WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other powers enabling me in this hebalf proclaim and power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from 1st May, 1963, to 30th April, 1968, inclusive.

## Schedule.

All that portion of Western Australian waters at Geographe Bay within one-quarter of a mile of any part of the Busselton Pier or Jetty.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 23165 (Swan Locations 5287, 5290, 5291, 5293 and 7167) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Mundaring in trust for the purpose of Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Mundaring in trust for Recreation with power to the said Shire of Mundaring, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to

- 2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan No. 1 and on Plan No. 2. The said land is herein referred to as "the area".
- 3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—  $\,$ 
  - (a) to improve and develop the area to the best possible advantage;
  - (b) to make provision for the better use of the land for building purposes;
  - (c) to make provision for traffic in the area;
  - (d) to assist in the development of Morley Drive.
- 4. Acquisition of Land: The land within the area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.
- 5. Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the area:—
  - (a) The area shall be resurveyed in conformity with the design shown on Plan No. 2.
  - (b) The roads coloured yellow on Plan No. 2 shall be constructed and drained.
- 6. New Lots Created by the Survey: The new lots created by the survey shall be dealt with as follows:—
  - (a) The new lots shown in column 1 of the schedule shall be offered to the owners of the old lots shown opposite in column 2 of the schedule. The offer will in all cases be made subject to the owner releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of the acquisition of his land and subject to the payment by him of his proportion of the costs of the Scheme.
  - (b) The new lots that is to say Lot Nos. 203, 208, 209, 210, 211, 212, 213 (House) 218, 219, 226, (hereinafter referred to as surplus lots) may be dealt with by the Council as hereinafter appears.
- 7. Rejected Lots: If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with clause 6 the Council may deal with the lot the subject of the offer in manner hereinafter appearing.

- 8. Sale of Surplus and Rejected Lots: The Council may sell the surplus lots and the rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council shall think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.
- 9. Valuation of Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the surplus lots or the rejected lots ascertain the value of them or of those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.
- 10. Claims for Compensation: In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme, the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto, and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

  - (a) General costs of Scheme shall consist of-

    - (ii) the costs of the works to be carried out.
    - (iii) all other costs and expenses incidental to the implementation of the Scheme.
  - (b) Compensation costs which shall consist of all compensation payable by the Council by reason of the Scheme and any compensation estimated under clause 10 hereof and all costs relative to the assessment or settling of compensation.
  - (c) The costs of acquisition of any land for the purposes of the Scheme other than by resumption.
- 12. The Scheme shall be credited with the net amount received by the Council on the sale of surplus lots and rejected lots or the valuations thereof made under clause 9.
- 13. Apportionment of Costs: In the event of the amounts received or credited by the Council under clause 12 being insufficient to meet the costs of the Scheme the net costs of the Scheme shall be divided by the number of new lots accepted by the owners as aforesaid and each such owner shall pay to the Council that proportion of the net total costs of the Scheme which the number of new lots accepted by him bears to the total of the new lots accepted by the owners as aforesaid.

- (b) Classes and grades beyond a margin of £477 per annum shall be those set out in Schedule A to this Agreement, provided that an officer shall not be eligible for promotion to a position classified above the automatic range or to claim or receive a salary higher than a margin of £477 per annum, until he has passed a promotional examination as determined by the Commissioner from time to time or has acquired equal or higher qualifications as approved by the Commissioner.
- (c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment to the automatic range may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

- (c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (d) an officer shall not be eligible to receive an allowance under this subclause unless he has completed not less than nine years? service in the Clerical Division as an adult permanent officer.

or holds or passes-

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,

and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule C to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (b) of that Schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

(b) Graduates and Associates:

A male adult clerk who holds-

a degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Law of the University of Western Australia; or

an associateship in Commerce, Management, Accounting, Business Administration or Public Administration of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department; or

who holds or passes-

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,

and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule C to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (c) of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

- (c) Payment of an allowance under the provisions of this clause shall cease— either—
  - (i) as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a margin for which no qualifications allowance is provided;

or-

(ii) by the effluxion of a period of 10 years from the date on which the officer first became entitled to payment of an allowance under this clause,

whichever occurs first:

Provided that in the event of (ii) hereof, payment of the allowance shall not cease before the 30th June, 1965.

19.—Fundamental Basis for Determination of Rates of Pay.

The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay expressed in this Agreement is the rate payable under the provisions of subclause (a) of Clause 8 to a male clerical division officer at the age of 26 years or during the sixth year of adult service. This rate was determined on the 1st January, 1963, at a margin of £427 per annum over the basic rate over the basic rate.

