## Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (ex-clusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department) should be vested in Peter John Hill: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Peter John Hill the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

# Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 104/62.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor 1961, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, unite any two or more fire districts the areas of which are contiguous into one fire district, and include or remove, as the case may be, the name of a local authority in or from Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act. Now, therefore. of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby-

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Kalamunda more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name High Wycombe Fire District to that fire district;
- unite the High Wycombe Fire District and the contiguous Metropolitan Fire District
- the contiguous Metropolitan Fire District into one fire district under the name of the Metropolitan Fire District;
  (d) include the name of the local authority the Shire of Kalamunda in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act by adding at the end of column two thereof the item, "Metropolitation of the Chine of Kalamunda". "Municipal District of the Shire of Kala-
- munda"; and
  (e) remove the name of the local authority the Municipal District of North Fremantle from Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of land situate within the municipal district of the Shire of Kalamunda bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the south-western boundary of Swan Location 1327 and the south-eastern side of road number 1846 and ex-tending north-easterly along that side and onwards to the north-eastern side of Kalamunda Road (road thence generally south-easterly number 1844); along that side to the south-eastern boundary of location 1327 aforesaid; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the southern corner of that location, and thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of that location to the starting point. (Public Plan 1C/20, N.W.)

Land Act, 1933-1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 26315 (Canning Location 1743) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalamunda in trust for the purpose of a Golf Course: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalamunda in trust for a Golf Course with power to the said Shire of Kalamunda, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease, subject to the condition that habitation shall not be permitted thereon.

Land Act, 1933-1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.
