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FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1920-1959.

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Schedule.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the Factories and Shops (General) Regulations, 1939, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th October, 1939, and amended from time to time thereafter and in particular as amended by regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th January, 1958, the 20th May, 1958, the 3rd July, 1958, the 1st August, 1958, the 15th August, 1958, the 7th November, 1958, the 23rd December, 1958, the 6th January, 1959, the 20th January, 1959, the 17th March, 1959, the 12th June, 1959, the 30th June, 1959, the 16th February, 1960, the 20th May, 1960, the 3rd October, 1960, and the 23rd March, 1961, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 41B of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) by substituting for Division 2 of each of the Parts I to XI inclusive the corresponding Division 2 set out in each of the Parts I to XI of the schedule hereunder.

SWAN RIVER CONSERVATION ACT, 1958.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Swan River Conservation Act, 1958, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Regulations.

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Swan River Conservation Regulations, 1961.

Interpretation.

2. (1) In these regulations unless the context requires otherwise—

“Appendix” means the appendix to these regulations;

“Secretary” means the Secretary to the Board;

“the Act” means the Swan River Conservation Act, 1958;

“wastes” means industrial wastes and any other matter likely to pollute any waters;

“waters” means such of the waters of the Swan River and its tributaries as are bounded by the shore-lines at high water mark between—

(a) that part of the boundary of the Fremantle Harbour which traverses the Swan River, and which is established at the time of the coming into operation of this Act by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902;

(b) the Kent Street weir on the Canning River;

(c) the Scott Street Bridge over the Helena River; and

(d) the Middle Swan Road Bridge over the Swan River.

(2) Expressions used in these regulations have the respective meanings given them by the Act.

## PART II—SEAL OF THE BOARD.

3. The form of the official seal of the Board is—



4. The Secretary is responsible for the care of the official seal and shall keep it in safe custody.

5. The official seal shall not be fixed to any document unless—

- (a) the Board has, at any meeting, directed that the official seal be affixed to that document; and
- (b) it is affixed by the secretary in the presence of the Chairman or his deputy, and one other member of the Board or his deputy.

## PART III—BUSINESS OF THE BOARD.

## Meetings.

6. The Secretary shall cause to be given to each member of the Board notice of any meeting of the Board, at least three clear days before the date fixed for the meeting; but if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable, in the case of emergency, so to do, shorter notice of a special meeting may be so given.

7. Where, at any meeting of the Board, a quorum is not constituted, the business set down for that meeting shall be included in the business of the next meeting of the Board.

8. An entry in the minute book, signed by the Chairman, that a resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

9. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose the revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members of the Board, three clear days before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.

10. Where a member intends to propose the revocation or alteration of a resolution of the Board he may, in lieu of giving notice to each member personally, as required by regulation 9 of these regulations, at any meeting of the Board give notice in writing of his intention to propose the revocation or alteration at the next following meeting of the Board.

11. Where notice of motion has been given as provided by regulation 10 of these regulations, the Secretary, when giving notice of the next meeting to members of the Board, shall annex thereto a copy of that notice of motion.

12. (1) The Board may appoint any sub-committee, comprising such members of the Board as it considers necessary for the conduct of the business of the Board; and that sub-committee shall have power to co-opt any person or persons it considers desirable.

(2) Where the Board delegates to a sub-committee power to act, the delegation shall be under seal, as provided by section 16(1) of the Act.

## Correspondence.

13. Any correspondence by the Board shall be signed by the Chairman or the Secretary or any other person, as may be authorised by the Chairman of the Board.

## Accounts.

14. Accounts due and payable by the Board shall be passed by resolution, duly carried at a meeting of the Board, but the Secretary may authorise payment, where necessary, in anticipation of, and subject to, confirmation by the Board.

## Engagement of Personnel.

15. (1) The Board may engage personnel, either in a full time or part time capacity, to assist in carrying out the work and functions of the Board and that personnel may include a Secretary, who shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the Board, and inspectors.

(2) The Board, by resolution, shall fix the salary and conditions of appointment and employment, in the case of each engagement.

## PART IV—PRESERVATION OF PURITY OF WATERS.

## Wastes—Standards.

16. (1) The Board shall determine the standard of wastes in respect of any application to discharge wastes into any of the waters, in accordance with the circumstances of the case, and having regard to the type of industry, the quantity, composition and temperature of the wastes to be discharged, the conditions and usage of the waters and any other relevant factor.

(2) Any determination made under this regulation shall be in accordance with general standards and principles approved by the Rivers and Waters Technical Advisory Committee.

