- 4. On the same date the Returning Officer declared your Petitioner to be the defeated candidate and proceeded to distribute among the other candidates the votes recorded in favour of your Petitioner in the order of the electors' preference
- After such distributions aforesaid the votes recorded in favour of the said Kenneth Wathen Dunn numbered 3367 and the votes recorded in favour of the said Jack Jerome Metcalfe numbered
- 6. On the 11th day of April 1962 the Returning Officer declared the said Kenneth Wathen Dunn to be the duly elected candidate
- If upon completion of the count of the primary votes cast at the said election the number of the primary votes recorded in favour of your Petithe primary votes recorded in favour of your Fetr-tioner had been equal to or greater than the num-ber of primary votes recorded in favour of the said KENNETH WATHEN DUNN and the said KEN-NETH WATHEN DUNN had been declared to be the defeated candidate then upon distribution of the votes recorded in favour of the said KENNETH WATHEN DUNN your Petitioner would have been elected as the candidate for the district by a substantial majority.

Your Petitioner says that this vote was a formal and valid vote and that as a feat it did not have upon it any that as a fact it did not have upon it any mark or writing not authorised by the Act which would enable the Returning Officer to form or to hold the necessary opinion.
