Australian Public Service Fellowships.

THE Harkness Fellowships for education and travel in the United States are offered in different categories to candidates from the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and Western Europe.

2. In Australia, up to three Public Service Fellowships are offered in open competition each year to outstanding men and women holding appointments under the Commonwealth and State Governments of Australia.

3. A candidate must be qualified by education and experience to carry out a definite scheme of advanced study, research or inquiry related to a problem which is of importance to the candidate's Government and can be investigated to special advantage in the United States. Probationers or junior officers desiring elementary grounding or University degrees are not eligible for these Fellowships.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954-1958.

(Section 33.)

Mundaring Shire Council.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Mundaring.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1958, you are hereby required on or before the 31st day of October, 1962, to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or otherwise clear firebreaks on or to remove inflammable material from land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following:—

(1) On land not exceeding one acre in area:—

(a) Where a residence has not been erected on the land and the land has not been cleared of scrub and fallen timber, then all inflammable material with the exception of standing trees, shall be removed from the whole of the land.

(b) Where a residence has not been erected on the land but the land has been developed by clearing of scrub and fallen timber, a firebreak, three feet wide, shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

(c) Where a residence has been erected on the land, all buildings shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet from the perimeter of the buildings and a firebreak three feet wide, shall be cleared inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

(2) On land exceeding one acre in area:—

(a) Where a residence has not been erected on the land and the land has not been cleared of scrub and fallen timber, two firebreaks each six feet in width and half chain apart, shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

(b) Where a residence has not been erected on the land, but the land has been developed by general clearing of scrub and fallen timber, a firebreak not less than six feet wide, shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and

along the whole of the boundaries of the land, and any buildings erected on the land shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings.

- (c) Where a residence has been erected on the land, then all buildings shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings and a firebreak not less than six feet wide shall be cleared inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, the approval of the Council or its duly authorised officer must be obtained to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

The removal of all inflammable material, with the exception of standing trees between the boundary of the property and any constructed road bounding the property shall be deemed to be a sufficient firebreak for that boundary in lieu of firebreaks required in paragraphs 1 (b), 1 (c), 2 (b) and 2 (c) above.