17. (1) In considering an application made under Division A of Part V of these regulations, the Board shall have regard to broad principles, and generally any wastes which it is proposed to discharge into the waters shall not contain—

- (a) sewage;
- (b) acidity or alkalinity outside the range of a pH value between pH5 and pH9;
- (c) poisons; or
- (d) any substance which is likely—
  - (i) to contribute to the formation of sludge or other deposit;
  - (ii) to contribute to the formation of scum, fat, oil, grease or floating material;
  - (iii) to contribute to the formation of objectionable odours or discolouration;
  - (iv) to be injurious to marine or animal or human life; or
  - (v) to deplete excessively the oxygen content of the waters.

(2) Without limiting the generality of the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation, wastes shall not be discharged into any of the waters—

- (a) if it is reasonable practicable to dispose of them satisfactorily, in some other manner;
- (b) unless every reasonable and practicable step has been taken to improve the quality and appearance of the wastes, prior to discharge; and
- (c) unless they conform with any bacterial, physical and chemical standards as may from time to time be laid down by the Board.

18. It is not the responsibility of the Board to specify the design, location, type of construction or particular manner in which any operation causing or threatening to cause a condition of pollution might be corrected; and any person ordered to correct the condition of any wastes shall correct the condition in a lawful manner.

19. (1) Consideration of any application for a permit to discharge any wastes shall be governed by the type of discharge and the ability of the waters to absorb the wastes, without detriment or deterioration.

(2) A permit may be for specified types of wastes and the quantity of wastes which will be taken into the waters shall be governed by the number of similar or other types of wastes already being discharged in the waters and any other relevant factor.

## Inspectors.

20. (1) Any inspector appointed by the Board, pursuant to the provisions of regulation 15 of these regulations, shall carry, and whenever required produce, an authority to act as such, issued under the Seal of the Board.

(2) An inspector has authority—

- (a) to enter and inspect any land or premises, on a foreshore, or which is so located that, in his opinion, wastes from the land or premises may find their way to, and discharge into, any of the waters;
- (b) to board and inspect any vessel on, or structure or premises over, any of the waters; and
- (c) to take and carry away a sample or samples of any matter whether wastes or not, being or being likely to be, discharged into the waters;

(3) Any person hindering or obstructing an inspector acting in the course of his duties commits an offence against these regulations.

## Rubbish and Litter.

21. Any person depositing rubbish, litter or other objectionable matter in or on any part of the waters or foreshores or adjacent to the foreshores, in any place where it or any of its components is, or is likely to be, or become, a source of pollution, commits an offence against these regulations.

22. (1) The Board, an inspector or a person authorised by the Board, may serve notice on the owner or occupier of any property on which there has accumulated, or on any person who has deposited in any waters or on the foreshore, any rubbish, litter or matter, including such matter as is mentioned in regulation 21 of these regulations, requiring that person to remove that rubbish, litter or matter within a period prescribed by the notice.

(2) Any person who, having been served with a notice, pursuant to this regulation, fails or neglects to comply with the provisions of that notice commits an offence against these regulations.

(3) Where a person fails to comply with a notice served under this regulation, the Board may remove, or cause to be removed, the rubbish, litter or matter to which the notice relates and may, without prejudice to sub-regulation (2) of this regulation, recover judgment, in any court of competent jurisdiction, for the cost of that removal, against the person to whom the notice is directed.

## PART V.—PERMITS.

## Division A—Wastes and Effluents.

23. The discharge either directly or indirectly of wastes into any of the waters or into any drain or open-cut or natural drainage channel connecting to those waters, is subject to a permit being issued under the authority of the Board; and subject to the provisions of subregulation (2) of regulation 30 of these regulations, a person shall not so discharge wastes without first obtaining a permit therefor.

24. Every applicant for a permit shall apply by means of Form No. 1 in the Appendix.

25. Every applicant shall submit full information regarding the composition, quantity, temperature, type, maximum rate of discharge and condition of any wastes and furnish such further information as may, from time to time, be required by the Board.

26. (1) The Board shall consider each application and may, at its discretion, grant or refuse a permit in respect of the whole or any part of the application.

(2) The Board may impose conditions under which any wastes may be discharged in any of the waters and any person not complying with those conditions commits an offence against these regulations.

(3) A permit issued by the Board under regulation 23 of these regulations shall specify the nature or types of the wastes; and should there be any subsequent change in the nature or types of the wastes, the person to whom the permit was issued shall forthwith advise the Board of the nature of that change.

27. (1) A permit shall be for such prescribed period, not exceeding twelve months, as may be determined by the Board and upon the expiry of that period the person to whom the permit was issued shall, if continuing to discharge wastes into any of the waters make application for renewal of the permit.

(2) Any person continuing to discharge wastes into any of the waters, after the expiry of a permit therefor, commits an offence against these regulations.

