WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:

Corr. No. 3513/60.—That Reserve No. 26204 (Albany Lot 1141) should vest in and be held by the Albany and Districts Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in trust for the purpose of Animal Welfare and Clinic.

Corr. No. 7917/12.—That Reserve No. 26205 (Moora Lots 323 to 338 inclusive) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of Native Housing.

Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 147 in Part VIII of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960, it is enacted, inter alia, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been or are about to be made by the legislature or other competent authority of or in any part of Her Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom and outside the Commonwealth of Australia for the endominions of judgments as defined in section 146 of the said Act so far as that definition relates to Western Australian judgments, orders and awards, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare such part of Her Majesty's dominions to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of Part VIII of the said Act and that the said Part VIII shall extend and apply with respect to that part of Her Majesty's dominions and thereupon such part of Her Majesty's dominions shall become a reciprocat-Her Majesty's dominions shall become a reciprocating State within the meaning of the said Part VIII, which shall extend and apply to such part of Her Majesty's dominions accordingly; and whereas by section 146 in Part VIII of the said Act it is enacted, inter alia, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare any Court in a reciprocating State to be a superior Court within the meaning of Part VIII of the said Act; and whereas the Governor of this State is satisfied that the the Governor of this State is satisfied that the legislature of the Colony of Hong Kong has by the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Ordinance, 1960, made such reciprocal provisions as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 146 and 147 of Part VIII of the said Act, doth hereby declare as follows:-

- (a) That the Colony of Hong Kong is a reciprocating State for the purposes of Part VIII of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960.
- (b) That Part VIII of that Act shall extend and apply with respect to the Colony of Hong Kong.
- (c) That the Supreme Court of the Colony of Hong Kong is a superior court within the meaning of Part VIII of that Act.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960. Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1. Alteration of District Boundary. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries

of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or any District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be altered: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087, and as described in the schedule to the Order in Council of 2nd July, 1948, and subsequent amendments, shall be altered in the following manner by deleting that portion of the boundary described in the Schedule (A) hereunder and by substituting therefor the altered boundary as described in the Schedule (B) altered boundary as described in the Schedule (B) hereunder.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 15 of 1960.

Between West Australian Branch, Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Air Beef Pty. Ltd., Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Meat Industry (Glenroy) Award and replaces Agreement No. 7 of

3.—Area and Scope.

- (a) Area.—This Award shall operate in that area occupied by Air Beef Pty. Ltd. at Glenroy.
- (b) Scope.—This Award shall apply to workers classified in Clause 21 hereof employed by the respondent in the processing of meat.

This Award shall operate for a period of twelve (12) months from the date hereof.

5.—Definitions.

In this Award, unless the context otherwise indicates, the words-

- (a) "mutually agreed" or "mutual arrange-ment" mean agreed in writing between the Management of the Works and the Union
- or its representatives; "seasonal operatives" "seasonal operatives" shall mean those workers who customarily reach Glenroy by the plane immediately preceding the commencement of operations.

General Conditions.

- (a) Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher rate than the rate pertaining to his recognised task shall be paid for that day at the highest rate for such tasks.
- (b) Wages shall be paid in the manner and at times that are mutually agreed.
- (c) The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. Overtime shall be distributed on a roster system, but any worker shall have the right to forego his place on the roster except for work in his own department, if required by the Management for work in that department. In all cases of overtime, sufficient men for the job required must be supplied.
- (d) Workers shall be provided with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose, including stretcher, mattress and pillow.
- (e) Each worker who boards at the Works Canteen shall have an amount equivalent to twenty-seven per cent. (27%) of the basic wage for the Goldfields Areas and all other portions of the State, exclusive of the South-West Land Division, deducted from his wages weekly.
- (f) All delegates shall be officially recognised by the Management.
- (g) Notwithstanding that the rates of pay are set forth on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Management or the workers to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the worker was employed at a daily wage.
- (h) The hideman shall (if required) assist in the loading operations off the plane and shall be paid at overtime rate for such work.

7.—Preference.

- (a) Preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Award shall be given to members of the Union, provided they are competent workmen for the task for which they are selected and do their work to the satisfaction of the Management.
- (b) Subject to preference to members of the Union, the Management shall have the right-
 - (i) To select workers with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks.
 - (ii) To allot to workers their respective tasks; to dispense with the services of any worker for incompetence, drunkenness, misconduct.
 - (iii) In the event of the work of a worker being unsatisfactory at a task to which he has been transferred, the Management shall have the right to place such worker on waiting time in accordance with Clause 20 of this Award.
 - (iv) Workers engaged in Perth shall be selected from the lists supplied by the Union.

8.—Transfer.

