WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board, from time to

time, and at any time, by proclamation declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereunder be declared a totalisator agency region for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 1st day of April, 1961, the land described in the schedule hereunder shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960.

#### Schedule.

All that portion in Perth of the municipal district of the City of Perth comprising the area bounded by lines starting from the point of intersection of the eastern boundary of Barrack Street and the northern boundary of Murray Street, and extending northerly along the eastern boundary of Barrack Street to the southern boundary of Wellington Street; thence westerly across Barrack Street and along the southern boundary of Wellington Street and across Forrest Place, William Street, Queen Street and King Street to the eastern boundary of Milligan Street; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundary of Milligan Street to the northern boundary of Murray Street; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Murray Street across King Street, Queen Street, William Street, Forrest Place and Barrack Street to the starting point.

## Land Act, 1933-1960.

## ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 387/22.—That reserve No. 21059 should vest in and be held by the Dalwallinu Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Corr. No. 1789/60.—That reserve No. 25888 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of Native Housing.

Corr. No. 83/61.—That reserve No. 25885 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of Native Housing.

Corr. No. 271/61.—That reserve No. 25880 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Education in trust for the purpose of School Quarters Site.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

## Land Act 1933-1960.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 3696/24.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 22636 should vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for the purpose of Water Supply and Stopping Place: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for Water Supply and Stopping Place with power to the said Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding seven years from the date of the lease.

## Forests Act, 1918.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests File 693/57; Lands File 1046/60.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dedicate any Crown lands as State Forests within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the lands described in the schedule

hereto as an addition to State Forest No. 25 within the meaning and for the purposes of the Forests Act, 1918.

(b) All that portion of land including Wellington Locations 3079, 3080 and 3083 bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Wellington Location 3078, a point on the present boundary of State Forest No. 25, and extending north-westerly to the southernmost south-western corner of location 3079; thence generally northerly along western boundaries of that location and location 3080 to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned location, a point on the present boundary of State Forest No. 25 aforesaid, and thence easterly, southerly, again easterly, again southerly, and generally westerly along that boundary to the starting point.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1438/60.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water

Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

#### Metropolitan Water Supply.

East Fremantle Municipality—East Fremantle.

Twenty-four Inch Diameter Water Main in Canning Highway.

The construction of a twenty-four inch diameter water main (length about one thousand and eighty feet).

The above main to be complete with valves and all necessary apparatus and the existing twenty-four inch diameter cast iron water main to be lifted.

The above works and localities are shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. and D.D. No. 8535.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 30th day of March, 1961.

A 12-inch diameter pipe sewer with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 8545.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960.  
Calingiri Country Water Area and Rating Zone.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 734/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Country Water Area; and whereas by section 10 of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Rating Zone in a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Calingiri Country Water Area as defined in Schedule "A" hereunder and assign the name of "Calingiri Country Water Area" thereto, and also doth hereby constitute the Calingiri Rating Zone as defined in Schedule "B" hereunder and assign the name "Calingiri Rating Zone" thereto.

Schedule "A."

Calingiri Country Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Melbourne Location 3255, a point on the Calingiri Townsite

boundary and extending northerly in prolongation of the western boundary of that location to the southern boundary of location 1580; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the easternmost south-eastern corner of that location, a point on the Calingiri Townsite boundary aforesaid; thence northerly, easterly, southerly and westerly along that townsite boundary to its intersection with a line parallel to and 300 feet north-easterly from the north-eastern side of the Calingiri-Bolgart Railway Reserve; thence generally south-easterly along that line to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the north-western boundary of Avon Location 11283; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the south-western boundary of location 1833; thence south-easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of location 17137; thence southerly to and along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of road number 5538; thence westerly to and along that side to the eastern side of road number 2552; thence northerly along that side to its intersection with a line parallel to and 300 feet south-westerly from the north-eastern side of the Calingiri-Bolgart Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence generally north-westerly along that line to its intersection with the southern boundary of Calingiri Townsite aforesaid, and thence westerly along that boundary to the starting point, as shown bordered in blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 38671.

