WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1961, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided and should be entered and departed from at specified places only, he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accord-ingly and that if of opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may, by Proclamation, proclaim the controlled access road and the places only at which the controlled access road and the places only at which the controlled access road may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided as hereinafter described and has made a recommendation to the Covernor accordingly; and whereas I than to the Governor accordingly; and whereas I, the Governor of the said State, am of opinion that such recommendation should be given effect:
Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with
the advice and consent of the Executive Council,

Traffic Act, 1919-1961. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Police T.O. 59/580.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 71 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1961, that the Act applies, inter alia, to persons and vehicles in the public service of the Crown, or of any local authority, but does not apply to any vehicle or class of vehicle or person or class of person to the extent of such exemption as may from time to time be declared by the Governor by Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 71 of the Act, doth hereby declare that the class of vehicle specified in the schedule hereto is exempt from the operation of all regulations in force and made from time to time under the provisions of the Act relating to brakes, lamps and lighting equipment except those regulations relating to any reflector or reflectors with which a vehicle is required to be equipped when used on a road.

Forests Act, 1918-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 574/61, L. and S. 543/45.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 1st day of November, 1961, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 29 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Shire of Boddington.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Boddington.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 15th day of November, 1962, to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear of all inflammable material firebreaks, as set out hereunder, on the land owned or occupied by you, and thereafter to maintain the firebreak clear of all inflammable material.