28. If, in the opinion of the Board, after issue of a permit there is any change in the nature of the wastes or in the conditions, or use, of the waters, the Board may re-examine the permit and may amend or revise its requirements, as it thinks fit or cancel the permit.

29. Any person using any of the waters for industrial purposes or discharging either directly or indirectly any wastes into those waters at the commencement of the Act, shall, at the request of the Board or an Inspector, apply for a permit in respect of any existing points of entry, on or before the 1st July, 1961, and a person failing so to apply commits an offence against these regulations.

30. (1) The Board shall, as soon as practicable, examine any application made pursuant to regulation 29 of those regulations and determine whether a permit should or should not be issued and may specify such conditions as it thinks necessary.

(2) Pending determination as to the issue of a permit under this regulation, the person or industry concerned may continue to utilise any existing method of discharge of wastes.

Division B—Jetties, Wharves, Bridges and River Structures Generally and Reclamation and Dredging.

31. (1) The construction or alteration of any jetty, wharf, bridge or river structure generally and the undertaking of any dredging or reclamation project in or over the waters is subject to a permit being issued, under the authority of the Board, and a person shall not commence any such construction or undertaking without first obtaining a permit therefor.

(2) Every applicant for a permit shall apply by means of Form No. 2 in the Appendix, in triplicate, and submit the application to the Board, through the Harbour and Light Department or the Lands Department, as the case may require.

32. Every applicant shall submit, in triplicate, full information regarding the intended structure or proposed work and shall furnish such further information as may, from time to time, be required by the Board or the relevant Department.

33. The Board shall consider any application made under this Division and may at its discretion grant or refuse a permit, in respect of the whole or any part of the application; and may attach such conditions as to the grant of a permit, as it thinks fit.

34. Any person who, having obtained a permit under this Division, does not comply with any condition attaching to the permit commits an offence against these regulations.

35. Every permit under this Division shall be for such prescribed period, not exceeding twelve months, as may be determined by the Board.

36. (1) The Board may renew any permit issued under this Division for such further period or periods as it may determine, but any renewal shall have regard to the condition and use of the structures, and to any change in conditions and usage of the waters.

(2) Any person who continues the construction, alteration or use of any jetty, wharf, bridge or river structure generally or the undertaking of any dredging or reclamation project, after the expiry of a permit, therefor, commits an offence against these regulations.

37. (1) The owner or occupier of any structure in or over the waters existing at the commencement of this Act, shall make application for a permit through the Harbour and Light Department on or before the 1st July, 1961, for leave to continue using that structure; and a person failing or neglecting so to apply commits an offence against these regulations.

(2) Any person undertaking a dredging or reclamation project at the commencement of these regulations shall make application for a permit through the Lands Department on or before the 1st July, 1961, for leave to continue with that project; and a person failing or neglecting so to apply commits an offence against these regulations.

38. (1) The Board shall as soon as practicable examine any application made under regulation 37 of these regulations and determine whether a permit should or should not be issued, and may specify such conditions as it thinks fit.

(2) Pending determination as to the issue of a permit under this regulation, the owner of a structure or person undertaking a dredging or reclamation project to which this regulation applies may continue to use the structure or continue the dredging or reclamation, as the case may be.

#### Division C—Fees Payable on Application for a Permit.

39. The following fees are payable, namely:—

#### Division D—Appeals Against Refusal to Issue a Permit or Give an Approval.

40. (1) Any person aggrieved—

- (a) by a refusal of the Board to grant a permit or give an approval under the Act; or
- (b) by a condition imposed by the Board as a condition of a permit, renewal of a permit, or approval,

may appeal against the refusal or, as the case may be, the condition, to the Minister.

(2) An appeal shall be lodged with the Minister within twenty-eight days of the Board's decision being communicated to the person thereby aggrieved.

(3) The Minister shall deal with the appeal and determine the issue, as soon as practicable after lodgment of the appeal.

(4) The Minister may, in his discretion, extend the time for lodgment of an appeal.

(5) The Minister may make such inquiries as he considers necessary and may determine any issue, with or without hearing the parties, and may call for the advice of the Rivers and Waters Technical Advisory Committee.

41. Within the time and in the manner prescribed by rules of Court, any person aggrieved by the decision of the Minister may appeal to a Judge of the Supreme Court against that decision.

#### PART VI—PROSECUTIONS.

42. A prosecution for an offence under these regulations shall be undertaken only with the approval of the Board and the consent of the Minister, on the complaint of a person duly authorised, by resolution of the Board, to make that complaint.

#### Penalty.

43. Subject to section 30 of the Act, any person contravening these regulations is liable to a maximum penalty of £10 and thereafter, where applicable, to a maximum daily penalty of 5s. per day during the continuance of the breach.

