WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by Subsection (1) of section 93 of the Electoral Act, 1907-1959, that a Province or District which is wholly or partly in any portion of the State, other than the North-West Area as defined in the Electoral Districts Act, 1947, may be declared by Proclamation to be a remote area to which section 93 of the Act applies: and whereas the Eyre Electoral District applies; and whereas the Eyre Electoral District and the Murchison Electoral District were so declared to be remote areas; and whereas it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (5) of that section that the Governor may, by subsequent Proclamation, cancel a Proclamation so made: Now therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the proving conferred upon ma by section 92 of the the power conferred upon me by section 93 of the Act, do hereby cancel the Proclamation declaring the Eyre Electoral District and the Murchison Electoral District to be remote areas, made the 19th day of March, 1958, and published in the Government Guzette on the 28th day of March, 1959, and ment Gazette on the 28th day of March, 1958, and do by this my Proclamation declare the Boulder-Eyre Electoral District, the Merredin-Yilgarn Electoral District and the Murchison Electoral District to be remote areas to which the section applies.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 2709/60.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinaftermentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Main Drainage.
Gosnells and Canning.
Lacey Street Main Drain.

Construction and improvement of open channel and pipe drains approximately 3,900 feet in length between Sevenoaks Street and the Canning River. The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8647.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 2nd day of February, 1962.

MILK ACT, 1946-1960.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 62 of the Milk Act, 1946-1960, it is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the adoption by The Milk Board of Western Australia, constituted under that Act, of a scheme for improvement of the production, supply and quality of milk for consumers, approved and recommended by the Minister for Agriculture in accordance with the provisions of the said section, particulars of which scheme are set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Scheme for Milk Improvement.

The Board proposes to improve the production of milk by extending milk testing and the testing of herds of dairymen and by providing additional facilities for these purposes, including a laboratory of its own.

The Board proposes to improve the supply and quality of milk by prohibiting the sale by dairymen of milk for consumption or treatment in cases where the quality of the milk of such dairymen is found on analysis not to be of the prescribed minimum standard, and by prohibiting milk vendors from purchasing or receiving milk from such dairymen as the Board specifies to milk vendors, in accordance with regulations made for implementing, enforcing and facilitating the provisions of the scheme and imposing penalties on persons contravening the same.
