BY His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 94A of Part VIA of the Police Act, 1892-1961, it is provided that if it appears to the Governor that any new derivative of morphine or cocaine or of any salts of morphine or cocaine cocaine or of any salts of morphine or cocaine or any other alkaloid of opium or any other drug of whatever kind is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill-effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine, the Governor may by Proclamation published in the Gazette declare that Part VIA of that Act shall apply to that new derivative or alkaloid or other drug in the same manner as it applies to the drug in the same manner as it applies to the

drugs mentioned in paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 94A of that Act; and whereas it appears to the Governor that the drugs mentioned in the schedule hereunder are likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill-effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 94A of Part VIA of the Police Act, 1892-1961, hereby declare that Part VIA of that Act shall apply to the drugs mentioned in the schedule hereunder in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of that section of the Act.

Gold Buyers Act, 1921-1961.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Gold Buyers Act, 1921-1961, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt any defined portion of the State from the operation of all or any of the provisions of that Act, but any such order may in like manner be varied or revoked; and whereas, by an Order in Council made the 3rd day of August, 1922, and published in the Government Gazette on the 4th August, 1922, the Lieutenant-Governor ordered that all that portion of the State lying morth of the Tropic of Capricorn should be exempt from the provisions of the Gold Buyers Act, 1921, in so far as they relate to the sale and purchase of gold; and whereas it appears expedient to the Governor that the said Order in Council should be revoked: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council made the 3rd day of August, 1922.

- By adding a new clause 20-Preference to Unionists, as follows:-
 - (a) Preference of employment shall be given to suitable members of the Union. Provided that any worker or applicant for employment who furnishes proof that he is a financial member of any other registered industrial union of workers shall subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, be given equal preference.
 - (b) Any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the Union or of any other registered industrial union of workers shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award apply in accordance with its Rules to become a member of the Union and any worker who is not a member of the Union but is a member of another registered industrial union of workers shall within fourteen (14) days from the expiration of his then current member-ship with such other Union apply to become a member of the Union.
 - (c) The provisions of this clause shall not debar from employment or continuance in employment any applicant for employment or any worker whose application to become a member of the Union has been refused by the Union without reasonable cause, unless and until such refusal is withdrawn.
 - (d) Any worker or applicant for employment who becomes a member of the Union shall continue his financial membership of the Union in accordance with its Rules, while he continues to be employed under this Award.
 - (e) The employer shall within fourteen (14) days of being advised in writing by the Union of the breach by a worker of the provisions of this clause determine the employment of any worker who fails to comply with the provisions of this clause unless such breach is remedied by the worker concerned within such fourteen days. Any dispute as to whether a worker has committed a breach of this clause may be referred to a Board of Reference by either the employer or the Union concerned.
 - (f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to any worker who objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to being a member of an industrial union of workers, so long as such worker, from time pays to a charitable organisation to time, pays to a charitable organisation nominated by the Court an amount equiva-lent to the subscription and levies prescribed by the rules of the Union to be paid by its members.
 - (g) Should any dispute arise as to the conscientious religious beliefs of any worker or applicant for employment the same shall be referred to a Board of Reference appointed under the Award.
 - (h) "Union" shall mean the "West Australian Fibrous Plasterers' Industrial Union of Workers.'

AGREEMENT.

(Registered 20th July, 1962.)

THIS Agreement, to be known as the "Institution Officers' (Child Welfare Department) Agreement," Officers' (Child Welfare Department) Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part 10 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 20th day of July, 1962, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the "Association") of the one part and the Director of Child Welfare of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Director") of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed in the classifications described in clause 4 hereof in the Child Welfare Institution Service and shall apply to officers seconded by the Director to the subsidised institutions included in the Second Schedule to the Child Welfare Act, 1947-

3.—Basic Rate Interpretation.

In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of-

- (a) male officers employed in the metropolitan area—the nearest pound (£) to the result obtained by multiplying the male basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th);
- (b) male officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared—the nearest pound (£) to the result obtained by multiplying the basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

4.—Definitions.

(a) The term "Staff Officer" shall mean and include an officer who has graduated from an "Institution Officers' Training Scheme" who is not placed in charge of other Staff Officers.

(b) The term "Senior Staff Officer" shall mean

an officer who has graduated from an "Institution Officers' Training Scheme" and who is in charge of other Staff Officers, or who is employed full-time on after-care duties.

5.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) The minimum hours for Senior Staff Officers employed on after-care duties shall be forty (40) per week.
- (b) The ordinary working hours of Staff Officers and Senior Staff Officers engaged on manual training instruction shall not exceed forty (40) hours in any one week, to be worked eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (c) Subject to the provisions of subclause (a), the ordinary working hours of Staff Officers and Senior Staff Officers engaged on other than manual training instruction shall not exceed 160 hours in any period of twenty-eight (28) days. Such hours shall be worked in not more than twenty (20) shifts in any roster period and shall, where practicable, be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours' duration.

6.—Salary Margins.

The following salary margins shall apply to officers:-

Staff Officer—£407-443-479-515-Senior Staff Officer—£623-677. -£407-443-479-515-569.

The foregoing rates include allowances for shift and week-end work and for work performed on public holidays.

The salary for Senior Staff Officers employed on after-care duties shall be deemed to cover all incidence of employment.

7.—Marginal Allowance.

All officers covered by this Agreement shall be paid marginal allowances similar to those applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904-

8.—Variations of Salary Rates.

The various salary rates expressed herein shall be automatically varied to conform to any variations which are made from time to time in the equivalent salary rates applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904-1950. Any such variation shall apply from the date that the variations have been effected in respect to officers employed under the Public Service Act, 1904-1950.