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Schedule.

## Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Qualification of Municipal Officers) Regulations, 1961.
2. In these regulations unless the context requires otherwise—
  - "Department" means the government department of the State established and known as the Department of Local Government;
  - "Minister" means the Minister for Local Government, and includes any Minister of the Crown for the time being discharging the duties of the office of that Minister;
  - "the Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960;words and expressions defined in section 6 of the Act and used in these regulations have the same respective meanings as in the Act.
3. (1) There shall be constituted under and in accordance with the provisions of the Act and these regulations the bodies referred to in subregulation (2) of this regulation, having the duties imposed and the powers conferred on each of them respectively by these regulations.
  - (2) The respective names of the bodies so to be constituted shall be—
    - (a) the Municipal Clerks and Treasurers Examination Committee;
    - (b) the Municipal Engineers Examination Committee;
    - (c) the Municipal Building Surveyors Examination Committee.
4. (1) The Municipal Clerks and Treasurers Examination Committee shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Governor from time to time and shall be—
  - (a) the Secretary for Local Government, or an officer of the Department nominated by him, and the Secretary, or as the case may be, the officer, shall be the Chairman;
  - (b) a person who is a member of a council, nominated by the body known as "The Local Government Association of W.A.";
  - (c) a person who is a clerk of a council, nominated by the body known as "The Western Australian Branch of the Institute of Municipal Administration";
  - (d) a person who is an officer of the Technical Education Division of the government department of the State established and known as the Education Department, nominated by the Superintendent of Technical Education of that department;
  - (e) a person nominated by the Minister.
  - (2) The Municipal Clerks and Treasurers Examination Committee shall conduct examinations and issue certificates of qualification in respect to clerks and treasurers in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, and shall at all times as and when required carry out and exercise all such other duties and powers imposed or conferred on the Committee by these regulations.
5. (1) The Municipal Engineers Examination Committee shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Governor from time to time and shall be—
  - (a) the Secretary for Local Government, or an officer of the Department nominated by him, and the Secretary, or as the case may be, the officer, shall be the Chairman;
  - (b) a person who is a member of a council, nominated by the body known as "The Local Government Association of W.A.";

- (c) the Commissioner of Main Roads appointed under the Main Roads Act, 1930 (as amended), or an engineer who is an officer of the Commissioner nominated by the Commissioner;
  - (d) a person who holds the position of engineer of a council and who—
    - (i) is a graduate of the Faculty of Engineering at the University of this State, or some other recognised university; or
    - (ii) is a corporate member of the Perth Division of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, or of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London; or
    - (iii) holds a certificate issued in a State of the Commonwealth of Australia that he is qualified to be a municipal or local government engineer,nominated by the Minister;
  - (e) a person who is on the staff of the University of this State and employed in the Faculty of Engineering, or is an officer of the Technical Education Division referred to in regulation 4 of these regulations, nominated by the Minister.
- (2) The Municipal Engineers Examination Committee shall conduct examinations and issue certificates of qualification in respect to engineers in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, and shall at all times as and when required carry out and exercise all such other duties and powers imposed or conferred on the Committee by these regulations.
6. (1) The Municipal Building Surveyors Examination Committee shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Governor from time to time and shall be—
- (a) the Secretary for Local Government, or an officer of the Department nominated by him, and the Secretary or, as the case may be, the officer, shall be the Chairman;
  - (b) a person who is a member of a council, nominated by the body known as "The Local Government Association of W.A.";
  - (c) the person holding the position of Principal Architect in the Architectural Division of the government department established and known as the Public Works Department, or an architect who is an officer of that department nominated by the Principal Architect;
  - (d) a person who is an officer of the Technical Education Division referred to in regulation 4 of these regulations, nominated by the Superintendent of Technical Education;
  - (e) a person nominated by the Minister.
- (2) The Municipal Building Surveyors Examination Committee shall conduct examinations and issue certificates of qualification in respect to building surveyors in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, and shall at all times as and when required carry out and exercise all such other duties and powers imposed or conferred on the Committee by these regulations.
7. (1) Persons nominated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 4, 5 or 6, as the case may require, of these regulations may be appointed by the Governor as deputies to act in the respective offices of members of a Committee in the absence of the occupants of the offices.
- (2) Any person so appointed is entitled, when the member of the Committee for whom he is the deputy is absent from a meeting of that Committee, to attend that meeting and, when so attending, shall be deemed to be a member of that Committee and may exercise any function which the member for whom he is the deputy could exercise if present.
8. (1) Except where the member holds office *ex officio*, every member of a Committee shall hold office at the Governor's pleasure.
- (2) If a member of a Committee—
- (a) becomes permanently incapable of performing his duties;
  - (b) becomes a person who would not be qualified to be appointed a member;
  - (c) dies;
  - (d) resigns his office by writing under his hand addressed to the Minister and the resignation is accepted; or
  - (e) has his appointment terminated by the Governor;
- the office of the member of that Committee becomes vacant.