# 20.—Adjustment of Rates of Pay.

- (a) Whenever necessary and in the manner prescribed in this clause the rates of pay contained in this Agreement shall be adjusted half-yearly as from the commencement of the first pay period in the months of July and January in each year.
  - (b) The amount of any adjustment shall be:-
    - (i) Male officers in receipt of a margin of £427 per annum and above—the difference between—
      - (a) the average to the nearest pound(£) of the margin in each case between the gross annual salary rate paid to an officer at age 26 years in the incremental scale of the male clerical automatic ranges of the Public Services of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania and the respective annual equivalent of the State basic wage for the capital city of each of the aforesaid States, or such other rate as may be used in the determination of cost of living adjustments for any of the foregoing Public Services, whichever may apply and
      - whichever may apply; and

        (b) the margin of £427 per annum payable to an officer at age 26 years or in the sixth year of adult service in the male clerical automatic range as prescribed in subclause (a) of Clause 8.

Provided that if the amount determined would result in an adjustment of less than £5 per annum from the current adjustment, if any, no variation shall be made.

(ii) Male officers in receipt of rates of pay below a margin of £427 per annum—

that proportion, to the nearest (£) of the adjustment applicable to male officers on a margin of £427 per annum, which the appropriate gross rate of pay (margin plus basic rate or percentage of basic rate) bears to the gross rate of pay (margin plus basic rate) payable in the metropolitan area to a male clerical officer at age 26 years or in the sixth year of adult service in the male clerical automatic range.

(iii) Female officers in receipt of a margin of £344 per annum and above—

Seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest (£), of the adjustment applicable to male officers on a margin of £427 per annum, provided that female Professional and General officers who are paid the same margins as those prescribed for male Professional or General officers in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (e) and (f) of Clause 13, shall be subject to the same adjustments as apply to male officers on a margin of £427 per annum.

(iv) Female officers in receipt of rates of pay below a margin of £344 per annum—

Seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest (£), of the adjustment applicable to male officers on the basis of the following table:—

- (c) Any adjustment to the rates of pay expressed in this Agreement which may be necessary in accordance with the provisions of this clause shall be made only as the result of a review of margins actually paid by each of the State Public Services on the 1st July and the 1st January each year and no effect shall be given to any retrospective application of revised salary rates which may be determined at subsequent dates.
- (d) Officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared shall, for the purpose of this clause only, be deemed to be employed in the metropolitan area.
- (e) No adjustment shall be made under the provisions of this clause before the commencement of the first pay period in the month of January, 1964.

### 21.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head regarding good conduct, diligence and efficiency an officer shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of his classification by annual increments according to the grades of such classification.

#### 22.—Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied, the rights of officers in respect of all appeals under the Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920-1950, shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

# 23.—Temporary Employees.

A person employed in a temporary capacity under the provisions of section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1956, shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable under the provisions of this Agreement to a permanent officer engaged on duties of a similar nature and of equal responsibility, except that—

(a) A male employed in a temporary capacity as a clerk or as a laboratory assistant shall be paid in accordance with the following scale of rates:—

#### 24.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement which replaces and supersedes the Agreements referred to in clause 1, shall operate as from and including the 1st day of January, 1963, and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years as from that date, provided that either of the parties may after the 31st December, 1963, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Court for an amendment to this Agreement. # INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

#### No. 4 of 1963.

### (Registered 14th March, 1963.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 8th day of March, 1963, between the Australian Workers' of March, 1963, between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") of the one part and Cheynes Beach Whaling Co. Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

### 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as "The Cheynes Beach Whale Chaser Crews Agreement, 1963.

#### 3.—Definitions.

"Whaling Season" shall mean the period from the day the Company commence whaling opera-tions, continuing until at least forty-eight (48) hours after the last whale, to be nominated by the Company, has been taken.

"Port Day" shall mean any day on which a vessel is in harbour for the purpose of maintenance or repair, or is prevented from whaling by rough weather or any other cause.

"Port Rate" shall mean the rate payable on a Port Day.

"Whaling Day" shall mean any day on which a vessel proceeds to sea on whaling operations.

"Whaling Rate" shall mean the rate payable on a Whaling Day.

#### 4.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over that area in which the Company is carrying out whaling operations off the coast of Albany, Western Australia.

#### 5.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all crew members below the rank of Ships' Officer who are employed by the Company on whaling operations.

### 6.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be from 8th March, 1963, until the completion of the 1963 Whaling Season.

