WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 2 of the Royal Visit Holiday Act, 1962, that for the purpose of honouring the visit proposed to be paid to this State by Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, in the year Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three (in this Proclamation called "the Royal Visit") the Governor may, by Proclamation, appoint a day to be observed, subject to the provisions of the Act, as a special holiday throughout the whole of the State or appoint different days in respect of different parts of the State for the observance of the special holiday in each of those parts as in his opinion would best enable the persons in that part to observe the occasion of the Royal Visit: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, do hereby cise of the powers conferred by the Act, do hereby appoint each day hereunder specified to be ob-served as a special holiday in that part of the State described immediately following each such day—

Monday, the 18th day of March, 1963, in the municipal district of the Shires of Wynd-ham-East Kimberley; Hall's Creek;

Wednesday, the 20th day of March, 1963, in Cockatoo Island and Koolan Island;

Thursday, the 21st day of March, 1963, in the municipal district of the Shires of Broome; Marble Bar; Nullagine; Port Hedland; West Kimberley, except Cockatoo Island and Koolan Island;

Monday, the 25th day of March, 1963, in the remainder of the State.