The Management may transfer workers from one department to another. In this case, the rates payable shall be those specified for the task performed, subject to the provisions of Clause 6 (a) hereof (General Conditions).

9.—Hours of Labour.

- (a) Except where otherwise provided, forty (40) hours shall constitute an ordinary week's work, divided into five (5) working days of eight (8) hours each, Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (b) Starting time for slaughter fioor workers, knocker, bleeder, chiller hands and others employed in loading operations for the plane, shall be between 5 a.m. and 7 a.m., unless other times are fixed by mutual arrangement between the Management and the Union representative.

10.-Meal Times.

The hours of labour shall be exclusive of meal times which shall be as mutually arranged in accordance with Clause 9 and all workers shall be entitled to a meal break for the midday meal of not less than one (1) hour.

11.-Smokos.

- (a) Workers under this Award shall be allowed a smoko of fifteen (15) minutes each forenoon and a further smoko of fifteen (15) minutes each afternoon at such times as shall be fixed by mutual arrangement and one smoko after every two (2) hours continuous work done outside ordinary hours if it is intended that after such smoko work is to continue for at least another hour.
- (b) When reasonably required by the Management owing to exigencies of work, workers shall forego their smoko until a convenient time.

12.—Overtime.

- (a) Overtime rates shall be paid-
 - (i) for all time worked after the usual ceasing time and before midnight, time and onehalf for the first four (4) hours and thereafter double time;
 - (ii) for all time worked in the period commencing from midnight, double time up to the worker's usual starting time;
 - (iii) for all work performed on Saturdays, time and a half for the first four (4) hours and thereafter double time.
- (b) For all time worked during meal hours and smokos, except as provided in Clause 11, double ordinary rates.
- (c) Except as provided in Clause 13 and subject to any mutual arrangement, workers called back to work after the meal time following ordinary ceasing time or required for overtime on Saturday, shall be provided with a minimum period of two (2) hours work or shall be entitled to payment for such.
- (d) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (e) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

13.—Sunday and Holiday Work.

Workers called out to work on the loading of planes on Sundays and holidays shall be provided with a minimum of two (2) hours work or payment for such and workers called out to work on any other tasks on such days shall be provided with a minimum of four (4) hours work or payment for such. In either case, payment shall be at holiday rates.

14.—Holidays and Holiday Rates.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Wyndham Cup Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday, by arrangement between the parties, in lieu of any of the days named in the subclause.
- (b) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday or a Monday, such holiday shall be observed on the next succeed-

- ing Tuesday; in each such case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.
- (c) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. Work performed on these days and on Sundays shall be paid for at double ordinary rates.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be at the rate pertaining to each worker's task.
- (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on such holiday.

15.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each day observed as aforesaid.
- (c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of that period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays; provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.
- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accidents sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (d) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (e) Annual leave must be granted not later than four (4) weeks after the leave falls due, and at least fourteen (14) days' notice shall be given to the worker of the date upon which he is to commence his annual leave.
- (f) (i) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (ii) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the Union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two periods.
- (g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them: Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the employer of his right to retain at the works during the close-down period such workers as may be essential.
- (h) Workers regularly working for the Management north of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the Management. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Perth during the period of such leave shall be allowed, once in each two (2) years, reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journey between the place of their employment and either of the said cities.

(i) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the average rate of wage the worker has received over the period of his employment in respect of his ordinary hours of work.

16.—Sick Leave.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (b) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year, January 1st to December 31st, in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (c) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (d) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (f) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

17.—Travelling.

- (a) Each worker shall be entitled to-
 - (i) passage from place of engagement to Glenroy and travelling time allowance;
 - (ii) passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available plane at discretion of Management, from Glenroy to place of engagement after termination of work in his department; or when his services are not further required by the Management, provided that his duties have been performed to the satisfaction of the Management.
- (b) Travelling time allowance referred to herein shall be at the task rate applicable but, if the travelling time exceeds one day, subsequent days shall be at half rate.
- (c) Any seasonal operative who leaves of his own accord or is dismissed for misconduct before the end of a fourteen (14) weeks' period from arrival at Glenroy shall be liable to refund the cost of his fare to Glenroy and any wages due to him shall be retained as part payment and the balance will be legally recoverable and any worker other than a seasonal operative who leaves of his own accord or is dismissed for misconduct before the end of the season's operations as defined in Clause 18, shall be liable to refund the cost of his fare to Glenroy and any wages due to him shall be retained as part payment and the balance will be legally recoverable.

18.—Guarantee.

