WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of sec-tion 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedules hereunder be declared totalisator agency regions for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the land described in the schedules hereunder shall be totalisator agency the schedules hereunder shall be totalisator agency regions for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, in the case of the land described in the First Schedule, as from and in-cluding the 18th day of September, 1961; and, in the case of the land described in the Second Schedule, as from and including the 25th day of September, 1961.

First Schedule.

THE HARKNESS FELLOWSHIPS for education and travel in the United States are offered in different categories to candidates from the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Western Europe.

2. In Australia, up to three Civil Service Fellowships are offered in open competition each year to outstanding men and women holding appointments under the Commonwealth and State Governments of Australia.

3. - (a) Where a residence has not been erected on the land and the land has not been cleared of scrub and fallen timber, two firebreaks, each six feet in width and half chain apart, shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.
- (b) Where a residence has not been erected on the land, but the land has been developed by general clearing of scrub and fallen timber, a firebreak, not less than six feet wide, shall be cleared of all infiammable material inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land, and any buildings erected on the land shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all infiammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings.
- (c) Where a residence has been erected on the land, then all buildings shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings and a firebreak not less than six feet wide shall be cleared inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

3. If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, the approval of the Council or its duly authorised officer must be obtained to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

4.