9.—Overtime.

All time worked with the approval of the Director of Child Welfare in excess of the ordinary daily hours as rostered for any shift shall be classed as overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. If an officer hours and double time thereafter. If an officer is called back on a rostered day off, he shall be paid for the time so worked at overtime rates.

10.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, efficiency and diligence, officers shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of their respective classes by annual increments.

11.—Higher Duties Allowance.

An officer called upon to relieve a Senior Officer will not be entitled to the salary of the senior position unless the period of relief exceeds seven (7) days. If the period of relief continues beyond seven (7) days, an allowance being the difference between the salary of the position relieved and the salary of the officer concerned shall be paid from the commencement of the relieving period.

12.—Long Service Leave.

- 1. All employees covered by this Agreement shall become entitled to thirteen (13) weeks' long service leave-

 - (a) after a period of ten (10) years' continuous service in a full-time capacity; and (b) after each further period of seven (7) years' continuous service in a full-time capacity.
- 2. The conditions under which the foregoing leave shall be granted shall be those applying to Government wages employees under the State Government Wages Employees' Long Service Leave Regulations.

13.—Annual Leave.

Every officer covered by this Agreement shall be entitled to four (4) weeks' leave on full pay for each twelve (12) months' service.

14.—Sick Leave.

- (a) An officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall as soon as possible advise his superior officer in sufficient time to enable arrangements to be made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave leave.
- (b) An officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will resume duty, to enable any necessary arrangements to be made.

- (c) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate, provided that if for any cause it is inconvenient for an officer to obtain a medical certificate which would allow him to be granted sick leave, such officer may have short leave granted to him by the employer, such period to be deducted from the three (3) days per annum which may be granted under clause 15 of this Award or from his annual leave.
- (d) An officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown on the first certificate shall thereupon furnish a further certificate and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the period respectively covered by such certificates.
- (e) The employer, on receipt of an application for leave of absence on account of illness and supported by a certificate of a registered medical practitioner, may require a further certificate from a Government Medical Officer. If in the opinion of the employer this further certificate does not endorse the certificate of the medical practitioner, the officer shall pay the fee due to the Government Medical Officer.
- (f) The basis of determining the leave which may be granted shall be ascertained by crediting officers with the following periods, such leave to be cumulative:-

- (i) Such sick leave as has accrued to the officer's credit shall remain to such officer's credit. On completion of the balance of the period required to complete a further twelve (12) months' service 10 On completion of each additional twelve (12) months' ser-10 •..• • • • • • (ii) On date of appointment 5 On completion of six (6) months' service On completion of twelve (12) months' service 10 On completion of each additional twelve (12) months' service •...•
- (g) Where an officer has been granted fourteen (14) months' continuous leave with pay he shall not be entitled to receive further leave with pay until he has completed a period of duty of not less than four (4) weeks.
- (h) The maximum period allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed nine (9) months on full pay and five (5) months on half pay.
- (i) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause, except under such special circumstances as may be approved by the employer.
- (j) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by misconduct of the officer or by circumstances within his control.
- (k) The employer, in order to satisfy himself in any case, may send a registered medical practitioner to attend on and examine the officer at his residence and if the report of the practitioner is, in the opinion of the employer, not favourable to the application of the officer concerned, the fee payable to the practitioner shall be deducted from any money which is or becomes payable to the said officer by the employer.
- (1) Where in the discharge of his duties, an officer sustains injuries which would be compensative in accordance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act and which necessitates the granting of leave under this Award, half the period only of such leave on full pay and/or half pay respectively shall be charged against his sick leave entitlements or sick leave credits as the case may be.

15.—Short Leave.

- (a) The employer may, on sufficient cause being shown, grant an officer leave of absence not exceeding two (2) days, but all such periods of leave shall be properly recorded and, at the discretion of the employer, shall or shall not be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated leave.
- (b) Provided that if the leave granted under subclause (a) hereof exceeds three (3) days in any one (1) year, the excess shall be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated leave.

16.—Termination of Service.

Except in the case of summary dismissal for misconduct, one (1) month's written notice shall be given by the Director to any officer whose services are no longer required and no officer shall leave the service of the Director without giving one (1) month's previous notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Director: Provided that the Director or the employee may pay one (1) month's pay in lieu of such notice.

17.—Maintenance of Salaries.

Nothing in this Agreement shall lower the rate of salary any officer was receiving at the coming into operation of this Agreement.

18.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate on and from the 1st day of February, 1962, and shall remain in force thereafter for a period of three (3) years: Provided that either party to this Agreement may after the twelve (12) months negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Court of Arbitration for an amendment to this Agreement.

- (a) In this clause the term "Unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of the industrial union of workers party to this Award
- (b) In engaging or dismissing labour, preference of employment shall be given to unionists provided that such unionists are adequately experienced in the class of work to be performed and are otherwise competent to perform the work; provided further that it shall be a defence on the part of an employer charged with engaging a worker other than a "Unionist" when a "Unionist" was available for such engagement, that the employer having made enquiries from the appropriate union did not know that any "Unionist" competent to perform the class of work involved was available.
- (c) Any worker whose application for membership of the Union has been refused shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar have the same rights under this clause as a "Unionist."
- (d) Subject to subclause (e) hereof, workers who are not "Unionists" shall within seven days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause by an accredited representative of the applicant Union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award.
 - (e) Exemptions:
 - (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth, (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.
 - (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption, and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (d).
 - (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—
 - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;
 - (b) if the employee objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union; and
 - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.
 - (iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall within seven days of the decision make application for membership of the applicant Union and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award.
- (f) No employer shall, while to his knowledge adequately experienced unionists competent to perform the class of work required are available, retain in his employment any