(3) Where the office of a member becomes vacant pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation, a person nominated in accordance with the provisions of regulation 4, 5 or 6, as the case may require, of these regulations shall be appointed by the Governor to fill the vacancy.

9. Each member of a Committee, and each deputy appointed under these regulations, shall be paid such fees as the Governor determines from time to time.

10. The Minister may grant leave of absence to a member of a Committee, or a deputy for a member, for such period and upon such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.

11. Each Committee shall have a secretary who shall be an officer of the Department and shall be appointed by the Minister from time to time.

12. (1) The first meeting of a committee shall be convened by the chairman and be held at a time and place appointed by him, and the Committee shall meet accordingly and shall hold such further meetings as it considers necessary for conducting its affairs.

(2) At a meeting of a Committee—

- (a) three members form a quorum;
- (b) the chairman, or in his absence the person appointed his deputy, shall preside, or if both be absent or there is no deputy so appointed, the members present at the meeting shall elect one of their number to act as chairman at that meeting;
- (c) all questions shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting; and
- (d) the chairman, or other person presiding as chairman, at the meeting has a deliberative vote but no casting vote, and in the event of an equality of votes, the motion shall be declared "not carried."

13. (1) The provisions of this regulation shall apply to appointments made by a council on and after the 1st day of January, 1964.

(2) In and for the purposes of this regulation—

"preceding year" means the financial year of the council which ended on the thirtieth day of June next preceding an appointment referred to in this regulation made by a council;

"revenue" has the same meaning as it has in an Award numbered 15 of 1957 made under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912 (as amended), and known as the Local Government Officers' Award, 1957, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th January, 1959.

(3) The council of a municipality which had for the preceding year a revenue in excess of £20,000 shall not appoint a person to the office of clerk of the council unless—

- (a) that person holds a certificate of qualification as clerk issued pursuant to these regulations; or
- (b) not being the holder of such a certificate, the appointment of that person is approved by the Minister.

(4) The council of a municipality which had for the preceding year a revenue in excess of £50,000 shall not appoint a person to the office of engineer to the municipality unless—

- (a) that person holds a certificate of qualification as engineer issued pursuant to these regulations; or
- (b) not being the holder of such a certificate, the appointment of that person is approved by the Minister.

(5) The council of a municipality which had during the preceding year a population in excess of 15,000 persons shall not appoint a person to the office of building surveyor to the municipality unless—

- (a) that person holds a certificate of qualification as building surveyor issued pursuant to these regulations; or
- (b) not being the holder of such a certificate, the appointment of that person is approved by the Minister.

(6) The council of a municipality which had during the preceding year a revenue in excess of £100,000 shall not appoint a person to the office of treasurer to the municipality unless—

- (a) that person holds a certificate of qualification as treasurer issued pursuant to these regulations; or
- (b) not being the holder of such a certificate, the appointment of that person is approved by the Minister.

14. Where the holder of an office referred to in regulation 13 of these regulations is absent on annual leave or on sick leave, the council may, notwithstanding the provisions of that regulation, appoint to that office, to act while the officer is so absent, a person on the staff of the council who does not hold the certificate of qualification required in respect of that office.

15. A Committee may issue a certificate of qualification to a person—

- (a) who passes the examinations, and complies with the other requirements, prescribed by these regulations; or
- (b) who satisfies the Committee that, pursuant to the provisions of these regulations, he is entitled to the issue of a certificate of qualification without examination.

16. The examination for a certificate of qualification as clerk of a council shall be divided into four parts, and shall comprise the following subjects:—

Part I.

- (i) Introductory Accountancy—
  - (a) General Bookkeeping.
  - (b) Accountancy I.
- (ii) English Expression I.
- (iii) Commercial Law A.

Part II.

- (i) Economics I.
- (ii) Office Administration.
- (iii) Miscellaneous Law (Local Government).

Part III.

- (i) Local Government Accounts.
- (ii) Local Government Law I.
- (iii) Economics IIG.

Part IV.

- (i) Local Government Law II.
- (ii) Theory of Administration (Local Government).
- (iii) Municipal Administration.

17. The examination for a certificate of qualification as treasurer to a municipality shall be divided into four parts, and shall comprise the following subjects:—

Part I.

- (i) General Bookkeeping—
  - Accountancy I.
- (ii) English Expression I.
- (iii) Commercial Law A.

Part II.

