IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1960, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means

of fishing nets in the whole of the Western Australian waters known as Broke Inlet (or Brookes' Inlet) from the seventh day following the day in each of the years 1961, 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1965 on which the said inlet opens to the sea, or from 1st November in each of the said years, whichever is the earlier day, to 31st May of each succeeding year respectively.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1960, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto from 1st November in each of the years 1961, 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1965 to 30th April of each succeeding year respectively.

Schedule.

All that portion of Oyster Harbour bounded by lines starting at a point on the western shore of Oyster Harbour aforesaid situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of lot 57 of

Plantagenet Location 7 and extending easterly to a point known as "Kalgan Stake"; thence south-erly to the easternmost extremity of Green Island; thence south-south-easterly passing through a point known as the "Wreck" and onwards to the northern boundary of Reserve 22698 and thence generally westerly and generally northerly along the shores of the said Oyster Harbour to the starting point.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedules hereunder be declared totalisator agency regions for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the land described in the schedules hereunder shall be totalisator agency regions for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, in the case of the land described in the First Schedule, as from and including the 3rd day of October, 1961; and, in the case of the land described in the Second Schedule, as from and including the 9th day of October, 1961.

First Schedule.

All that portion of land comprising the area bounded by lines starting in Moirley Park at the point where an imaginary line in prolongation of the north-western boundary of Clement Street in a north-easterly direction meets the south-western boundary of Coode Street; thence along that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the south-eastern boundary of Second Avenue; thence along an imaginary line in prolongation of that south-eastern boundary in a north-easterly direction across Coode Street to the point of the junction of the north-eastern boundary of that street with the north-western boundary of Camden Street; thence along that north-western boundary in a north-easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the south-western boundary of Wellington Road; thence along an imaginary line in prolongation north-easterly of that north-western boundary across Wellington Road to the point where it meets the north-eastern boundary of that road; thence along that north-eastern boundary in a north-westerly direction to the point of its junction with the eastern boundary of Camboon Street; thence along that eastern boundary in a northerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its intersection with the northern boundary of Victoria Road; thence along that northern boundary in an easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the western boundary of West Swan Road; thence along an imaginary line in prolongation of the said northern boundary in an easterly direction to the point where it meets the eastern boundary of West Swan Road; thence along that eastern boundary in a south-easterly direction to the point where it merges with the south-eastern boundary of the same road; thence along that south-eastern boundary in a general south-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same and then in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of West Swan Road across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the northern boundary of Swan Street; thence across Swan Street in a southerly direction to the point of the junction of its southern boundary with the eastern boundary of Meadow Street; thence along that southern boundary in an easterly direction across all streets meeting the same and the railway reserve of the railway between Guildford and East Guildford to the point of its junction with the north-western boundary of Janet Street; thence along that north-western boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point of its junction with the south-western boundary of Hervey Avenue; thence along that south-western boundary in a south-easterly direction to the point of its junction with the north-western boundary of West Parade; thence along that north-western boundary in a north-easterly direction to the point of its merger with the north-eastern boundary of Bushmead Road; thence along that north-eastern boundary in a south-easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the western boundary of Kalamunda Road; thence across that road to the point of the junction of its eastern boundary with the northern boundary of Helena Valley Road; thence along that northern boundary in a general easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its intersection with the north-western boundary of Railway Parade; thence along that north-western boundary in a south-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its merger with the western boundary of Ridge Hill Road; thence along that western boundary in a general southerly direction and then along the north-western boundary of Ridge Hill Road in a south-westerly direction to the point of its junction with the north-eastern boundary of Adelaide Street; thence across Ridge Hill Road to the point of its junction with the eastern boundary of Adelaide Street; thence along that eastern boundary in a southerly direction to the point of its intersection with the southern boundary of Gooseberry Hill Road; thence along that southern boundary in a westerly direction across Adelaide Street to the point of the junction of that southern boundary with the north-eastern boundary

of Kalamunda Road; thence across that road to the point of the junction of the north-eastern boundary of Brewer Road with the southern boundary of Maida Vale Road; thence along that southern boundary in a westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the north-eastern boundary of Epsom Avenue; thence along an imaginary line in prolongation of that southern boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point where it meets the south-western boundary of Epsom Avenue; thence along that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the northern boundary of Ascot Street; thence along an imaginary line in prolongation of that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction to the point where it meets the high water mark of the right bank of the Swan River; thence along that high water mark in a westerly direction to the point where it meets an imaginary line in prolongation of the south-western boundary of King William Street in a south-easterly direction; thence along that imaginary line in a north-westerly direction across Pall Mall to the point where the imaginary line merges with the said south-western boundary; thence along that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same and by way of the subway of the railway between Perth and Bayswater to the point where that boundary merges with the south-western boundary of Coode Street; thence along that south-western boundary in the same direction across all streets meeting the same to the starting point.

Second Schedule.

(a) All that portion of land comprising the area bounded by lines starting in Morley Park at the point where an imaginary line in prolongation of the north-western boundary of Clement Street in a north-easterly direction meets the south-western boundary of Coode Street; thence along that imaginary line in a south-westerly direction across Lawrence Street to the point of its merger with the north-western boundary of Clement Street; thence along that north-western boundary in a south-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the north-eastern boundary of Salisbury Street; thence across Salisbury Street to the junction of its south-western boundary with the south-eastern boundary of India Street; thence along that south-eastern boundary in a south-westerly direction to the point of its intersection with the south-western boundary of Wood Street; thence along that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction across India Street to the point of its junction with the south-eastern boundary of Walter Road; thence across Walter Road in a north-westerly direction to the point of the junction of its north-western boundary with the south-western boundary of Harold Street; thence along that south-western boundary in a north-westerly direction to the point of its intersection with the north-western boundary of Perth Street; thence along that north-western boundary in a north-easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of Grand Promenade; thence along that north-eastern boundary in a north-westerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the north-western boundary of Surrey Street; thence along that north-western boundary in a north-easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the south-western boundary of Lennard Street; thence continuing in a north-easterly direction across Lennard Street to the point of the junction of its north-eastern boundary with the south-eastern boundary of Second Avenue; thence along that south-eastern boundary in the same direction to the point of its junction with the south-western boundary of Coode Street; thence along that south-western boundary in a south-easterly direction across all streets meeting the same to the starting point.

(b) All that portion of land comprising the area bounded by lines starting in Mt. Pleasant at the point where an imaginary line in prolongation of

the southern boundary of Helm Street in an easterly direction meets the high water mark of the left bank of the Canning River; thence along that imaginary line in a westerly direction across the Esplanade to the point where it merges with the southern boundary of Helm Street; thence along that southern boundary across all streets meeting the same to the point of its intersection with the western boundary of Ogilvie Road; thence along that western boundary in a northerly direction across all streets meeting the same to the point of its junction with the south-western boundary of Canning Beach Road; thence across that road in a northerly direction along an imaginary line in prolongation of the western boundary of Ogilvie Road to the point where it meets the high water mark of the left bank of the Canning River; thence along that high water mark in an easterly then southerly direction to the starting point.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 12th day of September, 1961, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued.

Traffic Act, 1919-1959.

Port Hedland Shire Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Police T.O. 58/458.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1959, namely, that the Port Hedland Shire Council is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of—

- (1) clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads, and the use of footpaths;
- (2) clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads, or footpaths of traffic signs, lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions;
- (3) clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulates the use thereof;
- (4) clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof;

subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making, being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator.
