WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves Nos. 2010 and 7723 at Boat Harbour should be placed under the control of the Shire of Denmark as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserves under the control of the Shire of Denmark as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserves; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Companies Act, 1943-1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1960, that no company shall be registered by a name which, inter alia, is identical with that by which a company in existence is already registered under the law relating to companies, or in the oninion of the Registrar of Companies, so nearly resembles that name as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas it is provided, inter alia, in proviso (a) to subsection (7) of that section that where in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require a company incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of that Act applies to change its name before complying with the requirements of that Part) it is expedient, the Governor may authorise the Registrar to accept for filling the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of that Act; and whereas registration under Part XI of the Act of a company incorporated in the State of Victoria by the name of Patersons Pty. Ltd. was refused by the Registrar on the ground that in his opinion that name so nearly resembles the name by which a company in existence (Paterson & Co. Limited) is already registered under the said Act, as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require Patersons Pty. Ltd. to change its name before complying with the requirements of that Part of the Act and is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by proviso (a) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1960, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filling from Patersons Pty. Ltd. the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.
