- (a) In this clause the term "Unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of the industrial union of workers party to this Award.
- (b) Any worker whose application for membership of the Union has been refused shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar have the same rights under this clause as a "Unionist".
- (c) Subject to subclause (d) hereof workers who are not "Unionists" shall, within seven days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause by an accredited representative of the applicant Union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award. Workers who are unfinancial members of the industrial union of workers party to this Award shall become and maintain financial membership whilst employed by any respondent to the Award.

#### (d) Exemptions:-

- (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.
- (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (c).
- (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—
  - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial Union;
  - (b) if the employee objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union; and
  - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.

That Award No. 44 of 1948, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in accordance with the attached schedule.

Workers who are unfinancial members of the industrial union of workers party to this Award shall become and maintain financial membership whilst employed by any respondent to the Award.

### (d) Exemptions:—

- (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth, (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.
- (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven days of the applicant's reason of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause
- (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable-
  - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;
  - (b) if the employee objects on the grounds of conscienti-ous religious belief to be-coming a member of any industrial union; and
  - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.
- (iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall within seven days of the decision make application for membership of the applicant Union and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award spondent to this Award.

# (Registered 21st August, 1962.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 15th day of August, 1962, between The Western Australian Grain Handling Staff Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") of the one part and Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Employer") of the other part witnesseth that for the considerations hereafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

#### 3.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the whole of the State of Western Australia.

#### 4.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to Professional Executive and Technical Personnel employed by the employer as described in Schedule "A".

## 5.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

### 6.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided the contract of service shall be terminable by not less than one (1) month's notice on either side given on any day or if such notice is not given by the payment of one month's salary in the case of the employer, or the forfeiture of one month's salary in the case of a worker
- (b) The contract of service for workers on probation shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture of one (1) week's salary as the case may be.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss a worker for misconduct when wages will be payable to the time of dismissal only.
- (d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or by any Union affiliated with it.

# 7.—Salaries.

(a) Basic Wage:

Per Week £ s. d.

- (i) Within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth .... 14 18 9
- (ii) Outside a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, but within the South-West Land Division
- 14 17 3 14 11 7 (iii) Rest of the State
- (b) (i) The basic wage per annum shall be ascertained by multiplying the basic wage per week as declared by the Court of Arbitration from time to time by 52½ to the nearest pound.
- (ii) For the purpose of adjustment and payment the weekly salary shall be calculated as six three hundred and thirteenths (6/313ths) of the annual salary, the fortnightly salary as double the weekly salary and the monthly salary and the sala and the monthly salary as one-twelfth (1/12th) of the annual salary.
- (c) The minimum annual salaries shall be the annual basic wage plus the annual margin as set out in Schedule A hereto.

### 8.—Payment of Salaries.

Salaries shall be paid in cash or by cheque, at least weekly or monthly as nominated by the worker in accordance with existing practices.

#### 9.-Hours.

- (a) Except as provided herein, the ordinary hours of work shall be forty (40) per week to be worked in five days of eight (8) hours Monday to Friday inclusive, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., provided that where at the date of this Agreement, the hours usually and customarily worked were less than forty (40) per week such lesser hours shall continue to be observed as ordinated. lesser hours shall continue to be observed as ordin-
- (b) Terminal staff shall be paid for at least eight hours of duty on each day Monday to Friday inclusive and shall attend for duty at such hours as determined by the employer.
- (c) Workers required to travel regularly in the performance of their duties shall have no fixed hours of duty, but the total number of hours on duty per fortnight shall not exceed eighty (80) hours inclusive of travelling time.
- (d) (i) Subject to Clause 10 a worker may be required to work beyond the hours herein prescribed due to the exigencies of the employer's business, and shall therefore work in accordance with such requirements, but a worker specified in subclause (c) hereof shall not be kept away from his regular place of residence for more than nineteen (19) days.
- (ii) Any worker shall be deemed to be required to work on any hours actually worked unless he is directed not to work such hours by his superior officer.

## 10.—Overtime.

- (a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided all work performed outside of the hours prescribed in Clause 9 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first three hours and double time thereafter.
- (ii) All time worked between midnight and the usual starting time on Monday to Friday inclusive shall be paid at the rate of double time up to the usual starting time, but employees called upon to start work within an hour of the usual starting time shall be paid at time and a half until the usual starting time.
- (iii) All time worked on Saturdays or Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (iv) Where overtime commences more than one hour after the usual finishing time or ceases more than one hour before the usual starting time a four hour minimum shall apply.
- (v) For the purpose of assessing overtime each day shall stand alone.
- (vi) Where the employer and the worker agree time off equivalent to the overtime worked or part thereof may be allowed in lieu of payment at overtime rates.

