By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 6 of the Road Closure Act, 1961, the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to close portion of the public road in the Town of Midland, being portion of the Bellevue-Kalamunda Road (road No. 1135) commencing at the production north-westerly of the south-western alignment of Clayton Street and extending southward to a surveyed line on Lands and Surveys Diagram No. 67214 extending 274 degrees 28 minutes from the north-western corner of lot 2 on Land Titles Office Diagram No. 22910; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid portion of the road shall now be closed: Now, therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Governorcil, do by this my Proclamation close the portion of the Bellevue-Kalamunda Road (road No. 1135) in the Town of Midland as hereinbefore described, pursuant to the provisions of section 6 of the Road Closure Act, 1961.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 6 of the Bees Act, 1930-1957, that the Governor may, by Proclamation (inter alia)—

- (a) declare any portion of the State in which any disease affecting bees exists and defined in the Proclamation to be an infected area; and
- (b) prohibit, either absolutely or subject to regulation, the sending or bringing into an infected area or the removal from an infected area into any other part of the State, of bees, honey, wax, hives, beekeepers' appliances or any other articles used in connection therewith, in the opinion of the Governor likely to spread any disease;

and whereas it has been made to appear to me, the Governor, that the part of the State defined in the schedule hereto is an area in which a disease affecting bees exists and that the sending or bringing into, or the removal from that area of bees, honey, wax, hives and other beekeepers' appliances should be prohibited subject to regulation: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that part of the State defined in the schedule hereto to be an infected area, within the meaning of the said Act and prohibit the sending or bringing into, and the removal into any other part of the State from, that area of bees, honey, wax, hives and beekeepers' appliances of any kind, except in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act and for the time being in force.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. No. 2 of 1962.

(Registered 8th February, 1962.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 28th day of December, 1961, between the West Australian Fib-rous Plasterers' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part and The Colonial Sugar Refining Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Com-pany"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Colonial Sugar Refining Co. Ltd. Plaster Workers' Agreement.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers classi-fied in clause 10 hereof employed at the works occupied and controlled by Colonial Sugar Refining Co. Ltd.

4.—.Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.-Contract of Service.

One (1) day's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service. If such notice of termination is not given one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited. For the purpose of this subclause, notice shall be given at or before the usual starting time on any ordinary working day and shall be deemed to expire at the comple-tion of that day's work.

6.-Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct pay-ment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the buschdown of the employed because or any the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

7.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(c) The hours of work, except where shifts are worked, shall be performed as follows: Monday to Friday inclusive, between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(d) The starting and finishing time having been established in any factory, the employer shall notify the Union of any alterations thereto.

8.—Overtime.

(1) Any worker who is called upon to continue working for more than two (2) hours beyond his working for more than two (2) hours beyond his usual ceasing time shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid an allowance of three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to any worker who was advised on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime, nor to any worker who can conveniently return home for a meal.

(2) Any worker who has left the premises at which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one (1) hour shall receive payment for one (1) hour at overtime rates.

(3) If a worker is required to work during the recognised meal period so that the commencement of the meal period is postponed for more than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ an hour, that worker shall receive payment at double time rates until he gets his meal.

(4) Subject to the preceding subclause, if a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not in consequence obtain during the shift the full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained or any portion lost.

(5) The expression "recognised meal period" means the period customarily observed as the meal period between fixed times at the works.

(6) All work performed outside the normal limits of the hours of labour shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(7) Notwithstanding anything contained herein-

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime and such worker shall work the overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) an organisation, party to this Agreement, and/or a worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with (i) above.

9.—Shift Work.

Where two or more shifts are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

The penalty rate for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

10.—Wages

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Agreement shall be as follows:----Per Week.

11.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least once weekly. (b) When a worker is discharged at or before the usual time he shall be paid all wages due to him.

12 — Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service sub-sequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

13.---Under-rate Workers.

(1) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(2) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(3) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

14.-Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) All workers, except casual workers, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be entitled to holidays without deduction of pay in respect of the basic wage and margin, on the days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All workers required to work on the days named in subclause (a) hereof, or on any Sunday shall be paid double time rate for all time worked on any such day.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If any holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case

of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(i) "Picnic Day" shall be observed on a day mutually agreed upon between the employer and his workers.

(j) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(k) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

15.—Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing:—

- (a) The name and address of each worker to whom this Agreement applies.
 - (b) The class of work performed by him.
 - (c) The hours worked each day by him.
 - (d) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him.

Such record shall be signed by the worker and open to inspection by a representative of the Union during working hours and such person may take extracts therefrom.

16.—Posting Copy of Award and Union Notices.

(a) No employer shall prevent an official of the worker's Union from posting a copy of this Agreement or any Union notice, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place on any job.

(b) Liberty to apply to amend this clause is reserved in the event of any objectionable notice being posted.

17.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

(1) The Secretary or any authorised officer of the Union or Association shall be allowed free access to any job or shop at any time during the meal period, and with consent of the employer or his foreman at any other time, to interview any of the workers if he desires to do so.

