Water Board Act, 1904-1954.

Busselton Water Board—Proposed Loan of £6,600.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 6/39.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, a Water Board may, with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, of the Busselton Water Board borrowing the sum of six thousand six hundred pounds (£6,600), for a period of 15 years, repayable by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments with interest at the rate of five pounds ten shillings (£5 10s.) per centum per annum for the work approved by Order in Council dated the 23rd August, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th September, 1962, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the 1st day of May, 1963.

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1959.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1959, it is provided (*inter alia*) that the Governor may, by Order in Council—

- (a) establish special courts to be called Children's Courts and determine the area in and for which each court shall exercise jurisdiction, by reference to magisterial districts;

- (b) appoint, as special magistrates, magistrates or persons who may from time to time, temporarily or otherwise, be assigned to or occupying the office or performing the duties of a magistrate assigned to one or more magisterial districts; and
- (c) appoint such persons, male or female, as he thinks fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth—

- (a) establish a special court to be called a Children's Court at Wundowie, to exercise jurisdiction in and for the area known as the Avon Magisterial District; and
- (b) appoint—
- (i) Bernard Matthew O'Sullivan, Stipendiary Magistrate, Northam, to be a special magistrate for; and
- (ii) Roy Cecil Healy, Reginald Charles Hogg, Kenneth Arnold Hunter and Frank James McMullen, all of Wundowie, to be members of,
- the Children's Court at Wundowie.