Calingiri Rating Zone.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Melbourne Location 3255, a point on the Calingiri Townsite boundary and extending northerly in prolongation of the western boundary of that location to the southern boundary of location 1580; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the easternmost south-eastern corner of that location, a point on the Calingiri Townsite boundary aforesaid; and thence northerly, easterly, southerly and westerly along that townsite boundary to the starting point, as shown bordered in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 38671.

Companies Act, 1943-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1960, that no company shall be registered by a name which *inter alia*, is identical with that by which a firm is registered and is carrying on business under the Business Names Act, 1942-1946, or, in the opinion of the Registrar of Companies, so nearly resembles that name as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas it is provided, *inter alia*, in proviso (a) to subsection (7) of that section that where in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require any company formed or incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of the Act applies to change its name, style, title or designation before complying with the requirements of such Part) it is in the circumstances of the particular case expedient, the Governor may authorise the Registrar to accept for filing the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 32 of the Act; and whereas registration under Part XI of the Act of a company incorporated in the State of Victoria by the name of Australian Trade Union Press Proprietary Limited was refused by the Registrar on the ground that in his opinion that name so nearly resembles the name by which a firm (namely, Trade Union News) is already registered and carrying on business under the Business Names Act, 1942-1946, as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require Australian Trade Union Press Proprietary Limited to change its name before complying with the requirements of Part XI of the Act

and is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by proviso (a) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1960, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filing from Australian Trade Union Press Proprietary Limited the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.

PEPPERMINT GROVE ROAD BOARD.

Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

T.P.B. 853/2/19/1.

THIS Town Planning Scheme is prepared by the Peppermint Grove Road Board under the provision of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, for the purpose of zoning and classifying land within the Peppermint Grove Road District and regulating development thereon.

The Scheme is known as the Peppermint Grove Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

From the date of coming into operation of this Scheme, by-laws No. 66 to 70 inclusive previously in force, together with all amendments thereto, and by-law made by Proclamation dated 14th September, 1955, fixing the minimum area for building allotments are hereby repealed and this Scheme substituted therefor.

#### Preliminary.

##### 1. Definitions:—

The "Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, and any amendment or re-enactment thereof.

The "Board" means the Peppermint Grove Road Board.

A "building" means any structure either set on, or built into the ground, and capable of affording protection or shelter from weather, either roofed or intended or adapted to be roofed, and which is enclosed by walls or supported partially or wholly on posts or columns, and of open sides.

"Offensive trade" means and includes any of the trades specified in the Second Schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1954, and any other trade declared to be offensive under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1954, by a Proclamation of the Governor published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

"Residential flat" means a suite of rooms, being part of a building, and occupied or designed, intended or adapted to be occupied as a complete residence, or rented or let as such.

"Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which refreshments are provided for payment, and also includes hairdressers' saloons, and offices of agents, auctioneers and all other businesses and trades.

#### Part 1.—General.

2. This Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the Peppermint Grove Road District.

3. The responsible authority for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Peppermint Grove Road Board.

## Part 2.—Zoning.

4. The townsite is divided into five (5) types of zones and three (3) reservations. These types of zones and reservations are set out hereunder, together with the colours by which they are represented on the zoning plan:—

## Zone; Colour.

- A. Residential; uncoloured.
- B. Commerical; Blue.
- C. Residential Flat; Red brown.
- D. Civic, Cultural, Educational, or Institutional Buildings; Red.
- E. Car Parks; Edged red—"C" superimposed.

## Reservations.

- F. Drainage; Olive green.
- G. Public Open Space; Dark green.
- H. Private Open Space; Light green.

The above zones and reservations and their corresponding colours are shown in the key which is attached to the zoning plan.

