## F.D. 49/49, Ex. Co. No. 2289.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:-

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of 22nd December, 1962, to 30th April, 1963, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks defined in the Third Schedule hereto in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the shires specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the excep-tion of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of 23rd December, 1962, to 30th April, 1963, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks defined in the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exception of those areas defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (4) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (5) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than by a shotgun.

## General Areas.

- (a) All municipalities and townsites in the South-West Land Division.

#### Busselton Shire-

- (i) The whole of the waters of Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (k) The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 20 chains of its banks.
- (I) The whole of Reserves 3872 and 3876 (Public Utilities) in the Broadwater.

## Capel Shire-

(m) All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling bridges and all land within 20 chains of the river's bank.

## Dandaragan Shire-

(n) The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 80 chains of its shores.

#### Dumbleyung Shire—

(o) All that portion of the Coblinino River downstream from the eastern side of the bridge at the junction of road 3375 and road 323 (Oxley Road) to its mouth at the high-water mark of Dumbleyung Lake and all land within 20 chains of that part of the river's banks.

## Gingin Shire-

- (p) The whole of the waters of Lakes Nam-bung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (q) The whole of Swan Location 2340, including Wallering Swamp.

## Harvey Shire-

- (r) All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn south-east from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 20 chains of the included foreshores.
- (s) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

## Mandurah Shire-

(t) The whole of the area within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.

(u) The whole of the waters of Lake Leschen-aultia and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.

## Murray Shire-

(v) All that portion of the Serpentine River from road 8629 at the southern end of Goegrup (Willies) Lake to Peel Inlet near the Old Mill and all the land within 20 chains of the river banks.

Rockingham Shire-

(w) The whole of the Shire of Rockingham.

#### Toodyay Shire-

- (x) All that portion of the Avon River in the Toodyay District, between the northern boundary of Avon Location 3 and a point opposite road number 2069, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (y) All that portion of the Avon River from Dumbarton Bridge to the Railway Bridge, north of Toodyay and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.

#### Upper Blackwood Shire-

(z) The whole of the area within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Boyup

(aa) The whole of the Yanchep Caves Reserve.

#### Wickepin Shire-

(ab) The whole of the waters of Lake Yealering and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

(ac) The whole of the waters of Wardering Lake and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts tion, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Kalamunda Fire District which district is referred to in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the Darling Range Road District set out in column two of the said part opposite that fire district that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Kalamunda (the former Darling Range Road District) described and set out in the schedule to this Order in Council.

side of Glyde Road (road number 6852); thence generally westerly along southern sides of Glyde Road (road numbers 6852 and 7412) and onwards to and along the southern boundary of Kalamunda Townsite Lot 360 and again onwards to the southeastern corner of lot 176; thence northerly, northeasterly and westerly along boundaries of that lot to its north-western corner; thence northerly to and along the western boundary of lot 177 and on-wards to the southern boundary of lot 180 (Reserve 23383); thence generally westerly along that boundary and the southern boundaries of lot 179 (Reserve 24240) to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lot and onwards to the south-eastern corner of lot 102 of Canning Location 579 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3609; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that lot to the south-western corner of location 259; thence northerly along the western boundaries of that location and of locations 80 and 422 to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence northerly to and along the westernmost boundary of location 929 and onwards to the south-ern boundary of location 244; thence westerly, northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the south-western corner of location 398; thence northerly along the easternmost eastern boundary of Swan Location 1394, the eastern boundary of lot 47 of Canning Location 437, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2551 to the northeastern corner of that lot; thence north-northeastern corner of that lot; thence north-north-westerly to the south-eastern corner of lot 20 of that location; thence northerly and westerly along boundaries of that lot to the south-eastern corner of Swan Location 4141; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the southern side of Kalamunda Road (road number 1844); thence generally westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western side of Gray Road; thence northerly along that side and onwards to the northern side of Mead Road (road number 6273); thence generally eastroad troad number 6273); thence generally easterly along that side to the western boundary of lot 1 of location 331, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 6544; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the south-western corner of location 1378; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location to its north-western corner; thence north-wortherly along the western boundary of that location to its north-western corner; thence north-north-easterly to the western corner of lot 19 of location 1763 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4551; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of that lot and of lots 20 to 23 inclusive and onwards to a point situate west of the north-western corner of lot 2 of Kalamunda Townsite Lot 185 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 4676; thence east to the western side of William Street: thence generally north-easterly along that Street; thence generally north-easterly along that side and the western side of Lascelles Parade to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern side of Jessie Street aforesaid and thence easterly to and along that side and onwards to the starting point.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Perth is desirous, under the by-law making power conferred by section 193 of the Local Government Act, 1960, of making by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in the sea adjoining though outside its district for a distance of two hundred (200) yards from low water mark at ordinary spring tides; and whereas it is enacted by subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of that section, that such by-laws may be made only pursuant to an order made under subsection (8) of section 190 of the Act; and whereas it is enacted by the subsection lastmentioned, that where in the opinion of the Governor a by-law making power conferred

by the Act on a council should be extended to an area which is outside the district, the Governor may by order declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the power the area is to be regarded as being within the district and that the council may exercise the power in respect of the area as if in fact it were within the district; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that the said by-law making power should be extended to the said area outside the district of the said Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the powers conferred by subsection (8) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the said by-law making power an area which is outside the district of the Shire of Perth, namely, the area which adjoins that district and extends for a distance of two hundred (200) yards seaward from low water mark at ordinary spring tides is to be regarded as being within the district of the Shire of Perth and that the Council of the Shire of Perth may make bylaws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in respect of that area as if in fact it were within the municipal district of the Shire of Perth.