- (i) Accountancy II.
- (ii) Miscellaneous Law (Local Government).
- (iii) Economics I.

Part III.

- (i) Local Government Law I.
- (ii) Local Government Accounts I.
- (iii) Economics IIG.

Part IV.

- (i) Local Government Law II.
- (ii) Accountancy IIIB.
- (iii) Municipal Administration.

18. The examination for a certificate of qualification as engineer to a municipality shall be divided into two parts, and shall comprise the following subjects:—

Part I.

- (i) Mathematics.
- (ii) Mechanics and Strength of Materials.
- (iii) Hydraulics.
- (iv) Heat, Light and Sound.
- (v) Electricity and Magnetism.
- (vi) Drawing.

Part II.

- (i) Structures.
- (ii) Surveying.
- (iii) Town Planning.
- (iv) Sanitary Engineering.
- (v) Road and Street Engineering (2 papers).
- (vi) Powers and Duties of a Municipal Engineer.

19. The examination for a certificate of qualification as building surveyor to a municipality shall comprise the following subjects:—

- (a) Building Construction—Three papers.
- (b) Mechanics and Strength of Materials—Two papers.
- (c) Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor—One paper.

20. Where an examination is divided into parts, a candidate shall complete the whole of the subjects for a part before presenting himself for examination in any subject of the next part, unless the Committee orders otherwise.

21. (1) A person may be granted exemption from examination for a certificate of qualification as clerk of a council if he satisfies the Committee that—

- (a) he has, for at least five years during the period of ten years immediately preceding the 1st day of July, 1961, held the position of town clerk to a municipal council or secretary to a road board, within this State, and has acquired knowledge of and experience in local government practice and affairs sufficient to render him competent to hold the office of clerk of a council; or
- (b) he has, for at least five years during the period of ten years immediately preceding the 1st day of July, 1961, held the position of assistant town clerk to a municipal council or assistant secretary to a road board, within this State, which had throughout that period of five years an annual revenue in excess of £50,000, and has acquired knowledge of and experience in local government practice and affairs sufficient to render him competent to hold the office of clerk of a council; or
- (c) he has passed an examination in another State of the Commonwealth of Australia which in the opinion of the Committee, is of a standard comparable with the examination prescribed by these regulations, and has, by practice and experience, gained a sufficient knowledge of local government in this State; or
- (d) he has passed an examination conducted by the Technical Education Division referred to in regulation 4 of these regulations which is, in the opinion of the Committee, equivalent to the examination prescribed by these regulations.

(2) In and for the purposes of this regulation, "revenue" has the same meaning as in regulation 13 of these regulations.

22. A person may be granted exemption from examination in any subject prescribed for the examination for a certificate of qualification if he satisfies the Committee that he has passed another examination in that subject which in the opinion of the Committee is of a standard equivalent to the examination in that subject prescribed by these regulations.

23. (1) A person may be granted exemption from examination for a certificate of qualification as treasurer to a municipality if he satisfies the Committee that he has, for at least five years out of the period of ten years, immediately preceding the 1st day of July, 1961, held the position of treasurer

or accountant to a municipal council or to a road board within this State which had throughout that period of five years an annual revenue in excess of £100,000.

(2) In and for the purposes of this regulation, "revenue" has the same meaning as in regulation 13 of these regulations.

24. A person who—

- (a) has graduated in engineering at the University of this State, or at another recognised University; or
- (b) is a corporate member of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, or the Institution of Civil Engineers, London; or
- (c) has passed the examination for municipal or local government engineer prescribed in another State of the Commonwealth of Australia or any other examination deemed by the Committee to be the equivalent thereof; and

who has for a period of not less than two years been engaged as engineer to the Main Roads Department, or to a former municipal council or former road board, or a municipal council under the Act, or has been engaged as assistant engineer or engineering assistant for a like period to the Main Roads Department, or to a former municipal council or former road board or a municipal council under the Act which expended on engineering works during that period not less than £100,000 per annum, may be granted exemption from the whole of the examination prescribed by these regulations for a certificate of qualification as engineer to a municipality, with the exception of subject (vi) of Part II—Powers and Duties of a Municipal Engineer as set forth in regulation 18 of these regulations.

25. A person who has, for at least five years during the period of ten years immediately preceding the 1st day of July, 1961, been employed as building surveyor to a municipal council or to a road board, within this State, having a population of not less than 15,000 persons, and who has adequate technical knowledge may, if the Committee thinks fit, be exempted from the examination prescribed by these regulations for a certificate of qualification as building surveyor to a municipality.