(b) Terminal staff shall be paid for time worked in recognised ordinary hours (or between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. if there are no recognised ordinary hours) at ordinary rates and for time worked outside such hours at rates as set out in subclause (a) hereof.

Provided that where the employer and worker agree time off equivalent to time worked in excess of eight hours per day may be allowed in lieu of payment at overtime rates.

- (c) A worker specified in subclause (c) of clause 9 shall be paid for time worked in excess of eighty hours per fortnight at time and a half provided that where the employer and worker agree time off equivalent to time worked in excess of eighty hours per fortnight may be allowed annually in lieu of payment of overtime.
- (d) Nothing herein shall be deemed to require the payment of a higher rate than double time.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause no worker in receipt of a margin of or in excess of £728 per annum or in the case of Terminal Staff £1,200 per annum shall be entitled to payment of overtime or time off in lieu of payment for overtime.
- (f) The existing overtime allowance to Country Grain Handling Supervisors is to cease.

### 11.—Acting in Higher Grade.

A worker solely engaged for four (4) weeks or more on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate while so engaged provided that this clause shall not apply when a worker is relieving a worker who is on annual leave.

#### 12.—Travelling Time.

- (a) A worker in receipt of a margin of less than £728 per annum whose duties do not normally include travelling shall, when required to travel outside his normal working hours, be credited with ordinary time equivalent to the time spent in such travelling less eight hours in every twenty-four (24) hour period if sleeping berth provided.
- (b) Time so credited if not allowed off within one month from the time it accrued in accordance with subclause (a) hereof, shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in this clause, time spent in travelling between 15th October and 15th February may be adjusted within one (1) month of 15th February.

#### 13.—Travelling Allowance.

When a worker is required to travel away from home on the employer's business he shall be entitled to a refund from the employer of expenses actually and reasonably incurred for such travelling and board and/or lodging.

# 14.—Transfer Allowance.

- (a) Where a worker is transferred from one locality to another reasonably involving a change of residence he shall-
  - (i) be paid all costs of removal actually and reasonably incurred;
  - (ii) be paid for a period of three months the difference in rental actually incurred between the accommodation vacated and the new home or if the worker owns accommodation between the rental value of the accommodation vacated and the new accommodation. Provided that where, in the employer's opinion, the rental actually incurred for the new accommodation is not reasonable, the employer shall pay such lesser sum as he deems reason-
- (b) Where a worker with dependants is transferred from one locality to another to suit the convenience of the employer and at which no suitable accommodation is available, he shall if the transfer involves the dependants be paid such

reasonable accommodation expenses actually incurred until such time as suitable accommodation is available or for a period of six (6) months, whichever shall be the shorter.

- (c) Where a worker is temporarily transferred from one locality to another, to the extent that daily travel to and from the job is impracticable but the transfer does not reasonably involve a change of residence, travelling allowance shall be made for return home at regular intervals of not more than three weeks.
- (d) Where a worker is temporarily transferred from one place of employment to another in the same locality, he shall be paid travelling time in excess of one (1) hour per day at ordinary rates for all time spent in excess of that time usually occupied in travelling between his residence and his preceding place of employment and shall be paid fares actually and reasonably incurred in excess of those normally incurred in travelling between his residence and his preceding place of employment.
- (e) Where a worker is permanently transferred from one place of employment to another in the same locality, the company shall give all possible notice of the projected change. In the event of no notice being given or of the notice given being for less than one month, the provisions of the previous subclause shall apply for one month.

#### 15.—Dirty Work.

Workers engaged in work or in direct supervision of work alongside or in similar cirumstances to men for which or for whom the respective Award or Agreement provides an allowance for dirt or dust shall be paid an allowance in keeping with the comparable Award or Agreement. Such allowance shall not—

- (a) Be payable to Terminal Superintendents or Assistant Terminal Superintendents.
- (b) Be computed as wages or salary in the case of overtime.

# 16.—Meal Allowance.

A worker required to continue his work into overtime hours for more than two (2) hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) for a meal.

No such payments need be made to a worker living in the same locality as his place of employment who returns home for such meals.

