WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section five of the Native Flora Protection Act, 1935-1938, that the Governor may notify, by Proclamation published in the Gazette, that all wildflowers or native plants, on any specified Crown lands or in any State forest or specified portion thereof or on any specified land reserved for a public purpose under the Land Act, 1933, or any other Act or on any road, are protected under the Act, and that the Governor may revoke or amend any such Proclama-Governor may revoke or amend any such Proclamation at any time by a like Proclamation published in the Gazette; and whereas it is expedient to so notify that all wildflowers and native plants are notify that all wildhowers and native plants are protected and to revoke all proclamations here-tofore made: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in me vested, do hereby notify that all wildhowers and native plants in those parts of Western Australia described in the schedule hereunder are protected under the Native those parts of Western Austrana described in the schedule hereunder are protected under the Native Flora Protection Act, 1935-1938, and do hereby revoke the Proclamations made under that Act on the 8th day of October, 1936, the 22nd day of December, 1937, the 11th day of September, 1946, the 5th day of September, 1956, and the 22nd day of July 1956 and published in the Carattee of July, 1959, and published in the Gazette on the 16th day of October, 1936, the 24th day of December, 1937, the 20th day of September, 1946, the 14th day of September, 1956, and the 31st day of July, 1959, respectively.

Fires Brigades Act, 1942-1961. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-(2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, unite any two or more fire districts the areas of which are contiguous into one fire district, and include the name of a local authority in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, details because of the country of the co the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Metropolitan Fire District as set forth in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the Road Districts of Can-Act by substituting for the Road Districts of Canning, Cockburn, Gosnells and Mundaring referred to in that Part II of such schedule those portions of each of the municipal districts of the Shires of Canning, Cockburn, Gosnells and Mundaring respectively described and set forth in the First Schedule to this Order in Council, and by substituting for the portion of the district known as High Wygombe being part of the Municipal Dis-High Wycombe, being part of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kalamunda referred to in that Part II of such schedule, that portion of the district known as High Wycombe, being part of the municipal district of the Shire of Kalamunda, described and set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order in Council.

First Schedule.

Canning Fire District. All those portions of land situate within the

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954-1958.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Beverley Municipality.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 1st October, 1963, east of the Great Southern Railway, or 15th October, 1963, west

of the Great Southern Railway, to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than seven (7) feet wide in the following position on the land owned or occupied by you:—

- (1) Inside and within three (3) chain of the boundary of all property.
- (2) Where the above lands are divided by or abut a trafficable public road or railway reserve, a firebreak shall be provided within three (3) chain of the boundary of the road or railway reserve.
- (3) Within three (3) chain of the perimeter of all buildings and hay stacks on the land, to completely surround the buildings or group of buildings or hay stacks.
- (4) Land, the bush on which has been bull-dozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing or burning shall be completely surrounded by a firebreak ten (10) feet wide. (Note: Firebreak may be provided on adjoining land).
- (5) Existing gullies, salt lakes, rivers or drains shall not form portion of a firebreak required by this order unless approved by the Shire Council.
- (6) Townsite: The whole of all townsite and subdivision lots to be cleared of all inflammable debris. Additionally a firebreak seven (7) feet wide completely free of all inflammable material cleared inside and along the external boundaries.
- (7) Fuel Dumps: All grass or other infiammable material must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel, are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of 10 feet completely surrounding the fuel drums.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Firebreaks in the situation hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of the notice so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:—

- (a) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on a public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the common boundary.

Where any land has been rolled or otherwise prepared for burning off, the whole area of such prepared land shall be completly enclosed by a firebreak not less than 10 feet wide to be made round any area occupied by buildings or haystacks.

The firebreaks required by this notice shall be constructed by ploughing the whole width of the various firebreaks. The soil for the full width of the firebreak is to be completely turned over and the firebreak maintained in a condition of efficiency by all regrowth or inflammable material being removed there from as often as may be required to keep the firebreak completely cleared of inflammable material.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Nurses' (Doctors' Surgeries) Award.'

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to nurses employed by any qualified medical practitioner or practitioners.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area of the State of Western Australia south of the 28th parallel of South Latitude.

5.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Definitions.

"Nurse" shall mean one who is registered or entitled to be registered as a general trained nurse in Western Australia under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1957.

7.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:—

8.—Sick Leave.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that subject to subclause (f) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.
- (b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from her employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of her employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of her own wilful default or for sickness arising out of her own wilful default.
- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless she produces proof satisfactory to her employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (f) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by her employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by her employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

- (g) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, subclause (f) hereof shall be deemed to have become operative as from the date of the delivery of this Award.
- (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers,

9.—Hours.

- (a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) hours in a week. The ordinary hours on any day shall not exceed ten (10) hours.
- (b) Meal breaks of not less than thirty (30) minutes, at a time mutually agreed upon, shall be allowed workers each day.

10.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked in excess of forty (40) hours in any one week, or in excess of ten (10) hours on any day, shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
 - (ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (c) When work is performed on a holiday, time off with pay equivalent to the period worked shall be granted at some other time or, alternatively, the time worked shall be paid for at double time.

