Companies Act, 1961-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Companies Act, 1961-1962, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that section 348 of the Act does not apply to or in relation to a foreign company that is included in a class of companies incorporated under the law of another State, Territory or country, being a class of companies which the Governor has declared, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1962: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Companies Act, 1961-1962, doth hereby declare exempt proprietary companies incorporated under the Companies Act, 1962 (Tasmania), to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1962.

Land Act, 1933-1962. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Local Government Act, 1960. Shire of Perth. Retirement of Councillors. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 186/60.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 41 (7) (a) (iii) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where the total number of Councillors of a Council is not a multiple of three or the number of Councillors

representing a Ward is not three or a multiple of three, as near as practicable to one-third of the total number of Councillors for the district and as near as practicable to one-third of the number of Councillors representing each Ward shall retire from office on the fourth Saturday in May in each year; and whereas it is further provided in section 41 (7) (d) (iv) that where one Ward is or some Wards are represented by only one Councillor and another Ward is or other Wards are represented by Councillors of a number which is not three or a multiple of three, the order of retirement is, *inter alla*, such that as near as practicable to one-third of the total number retires on the fourth Saturday in May of each year; and whereas it is further provided in section 41 (8) of the said Act that where in a district the order of retirement of any member will not be in accordance with the provisions of the section, the Governor may by order declare the date on which that member shall retire; and whereas the Perth Shire Council is represented by 11 Councillors respectively; and whereas the arrangement at present existing for retirement of members is such that there are not a roting in each 1000 and a mether shall there is an ultiple of three and the respective wards are represented by one or two Councillors respectively;

is represented by 11 Councillors which is not a multiple of three and the respective Wards are represented by one or two Councillors respectively; and whereas the arrangement at present existing for retirement of members is such that there are not retiring in each year as near as practicable to one-third of the number of Councillors, the number due for retirement being in respect of 1964 five Councillors and in respect of 1965 two Councillors; and whereas it is considered necessary that the retirements should be brought into conformity with the Act and to that end that the term of office of Herbert Richard Robinson should be extended so that he will retire on the fourth Saturday in May, 1965, instead of in May, 1963, and it is also desirable that the term of office of Neil Campbell Hawkins should be extended so that he also will retire on the fourth Saturday in May, 1965, instead of in May, 1964; now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby declare that the date on which Herbert Richard Robinson and Neil Campbell Hawkins shall retire from office shall be the fourth Saturday in May, 1965.

Western Australia-Port of Fremantle.

Royal Visit, 1963.

Issued under the authority of the Fremantle Harbour Trust and the Naval Officer in Charge, West Australia Area.

1.—General.

During the visit of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh to Western Australia, certain special arrangements for the control of water traffic in the Port of Fremantle will be necessary. These special arrangements are detailed below and the instructions contained therein must be observed by all masters and owners of ships and skippers and owners of small craft.

2.-H.M.Y. "Britannia"-Security Arrangements. (a) Passes Required to Barricaded Area.

During the period Monday, 25th March, 1963, to Wednesday, 27th March, 1963 (inclusive), H.M.Y. to Wednesday, 27th March, 1963 (inclusive), H.M.Y. "Britannia" will be berthed between "B" and "C" Berths, Victoria Quay. The berths will be barri-caded off on the landward side and only those persons having official business in the barricaded area and holding special passes, issued by com-petent authority, will be permitted to pass the barricades or board the yacht.

(b) Approach of Craft Prohibited.

During the period given in (a) above, a prohibited area extending approximately 100 feet to seaward of the Yacht will be established, marked by three red buoys exhibiting a red light during the hours of darkness and patrolled by an armed naval launch. No ship or craft, unless specially authorised to do so by the Naval Officer in Charge, may enter the prohibited area.

3.—Arrival of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh.

(a) Port to be Closed.

(i) The Port of Fremantle will be closed to all movements of shipping from 0600 hours on Mon-day, 25th March, 1963, until 11.15 a.m. on that day. The "Port Closed" signal (three black balls one below the other, and six feet apart), will be hoisted at the Signal Station at 0600 hours and hauled down when the port is re-opened after the H.M.Y. "Britannia" and Naval escort are berthed in the Inner Harbour in the Inner Harbour.

(ii) During this period no ship or craft other than those specially authorised to do so by the Fremantle Harbour Trust or Naval Officer in Charge and small craft taking part in the marine welcome (see paragraph 4 below) may move within the waters of the Port of Fremantle.

