Constitution Act, 1889-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3044/11.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which, by Order in Council, are vested in heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys should be vested in Gerald Joseph Clarke (Accountant) and that the like powers vested in Albert Ernest Heagney by Order in Council dated the 7th September, 1960, shall be cancelled: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest and the same is hereby vested in Gerald Joseph Clarke (Accountant), and that the like powers vested in Albert Ernest Heagney by Order in Council dated the 7th September, 1960, shall be cancelled accordingly.

Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 44 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960, that the Governor may, from time to time, upon any report or recommendation of the Judges of the Supreme Court *(inter alia)* make Orders in Council regulating the vacations to be observed by the Court; and that any Order in Council made pursuant to that section shall, so long as it continues in force, have effect as if enacted by the Act; and that Rules of Court may be made accordingly for carrying the Order in Council into effect; and whereas the Judges of the Supreme Court have recommended that the vacations of the Court be regulated as in this order provided: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on a recommendation of the Judges of the Supreme Court and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth, by this order, regulate the vacations of the Court so that, as from and after the 24th December, 1963, until further order—

- (a) the Summer Vacation of the Court shall commence on the 24th day of December and terminate on the 11th day of February;
- (b) the Easter Vacation of the Court shall commence on Good Friday and terminate on the Easter Tuesday, following; and
- (c) the Winter Vacation of the Court shall commence on a day in June, July or August fixed by Rules of Court, from year to year, and terminate on a day, fourteen days after the day so fixed.

IN accordance with section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1958, all owners or occupiers of land in the Shire of Cunderdin are required to observe the following requirements pertaining to the provision of firebreaks in each and every year:—

- (1) A fire break as prescribed hereunder shall be provided completely surrounding areas of the land comprising of not more than 400 acres.
- (2) Such fire breaks as defined shall be completed on or before the 15th October of each year.

Definition of "Firebreak": For the purpose of the above regulation, a firebreak shall be deemed to be a strip of land, not less than eight feet in width, cleared of all infiammable material by either ploughing, cultivating, burning, etc., so that such strip cannot carry fire.

For the purpose of this regulation, any made road cleared to a width of not less than 20 feet of all infiammable material will be accepted as a firebreak.

Where it is not considered practicable or advisable by reason of possible erosion or other effect to adhere in detail to the regulations, a variation of such may be applied for from the nearest fire control officer.

RESOLVED that the Canning Shire Council, in pursuance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962, prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situated wholly within the Canning Shire and enclosed within the inner edge of a blue border on the plan now produced to the Canning Shire Council and marked and certified by the President and the Shire Clerk of the Council under their hands dated the 24th day of September, 1962, as Plan No. 1 and Plan No. 2.

Details of Scheme No. 7.

1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Canning (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan No. 1 and on Plan No. 2. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Area."

3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—

- (a) to improve and develop the Area to the best possible advantage;
- (b) to make provision for the better use of the land within the Area for building purposes;
- (c) to make better provision for roads and traffic within the Area.

4. Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the Area:—

- (a) Low lying land shall be filled and levelled.
 (b) The Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on Plan No. 2.
- (c) Those portions of the roads shown on Plan No. 1 which are no longer shown as roads on Plan No. 2 shall be closed and the land used for the purposes shown on Plan No. 2.
- (d) The roads coloured yellow on Plan No. 2 shall be constructed and drained.

5. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

6. Valuations: Lots shown on Plan No. 1 (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme.

7. The lots created by the re-survey of the Area in accordance with Plan No. 2 (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

8. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to ascertain the unimproved value as defined by section 533 (3) of the Local Government Act, 1960-1961.

9. Increase Value Ratio: From the sum of the values of the new lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new lots. The increase value ratio is the relationship between the sum of the values of the old lots and the net value of the new lots.

10. Owners Interest in Scheme: Each owner from whom an old lot has been resumed shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in this Scheme of a value equal to the value of the land resumed from him increase in the ratio of the "increase value ratio" determined in accordance with paragraph 9 hereof.

11. Costs of Scheme: The Scheme shall be debited with—

- (a) the administration costs of the Scheme;
- (b) the costs of the works to be carried out;
- (c) all compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation;
- (d) the estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 12 hereof;
- (e) the cost of acquisition of any land within the Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.

12. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme, the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

13. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of this Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under clause 21 hereof whichever is the later. 14. Allocation and Disposal of New Lots: The new lots created by the resurvey of the Area will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) Each owner of an old lot will be offered the new lot with the position and dimensions as nearly as possible as that shown on Plan No. 2 bearing the number shown in red of his old lot (hereinafter called "replacement lots").
- (b) The Council shall set aside sufficient lots (hereinafter called "saleable lots") in order that the costs of the Scheme may be paid from the sale of them.
- (c) The remaining new lots shall be apportioned among the owners of the old lots as equitably as possible and offered to such owners.
- (d) The offer mentioned in subclause (c) hereof will be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the replacement lot and the said offer of the additional lot or lots with or subject to a payment is equal to the owners interest in the Scheme as ascertained in accordance with clause 10 hereof.

15. Nature of Offers: The offers mentioned in clause 14 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots the subject of the offer and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owners interest in the Scheme, how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

16. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

17. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall, subject to clause 22 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected. No acceptance of the offer shall be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owed by the owner of land within the area have been paid.

18. The offer of the replacement lot may be accepted and the offer of the remaining lots may be rejected.

19. If the offer of the replacement lot be accepted only the replacement lot shall be treated as being in payment on account of any claim for compensation the owner may have for the resumption of his old lot or by reason of the operation of this Scheme.

20. If the offer be wholly accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.

21. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1959, and return it to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer), the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot. 22. Rejected Lots: If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with this Scheme or fails to complete a transfer of the said lot in manner aforesaid, the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.

23. Sale of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

24. Valuation of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the saleable lots or rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

25. Profits of Scheme: In the event of the Scheme showing a profit, the profit shall be divided equally among the replacement lots and shall be paid to the owners who accept the offer mentioned in clause 14 (a) hereof. The amount of profit referable to rejected lots shall be paid to the Council.

26. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee, the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance.

27. Powers of Council: The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) To demolish wholly or partly any buildings which are in the area of or within the building lines of any new streets on Plan No. 2.
