WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, that, except to the extent which the Governor declares by proclamation pursuant to the provisions of that section, all fauna is wholly protected throughout the whole of the State of Western Australia at all times and that the Governor may from time to time declare that any of the fauna is not protected; and whereas it is further enacted by that section that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, vary the provisions and operation of a Proclamation promulgated pursuant to the power conferred upon him by that section by cancelling those provisions and that operation wholly or in part and substituting other provisions

and their operation for those so cancelled; and whereas by a Proclamation dated the 4th July, 1962, the Lieutenant-Governor declared, *inter alia*, that the fauna described in the Schedule to that Proclamation not protected; and whereas it is now deemed advisable that all the fauna, described in the Schedule to this Proclamation be not protected: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and pursuant to the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby—

- (a) cancel the Proclamation dated the 4th July, 1962;
- (b) declare that the fauna described in the schedule to this Proclamation shall be not protected.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests 150/58, Lands 1027/25.

(a) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the westernmost corner of Avon Location 24446, a point on the Goldfields Watershed boundary, and extending generally north-easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 21581; thence southerly to the north-eastern corner of that location; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and westerly along the southern boundary of location 24446 aforesaid to the starting point.

(c) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the Goldfields Watershed boundary situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of the south-western severance of Avon Location 13376, and extending generally north-westerly and easterly along that watershed boundary to the 61-mile post; thence 103 degrees 53 minutes 27 chains 10 and three-tenths links, 87 degrees 30 minutes 20 chains 64 and six-tenths links, 107 degrees 30 minutes 28 chains 83 and three-tenths links along that watershed boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 17530; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of the north-western severance of location 13376 aforesaid; thence southerly to and along that boundary to the northern boundary of location 12289; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location and southerly along the western boundary of the south-western severance of location 13376 aforesaid to its south-western corner; and thence westerly to the starting point.

Limited to change its name before complying with the requirements of that Part of the Act and is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by proviso (a) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1961, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filing from General Constructions Pty. Limited the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.