#### 7.—Hours.

- (1) Port Days-
  - (a) Eight (8) hours shall constitute a days work to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on any day Monday to Eniday inclusive. Friday inclusive.
  - (b) All work performed in excess of eight (8) hours per day or outside the daily spread of hours prescribed in subclause (a) here-of shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
  - (c) All work performed on a Sunday or on a holiday prescribed in clause 10 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double
  - (d) In the calculation of overtime rates each day shall stand alone, provided that when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous days work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.
  - (e) For the purpose of this clause, forty (40) hours shall comprise a weeks work.
  - (f) Crew members who are required to attend a callout outside the daily spread of hours prescribed in subclause (a) hereof and are not put to work shall be paid for each such callout as follows:-

Saturdays, Sundays and holidays pre-scribed in Clause 10 hereof—Three (3) hours at the appropriate rate.

#### (2) Whaling Time-

- (a) The working week whilst whaling operations are being carried out shall consist of seven (7) days, Monday to Sunday inclusive, and on such days crew members shall work such hours as are necessary for the successful execution of whaling operations, provided that on any day on which a vessel commences whaling operations and returns to port through weather conditions, or any other reasons, prior to the elapse of ten (10) hours from standby, crew members may be employed, at the discretion of the Company, until such ten (10) hours has elapsed.
- (b) The Master of each vessel shall determine each days whaling time and no overtime shall be payable, provided that on returning to port after the completion of a whaling day all work performed in excess of one (1) hour after berthing shall be paid for at Port overtime rates.
- (c) Crew members shall be granted one (1) day off in each two weekly period, payment for such day to be made at Port Rate.

#### (3) Station Bunkering-

- (a) When a chaser is required to deliver fuel oil to the Station or to standby a vessel receiving whale oil for overseas shipment, that day shall be counted as a Whaling Day and in addition crew members of such chaser shall be credited, in respect to both "head bonus" and "end of season bonus" with the number of whales caught by the whaling vessel during such bunkering period.
- (b) Whilst on bunkering duties, all work performed, in excess of one (1) hour after the berthing of the whaling vessel as set out in Clause 7 (2) (b) hereof, shall be paid for at Port overtime rates.

### (4) Ship Watching-

All ship watching permformed outside of ordinary working hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and one quarter with the exception of Sundays and public holidays when the rate of time and one half shall apply, provided that a worker required to perform watching duty after the completion of an ordinary shift and such watching duty extends through to the commencement of the next succeeding ordinary shift shall be relieved from duty not later than noon on such next succeeding ordinary shift without deduction of pay.

#### 9.—Bonus Rates.

### (a) Head Bonus .--

The Company shall pay to each seaman, fireman and cook a "head bonus" of thirteen shillings and sixpence (13s. 6d.) for each legal whale of either baleen or sperm variety credited to the catcher upon which he is employed.

For a whale to be credited to a catcher, it must be delivered to the Station whale buoy by either catcher.

The "head bonus" referred to shall be paid weekly.

#### (b) End of Season Bonus .-

The Company shall pay to each seaman, fireman and cook an "end of season bonus" of six shillings and sixpence (6s. 6d.) for each legal whale of either baleen or sperm variety credited to the catcher during his period of employment on such catcher, provided that:—

- (i) The Company takes in excess of three hundred (300) legal length whales, all types included. On the three hundredth (300th) whale being taken the additional bonus will accrue for all whales credited to the chaser upon which and for that period during which a crew member is employed and will continue to accrue for all additional whales taken until the end of the season.
- (ii) The crew member is in the employ of the Company at the end of the season and has been in the employ of the Company for not less than twelve (12) calendar weeks prior to that date.
- (iii) A crew member who terminates his employment prior to the end of the season for reasons not acceptable to the Company shall forfeit his "end of season" bonus. Should any dispute arise regarding this clause the Union shall have the right to refer the matter to a Board of Reference.

#### 10.-Holidays.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to subclause (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) A crew member required to work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid an additional day's pay at Port Rates.

# 11.—Holiday Pay.

- (a) A crew member shall be entitled to holiday pay at the rate of one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at Port Rate in respect of each month of continuous service.
- (b) Any time in respect of which a crew member is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays, annual leave or long service leave, as prescribed, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (c) A crew member who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.
- (d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave, there shall be added to that period one day, being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed.

### 12.—Contract of Service.

- (a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice given on either side on any day. If the Company or the crew member fails to give the required notice, one (1) week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

#### 13.—Absence Through Sickness.