- (a) Subject to Clause 7 (b), a guarantee of fourteen (14) weeks' work from date of commencement of slaughtering is given to each worker brought from Perth or Fremantle. The rate applicable under this guarantee shall be the rate for the respective task allotted.
- (b) Every worker shall be engaged on the express condition that he will perform at least fourteen (14) weeks' work from such date of commencement and at the rates for the respective tasks allotted to him and will continue to work for such additional period as in the opinion of the Management is necessary to fulfil the season's operations.
- (c) This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the worker has continued to work for a period of not less than four (4) weeks after the last day of killing.

19.—Waiting Time.

(a) The date of commencement of slaughtering shall be determined by the Management, but one clear day (not including the day of arrival) shall elapse between the date of arrival of seasonal operatives and the date of commencement of slaughtering operations.

- (b) Waiting time allowance as defined in Clause 20 (a) shall be paid for the day after the day of the arrival of seasonal operatives.
- (c) All workers, including seasonal operatives, shall if so required by the Management do any work other than slaughtering available between the date of arrival of seasonal operatives and the date fixed for the commencement of slaughtering under this clause.

20.—Waiting Time Allowances.

- (a) When no employment is available for a worker at his usual task, such worker shall, if so required by the Management, do any other work available and be paid whatever rate shall be the highest for the task performed or the recognised usual task.
- (b) If for any reason no employment is available to a worker, waiting time allowance at half his recognised task rate shall be paid for such waiting time, in which case the minimum rate shall not apply to the period of such waiting time.

21.-Rates and Conditions.

- (i) The slaughter floor gang shall consist of two slaughtermen, one bleeder, one sawman and two knifemen
- (ii) The ordinary rate per head for cattle treated by the slaughter floor gang shall be fixed so as to give to each of the men in the gang the basic wage together with the appropriate margin set out hereunder for treating the Monday to Friday tally of bullocks in any week:—

- (iii) The tally for the slaughter fioor gang shall be thirty-eight (38) bullocks per day, Monday to Friday. All cattle treated in excess of thirty-eight (38) up to fifty-one (51) per day shall be paid for at rate and a quarter and all cattle treated in excess of fifty-one (51) shall be paid for at rate and a half.
- (iv) All cattle treated on Saturday shall be paid for at rate and a half up to twenty-six (26) and double rate for all such cattle in excess of twentysix (26).
- (v) All cattle treated on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at double rates.
- (vi) All bulls and genuine stags shall be paid for at double rate provided that other animals classified as bulls by the Meat Inspector shall be paid for at rate and a half. "Genuine stag" means a fully grown animal that exhibits characteristics of a bull including a definite neck crest.
- (vii) All cattle condemned by the Commonwealth Veterinary Officer for tuberculosis, cancer, ulcer, tumour or gangrene shall be paid for at double rates.
- (viii) The duties of the slaughter floor gang shall include all operations, i.e., killing and dressing. In the event of knocking operations having to be done by the slaughter floor gang, they shall be paid as a gang an extra amount of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per beast in excess of the rate per head fixed as hereinbefore prescribed.

(c) Hide Department:

- (i) The ordinary rate per hide for hides treated by the hideman shall be fixed so as to give to the hideman the basic wage together with a margin of thirteen pounds two shillings and fivepence (£13 2s.5d.) for treating a tally of fifty-seven (57) hides per day, Monday to Friday.
- (ii) All hides treated in excess of fifty-seven (57) per day and up to seventy-six (76) per day shall be paid for at rate and a quarter and all hides treated in excess of seventy-six (76) shall be paid for at rate and a half.

(d) Boning Department:

- (i) The ordinary rate for quarters boned shall be fixed so as to give to a boner the basic wage together with a margin of seven pounds one shilling (£7 1s.) for a tally of thirty-two (32) quarters per day from Monday to Friday in any week.
- (ii) All quarters boned in excess of thirty-two (32) per day Monday to Friday shall be paid for at rate and a half with a minimum payment for thirty-six (36) quarters per day.
- (iii) The maximum number of quarters for any day shall not exceed forty-eight (48) per boner.
- (iv) All quarters boned on Saturday shall be paid for at rate and a half for sixteen (16) quarters and double rates thereafter.
- (v) All quarters boned on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at double rates.
- (vi) Bulls and genuine stags shall be paid for at double rates provided that other animals classified as bulls by the Meat Inspector shall be paid for at rate and a half.
- (vii) For the purpose of computing the daily tally the following equivalents shall apply:—
 - One hind quarter shall equal one quarter of beef.
 - One fore quarter shall equal one quarter of beef.
 - Five briskets shall equal one quarter of beef.

 Three rumps and loins shall equal two quarters of beef.
 - Fifteen shins shall equal one quarter of beef.

