IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an open season for finches of all species from 1st September to 31st December, 1961, throughout the whole of the Kimberley Division of the State as defined in the Land Act, 1933-1956: Provided that finches shall be taken in the area aforesaid only by a person who is—

- (a) the holder of a license issued under regulation 8 of the Fauna Protection Regulations; or
- (b) a property owner whose property is being damaged by finches; provided further that such a property owner shall not take any finches for sale or sell any finches unless he is the holder of a license issued under regulation 8 of the Fauna Protection Regulations.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1899, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Commissioner of Main Roads should be vested in the officer whose name is set out in the attached schedule: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the officers named in the attached schedule and any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in their place, the appointment of foremen and all persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act 1933-1960, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 26029 (Kalamunda Lot 426) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The State

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. No. 4025/57.—That reserve No. 25221 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Mosman Park in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Corr. No. 4066/28.—That reserve No. 26045 should vest in and be held by The Midland Railway Company of Western Australia Limited in trust for Railway Purposes.

Corres. No. 2350/57.—That Sussex Locations 4171 and 4172 being portions of Class "A" Reserve 8434 and Sussex Locations 4173 and 4174 being portions of Class "A" Reserve 8438 should vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Tourist Bureau in trust for the purpose of the Protection and Preservation of Caves and Flora, and for Health and Pleasure Resort.

(The previous vesting order, dated 24th July, 1957, is hereby superseded.)

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 943/59; Lands 315/59, 2873/32.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation,
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 28th day of October, 1959, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 9 and 49 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1225/60.

WHEREAS by The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect

of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor-in-Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.

City of Perth.

Proposed Bold Park No. 1 Service Reservoir.

The construction of a concrete lined excavated reservoir, of approximately fifty million gallons capacity, and an excavated sump. These works to be complete with valves and all necessary apparatus.

The above works are shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8506.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 25th day of August, 1961.

Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

High Road, Brentwood, Extension.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1335/57.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1, and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087, and as described in Order in Council of 2nd July, 1948, and subsequent amendments, shall be extended in the following manner by adding the area described in the Schedule hereunder and including it in Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

Schedule.

(a) All that portion of land bounded by lines commencing at a point on the prolongation of the western boundary of lot 306, High Road, Brentwood, approximately 40 feet south of the northern boundary of the High Road road reserve and proceeding in a northerly and easterly direction along the western and northern boundaries respectively of the said lot to the south-western corner of lot 292, Cambey Way; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the said lot to and across Cambey Way and along the western boundary of lot 283, Cambey Way, to a point on the southern boundary of lot 239, Adamson Road; thence in a westerly and northerly direction along the southern and western boundaries respectively of the said lot to a point in the centre of Adamson Road; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Adamson Road to a point in the centre of Moolyeen Road; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Moolyeen Road to a point on the prolongation of the northerly boundary of lot 3, Adamson Road; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary and along the northern boundary of lot 4, Adamson Road, to a point on the western boundary of lot 234, Adamson Road; thence in a northerly and easterly direction along the western and northern boundaries respectively of the said lot and along the northern boundaries of lots 233 to 221 inclusive, Adamson Road, to and across Rivett Way and along the northern boundaries of lots 73, 72, 71, Adamson Road, to a point in the centre of Reddington Way; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Reddington Way to a point in the centre of Adamson Road; thence in an easterly direction along the centre of

Adamson Road to a point in the centre of Bateman Road; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bateman Road to a point on the prolongation of the northern boundary of lot 177, Bateman Road; thence in a south-easterly direction along the said boundary to a point on the north-western boundary of lot 164, Selway Road; thence in a north-easterly and south-easterly direction along the north-western and north-eastern boundaries respectively of the said lot to a point in the centre of Selway Road; thence in a general south-westerly direction along the centre of Selway Road to a point in High Road approximately 40 feet south of the northern boundary of the High Road road reserve; thence in a westerly direction along High Road to the point of commencement as shown in colour on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087.

(b) All that portion of land bounded by lines commencing at a point in the centre of Pulo Road on the prolongation of the southern boundary of lot 1, Pulo Road, and proceeding in a westerly direction along the said boundary to the south-western corner of the said lot; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the said lot to a point in the centre of Sheridan Way; thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Sheridan Way to a point in the centre of Pulo Road; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Pulo Road to the point of commencement, as shown in colour on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087.

2. Clause 21.—Payment for Sickness. Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

21.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by subsequent service to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default, or for any sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker, by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years, but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