26. A person who—

- (a) has passed the examination for a certificate of building surveyor in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia; or
- (b) is a member of the Royal Institute of Architects; or
- (c) is a registered A class builder under the Builders' Registration Act, 1939 (as amended);

may be granted exemption from examination for a certificate of qualification as building surveyor to a municipality in such subjects as the Committee thinks fit.

27. Examinations pursuant to these regulations will be held annually, in the month of November, at such times and places as the Committee appoints, and for the purpose of such examinations the Committee may appoint examiners, or may appoint examiners jointly with other public bodies, institutions, or examining authorities.

28. A person wishing to sit for examination shall make application in the Form No. 1 in the schedule to these regulations not later than the first day of September in any year and shall pay the appropriate fees prescribed by regulation 41 of these regulations.

29. A person seeking the issue of a certificate of qualification without examination shall make application in the Form No. 1 in the schedule to these regulations and shall pay the appropriate fees prescribed by regulation 41 of these regulations.

30. The Committee shall notify the candidate, not later than the first day of October, of the time and place appointed for the holding of the examination in respect of which he is a candidate.

31. Where an isolated examination place is appointed for one candidate only, he shall be required to pay an additional fee to cover the cost of supervision.

32. The procedure relating to holding and conducting examinations shall be such as the Committee from time to time determines.

33. If a candidate passes the examination in full, and otherwise conforms to these regulations, the Committee shall, on his paying the fee for the certificate of qualification prepare and issue a certificate of qualification to him.

34. If a candidate passes in one or more subjects, but fails to pass in other subjects, he may, with the consent of the Committee, present himself for re-examination in those subjects which he failed to pass and not in those subjects which he passed.

35. (1) A person shall not be a candidate for examination unless—

- (a) in the case of examination for a certificate of qualification as clerk, treasurer, or engineer, he has passed the University Junior Examination, or one which the Committee considers equivalent; (including passes in English and Mathematics or Commercial Arithmetic);
  - (b) in the case of examination for a certificate of qualification as building surveyor, he has passed the University Junior Examination, or one which the Committee considers equivalent;
  - (c) in any case, he is a natural born or naturalised British subject, and satisfies the Committee that he is of good character;
- but, in the case of a person more than twenty-five years of age the requirements specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation may be dispensed with at the option of the Committee.

(2) No certificate of qualification shall be issued to a person who has not attained the age of twenty-one years.

36. The Committee may at any time cancel the certificate of qualification issued to a person—

- (a) who has obtained such certificate by fraud or misrepresentation; or
- (b) who becomes bankrupt, applies to take the benefit of any law for the relief of bankrupt or insolvent debtors, compounds with his creditors or makes an assignment for their benefit; or
- (c) who is proved to the Committee to be no longer capable of exercising, because of mental defect, the duties to which the certificate of qualification relates; or
- (d) who has been convicted in this State of any crime or misdemeanour or who has been convicted in any place outside this State of any offence which, if committed in this State, would be a crime or misdemeanour; or
- (e) who is proved to the Committee to have been guilty of fraudulent or dishonest conduct in the course of his employment by a council.

37. (1) The Committee, by notice in writing given to a person whose certificate of qualification has been cancelled pursuant to these regulations, may require that person to surrender the certificate to the Committee within a time to be specified in the notice.

(2) The cancellation of a certificate of qualification shall have effect notwithstanding any failure to surrender the certificate.

38. The Committee may at any time, either of its own motion or upon application by a person whose certificate of qualification has been cancelled pursuant to regulation 36 of these regulations, issue to that person a fresh certificate of qualification in lieu of the certificate so cancelled.

39. Where a Committee cancels a certificate of qualification, or having cancelled such a certificate issues a fresh certificate in lieu thereof, in accordance with these regulations, the reasons of the Committee for so doing shall be reduced into writing and signed by the chairman, and upon request by the person concerned a copy of those reasons so written and signed shall be supplied to that person.

40. (1) There shall be an appeal to a stipendiary magistrate sitting in a court of petty sessions, whose order shall be final, in any case where a Committee cancels a certificate of qualification, or having cancelled such a certificate refuses to issue a fresh certificate in lieu thereof upon application made therefor.

(2) On the hearing of the appeal the court may order that the cancellation shall have no effect, or that the fresh certificate shall be issued to the applicant therefor, or may dismiss the appeal, and may order either party to pay such costs as the court in its discretion may think fit.

(3) A notice of appeal under this regulation shall state specifically every ground of appeal upon which the appellant intends to rely at the hearing, and a copy thereof shall be served by the applicant on the secretary of the Committee at least fourteen days before the date fixed by the court for the hearing of the appeal.

## SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1960.

Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909.