 Two necks and blades shall equal one quarter of beef.
 - Two ribs and two briskets shall equal one quarter of beef.
 - Three crops 70 lb. and under shall equal two quarters of beef.
 - Three crops 71 lb. to 105 lb. shall equal two and a half quarters of beef.
 - One crop over 105 lb. shall equal one quarter of beef.
 - Three shoulders shall equal two quarters of beef.
 - Three chucks and blades shall equal two quarters of beef.
 - Five butts shall equal two quarters of beef. Seven briskets with shin attached shall equal two quarters of beef.
 - Three butts and rumps shall equal two quarters of beef.

22.-First Aid.

It shall be obligatory upon the employer to keep at the works, a first aid kit fully stocked in accordance with the requirements of the Australian Aerial Medical Service.

23.—Clothing.

- (a) The Management agrees to supply each worker with two (2) singlets or fiannels and two (2) pairs of shorts or long trousers.
- (b) Such clothing to be washed and kept in good repair by the worker.
- (c) The worker shall report for work each day in a clean set of such clothing.
- (d) If at any time the Management considers the clothing is no longer serviceable the worker shall purchase and wear replacements which shall be washed and worn in accordance with the above subclause.
- (e) Rubber boots, gloves, blue coats, aprons, shall be supplied by the Management to all workers who require them by the nature of their work and same shall be replaced when required.

(f) A laundry equipped with a washing machine shall be provided by the Management.

24.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose; are embodied in this Award.

25.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend or delete any provision of, or to add further provisions to, this Award.

 - (iv) Subject to subclause (v), work performed at places beyond thirty (30) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, shall be deemed to be distant work unless the employer and the workers with the consent of the Union agree in any particular case that the travelling allowance for such work shall be paid under this clause in which case an additional allowance of eight pence (8d.) per mile shall be paid for each mile in excess of thirty (30) miles.
 - (v) In respect to work carried out from an employer's depot situated more than thirty (30) miles from the the G.P.O., Perth, the main post office in the town in which such depot is situated is substituted as the centre for the purposes of this clause.
 - (vi) Apprentices shall be paid three-quarters $(\frac{3}{4})$ of the above rates.
 - (vii) Where transport to and from the job is provided by the employer from and to his depot or such other place more convenient to the worker as is mutually agreed between the employer and worker, half the above rates shall be paid: Provided that the conveyance used for such transport is provided with suitable seating and weatherproof covering
 - (b) For travelling during working hours from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another, a worker shall be paid by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling, and reasonable expenses.
- 5. Clause 18—Distant Work.—Delete clause 18 and insert in lieu thereof the following:—
 - (a) Where a worker is sent by his employer or is engaged or selected or advised by an employer or his agent to proceed to a job or is

- told by an employer or his agent that a job will be available at such distance that he cannot return to his home each night, the employer shall provide board and lodging or shall pay the expenses reasonably incurred by the worker for board and lodging: Provided that where the employer provides board and lodging, except that the worker is required to provide bedding, an allowance of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per week shall be paid by the employer.
- (b) When any worker is required to travel at night, sleeping berth accommodation shall be provided by the employer.
- (c) Time occuped in travelling (including waiting for transport connections) up to a maximum of eight (8) hours each day shall be paid for at ordinary rates. Time occupied after arriving at the destination awaiting commencement of work during ordinary working hours shall be deemed to be time occupied in travelling.
- (d) The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling and shall pay a meal allowance of five shillings (5s.) for each ordinary meal actually and reasonably required during such travelling: Provided that neither the amount of the return fare nor the amount payable for the return travelling shall be payable if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or within one (1) week of his commencing work on the job, for incompetency, or if the worker terminates or discontinues his work on the job within one (1) month of his commencing it.
- (e) The employer shall provide free transport for the workers' tools. Provided that free transport for tools shall not be provided when a worker severs his own contract of service.
- (f) Where a worker uses any kind of conveyance of his own in travelling, the amount of the fare that would have been reasonably incurred had the worker used a public conveyance shall be paid by the employer to the worker.
- (g) If a worker elects to return to his home at the week-end after three (3) months' continuous service away from home in the employ of the one employer and thereafter at the end of each three-monthly period, he shall be paid a second-class return rail or road bus fare on the pay day which immediately follows the date on which he returns to the job, unless travelling facilities are provided. This shall not apply where the worker has visited his home at the employer's expense during the three-monthly period.
- 6. Clause 21—Preference to Unionists.—Delete subclause 7.
- 7. Clause 22—Holidays.—Delete subclause (a) and insert in lieu thereof the following:—
 - (i) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall (subject to the appropriate clause or clauses covering special rates and conditions for work on holidays) be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties, in lieu of any of the days named in the subclause.