5. Subject to Part 3 of this Scheme, no building shall be erected and no land or building shall be used or adapted for use for any other purpose than a purpose permitted in the zone in which such land or building is situated provided that—

- (a) land which is not built on may be used for a purpose for which a building could be erected and used on such land under the Scheme or for any purpose directly ancillary to such building;
- (b) land in any zone may be used for the purpose of a private garden.

6. Certain uses of land in the townsite are controlled. These controlled uses are known as "Use Classes" and are classified as follows:—

Use Class 1—Residential Flats.

Use Class 2—Dwelling House.

Use Class 3—Shops, department stores, restaurants, cafes, ticket offices and bureaux, receiving offices, hairdressers, local post offices, amusement halls, cinemas and theatres.

Use Class 4—Showrooms in connection with retail warehousing or offices and intended for the display of goods of a bulky character.

Use Class 5—Offices, banks, stock or produce exchanges.

Use Class 6—Public buildings and places of assembly including churches, Government and Local Government offices and buildings, non-residential clubs, colleges, and institutions.

Use Class 7—Car parks and taxi parks.

Use Class 8—Wholesale warehouses designed for the storage of goods and transaction of business other than retail business.

Use Class 9—Outdoor recreation, including public parks or gardens, foreshore reserves, playing fields, children's playgrounds, private open spaces, which do not fall within other use classes.

Use Class 10—Professional chambers or professional offices.

Use Class 11—Open air displays and premises for sale of motor vehicles or other goods and equipment but always subject to an annual permit from the Board.

Use Class 12—Industrial and all other uses not within classes 1-11 inclusive.

7. The Zoning Table hereunder sets out—

- (a) all of the use classes itemised in clause 6, in the first vertical column the number appearing represents the use class opposite the same number in clause 6;
- (b) in the horizontal column the zones set out in clause 4;
- (c) opposite each use class indicates by use of the letters described below whether—
  - (i) the use is permitted as of right, indicated by the letter "P";

- (ii) the use is not permitted unless approval is obtained from the responsible authority indicated by letters "AA";

- (iii) the use is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use and the approval of the responsible authority is obtained, indicated by the letters "IP";

- (iv) the use is not permitted, indicated by the letter "X".

## Non-Conforming Use of Land.

8. (a) Subject to the following provisions in this part and in Part 3 of this Scheme, where immediately before the commencing date hereof, any land was lawfully used for any purpose which does not conform to the provisions of this Scheme, such land and any adjoining land which on the commencing date hereof was in the same ownership, may continue to be used or be (as the case may be) for that purpose so long as any building or works comprised therein at such commencing date is not, save with the consent of the responsible authority, enlarged, rebuilt, or extended. Such consent may be refused if in the opinion of the responsible authority the use thereof as enlarged, rebuilt, or extended is likely to cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood or to increase any existing injury to or prejudicial affection of the neighbourhood, including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, injury or prejudicial affection due to the emission of noises, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil waste, water, or waste products.

(b) For the purpose of this clause, land shall be deemed to have been used immediately before the commencing date hereof—

- (i) in the case of unused land, for the purpose for which it was last used within twelve (12) months prior to such date;
- (ii) in the case of land upon which immediately before such date any building or works was lawfully being constructed for the purpose for which such building or works was being constructed; and

- (iii) in the case of land in respect of which a contract for the construction of any building or works which could lawfully have been constructed was entered into prior to such date, and for which a building permit has been obtained (if required) for the purpose for which such building or works was to be constructed.

9. Should any land to which clause 8 of the regulation applies be subdivided and sold in separate parcels, only such parcels of land upon which on the commencing date hereof there existed substantial buildings or works or upon which with the consent of the responsible authority any enlargement or extension of a building or works had been carried out may in pursuance of the said clause continue to be used for a purpose not conforming with the provision of the planning scheme.