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Asher Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Lawrence Walter Jackson, Senior Puisne Judge, and the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, and the Honourable John Hale, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, being a majority of the Judges of the said Court, acting in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf do hereby amend the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and declare that such amendments shall come into operation forthwith upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

## 1. ORDER XI.

Rule 1 is amended—

(i) by omitting paragraph (e) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph—

(e) the action is one brought to enforce, rescind, dissolve, annul, or otherwise affect a contract, or to recover damages or other relief for or in respect of the breach of a contract—

(i) made within the jurisdiction, or

(ii) made by or through an agent trading or residing within the jurisdiction, on behalf of a principal trading or residing out of the jurisdiction, or

(iii) by its terms or by implication to be governed by the law of this State; or is one brought in respect of a breach committed within the jurisdiction of a contract wherever made, even though such breach was preceded or accompanied by a breach out of the jurisdiction which rendered impossible the performance of the part of the contract which ought to have been performed within the jurisdiction.

(ii) by adding paragraphs as follows—

(j) the action is by a mortgagee or mortgagor in relation to a mortgage or personal property situated within the jurisdiction, and seeks relief of the nature or kind following, that is to say, sale, foreclosure, delivery of

possession by the mortgagor, redemption, reconveyance, delivery of possession by the mortgagee, but does not seek (unless and except so far as permissible under paragraph (e) of this rule) a personal judgment or order for payment of moneys due under the mortgage.

In this paragraph the expression "personal property situated within the jurisdiction" means personal property which, on the death of an owner thereof intestate, would form subject-matter for the grant of letters of administration to his estate by the Court; the expression "mortgage" means a mortgage, charge or lien of any description; the expression "mortgagee" means a party for the time being entitled to or interested in a mortgage; and the expression "mortgagor" means a party for the time being entitled to or interested in property subject to a mortgage.

- (k) the action is property brought in this State under the Civil Aviation (Carriers' Liability) Act 1959, of the Commonwealth.

In fixing the allowance to be made under items 3, and 4, the taxing officer shall have regard to the amount of salary or wages actually lost by the witness.

In addition to the above allowances, witnesses residing at a distance from the place of trial or hearing may be allowed reasonable travelling expenses actually paid, excluding any charges for maintenance or sustenance.

The taxing officer may also allow such amount as he thinks has been reasonably and properly incurred and paid to witnesses for qualifying to give skilled evidence.

Except by special order of the trial judge, no allowance shall be made to any expert witness for attendance at Court assisting or advising counsel or solicitor for a party during the trial.

In the case of persons giving evidence as experts the allowances in the above Scale may be increased in the discretion of the taxing officer.

THE Harvey Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919 (as amended), published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 8th day of November, 1957, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following by-law prescribing rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads within the townsite of Brunswick Junction in the Harvey Road Board District:—

1. (a) No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on the western side of Ommaney Road (South-Western Highway), Brunswick Junction, between a point twenty feet south of the intersection with George Avenue and a point eighty feet south of that intersection for a period exceeding one hour between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. in any day except Saturday and Sunday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays.

(b) No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on the southern side of George Avenue, Brunswick Junction, between a point twenty feet west of the intersection with Ommaney Road (South-Western Highway) and a point seventy feet west of that intersection for a period exceeding one hour between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. in any day except Saturday and Sunday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays.

2. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

## Schedule.

## Regulations.

Principal regulations.

1. In these regulations the Betting Control Regulations, 1955, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th May, 1955, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices published in the *Government Gazette*, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 104 the following regulation:—

104A. (1) Except where the amount of the bet is paid in cash to the bookmaker at the time the same is made, a person shall not make with a bookmaker who holds a license to carry on the business of a bookmaker at registered premises, or with his employee, and a bookmaker shall not accept from a person, a bet on a horse in a race, unless at the time of making the bet that person informs, or has previously informed, the bookmaker of his true and correct name and his correct address.

(2) Every bookmaker shall record in a book to be kept by him for that purpose at his registered premises every name and address furnished to him pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, and if a person in making such a bet with the bookmaker uses as a means of identifying himself to the bookmaker a pseudonym, or a name, word or expression not his true and correct name, the bookmaker shall record also in that book opposite the name and address of that person the pseudonym, name word or expression so used.

(3) Within fourteen days after the first day of each of the months of January, April, July and October in each year, every bookmaker shall lodge with the Board a complete and correct list of the names and addresses so furnished to him pursuant to this regulation during the period of three months immediately preceding each such date, together with the respective pseudonyms, names, words or expressions used by persons in making bets with the bookmaker:

Provided that where the license of a bookmaker expires, or is suspended, cancelled or surrendered, pursuant to these regulations, or is cancelled by force of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, the list referred to in this subregulation shall be lodged with the Board within fourteen days thereafter, and shall contain the names, addresses and other required information furnished to him since the completion of the last previous list.