11.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) Annual Leave:

- (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by her employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (ii) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves her employment or her employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at her ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (iii) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (iv) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which she is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining her right to annual leave.
- (v) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, she shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (b) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to her length of service during that period with such employer and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers she shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

- (vi) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (vii) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.
- (viii) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two (2) periods.
- (ix) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this subclause.

(b) Holidays:

- (i) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to clause 10 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties in lieu of any of the days named in this subclause.
- (ii) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present herself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (iii) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday or a Monday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday; in each such case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.

12.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual or part-time workers, one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day shall be necessary to terminate the engagement. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, one (1) week's wages shall be paid or forfeited as the case may be.

13.—Casuals.

A nurse employed for a period of less than two (2) weeks shall be deemed a casual worker and be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

14.—Part-time Workers.

- (a) Notwithstanding anything contained herein, an employer shall be at liberty to regularly employ part-time workers.
- (b) A part-time worker means a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service who regularly works less than the normal hours per week.
- (c) Part-time workers shall be paid a pro rata amount of the wages specified in clause 7 hereof depending upon the number of hours worked and shall be entitled to pro rata payment for annual and sick leave.

15.—Motor Car Allowance.

Where a worker maintains a motor car and is authorised in writing by her employer to use her car in the performance of her duties, she shall be paid at the rate of tenpence (10d.) for each mile she uses her car on her employer's business.

16.—Telephone.

Where a worker is required by the employer to install a telephone at her home for the performance of her duties, the employer shall pay the rental charge of such telephone.

17.—Laundry and Uniforms.

Where a worker is required by the employer to wear a special uniform, such uniform shall be provided and laundered by the employer at his expense or, alternatively, the employer may pay an allowance of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.)

per week in lieu of such uniform and/or a further allowance of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per week in lieu of laundering the uniform.

18.—Special Allowances.

Any nurse who is required by the employer to hold more than one certificate in connection with her duties shall receive a sum of fifteen shillings (15s.) for midwifery and ten shillings (10s.) for other certificates required to be used, in addition to the appropriate wage rate provided in clause 7—Wages.

19.—Preference.

- (a) In this clause the term "unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of the industrial union of workers party to this Award.
- (b) Any worker whose application for membership of the union has been refused shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall, pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar, have the same rights under this clause as a "unionist."
- (c) Subject to subclause (d) hereof, workers who are not "unionists" shall, within seven days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause by an accredited representative of the applicant union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award. Workers who are unfinancial members of the industrial union of workers party to this Award shall become and maintain financial membership whilst employed by any respondent to this Award.

(d) Exemptions:-

- (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth (whose decision shall be final), for exemption from this clause.
- (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar her reasons for desiring exemption and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (c).
- (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—
 - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;
 - (b) if the worker objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union; and
 - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.
- (iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall within seven days of the decision make application for membership of the applicant union and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by a respondent to this Award.

20.-Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of continuous service since the 24th December, 1938.

- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof but after the 24th December, 1938, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.
- (ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession, whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law, and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
 - (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
 - (b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen (15) working days in any year of her employment;
 - (c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave:
 - (d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom she was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
 - (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;

- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six (6) months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which she has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) day of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to her last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least twenty (20) years' service the amount of leave shall be—
 - (a) in respect of twenty (20) years' service so completed—thirteen (13) weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each ten (10) years' service completed after such twenty (20) years'—six and a half (6½) weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and her employment is terminated—
 - (a) by her death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct; the amount of leave shall be—
 - (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to twenty (20) years;
 - (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to twenty (20) years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least ten (10) years' service but less than fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and her employment is terminated—
 - (i) by her death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious miconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to twenty (20) years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

- (d) Payment for Period of Leave.
- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which she has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled, the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to her at the date she commences such leave.
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to her for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to her at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date she commences such leave.
 - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference, the employer shall give to a worker at least one (1) month's notice of the date from which her leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three (3) separate periods in respect of the first thirteen (13) weeks' entitlement and in not more than two (2) separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave:
 - (ii) at the same time as her wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
 - (f) No worker shall, during any period when she is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the

- employment from which she is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision she shall thereupon forfeit her right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which she has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of her employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which she is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.
- (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.
- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment, a proportionate amount on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which she was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
- (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State Law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by her employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent hereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(g) Records to be Kept.

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker, a period of three (3) years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and her occupation, the date of the commencement of her employment and her entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to her or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of-
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder:
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State Law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of twenty (20) or more years' service of employment or an accrued right on a worker or her personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance here-
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State Law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Enderd Embedies tralian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

21.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the functions
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
 - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

- (c) more than twelve other workers covered by this Agreement shall be paid twelve shillings and eightpence (12s. 8d.) per day extra.

Where a leading hand works under the supervision of a foreman for the major portion of the day, the extra rates set out in this clause shall be halved.