(b) Probibited Area in Vicinity of Saluting Battery.

A gun salute will be fired from a battery at the outer extremity of the North Mole as Her Majesty disembarks from the H.M.Y. "Britannia" at 1040 hours. All craft are prohibited from approaching within 200 yards to seaward of the battery from 0900 hours on the 25th March, 1963, until the completion of the salute.

 (c) Ships and Craft to Keep Clear of H.M.Y. "Britannia" and Naval Escort.
 The H.M.Y. "Britannia" and Naval escort will pass the Fairway buoy at 0916 hours proceeding towards the North Meth. towards the North Mole.

No ship or craft is to approach closer than 1,000 feet of H.M.Y. "Britannia" or the Naval escort.

Special separate instructions will be issued to authorised escort craft.

4.-Special Arrangements for Yachts and Small Craft.

Special Notice to be Issued.

Arrangements have been made for a marine welcome to Her Majesty to take place on Monday, 25th March, 1963, with a prior rehearsal. A special notice giving full details of these arrangements will be issued, but the following outline is published for the information of those concerned.

5.—Area Set Apart for Small Craft.

(a) For Small Craft at Anchor.

(i) Between No. 1 Berth North Wharf and No. 2 Berth North Wharf and within a line parallel to the wharf marked by buoys laid 150 feet from the face of the wharf.

(ii) Between the South Mole and the beacon and buoys marking the southern edge of the shipving channel.

(iii) Between the North Mole and the pylons and buoys marking the northern edge of the shipping channel.

(b) For Craft Under Way.

(i) The area to the eastward of an imaginary line drawn from the light tower to the North Mole to the Hall Bank buoy and thence to a position one mile eastward of the Fairway buoy, and thence to the shore, but excluding the prohibited area in the vicinity of the North Mole saluting battery (see paragraph 3 and (b) above).

(ii) The area to the southward of an imaginary line formed by the transit of the light tower and the South Mole and the war memorial extended to a point 261° (true) one to three miles from the light tower and to the westward of an imaginary line drawn from this point northwards to a position one mile west of Hall Bank buoy and thence to a position one mile westward of Fairway buoy.

Note.--In the event of adverse weather being experienced it may be necessary to close certain of the above areas. Instructions in this regard will be given by the patrol craft to all concerned.

6.—Prohibited Area for Ships and Small Craft. From 0600 hours on Monday, 25th March, 1963, until the H.M.Y. "Britannia" and the Naval escort are berthed in the Inner Harbour, the area delineated below is prohibited to ships and small craft other than authorised small craft participating in the marine welcome.

The area enclosed by imaginary lines drawn from the light tower on the North Mole to Hall Bank buoy thence in a northerly direction to a position one mile eastward of Fairway buoy; thence in a of Fairway buoy; thence in a southward direction to a point two miles westward of Hall Bank buoy; thence to a position in distance one mile two and one-half cables westward of the light tower and the North Mole, this line extended, cutting the transit of the South Mole and the war memorial.

7.-Patrol Craft.

Patrol craft (to be distinguished by a white flag with the letter "M" in red in the centre) will patrol the areas allocated to small craft and the prohibition area and instructions issued by the officers in charge of these craft are to be followed by all concerned. The officers in charge are authorised to remove, by force if necessary, any craft failing to carry out instructions.

8.-Craft to be Seaworthy, etc.

All craft taking part in the marine welcome are to be in a seaworthy condition and provided with efficient anchors and ground tackle sufficient for anchoring in 40 feet of water. The officers in charge of patrol craft are authorised to remove any craft considered to be overloaded, or otherwise unseaworthy or without anchors.

9.-Closing of Railway Bridge.

The navigational arches of the Railway Bridge will be closed to all water traffic (other than official craft specially authorised) from 0730 hours until 1115 hours on Monday, 25th March, 1963. All craft from up-river authorised to take part in the marine welcome must clear the navigational arches of the Railway Bridge by 0730 hours.

No other craft will be permitted to pass through the navigational arches of the bridge after 0600 hours.

10.-Dispersal of Small Craft.

At approximately 1100 hours the dispersal signal for small craft (a large black cone from the north yardarm) will be exhibited from the Signal Station.

Small craft will then be required to clear the Inner Harbour and entrance channel as soon as possible.