10. Should any land to which the provisions of clause 8 of this regulation apply cease to be used for the purpose for which such land was used on the commencement date hereof, and be not used for that purpose for a period of twelve (12) consecutive months, or should since such date any building or works comprised in such land be so damaged or destroyed that the cost of restoration or replacement is greater than seventy-five per centum (75%) of the value of such building or works immediately prior to the damage to or destruction thereof, such land shall be used only in conformity with the provisions of the planning scheme.

11. Subject to the foregoing, land used for a non-conforming use may be used for any other purpose within the same use class.

#### Part 3—Provisions as to Certain Zones and Uses.

12. In any new subdivision of land within the Business Zone, a rear access way is to be provided for services and off-street loading, and such rear access way shall be a minimum width of twenty feet with either a turning circle or return access.

13. Not more than one dwelling or building for residential use shall be built on any lot. Provided always that the Board may, in its discretion, permit the conversion of a dwelling existing at the date of gazettal of this Scheme into residential flats, but no dwelling shall be converted into more than two (2) residential flats. This section shall apply to a dwelling whether erected in the residential flat zone or not.

#### Building Alignments.

14. The building line for any building shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be as follows:—

- (a) For land in a residential zone—(30) thirty feet from the alignment of the street on which such land abuts (unless the Board in its discretion determines that the building line in any special case or cases may be less than 30 feet from such alignment).
- (b) For land in a business zone—(10) ten feet from the alignment of the street on which such land abuts (in respect of these lots fronting Stirling Highway) and (20) twenty feet elsewhere.
- (c) For land in a residential flat zone—(30) thirty feet from the alignment of the street on which the land abuts.
- (d) For all other lands—(30) thirty feet from the alignment of the street on which such land abuts.

#### Corner Blocks.

15. Where in a residential zone, a business zone, or a residential flat zone, a parcel of land abuts on more than one street, the principal building may be erected to within (10) ten feet of (but not nearer than (10) ten feet to) such one of those streets as the Board may determine.

#### Existing Adjoining Buildings.

16. No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any building so that any portion of the building is erected closer to any road or street than the above building alignments.

Provided that this clause may be varied by the Board in its discretion as follows:—

Where both adjoining lots are built upon and one or more such buildings shall be nearer to the street or road, than the building alignment determined above, the Board may permit a building to be erected nearer to the street or road than the building alignment, but not nearer than the foremost portion of the rear-most building.

#### Prohibition.

17. Subject to aforesaid no building shall be erected nearer to a street than the building line.

18. No building of any class shall be erected unless means of access be provided for the removal of rubbish and servicing to every separate tenement and/or shop within the building. Such means of servicing shall be provided in such a manner that every separate tenement or shop can be serviced without passing through the front entrance thereof or through any other shop or tenement.

19. No land shall be built on until it is drained and provision made for the disposal of roof water and household or trade waste as the case may be to the satisfaction of the responsible authority.

20. (a) In a residential zone no lot shall be built on to a greater extent than two-thirds of the area of the lot.

(b) No land shall be subdivided or re-subdivided so that any lot to be used for residential purposes with or without a shop, shall be less than 8,000 square feet.

(c) In the Civic, Cultural, Educational and Institutional Buildings Zone no parcel of land shall be used for the purpose of a school unless it has an area of one acre per hundred pupils, with a minimum area of two acres.

(d) The minimum area of land on which a shop shall be erected (inclusive of the open spaces at the front and rear thereof) shall be 2,000 square feet with a minimum frontage of (20) twenty feet.

21. No land shall be subdivided or re-subdivided if the effect of such subdivision or re-subdivision is that the use of any lot forming part of such subdivision or re-subdivision is, as to area or otherwise, not then in conformity with any provisions of this Scheme.

#### Compensation.

22. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of these by-laws shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these by-laws are first published in the *Government Gazette*.

#### Penalty.

23. Any person shall, who commits a breach of any of these by-laws, be liable upon conviction to a penalty of twenty pounds (£20) and to a daily penalty of two pounds (£2).