## 17.—Camp and Away from Home Allowance.

Workers not entitled to travelling allowances or whose duties require or compel them to camp shall be paid an allowance of seventeen shillings (17s.) per day for tent or hut camping and twelve shillings (12s.) per day for caravan camping for each day so required or compelled to camp including Saturdays and Sundays and holidays if required or compelled to be in camp on such days and on the working days immediately preceding and succeeding such days.

#### 18.—Holidays.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall except as provided herein be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Easter Tuesday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties, in lieu of any of the days named in the subclause.
- (b) Where Christmas Day, Boxing Day or New Year's Day fall on a Sunday and where Christmas Day or New Year's Day fall on a Saturday such holiday or holidays shall be observed on the next succeeding working day or days which shall be deemed a holiday or holidays without deduction of pay in lieu of the days named.

(c) If a worker is required by the employer to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or be taken at some subsequent date where the worker so agrees.

#### 19.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payments of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer in respect of each of the first seven years of continuous service.
- (b) A worker who has completed seven years' continuous service on the permanent staff shall be allowed a period of three (3) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed after each further period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (c) If any holiday prescribed in clause 18 (a) hereof falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (d) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth ( $\frac{1}{6}$ ) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

In the case of workers entitled to the period of annual leave prescribed in subclause (b) hereof, the proportionate entitlement shall be at the rate of one-quarter  $(\frac{1}{4})$  of a week's pay in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

- (e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (f) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (d) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (g) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.
- (h) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer and the worker, annual leave may be taken in not more than two periods.

## 20.-Sick Leave.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-sixth (\frac{1}{6}) of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to two (2) weeks' pay in each year of service. Provided further that a worker with at least two (2) years of service shall be entitled to payment for sickness up to one-third (\frac{1}{3}) of a week for each completed month of service, with a limit of four (4) weeks' pay in each year of service.
- (b) In the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each year of service or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer.
- (c) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

- (d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (e) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (f) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of five (5) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (g) Any worker shall, if so directed, present himself for examination by a medical officer selected by the employer at such time and place as shall be fixed and the payment of sick leave shall be made on the basis of such examination.
- (h) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to payment under this Clause.

# 21.—Protective Clothing.

The employer shall provide suitable protective clothing for the protection of a worker's clothing where it is reasonable to assume that clothes will be necessarily unduly soiled or injured by the nature of the work done.

#### 22.—Appointments and Promotions.

At least two weeks' notice of all vacancies and new positions shall be given in the employer's "Weekly Bulletin" showing the salary and conditions relating to the position.

# 23.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Agreement:—
  - (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them.
  - (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (d) The provisions of Regulation 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961 shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

# 24.—Union Notices.

The employer shall allow Union Notices approved by the General Manager and a copy of the Agreement if supplied by the Union to be posted up in a place accessible to the workers in a place or places approved by the General Manager.

# 25.—Interviewing Staff.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the General Manager, more than once in any one (1) week.

#### 26.—Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked, and the salaries and allowances paid. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours.

# 27.—No Reduction.

No worker shall, as a result of this Agreement suffer any reduction in salary which he was receiving on the date of the operation of this Agreement

### 28.—First Aid Equipment.

Adjacent to each working area, a first aid kit shall be set aside for the treatment of illness or injuries. The first aid area and equipment shall be related to the nature of the work undertaken and the number of men employed, and the distance from medical facilities.

### 29.-Equipment.

All instruments, tools, equipment and reference books necessary for the proper and efficient discharge of duties shall be provided by the Company.

### 30.—Long Service Leave.

# (a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

#### (b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the 24th December, 1958 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.
- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was a worker of the transmittor in that business becomes a worker of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.
- (ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
  - (4) Such service shall include-
    - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
    - (b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment;
    - (c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any Agreement in respect of annual leave;
    - (d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
      - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of

Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

- (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
- (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—  $\,$ 
  - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
  - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
  - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer:
  - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law:
  - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
  - (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
  - (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination:
  - (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
  - (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

#### (c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—
  - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
  - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
  - (a) by his death;
  - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
  - (i) by his death; or
  - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
  - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

#### (d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay appliacable to him at the date he commences such leave;
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Agreement, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;
  - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
    - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
    - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

#### (e) Taking Leave.

- - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or

times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—
  - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
  - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
  - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

# (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought in to Account.

- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a

proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

#### (g) Records to be Kept.

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the time and wages record.

# (h) Special Board of Reference.

- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—  $\,$ 
  - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
  - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

#### (i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 24th December, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

Margin Over

#### (j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its workers where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the workers of that employer than the provisions hereof.

#### (k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this agreement to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.