(2) The Secretary or any authorised representative of the Union or Association shall have the right to visit and inspect any factory or works or any part thereof during the time that work is being carried on outside the ordinary working hours and to interview workers therein.

18.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement, or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

19.—Long Service Leave.

(1) Entitlement to Leave.

Subject to this Agreement, every employee, not being a casual employee, shall be entitled to long service leave on ordinary pay in respect of continuous service with the employer.

(2) Period of Leave.

The amount of such entitlement in the case of an employee who has completed at least 20 years' continuous service with the employer shall be—

- (i) in respect of the 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave; and
- (ii) in respect of each 10 years' service with the employer completed after such 20 years—six and one-half weeks' leave.

(3) Pro Rata Entitlement on Termination.

In the case of an employee who has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 20 years' service with the employer and whose services with the employer are terminated by the employer for any cause other than serious misconduct, or by the employee for any reason or by reason of the death of the employee, the employee shall be entitled to a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service, or since the last accrual of entitlement to leave on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service.

(4) Calculation of Continuous Service.

(a) For the purpose of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, and shall, subject to any limitation herein, count as service:—

- (i) Absence in respect of any period during which the employee shall have served as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (other than as a member of the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia and other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan), or as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939 (as amended), or absence on compulsory service in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended): Provided that the employee as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumes employment with the employee by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such absence.
- (ii) Absence on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (iii) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations under this Agreement in respect of long service leave or annual leave.
- (iv) Absence necessitated by personal sickness or injury of which not more than 15 working days a year shall count as service.

(b) For the purposes of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Agreement) shall not break the continuity of service, but the period of such absence shall not count as service:—

- (i) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade, if the employee be re-employed by the employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination.
- (ii) Absence during any standing down of an employee in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

- (iii) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the employee is reemployed by the employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination.
- (iv) Absence of the employee authorised by the employer at any time.
- (v) Absence arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute but only if the employee returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute.

(c) After the coming into operation of this Agreement absence from work by reason of any cause not being a cause specified in this clause for a period in excess of 14 days shall be deemed to break the contract of employment and the continuity of service for the purposes of this Agreement unless the employee notifies the employer in writing of the reason for his absence.

(5) Service before Commencement of Agreement.

For the purpose of calculating the entitlement to leave, continuous service of an employee with the employer immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Agreement, shall be taken into account but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of such service, provided that any service prior to such 20 years' service will carry such leave if the employee remains in the employer's service until his retirement.

(6) Time of Taking Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted and taken on the retirement of the employee provided that when an employee has completed 20 years of continuous service he will be entitled to not more than eight weeks' interim leave which will be taken at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the employee having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment where the employee is working. Additional interim long service leave on the basis of four weeks for each additional 10 years' service may be taken at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the employee.

(7) Payment on Termination for Leave not Taken.

Where the employment of an employee is terminated otherwise than by his death and he has an entitlement to long service leave the employee shall be deemed to have entered upon and taken the leave from the date of such termination and the employer shall forthwith pay to the employee in full his ordinary pay for the leave less any amount already paid to the employee in respect of that leave.

(8) Payment on Death.

Where an employee dies during his employment and any long service leave to which he is entitled under this Agreement has not been taken or received in full by the employee, the employer shall upon request by the personal representative of the employee, pay to that representative the amount due in respect of such leave providing that where no personal representative has been appointed within three months of the date of the employee's death the employer may pay to the widow or such of the next of kin as it considers appropriate, the said amount due. The obligation of the employer to such employee or employee's estate in respect of long service leave shall be and shall be deemed to have been satisfied by such payment.

(9) Payment for Period of Leave.

Each employee shall be paid for each week of leave his ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave. Such ordinary time rate shall be for the standard hours prescribed by this Agreement but in the case of part time workers for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

Note.—"Ordinary time rate of pay":

 (i) Shall not include—shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

Payment in the case of employees employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by result shall be at ordinary time rates. (ii) Shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave.

(10) Method of Payment.

Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) In full before the employee goes on leave.
 (ii) At the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the employee had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the employee in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the employee.
- (iii) In any other way agreed between the employer and the employee.
- (11) Public Holidays and Annual Leave during Period of Leave.

Any long service leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(12) Transmission of Business.

For the purposes of this Agreement where a business had, whether before or after the coming into operation of this Agreement been transmitted from an employer (in this paragraph called the transmittor) to another employer (in this paragraph called the transmittee) and an employee who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee:

- (i) The continuity of service of such employee shall be deemed not to have been broken by reason only of the transmission.
- (ii) The period of the continuous service which the employee has had with the transmittor (or any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be continuous service of the employee with the transmittee.

In this clause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(13) Benefits Related to Long Service.

The employer will continue to operate its F.E.A. Scheme to provide superannuation benefits in accordance with the rules of that scheme in addition to any leave granted under this Agreement.

(14) Leave to be in Satisfaction of all Rights.

