WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the 22nd day of November, 1939, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 29 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

A firebreak, six feet wide, shall be cleared one chain from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and homesteads by the 15th November, 1962, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack shall be cleared of all inflammable material by the 15th December, 1962.

Townsites.

On or before the 15th December, 1962, all town lots within the shire are required to be cleared of all debris of inflammable nature and maintained free of such material.

If it is impracticable for any reason to complete the clearing of firebreaks by the dates required by this notice, application must be made in writing to the Upper Blackwood Shire Council not later than the 31st October, 1962, for permission to complete breaks by a later date. - (1) All main roads.
- (2) Cunderdin-Quairading Road.(3) Cunderdin-Wyalkatchem Road.
- (4) Cunderdin-Minnivale Road.
- (5) Meckering-Dowerin Road. (6) Meckering-Goomalling Road.
- (7) Meckering-York Road.

TOWN OF BUNBURY.

Town Planning Scheme No. 4.

THE Bunbury Town Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961, hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme primarily for the purpose of Road Development within the District of the Town of Bunbury but also for the purposes of the other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. The Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Town of Bunbury Town Planning Scheme No. 4 (hereinafter called "the Scheme") and shall come into operation on the publication of the Minister's approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the district of the Town of Bunbury which land is set out in the maps in the First and Second Schedules hereto which maps have been countersigned by the Mayor of the Town of Bunbury and copies of which are available for inspection by the public free of charge at the following places:—

The offices of the Bunbury Town Council at Bunbury.

The offices of the Town Planning and Development Department, 33 Mount Street, Perth.

3. The Responsible Authority for carrying out this Scheme is the Council of the Town of Bunbury.

Arrangement of Scheme.

4. This Planning Scheme is divided into the following parts and schedules:—

Part I—Preliminary.

Part II—Application of Scheme.

Schedules:

First Schedule—Land Use Map (Annotated Map No. 1) which is identical to the Land Use Map No. 1 for the Town of Bunbury Town Planning Scheme No. 3.

Second Schedule—Planning Scheme Map (Annotated Map No. 2 (as exhibited) Map No. 3 (as approved).

Interpretation.

- 5. In this Scheme unless the context otherwise indicates—
 - "Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961;
 - "approved date" means the date on which the notice of the approval of this Planning Scheme is published in the Government Gazette:
 - "building" includes any structure and any part thereof fixed moveable or otherwise permanent or temporary;
 - "Minister" means the Minister for Town Planning:
 - "non-conforming use" means the use of land which though lawful immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Scheme is not in conformity with the provisions of the zone or reserve within which such use is located.

PART II.—APPLICATION OF SCHEME. Road Design Reserve.

6. The land coloured pink on the map in the Second Schedule hereto and indicated as such in the legend to such map is known as the Road Design Reserve and subject to the provisions of clause 7 hereof the use of any land within this Reserve for any purpose other than roadways and ancillary uses is hereby prohibited.

Non-Conforming Use.

7. Until the land within this Scheme or any part thereof is required for use by the Responsible Authority for roadways and ancillary uses this Planning Scheme shall not preclude continuance of the non-conforming use of any land or building which was lawfully used immediately before the approved date. Provided that no new buildings, extension of buildings or subdivision of land on any of the land within the said Reserve shall be carried out without the written permission of the Responsible Authority first had and obtained.

Acquisition of Land.

- 8. The Responsible Authority may for the purpose of this Scheme and subject to the provisions of the Act with the consent of the Governor compulsorily acquire any land comprised within the Road Design Reserve. Provided that this clause shall not apply to the following lands:—
 - (a) Part Leschenault Location 26, Lot 270, Plan 2954.
 - (b) Part Leschenault Location 26, Lot 19, Plan 803.
- 9. The Responsible Authority may for the purpose of this Scheme purchase any land or part thereof within the Road Design Reserve from any persons willing to sell the same. In the event of any owner of land within such Reserve demanding that the Responsible Authority shall purchase such of his land or any part thereof as shall be within the reserve and if so directed by the Minister then the Responsible Authority shall immediately purchase the same from such person. Provided that for the purpose of this clause in any zone within the District of the Town of Bunbury set aside for residential purposes where new subdivision would require road access as a charge to the subdivider, only that portion of land within the Road Design Reserve required beyond the normal width pursuant to such new subdivision shall be purchased.
- 10. For the purposes of clauses 8 and 9 hereof the purchase price for such land shall be agreed between the Responsible Authority and the owner

thereof and, in default of agreement, the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1902-1945, relating to payments for compulsory acquisition of land

Proposed Closure of Roads.

- (i) The roads or parts thereof shown by symbol black hatch on road reserves on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map are hereby closed or stopped up and all rights-of-way and other easements to which the same are subject are hereby artinguished. extinguished.
- (ii) Notwithstanding anything contained in subclause (i) of this clause in relation to any road or roads which at the approved date forms or form the only means of access to any land, the Responsible Authority shall, until either alternative access is available or access is no longer required, permit the use of such road or roads for the purposes of such access.
- (iii) The Responsible Authority shall make such arrangements and agreements as are necessary for the removal of any service installations, and fixtures which may have been lawfully laid over, on or under, such road or roads.
- (iv) Save as is provided in subclause (ii) of this clause, land forming a closed road shall not be used for any purpose other than an access way for abutting owners or in accordance with the use pertaining to the zone or reserve indicated by the underlying colour or symbol on the map in the Second Schedule.

Compensation.

12. Claims for compensation by reason of this Scheme, other than for the purposes of clauses 8 and 9 hereof, shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these provisions are first published in the Government Gazette.
