the Union, provided that any employee who at the time of engagement is not a member of such Union, shall become a member thereof within fourteen (14) days and provided also that the Union shall not refuse to accept as a member any such employee who is eligible and applies in the manner prescribed under the rules of the Union to become a member thereof.

15.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between a foreman stevedore and the employers, work shall be con-tinued without any cessation and the matter re-(1) representative each of the Union and Employers and a chairman, to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agree-ment the Industrial Registrar of the State Arbitration Court, shall act as chairman.

16.—Long Service Leave.

A foreman stevedore shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with the provisions of Order No. 55 of 1958 of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

17.—Operation.

This Agreement shall operate from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on the 21st day of February, 1961, and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years.