The entitlement to long service leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave or benefit in the nature of long service leave, to which the employee may be entitled in respect of the employment by the employer, and any leave taken or in respect of which payment has been made by the employer shall be deducted from any amount of long service leave to which such employee is entitled pursuant to this Agreement.

(15) Records.

(Registered 9th February, 1962.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 21st day of December, 1961, between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers and The Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Unions"), of the one part, and R. J. Davies Pty. Ltd. (hereinafter called "the em-ployer") of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Bridge Building (Fremantle Traffic Bridge) Workers' Agreement.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall operate over the areas actually occupied and controlled by the employer and shall apply to all workers employed in the classifications referred to herein.

4.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of two (2) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Contract of Service.

One (1) week's notice on either side shall be One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service of any worker, other than a casual worker (where the notice shall be one (1) hour). If the required notice is not given, one (1) week's (or one (1) hour's, in the case of a casual worker) pay shall be paid or forfeited as the case may be.

6.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker can-not be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery, or from any other cause for which the employer is not re-sponsible, with the exception of wet weather, in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the engineer in charge, if available, and, in his absence, the foreman.

7.-Casual Workers.

A worker engaged for less than one (1) week (except a worker who is dismissed for inefficiency or misconduct or who leaves the service of the employer of his own volition) shall be deemed a casual hand and whilst engaged as such shall be entitled to receive ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the minimum rate herein prescribed.

8.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary work for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the mini-mum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

9.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked from Monday to Friday (inclusive) each week.

10.—Overtime.

(a) (i) All work performed beyond eight (8) hours in any day or on Saturdays shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of one and a half times for the first two (2) hours and double time theoretical states are also been as a state of the state of t double time thereafter.

(ii) All time worked on Sundays or on the holi-days referred to in subclause 12 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

11.—Meal Money.

When a worker is required for overtime with-out having been notified on the previous day, he shall be supplied with a meal or be paid five shil-lings (5s.) for a meal. Provided no such meal or payment is due unless the worker works more than two hours after the usual knock-off time. Provided that a worker who is allowed not less than one hour and a half in which to get a meal before resuming work, and facilities for obtaining a meal are available, shall not be entitled to meal money or a meal under this clause.

12.—Holidays, Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Building Trades Picnic Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed an-nually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If after one (1) week's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer, through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-twenty-sixth (1/26th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wages in respect of each completed week of continuous service.

(e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (d) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportion-ate to his length of service during that period with such employer and if such leave is not equal to the

(g) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(h) With the exceptions of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof the provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

13.-Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement, or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

14.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, and hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

15.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly within fifteen (15) minutes of the worker's knock-off time. The employer shall not keep more than two days' pay in hand.

16.—Change Room.

The employer shall provide a suitable change room where the workers may change their clothes.

17.—First Aid.

An adequate first aid kit, maintained by the employer, shall be provided on the site.

18.—Special Rates.

(a) Dirt Money.

A dirt allowance of fourpence (4d.) per hour shall be payable in connection with work deemed to be more than ordinarily dirty; cases of dispute to be determined by the Board of Reference.

(b) Wet Work.

(i) Any worker working in water or "wet places" shall be paid an extra allowance of one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day or part of a day.

(ii) "Wet places" shall mean places where, in the performance of the work the splashing of water and mud saturate the worker's clothing or where protection is not provided to prevent splashings or drippings sufficient to saturate his clothing, and shall include wet material or wet ground in which it is impracticable for the worker wearing ordinary working boots to work without getting wet feet. Provided that this clause shall not apply to men working on natural surfaces made wet by rain.

(iii) In exceptional cases where the work is excessively wet and which are not covered by subclause (ii) hereof, an extra allowance may be agreed upon or, failing agreement, determined by the Board of Reference.

(iv) Subject to subclause (iii) the engineer in charge or the foreman shall decide whether any allowance is payable under this clause.

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(v) Workers called upon to work overtime in water or in wet places shall receive an extra one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) or the appropriate allowance fixed by the Board of Reference for each eight (8) hours or portion thereof, of overtime worked and such allowance shall be treated as portion of the wage for the calculation of overtime. For all other purposes, the extra payment shall be deemed an allowance.

19.—Maximum Rate.

The highest rate to which a worker employed subject to this Agreement shall be entitled is twice the ordinary rate of pay.

20.—Oilskins.

The employer will supply oilskins free of charge to all workers required by the employer to work in the rain or in exposed positions, as approved by the engineer in charge.

21.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave for one day or less shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.

22.—Wages.

23.-Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include:----

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after 26th June, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) Any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute.
- (f) Any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct or by the worker illegally severing his contract of service;

the amount of leave shall be-

 (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years; (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated-

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sick-ness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave:

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award (or agreement), but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

- (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like;

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies-

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award (or Agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:-
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave:
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address speci-fied by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been a taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportion-ate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the em-In respect of any period of service with the em-ployer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation thereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitle-ment of the worker hereunder.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be re-ferred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of-

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Em-ployers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be interviewed with the meridiant hereof be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in re-spect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any em-ployer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Agreement to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Austra-lian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Em-ployers' Organisations is varied in any way.
